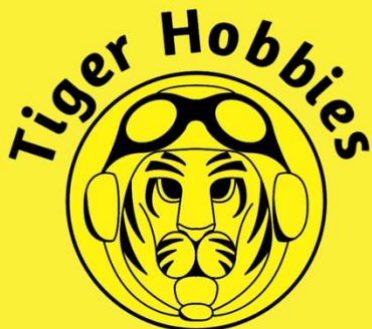

# Bluescene

Good evening, ladies and gentlemen, welcome to The SALUS Stadium for this evening's Northern Counties East Premier Division game against Liversedge. We give a warm welcome to Tadcaster's players, officials and supporters and hope they have a safe trip home after the game.

This evening's visitors, Liversedge, currently sit in 4th place on 13 points after 6 games. Liversedge started the season with 1 point from their first 2 games back in the NCEL since then they have won 4 on the trot, all at home, and all without conceding. A pair of 2-0 wins over Beverley Town and Eccleshill United kickstarted their season. This was followed by a 4-0 victory against newly promoted Wombwell Town then on Saturday they faced another of the newbies, Horbury Town, beating them by 2 goals to nil. Ex-Blues George Green and Kelan Swales have been in the goals lately with 7 between them in the last 5 games in all competitions.

The Blues come into today's game in 7th place on 9 points after 6 games. Since our 1-0 win against Thackley, here at The Wezzie, courtesy of Luis Afonso Ferreira's goal of the season contender, The Blues had a bad week, losing 3 games in 8 days. A 1-0 defeat at Bottesford proceeded a 5-1 home mauling at the hands of step 6 visitors Maghull in the FA Vase, the consolation goal was a Destiny Ifeanyi Nnenanya penalty, and a 3-0 loss to league leaders Tadcaster Albion. But at the weekend, we saw a resounding response, winning 2-0 at Penistone Church with a

dominant performance and goals from Destiny and Luis.

Our most recent meeting with Liversedge was in February 2022 in the Northern Premier League Division 1 East, The Blues losing 2-0 as Sedge closed in on the league title. Our most recent encounter at Westfield Lane, was in the same division in November 2021 and ended with the same result and scoreline. The last time we scored against Liversedge was in the days before the improvement in their finances, in August 2018, in an FA Cup Preliminary Round. The Blues were in the NPL (step 4) at the time and Liversedge were in the NCEL (step 5). The Azzurri were 10-1 winners, after being a goal down, recording the highest score in that season's FA Cup competition. Braces by Tyler Walton, Dan Palmer and Jack Burton, and a single goal from Sam Liversedge, were topped off by Jacob Hazel's hat trick.

Expect The Blues to be doing their utmost to replicate their top performance from Saturday.

In recruitment news, winger Kieron Ceesay has joined The Blues. Kieron made his debut at Penistone on Saturday, coming on as substitute. We wish him the best of luck in his time at Frickley.

Our next game sees The Blues travel to Penistone Church on Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> August, 3pm kickoff. The Blues are next in action here at Westfield Lane on Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> September when Liversedge are our visitors, 7.45pm ko. We hope to see you all there.

# Meet The Visitors

Liversedge Football Club was founded in 1910 following the demise of the old Liversedge Rugby Club which had been a member of the Northern Union which, in turn, was the forerunner to the Rugby League. It was one of a number of clubs which switched codes around that time.

Liversedge started in the Bradford League for three years and won it in 1920/21 season.

The club was a founder member of the West Riding County Amateur League in season 1922/23 and went on to be the most successful club in the league's infancy, taking the league title three times in the first five seasons

1923/24, 1925/26, 1926/27 and again in 1964/65, 1965/66.

The long association with the County Amateur League was maintained until the early 1970s by which time the club had kept up their position as a top local side and winning it in 1968/69 season.

