Bluescene

Good afternoon, ladies and gentlemen, welcome to The SALUS Stadium for this afternoon's Northern Counties East Premier Division game against Thackley. We give a warm welcome to Thackley's players, officials and supporters and hope they have a safe trip home after the game.

This afternoon's visitors, Thackley, currently sit in 3rd place on 7 points after 3 games. Thackley's recent form has seen them go unbeaten in the league so far in 2025/26. Starting with a 1-0 win at home to new boys Wombwell Town then repeated the trick at Rossington Main. And last Saturday, the Dennyboys hosted another newly promoted side, Horbury Town, and played out a goalless stalemate. The only fly in their ointment to date was a 4-0 drubbing at Irlam in the FA Cup Preliminary Round.

The Blues come into today's game in 12th place on 3 points after 2 games. Our first 3 games of the season have seen us win 1 and lose 2. Goals from Luis Afonso Ferreira and Tom Alngohuru gave us all 3 points on opening day as we downed visitors Albion Sports by 2 goals to 1. Since then 2 defeats by the only goal of the game have followed at Brighthouse Town in the FA Cup and at Barton Town in the league last weekend.

Our most recent meeting with Thackley was our league game in December 2024. Played at their Dennyfield ground, The Blues disappointingly lost 3-1. Callum Brook equalised for The Blues just before the

break but 2 goals by the hosts in the last 10 minutes gave them the spoils. Our last meeting here at The Wezzie was in November 2024 for Tom Claisse's first home game in charge of The Azzurri. His charges did him proud, seeing Thackley off 3-0, courtesy of goals from Rob Guilfoyle, Joel Spence and Jack Varley (a penalty). We also met in the FA Cup EP Round in August of last year. Thackley were 2-0 victors but The Blues battled hard and did everything but score.

Expect The Blues to be looking to do their utmost to build on their successful home start to the league season.

In recruitment news, there's already been movement in these early days of the season. Defender Cody Collins and midfielder Sam Tingle have been added to the squad, joining from Bottesford Town and Retford FC respectively. Cody has Frickley in his blood as 2 of his uncles, Simon and Scott have both lined up for The Blues. Also, Luke Williams has moved on to Club Thorne. We wish all 3 the best of luck.

Our next game sees The Blues travel to Bottesford Town on Tuesday 19th August, 7.45pm kickoff. The Blues are next in action here at Westfield Lane on Saturday 23rd August, when we set off on the road to Wembley (part deux!) and Maghull are our visitors, 3pm ko, in the FA Vase First Round Qualifying. We hope to see you all there.

Meet The Visitors 1

Thackley AFC is known as “the club in the woods” because of its idyllic setting in the heart of the Bradford countryside. Thackley is a true community football club because its location and standing put it at the heart of a busy and growing residential community. The area immediately surrounding the ground is used extensively as a leisure and recreational facility that attracts large numbers of our village to use the rural amenities for activities such as dog walking, bird watching, horse riding and rambling.

The club was founded in 1930 by the younger members of Thackley Wesleyan Methodist Church which follows the trend of church affiliation set by Bolton Wanderers, Manchester City and Aston Villa among others. It is rumoured that young men were encouraged, by churches, to take up football and thus refrain from frequenting public houses.

Thackley has a tradition of being administered by residents of the immediate locality. One of the originators of the club in the 1930s was Arthur Hylton who lived all his life less than a mile from the ground. He was assisted by his brother, Leslie, in building up a thriving and successful club that used the village youth for their playing members. All active members of the committee, at this time, lived within walking distance of the ground and this tradition has been maintained to the present day. The ambitious young Chairman, for example, has spent all his life as a Thackley resident and the committee is largely made up of people living and working within a stone’s throw of the club.

Thackley’s nickname “The Dennyboys” refers to the ground Dennyfield which is named after the long serving groundsman George Denny who lived nearby.

The clubhouse is named after Arthur Hylton who was secretary of Thackley during the formative years from the 1940’s until the 1970’s. Arthur’s contribution to the development of Thackley Football Club was greatly influential. Born and raised in Thackley he remained a loyal contributor to the club until his death. Thackley has a history of long serving secretaries.