The decision was taken to apply for membership of the Yorkshire League and the club's acceptance for season 1972/73 was followed by immediate promotion from Division Three. While not winning trophies around this time, success did come the club's way as promotion to Yorkshire League Division One was achieved prior to the amalgamation of the Midland and Yorkshire League to form the Northern Counties East League in 1982. The early years in the new set-up saw Sedge struggle both on and off the pitch but large strides were made in the late 1980s. In 1988/89, they were promoted to NCEL Division One but a lack of floodlights the following season saw them miss out on promotion to the Premier Division. A great club effort the following season by players, officials and supporters alike saw them promoted to the Premier Division. The disappointment of missing out the previous season had been tempered by the winning of the West Riding County Cup for the first time in the club's history.

Life in the top flight brought fluctuating fortunes but under Manager Eugene Lacy, the high spot of 2004/2005 was undoubtedly a fine FA Cup run to the Fourth Qualifying Round, beating three higher-ranked opponents along the way before being knocked out by Coalville Town.

The 2005/06 season saw a new look to Sedge's ground, as the famous Clayborn Slope was removed. The club's epic FA Cup run had enabled the club to finance, with the help of the

FA, the levelling of the playing area, a fitting reminder of their FA Cup exploits.

On the field also brought success, by way of the winning of the NCEL League Cup for the first time, as victors over Selby Town, and Sedge's highest ever placing of runners-up spot in the NCEL Premier Division behind Buxton.

Unfortunately promotion was not to be gained, as the club's changing rooms did not meet the requirements of the Unibond NPL.

2007/08 saw another trophy win as Sedge defeated Armthorpe in the NCEL President's Cup Final over two legs.

The last decade or so saw a number of managerial changes and relegation has been flirted with on a couple of occasions but Sedge is still proud of their record of never ever being relegated. Development of the facilities has been ongoing as well. Current manager Jonathan Rimmington has been in charge for several years and has brought more stability to the club. This culminated in the club succeeding in its ambition to join the NPL, promoted from the NCEL as a result of performances in the Covid-hit 2019/20 and 2020/21 seasons to the expanded Step 4. Sedge hit the ground running in 2021/22, their first ever Northern Premier League season, winning the league following a tight title battle with Marske United, and gaining promotion to the NPL Premier Division. Jonathan Rimmington's side made it a league and cup double with a 3-1 West Riding County Cup Final win against local rivals Brighouse Town.

Sedge had it rough in 2022/23 in the NPL Premier Division, as Sedge was relegated.

Sedge made some crucial appointments, including ex-Premier League footballer Ross McCormack, who joined in 2023/24 as a player/director of football.

However, a 10th place finish in 2023/24 was only a hiatus as 21st place and relegation followed again in 2024/25.

Back in the NCEL in 2025/26, Liversedge, under current manager Danny Forrest, will be looking to halt the slide and use the knowledge gained over the last few years to climb up the pyramid again.

# Frickley's History

Frickley Athletic FC is based in the former coal mining village of South Elmsall. Recent research has shown that the first South Elmsall football team was formed in 1905 but was superseded in 1908 by the newly formed Frickley Colliery Athletic Club and joined the South Yorkshire league which comprised of works, church and village teams. In 1910, the football club moved to the Sheffield Association League and first played in the FA Cup.

The club remained in the Sheffield Association League (except for the war years) until 1922, finishing runners up in 1911/12, and winners in 1920/21, our only ever league title.

In 1922/23 Frickley joined the Yorkshire league and after finishing runners up in 1923/24, the club were elected into the Midland League. Although the club had to apply for re election several times pre war (and didn't play in any league in 1933/34) it was kept going by the support of the mineworkers and the sale of players.

1936/37 was Frickley's worst ever league season when the club finished bottom with only 8 points, but amazingly reached the FA Cup 1<sup>st</sup> round proper for the first time.

Post war, Frickley remained in the Midland league gaining its best finish, 7<sup>th</sup>, in 1945/46, but left the league on its break up at the end of 1959/60.

From 1960/61 to 1969/70, Frickley Colliery played in the Cheshire County League. However, financial considerations led the club to join the Midland Counties League for 1970/71. They finished runners up in 1972/73, and were eventually elected into the NPL for the 1976/77 season as Frickley Athletic.