Stewart Willingham, who has now retired from the post and is now club president, took up his responsibilities in 1973 and was still going strong until 2016, a total of 43 years at the helm of a club at this level. Stewart was able to sustain

this commitment because of the support he received from his better half, June, now sadly, no longer with us. The hospitality suite in the clubhouse is named in honour of Stewart and June, the Willingham Suite. At the beginning of the season Stewart received a long service award from the FA for his invaluable contribution to grass roots football and Thackley in particular. Thackley also has a tradition that provides playing facilities for all members of the community and this season we retain our Ladies’ team which makes an important contribution to football both at the club and in the surrounding area.

Thackley’s development as a thriving football club has been steady and consistent. Progressing from the Bradford Mutual Sunday School League to the County Amateur League by 1939, Thackley has seen a constant rise through the league systems, the West Yorkshire League, the Yorkshire League (in 1967) and the NCEL when it was founded in 1982. Thackley AFC has retained a Premier Division place in every season since (the only club to have done so).

There have been many successes during Thackley’s existence - County Amateur League winners five times, West Riding Challenge Cup 1964 and 1967, West Riding County Cup 1974 and 1975 and the Bradford and District Senior Cup 13 times (a competition record). Recent achievements include reaching the 2010/11 final of the West Riding County Cup but lost in extra time to Guiseley, having twice held the lead, and winning the Toolstation NCEL League Cup in two consecutive years, 2011/12 and 2012/13.

The 2016/17 season saw a record points haul for the Dennyboys of 78 points, and resulted in 5th place finish in the League. This success was short lived, in the 2017/18 and 2018/19 seasons Thackley finished below mid-table in 15th position. 2019/20 was incomplete with Thackley, once again in the lower half of the table when games were suspended.

After half a dozen seasons of finishing between 14th and 16th, Thackley made significant improvement in finishing in 7th position in 2023/24, then went even better in 2024/25 by finishing 5th and reaching the playoffs.

In 2025/26 the team will be looking to further that upward trend and continue to play a large part in the life of their local community.

Liam Wilson (Goalkeeper): Joined in pre-season 2025/26 from Farsley Celtic. A graduate of the development squad with first team appearances as well.

Alfie Gibbon (Defender): Alfie was part of the 2024/25 team and is able to operate all along the back line. Gives 100% every time he plays.

Kam Basi (Defender): Kam joins from Albion Sports where he has a decade of NCEL experience. A strong defender and a real leader.

Adam Pow (Defender): An attacking left back who joins from Harrogate Town. Reads the game well and likes to be an attacking outlet on the left.

Ousimane Sidibe (Defender): A strong defender who reads the game well and joins after experience at Horbury Town and Yorkshire Ams.

Harry Hindle (Defender): An attacking full back who joined in time for the 2025/26 season.

Lewis Morgan (Defender): Son of former Thackley manager, Dave, Lewis returns to provide much needed stability to the back line. A fiercely competitive defender who is equally proficient on the ground and in the air.

Hass Gorji (Forward): Hass joins the club after having previous experience with Albion Sports and Eccleshill United. A real goal threat and a presence up front.

Lucas Alexander (Midfielder): A graduate of the Guiseley AFC academy and able to play as an attacking midfielder. A free kick specialist.

Ebenezer Ameho (Midfielder): A new addition to the Thackley squad for the 2025/26 season

Ed Fitch (Forward): A young and direct winger with a big future in the game. Experience at Halifax Town and Farsley Celtic.

Adrian Mangubalan (Defender/Midfielder): Can operate in a variety of roles.

Declan Parker (Midfielder/Defender): Declan is capable of giving impetus to the attack, and is also the first line of defence. Declan's previous clubs include Bridlington, Hemsworth MW and Handsworth. Rejoins after a season away.

Paul Walker (Midfielder): Well known in non-league football in the area. Has appeared for Emley, Garforth Town and Bradford Park Avenue. Signing Wakka was a coup for Thackley.

Josh Owen (Forward): A young player from the Bradford PA scholarship programme. Has an eye for goal and is one to watch in the future.

Owen Murphy (Forward): Murph rejoins the Dennyboys after a spell away. Previously with Chesterfield and the FBT Academy. Owen is most effective when in a more attacking role, creating scoring opportunities for his colleagues.

Yianni Abbas (Midfielder): A young player who joins from Bradford Park Avenue scholarship programme and can operate either as a wide attacking midfielder or a number 10.

Philip Conteh (Defender/Midfielder): A powerful player who joined from Goole, and can operate in defence or midfield.

Nathan Hunt (Midfielder): Nathan rejoins Thackley after originally joining at the start of 2024/25. Can operate in an attacking or a deeper role. Another who has an eye for goal.

Keanan Mannings (Midfielder): Joined from Frickley Athletic where he made over 50 NCEL appearances.

Tom Parkinson (Midfielder): A tricky winger who despite his young age has plenty of experience at Gainsborough Trinity, Selby, Goole and Winterton Rangers.

Alex Washington (Midfielder): Alex joins from Maltby Main. With over 100 NCEL games under his belt, he can tackle, pass and drive the team on.

Alex Charlesworth (Defender): Alex joins from Tadcaster. A versatile defender who can play anywhere along the back line.

Josh Prior (Goalkeeper): Josh joins from Harrogate Town and provides further competition in the goalkeeping area.

Jack McClarin (Midfielder): Jack joins from Harrogate Town. A central midfielder who can also operate in defence.

Lucas Alexander (Midfielder): Signed on dual registration with Guiseley, Lucas is an attacking midfielder with real promise.

Luke Brooks (Midfielder): Luke joins from Halifax Town. A player with bags of potential.

Tabish Hussain (Forward): An experienced and skilful player who counts Albion Sports and Eccleshill United amongst his former teams.

Jamie Price (Manager): Joined Thackley in pre-season 2025/26. A former professional footballer with 75 EFL appearances and over 800 non-league appearances. Has extensive coaching experience at Emley and Selby.

Josh Walsh (Assistant Manager): A young coach with previous experience as assistant manager at Tadcaster Albion and various other non-league clubs in Yorkshire. Known for his ability to spot promising young players.

Alan Jackson (Physio): A former Premier League physio with vast experience of both the professional game and non-league. Jacko rejoins the Dennyboys for his second spell.

Ryan Monk (Student Physio): Ryan joined Thackley during the 2024/25 season and has been a real asset to the club.





Frickley's History

Frickley Athletic FC is based in the former coal mining village of South Elmsall. Recent research has shown that the first South Elmsall football team was formed in 1905 but was superseded in 1908 by the newly formed Frickley Colliery Athletic Club and joined the South Yorkshire league which comprised of works, church and village teams. In 1910, the football club moved to the Sheffield Association League and first played in the FA Cup.

The club remained in the Sheffield Association League (except for the war years) until 1922, finishing runners up in 1911/12, and winners in 1920/21, our only ever league title.

In 1922/23 Frickley joined the Yorkshire league and after finishing runners up in 1923/24, the club were elected into the Midland League. Although the club had to apply for re election several times pre war (and didn't play in any league in 1933/34) it was kept going by the support of the mineworkers and the sale of players.

1936/37 was Frickley's worst ever league season when the club finished bottom with only 8 points, but amazingly reached the FA Cup 1st round proper for the first time.

Post war, Frickley remained in the Midland league gaining its best finish, 7th, in 1945/46, but left the league on its break up at the end of 1959/60.

From 1960/61 to 1969/70, Frickley Colliery played in the Cheshire County League. However, financial considerations led the club to join the Midland Counties League for 1970/71. They finished runners up in 1972/73, and were eventually elected into the NPL for the 1976/77 season as Frickley Athletic.

After finishing 3rd in 1979/80, the club was promoted into the Alliance Premier League, now the National League. Here they remained for 7 years, the most successful in the club's history, and in 1985/86 reached the FA Cup 3rd round proper, after beating a Football League club, Hartlepool Utd, only to lose 3-1 at home to Rotherham Utd. The club also finished as Gola League runners up. The following season saw a reversal as we were relegated back to the NPL. From 1987/88 to 1991/92 the club consistently finished around mid-table in the NPL, but did manage to reach the league cup final in 1991/92, losing 1-0 to Marine at Maine Road.

The next few seasons saw Frickley finish in the lower reaches of the table. Then, in 2005/06 The

Blues had their best league season for 20 years, finishing 2nd to Blyth Spartans. Unfortunately, the Blues lost on penalties in the playoff semi.