After finishing 3<sup>rd</sup> in 1979/80, the club was promoted into the Alliance Premier League, now the National League. Here they remained for 7 years, the most successful in the club's history, and in 1985/86 reached the FA Cup 3<sup>rd</sup> round proper, after beating a Football League club, Hartlepool Utd, only to lose 3-1 at home to Rotherham Utd. The club also finished as Gola League runners up. The following season saw a reversal as we were relegated back to the NPL. From 1987/88 to 1991/92 the club consistently finished around mid-table in the NPL, but did manage to reach the league cup final in 1991/92, losing 1-0 to Marine at Maine Road.

The next few seasons saw Frickley finish in the lower reaches of the table. Then, in 2005/06 The

Blues had their best league season for 20 years, finishing 2nd to Blyth Spartans. Unfortunately, the Blues lost on penalties in the playoff semi.

In the following seasons Frickley returned to the lower half of the table, but 2015/16 saw the club have a great season to finish 7<sup>th</sup>.

This was not repeated in 2016/17 as most of the players who had brought this success were attracted to join more affluent clubs. The club were relegated from the NPL Premier Division after being members for 30 years.

2017/18 saw the club enter the NPL Division 1 South, finishing 3<sup>rd</sup> in the league, scoring a record 117 goals. Additionally, Jacob Hazel broke the club record for individual goals in a season with 47 strikes. The season ended disappointingly with playoff semi final defeat at the hands of Stamford.

2018/19, in the new NPL East Division, was less successful, seeing managerial changes and a 12<sup>th</sup> place finish. However, the season had its highlights, with victory at highflying Morpeth and a 10-1 win over Liversedge in the FA Cup.

More change followed prior to the start of 2019/20. A further league reorganisation which put the Blues into the NPL South East Division was accompanied by a new manager. An inauspicious start led to the appointment of Dave Frecklington in September 2019.

Frecks rapidly turned the side's fortunes around, before lockdown ended the season. 2020/21 ultimately suffered the same fate.

Frecks built what looked like strong squad for the 2021/22 season, able to compete for promotion from the newly formed NPL East Division.

However, things didn't pan out the way that was hoped. Key departures led to a run of form that saw the club relegated to the Northern Counties East League for the first time in our history.

In the summer of 2022, former Blue, Wayne Benn, was appointed as manager, with ex-Frickley goal scoring legend Andy Hayward as his assistant. There were occasional highs but Benn resigned in early 2023 so Patrick McGuire came in to avoid a second successive relegation.

2023/24 started well, and included an 8-0 win at Goole, but ended with the release of McGuire. James Baxendale was in the hot seat for the start of 2024/25 but left in October.

Tom Claisse took the reins in November 2024 and successfully avoided

relegation. Tom and his team will be looking to bring back winning ways to Westfield Lane in 25/26.

The first match was a FA Cup Preliminary round tie against Shildon, played on Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> September 1982. # Five unbeaten for impressive Blues

ANOTHER impressive team performance from Frickley Athletic stretched their unbeaten run in the Unibond Premier Division to five matches with a 1-0 success at Ashton United on Friday.

Apart from a second-minute scare, when a close-range shot zipped into the side netting, little was seen of the home attack which rarely managed to escape a stranglehold imposed by the Blues cover.

Martyn Woolford picked up a ball in the middle of the Ashton half in the ninth minute and rode a challenge before unleashing an 18-yard drive which United keeper Ashley Connor superbly tipped over the top.

Some neat combination between Ashley Scothern and Woolford in the 20th minute set up Scothern on the

fringe of the penalty area, but his shot flashed just off target and, while Frickley generally controlled exchanges, they were kept at bay by a determined home defence.

The second half saw the visiting attack threaten again, Andy Evans collecting a throw-in from Steve Robinson and sending over a cross which came back off the bar in the 57th minute. A quick break involving Evans, Scothern and Woolford, five minutes later, led to Woolford firing just over from the edge of the penalty area.

Evans was brought down in the 68th minute, and Calum Selby curled a 20-yard free-kick into the top corner of the net to give the Blues a deserved lead.

Frickley increased the tempo,

Scothern collecting a ball on the right in the 75th minute and picking out Woolford, who cut inside defender James Riordan but lacked accuracy in his finish.

Woolford was unlucky again eight minutes later when he lashed a 25-yard drive past Connor, only to see the ball clip the top of the bar.

It's FA Cup football for Frickley tomorrow, when they entertain North West Counties side Chadderton in the 1st qualifying round, kick-off 3pm.

Should there be no replay, the Blues are scheduled to visit Blyth Spartans in the Unibond Premier next Tuesday, subject to Spartans also being free, with kick-off at 7:45pm.

# NCEL News

Pickering Town are the sole remaining Macron NCEL side in this year's Emirates FA Cup after their 5-2 home win over Northern Premier League side Redcar Athletic on Friday evening.

All four of our teams taking part in the First Round Qualifying stage came up against higher ranked opposition and the Pikes got the weekend off to a fantastic start as a George Brown hat-trick was added to by Joe Wood and George Thewlis to book their place in Monday's draw.

However, despite battling performances from our sides, there was no upset to cheer on Saturday in the remaining three ties.

Rossington Main had the toughest task as they faced Northern Premier League Premier Division leaders FC United of Manchester at the Kalkut's Community Stadium in front of a bumper 1,458 crowd and it was the visitors who went through with a 4-0 victory.

Oliver Fearon scored for Wombwell Town as they went down 3-1 at home to Stocksbridge Park Steels in another game that saw a two division difference between the two clubs prove insurmountable.

And, Bottesford Town also bowed out as they were beaten 4-1 at Step 4 side Matlock Town, Jack McMenemy with a 41st minute equaliser for the Poachers before the hosts took full control in the second period.

In the Macron NCEL Premier Division, Tadcaster Albion have increased their lead at the top of the table to four points after Alfie Dean and Charlie Marshall scored for the Brewers in a 2-1 home victory over Knaresborough Town, Joshua Hardcastle with an injury time consolation for the visitors.

A double from Lewis Stephens helped Barton Town to a 3-0 victory over visitors Golcar United to move the Swans up into second, Thomas Waudby also got on the scoresheet to heap more pain on their Golcar who remain in the basement. Liversedge are fourth after a George Green penalty and a Kelan Swales strike each side of half time secured a 2-0 win at home to Horbury Town and Parkgate complete the top 5 following their goalless draw at home to Beverley Town. Paul Walker, Hass Gorji and Joshua Owen were the scorers for Thackley whose 3-1 home win over Albion Sports moves them up to sixth, Emmerson Cox finding the net for the Lions who

stay nineteenth.

And, in the two local derbies played on Friday night, there was a hat-trick for Max Dickinson as Campion beat visitors Eccleshill United 4-1 and Connor Cutts cancelled out Mitchell Dunne's opener for Handsworth as Sheffield drew 1-1 at home in front of the division's biggest crowd of the season, 533.

Harrogate Railway Athletic and Dearne & District were both home winners in Division One to continue their excellent starts to the season.

The Rail are at the summit, two points ahead of Dearne, after Alex Ingham's opener and a brace from Dominic Creamer earned them a 3-0 scoreline over Route One Rovers.

And, Jacob Woodward, Owen Fieldsend and Jamie Austin netted for Dearne as they defeated Ilkley Town, 3-1, to grow the gap between the top two and the chasing pack.

Worsbrough Bridge Athletic climb into third as Benjamin Pike's hat-trick secured them a 3-2 win at Armthorpe Welfare, the winner coming in injury time in dramatic fashion.

Tom Hinton struck twice for Wakefield AFC as they won 3-0 at Athersley Recreation, moving them up into fourth, whilst Club Thorne Colliery drop a couple of places into fifth as they went down 1-0 at home to Crowle Colts on Friday night, Joe Hare with the 54th minute decider. James Law and William Law struck in quick succession as South Leeds were 2-1 winners at home to Appleby Frodingham to move up into sixth with Crowle in seventh and Goole AFC, following their 4-1 win at Winterton Rangers, completing the top eight.