In the following seasons Frickley returned to the lower half of the table, but 2015/16 saw the club have a great season to finish 7th.

This was not repeated in 2016/17 as most of the players who had brought this success were attracted to join more affluent clubs. The club were relegated from the NPL Premier Division after being members for 30 years.

2017/18 saw the club enter the NPL Division 1 South, finishing 3rd in the league, scoring a record 117 goals. Additionally, Jacob Hazel broke the club record for individual goals in a season with 47 strikes. The season ended disappointingly with playoff semi final defeat at the hands of Stamford.

2018/19, in the new NPL East Division, was less successful, seeing managerial changes and a 12th place finish. However, the season had its highlights, with victory at highflying Morpeth and a 10-1 win over Liversedge in the FA Cup.

More change followed prior to the start of 2019/20. A further league reorganisation which put the Blues into the NPL South East Division was accompanied by a new manager. An inauspicious start led to the appointment of Dave Frecklington in September 2019.

Frecks rapidly turned the side's fortunes around, before lockdown ended the season. 2020/21 ultimately suffered the same fate.

Frecks built what looked like strong squad for the 2021/22 season, able to compete for promotion from the newly formed NPL East Division.

However, things didn't pan out the way that was hoped. Key departures led to a run of form that saw the club relegated to the Northern Counties East League for the first time in our history.

In the summer of 2022, former Blue, Wayne Benn, was appointed as manager, with ex-Frickley goal scoring legend Andy Hayward as his assistant. There were occasional highs but Benn resigned in early 2023 so Patrick McGuire came in to avoid a second successive relegation.

2023/24 started well, and included an 8-0 win at Goole, but ended with the release of McGuire. James Baxendale was in the hot seat for the start of 2024/25 but left in October.

Tom Claisse took the reins in November 2024 and successfully avoided

relegation. Tom and his team will be looking to bring back winning ways to Westfield Lane in 25/26.

The first match was a Preliminary round tie against Runcorn Town, played on Saturday 19th August 2017. FRICKLEY ATHLETIC won through to the first qualifying round of the Emirates FA Cup when they survived a late comeback by opponents Runcorn Town to come out on top at Westfield Lane last Saturday.

Goals by Jacob Hazel and Teddy Bloor, with his first for the club, earned a 2-1 victory in a preliminary round tie and the Blues will now face Buxton away in the next round on Saturday, September 2.

Frickley went into their first FA Cup tie under manager Spencer Fearn off the back of a win and a defeat in their first week of competitive football and started well with Hazel almost scoring with a lob over the visitors' keeper that went just over the bar as well after he was set up by Steve Hopewell's header.

Hopewell hit a shot over after the ball fell to him on the edge of the box while Hazel fired over after making space for himself in the area.

Runcorn were handed a great chance to take the lead when Jameel Ible brought down visitors' striker Mark Reed and a penalty was awarded. But Craig Cairns saw his well driven spot-kick saved by Sebastian Malkowski's outstretched feet.

At the other end Hazel burst through, but was denied by a good save from Andy Metcalfe as the keeper narrowed the angle well. From the rebound the Blues striker was left holding his head as he miskicked with the goal gaping.

Metcalfe made another good save to deny Ben Wiles as he blocked at close

range. Richard Patterson did have the ball in the net only to be given offside and it remained goalless to half-time.

In the second half Cairns missed a decent chance for Runcorn before the Blues went ahead as substitute Rhys Davies played the ball inside and Hazel came up with a superb finish, sending the ball into the top corner from 20 yards out.

Tom Dugdale then played a one-two with Hazel and his shot brought another good save from Metcalfe.

A second goal came on 67 minutes as substitute Bloor was left unmarked at the far post and shot home.

Malkowski saved from Reed as Runcorn looked to hit back, but he was finally beaten in the 87th minute when Sebastian Julien hit an unstoppable strike from the edge of the box.

With four minutes of injury-time to play Frickley had to defend, but held on to seal the victory.

Manager Fearn said: "Runcorn are a very good team so we knew it was going to be tough. But I'm delighted with the lads and their application in difficult conditions. They've worked their socks off.

"There were a lot of good performances.

"The FA Cup is great and if we can have a bit of a run it would be fantastic."