Curtis Davies, Leo Berriman and Kyle Austin scored for the Vikings whilst they were also helped by an own goal from Oakley Hill and Charlie Weeks grabbed one back for Rangers. Goals in the second half from Dayle Hutson and Henry Parr led to a much-needed home victory for Brigg Town as they saw off Selby Town 3-1 and Adam Milson got the only goal of the game as Louth Town beat visitors Maltby Main.

Omar Sanyang and Junayd Cassius-Gill struck to claim a 2-0 away win for Leeds UFCA at basement side Nostell Miners Welfare and there was a goalless game between Glasshoughton Welfare and Doncaster City that means they are nineteenth and sixteenth, respectively.



# The NLP Column: Board Games

It's easy to forget quite how big the National League System is and the broad church it represents.

From huge ex-Football League clubs with seven figure playing budgets for their season to very small community clubs run by a handful of volunteers. But that's what makes non-league, and football in this country generally, so unique and special.

You may have heard The FA last year introduced a new board to oversee this level of the game along with the women's pyramid.

We sat down with Head of National League System James Earl (pictured top) and National League System manager Matt Edkins to discuss this for The NLP.

Our chat covered the new National Leagues Pyramid Board, including the appointment of its first ever independent chair, Chris Brown (pictured bottom).

"The important bit to say is it's still a fundamental moment where this level of the game in both the men's and the women's pyramid have a strong collective

voice with a senior seat at the table at the FA," Earl told us.

"Historically, certainly the National League System has been positioned between the professional and the grassroots game and has sat in a governance structure that's

been in and around the grassroots game. "But there's been a recognition of the importance of the National League System, and the women's football pyramid, and that it is unique in how we should be servicing it at The FA. So its introduction last year for the first time was a really key moment.

"That has had challenges and opportunities.

Challenges is bringing two pyramids together that have been governed separately. "One of the pieces of work we've been doing is around the brand and identity for the board, but also the level of the game.

"So there has been some work done around a new brand and hopefully that will be launched soon, which will

bring a collective identity for not just the board, but leagues and clubs and other stakeholders to stand behind.

"It has been important to not make the board a repeat of committees that still exist. The intent is to make this a strategic board that looks at the broader direction of travel for clubs and leagues and players at this level of the game.

"We've still got a journey to go on to really understand what it is we want the board to do to be able to drive standards up, not just in the competitions, but the club landscape as well.

"I think after a year there's been some great success. We've had some good debates and good conversations, but actually the proof will be in delivery and I think that's going to come over the next couple of years."





# Match Reports

## Frickley 0 Tadcaster Albion 3

The Blues slipped to a third consecutive defeat in all competitions in a week. The 3-0 scoreline against the table toppers told its own story, but in truth the game was tighter than the result suggested. The Azzurri carved out a number of chances and worked hard throughout, yet lacked the spark needed to change the outcome.

Frickley began positively and almost made the perfect start inside 3 minutes. Destiny wriggled into space and pulled the trigger, but his effort was deflected wide of the goal.

That early intent set the tone, but it was Tadcaster who struck first. On 20 minutes, the ball dropped kindly for the visiting number 10, who took a snapshot from 20 yards. The shot arrowed through a crowd of bodies and into the net, giving Sykes little chance.

The goal gave Tadcaster confidence, and they pushed on with a couple of half chances, a lofted effort over the bar from a corner and a teasing low cross flicked wide.

Los Azules responded in kind as Kilner produced a fantastic run down the flank, pulling the ball back for Destiny, whose two quickfire attempts were smothered by defenders. Woolly then went close with a wormburner that rolled narrowly wide of the post.

Just as The Blues looked to be growing into the game, misfortune struck. 5 minutes before the interval, Tadcaster's number 10 spotted Sykes off his line and attempted the audacious from inside his own half, pinging the ball over the retreating keeper and into the net for his and his side's second of the evening.

With maybe not a mountain but a considerable hill to climb, Destiny blazed over as Les Bleus looked to respond, and a tricky Tingle corner caused the opposing keeper problems, before a foul halted the attack, but half time arrived with Taddy two goals to the good. HT 0-2.

The Blues came out with renewed energy after the break, yet were dealt another blow just 7 minutes in. A Taddy set piece was met with a decent header that flew into the bottom corner. The considerable hill was now a Munro, But De Blauwen continued to fight. Gagen went close on 67 minutes, rising to meet Jenko's cross but directing his header straight into the keeper's hands under the bar. Destiny remained a threat,

# Match Reports (cont.)

## Penistone Church 0 Frickley 2

The Azzurri produced a display of almost total dominance to secure a thoroughly deserved 2-0 win in the wind and rain at Penistone Church. The recent hoodoo against one of the division's strongest sides was broken, as was their unbeaten league record. And The Blues claimed a first away victory under boss Tom Claisse.

With just 17 seconds on the clock, Luis AF left his marker trailing and attempted an audacious lob, only to see it drift wide. It was a statement of intent, and the pressure didn't let up.

On 5 minutes, Destiny went on a run like Maradona in the 86 World Cup in Mexico but unfortunately there was no Terry Butcher to stick it in at the end.

Penistone's defenders were quickly being forced into errors, heading behind under pressure.

The Blue tide kept rolling in. Robbo, Tom A, and Spence combined to turn the screw, ending with Luis AF hitting an overhead kick over the bar on 12 minutes. Luis AF then turned provider, delivering a pinpoint cross that Spence could only head straight at the keeper.

Tom A was next to go close, racing clear only to be denied by the keeper. But he wasn't giving up, he chased down the loose ball before firing narrowly wide from a tight angle. The breakthrough, however, was inevitable.

In the 22nd minute, a corner caused chaos as Radz rose highest to nod the ball down, Robbo stabbed goalwards, the keeper saved, but the ball was recycled by Woolly out wide and guided home by Destiny to open the scoring.

The Azzurri did not relent. Destiny whipped in two dangerous crosses soon after, Luis AF blazed the second over from 6 yards out. Luis AF struck the post when clean through in the 37th minute, and the winger again left the fullback reaching for the Sudocrem after scorching him but was thwarted by the onrushing keeper. Robbo also went agonisingly close before the interval. And there were other chances created that just lacked that crucial coup de grace.

The only opportunity worthy of the name for the hosts resulted in a brave save at the feet of the attacker by Sykes. So at half time it remained a single goal lead for Los Azules, a scoreline that very much flattered Penistone. HT 0-1.

The second period brought more of the same. Tom A twisted and turned through the home

defence, forcing a smart save early on before Penistone hit a rare looping effort wide.

Then, on 61 minutes, the killer blow arrived. Robbo found Luis AF, who danced around two defenders before coolly slotting past the keeper. A brilliant solo effort that he had been threatening all afternoon to make The Azzurri's advantage rather more comfortable.

The Blues stayed in control, though tempers flared as a flurry of yellow cards were shown, including to Woolly, Jenko, Spence, Destiny, and Radz. New signing Kieron Ceesay was introduced for his debut and almost marked it with a goal, but a bobble saw his shot skew wide.

The Boys in Blue kept pressing for a third. Tom A drew another fine save, Radz went close with a header, and Luis AF continued to torment his fullback.

Penistone, by contrast, barely threatened, their best was a shot across goal that flew well wide in the 87th minute. To add insult to injury, they finished with 10 men after their number 2 was sent off for dissent in stoppage time. FT 0-2.

After 5 straight defeats against Penistone, conceding 22 goals and scoring just 7 in the process, the manner of the triumph was impressive. One way traffic, a cleano and 3 cherries on the board.

## ON THIS DAY IN FOOTBALL – 2<sup>ND</sup> SEPTEMBER

**1892** - Everton played their first match at Goodison Park. Bolton Wanderers were beaten 4-2 in a friendly.

**1893** - Arsenal drew 2-2 in a Second Division match against Newcastle United. It was the first Football League match in London and was also Newcastle's first match in the Football League.