Frickley now return to the Evo-Stik First Division South with two games over the bank holiday weekend. They are away to Alvechurch this Saturday (kick-off 3pm) and back at home on Monday when hosting Chasetown (3pm).

ENCOURAGING DISPLAY BY FRICKLEY

FINANCIAL difficulties have compelled Frickley Colliery to field their cheapest team ever in the Cheshire County League, but it gave an encouraging display in beating Witton Albion 3—0, at South Elmsall on Saturday, to register the first win in an opening match for four years.

Four young new players were included, and two others, wing halves Williams, from Doncaster Rovers, and Grierson (Mexborough Town), gave outstanding displays. Inside-right Lawrence, from Wombwell, and 17-year-old left winger Schofield, from Monckton Colliery, also made promising debuts.

Full-backs Haughton and Jones kept a tight grip on the Witton forwards, who were rarely dangerous.

The Frickley forwards made good use of their chances, and inside-left HEATH showed opportunism in scoring twice.

His first goal, after eight minutes, was with a 25 yards' drive which appeared to catch the Witton goalkeeper unaware, and his second came after 74 minutes.

Long service right winger WILKINSON also scored after 59 minutes.

Match Reports

Frickley 2 Albion Sports 1

The 2025/26 season kicked off in style as The Azzurri put in a confident display to claim a deserved 2-1 win over Albion Sports, despite a raft of absences stretching the squad. The afternoon started with a very moving minute's applause to commemorate the sad passing of Tracy Clarkson, friend to the club and, mum of our secretary Joel and wife to Ian. RIP Tracy. To the game, the opening stages saw The Blues settle quickly, with Robbo going close in the 7th minute, sending a 25 yard effort just wide. A minute later, a nervous moment at the back saw Butch fouled to concede possession, but Sykes was alert to collect Albion's half chance. The breakthrough came in the 12th minute as relentless pressure paid off when Luis AF charged down a defender's clearance, the ball rolling into the net to make it 1-0. Albion thought they had levelled 7 minutes later, but their effort was chalked off for offside. Gagen caused real problems down the flank, twice getting in behind the defence. First time, wrongly flagged offside after a superb run, and again with a dangerous cross that just missed its intended target. At the other end, Jenkinson, Katsere, and Kilner stood firm, keeping the Albion front line at bay. Albion had a couple of sniffs before the break, a flicked header wide and a wild shot over the bar, but Sykes capped off the half with a composed claim in added time, sending The Boys in Blue into the interval with their noses in front. HT 1-0. The second half saw more of the same, calm handling from Sykes early on and another big chance when Butch found Tom A, only for the keeper to smother the ball at his feet. Albion pushed, but Sykes was equal to a low drive in the 58th minute. Just past the hour mark, Tom A lit up proceedings with a sensational solo run, weaving through defenders before finishing coolly to double the lead, celebrating with a Hugo Sanchez somersault (Google him, kids!). Robbo then set up Willo for a blocked shot, and Luis nearly added another after a tough (illegal!) challenge on Gagen, but the ref waved play on. Destiny, introduced from the bench, got into good positions late on but was twice denied, first by the keeper, then by the outside of the post deep into

stoppage time.

In between Destiny's chances, Albion pulled one back in the 86th minute through a Cartman header. Despite their desperate late efforts, it was too little too late from the visitors. FT 2-1. Brighouse Town 1 Frickley 0 (FA Cup)

The Azzurri's FA Cup campaign came to an early end with a narrow 1-0 defeat away at Brighouse Town, despite a battling performance, especially after the break, and a flurry of late chances. Sporting our new grey away strip for the first time, the Frickley lads made it clear early on that we weren't getting rolled over without a fight. After Sheard's low drive skidded wide of the post on 10 minutes, the home side responded with attacking intent of their own. Everywhere We Go

Brighouse

Croydon Council might've barely finished clearing the ticker tape from Crystal Palace's open top bus parade for winning the FA Cup, their first, in May, but The Azzurri were on the road to Wembley at Brighouse Town in the Extra Preliminary Round. We hadn't been to Brighouse for a few seasons, since our relegation from the NPL, although they tried their best to renew hostilities by getting relegated at the end of last season, only to get a reprieve. So a cup tie will have to do.