**1939** - The record books show that Bournemouth's record League victory was an 8-0 away victory at Birmingham City in the Championship in 2014. However on Saturday September 2nd 1939 they beat Northampton Town 10-0 in a Football League Third Division (South) fixture. But the next day war was declared on Germany and the game was declared void and expunged from the record books.

**1980** - Graham Taylor's Watford won 7-1 against Southampton in the second leg of a League Cup Second Round tie at Vicarage Road, after being beaten 4-0 at The Dell in the first leg, to go through 7-5 on aggregate.

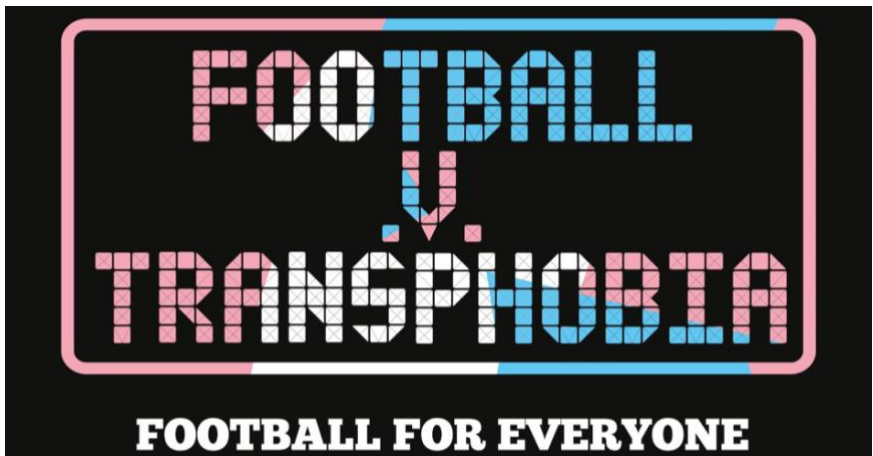
**1981** - During a League Cup First Round game between Chester and Plymouth Argyle at Sealand Road. Chester keeper Grenville Millington collided with an upright when making a save, breaking the post beyond repair so the match was abandoned after 78 minutes.

## Linked to The Lane

I'm an incorrigible collector of old A&BC, Panini, Merlin, Topps, etc. football cards and stickers, and it struck me how many of the players pictured had links to Frickley Athletic. They might have played for or against us at some point, or are related to one of The Azzurri past or present. Or the connection might be even more tenuous! But you can be sure it was the highlight of their career ;)

Frank Carrodus is another who played against The Blues and trod the hallowed turf, and who deserves to be better known. Hold my beer... Cheshire born in 1949, Carrodus carved out a respectable career as a hardworking and reliable winger during the 1970s and early 1980s. Though he never achieved international fame, his steady rise from non-league football to the top tiers of the English game reflects a story of persistence and grit.

Carrodus started out at local side Heys Albion before a brief stint with Altrincham in 1969.

His rise really took off when he caught the eye of legendary Manchester City manager Malcolm Allison whilst on trial. Balancing his football aspirations with studies in civil engineering, Carrodus joined City later that year. Over the course of the next 5 seasons, he made 42 league appearances, scoring once. Although often on the fringes of the first team, by the 1973/74 season he had begun to establish himself as a dependable squad member, and he was an unused sub as City won the 1974 League Cup Final at Wembley.

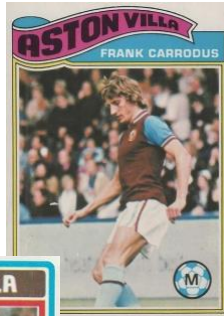
In 1974, Carrodus transferred to Aston Villa for a fee of £95k. The move reunited him with Ron Saunders, a former manager at City. At Villa, Carrodus hit his stride. He played a big part in helping the club gain promotion from the Second Division in 1974/75. His contributions didn't stop there, he was also part of Villa's League Cup winning side in 1975 against Norwich City. Back in the First Division, another of the highlights of his Villa tenure came in December

1976, when the team demolished Liverpool 5-1 as Carrodus pulled the strings.

His time at Villa wasn't without setbacks. He won the League Cup again in 1977 against Everton but missed the final's second replay due to a knee ligament injury and later injuries and surgery disrupted his 1978/79 season.

Carrodus left Villa to join Wrexham in December 1979 after 5 years at the club where he had made

150 league appearances and scored 7 goals, with a hatful of assists and tireless performances on the wing. He enjoyed a productive spell at the Welsh club, playing 97 league matches and scoring 6 goals. He marked his debut with a 3-1 win over Luton Town and reached his 100th appearance (in all competitions) milestone in a game against Chelsea in



1982.

A short stop followed at Birmingham City during the 1982/83 season, then at Bury the following year.

As his Football League career came to a close, Carrodus returned to non-league football. He turned out for clubs including

Witton Albion, Runcorn, Macclesfield Town, and briefly, Alty again in 1987.

Though his time in the lower leagues received less fanfare, it showcased his enduring passion for the game and got him a runout at The Wezzie.

After retiring from football, Carrodus initially ventured into financial services before finding his niche in corporate hospitality. He established and ran a

successful company in Hale, remaining connected to the business side of sport and entertainment.

Like The Mighty Blues, Frank Carrodus was never the flashiest player on the pitch, but he was certainly no nonsense and resilient. His story is a valuable reminder of the role of the unsung hero in the fabric of football history.

**Rotherham Facts:** Rotherham was once a powerhouse of coal and steel production, and was also famed for its glassmaking. It is the home of the world's first iron-framed building, the 18th century Rotherham Bridge Chapel, one of only four still standing in the UK. The town is home to the impressive Rotherham Minster, whose origins date back to the 15th century, and Clifton Park, a Victorian green space with its own museum that once displayed the preserved remains of a lion called Nelson. Rotherham is also the birthplace of the Chuckle Brothers, Paul and Barry Elliott, World Cup Final referee Howard Webb and actor Dean Andrews.

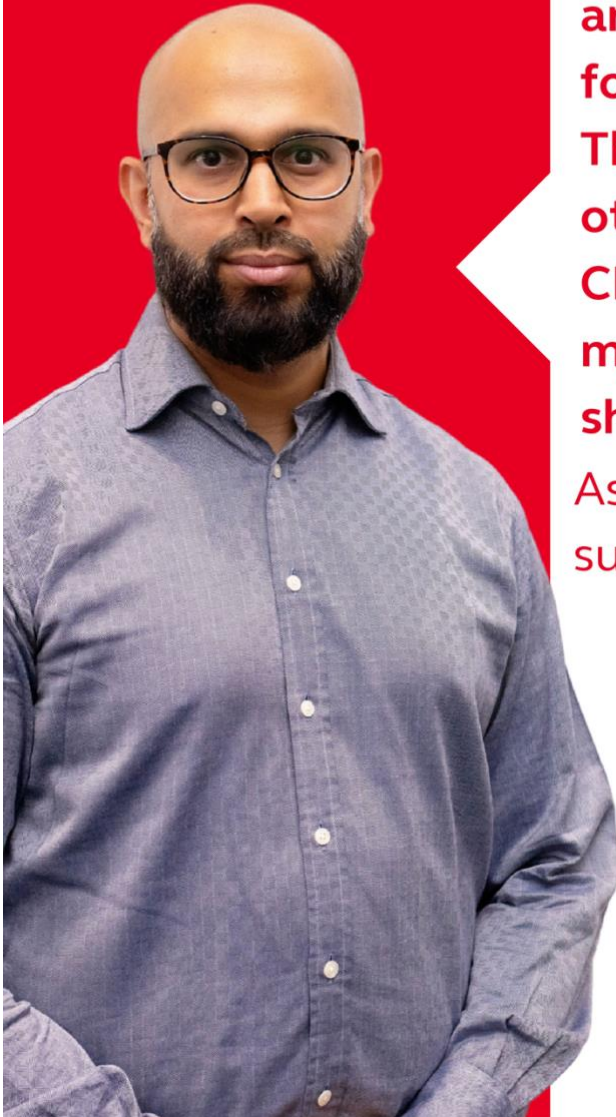