Brighouse's ground at St Giles Road carries the catchy sponsors name of the Heffernan Utilities Stadium, and sits quietly behind wasteland and the rows of houses, with only its floody pylons giving away its position. It's not a terribly old ground as the club only moved there in the 1980s when their previous ground was redeveloped for housing.

St Giles Road is small and straightforward, with covered seating in a main stand which runs along one side of the pitch and covers a little over half its length, sheltered under a corrugated roof to echo the cheers/groans (bottom pic). The rest of the ground is open hard standing and low terracing, giving us the choice of moving freely to follow the action, as is the norm at our level.

Behind one goal sits a little clubhouse, where many shuffle around the perimeter to at half time to pick up a cup of tea, a pie, or a slice of non-league nostalgia.

While the facilities are basic, there's the will to improve, with new floodlights on the way (like ourselves). It's not a ground of grandeur, but rather one of ramshackle charm, a no frills venue where you can hear every shout and catcall. It can be a bit bleak and windswept in the cold and rain of autumn and winter but on this occasion it was comfortably shirtsleeves weather. Very welcome it was too.

To the game. We haven't beaten higher division opposition in the FA Cup since 2011 when we

saw off Harrogate Town after a replay in the 2nd qualifying round. Well, our wait for another FA Cup 'giant' killing goes on. A soft Brighouse goal, scored seconds after the restart, belies our steely resolve for much of the game, but was ultimately the only goal of the game.

I write most years that Barry Fry basically said "I hate cup football" -

profanity removed. I still see no reason to disagree with a footballing philosopher of Barry's great stature.

No matter. The game ended with the most of the noise coming from the travelling Blue Faithful, clapping the lads off the pitch. We're part of something small but stubbornly proud, regardless of the result.



Linked to The Lane

I'm an incorrigible collector of old A&BC, Panini, Merlin, Topps, etc. football cards and stickers, and it struck me how many of the players pictured had links to Frickley Athletic. They might have played for or against us at some point, or are related to one of The Azzurri past or present. Or the connection might be even more tenuous! But you can be sure it was the highlight of their career ;)

This week it's someone who was a visiting manager to The Wezzie several times in the 1950s with Peterborough United in the old Midland League, a thorn in Frickley sides as they won the league several times before they were elected to the EFL in 1960. And he played for Bradford City, amongst others, one of Thackley's local pro clubs.

Born just up the road in Campsall in 1914, George Hedley Swindin began his footballing journey in non-league, playing for clubs such as Rotherham YMCA and New Stubbin Colliery, before catching the attention of the scouts. His big break came in 1934 when he joined Bradford City, quickly establishing himself as a goalkeeper of promise in the Second Division.

In 1936, his form earned him a move to Arsenal, the dominant side of the the 1930s in English football. Despite initial competition for the number 1 shirt, Swindin soon became Arsenal's first choice keeper, praised for his bravery, athleticism, and positional awareness, attributes that set him apart in an era when keepers often faced brutal physical challenges.

He played a key role in Arsenal's successful 1937/38 league campaign, helping the club secure the First Division title, appearing in 18 league matches.

World War II interrupted Swindin's career, as it did for many players of his generation. He served in the military and played in wartime matches for Arsenal and as a guest for several other clubs.

When the Football League resumed in 1946, Swindin returned to Arsenal's goal during a crucial rebuilding period.

Post war, Swindin played nearly every match as Arsenal once again won the First Division title in 1947/48 as he and his defence allowed the fewest goals in the league.

Swindin added another major honour in 1950, winning the FA Cup with Arsenal after a 2-0 victory over Liverpool at Wembley.

He played his final game for Arsenal in 1953, the year the club won yet another Championship.

Although by then the starting role had gone to Jack Kelsey. In total, he made 297 official appearances for Arsenal, a figure that would have been significantly higher had wartime matches counted toward his numbers.

Surprisingly, considering his club form and success, Swindin was never capped by the England senior team. Their loss.

After retiring as a player, Swindin moved into management with Peterborough United in 1954. He enjoyed remarkable success there, guiding the club to 3 consecutive Midland League titles.

In 1958, Arsenal turned to their former player and appointed Swindin as manager. However, Arsenal did finish third in the First Division in his first season but failed to win any major trophies in his time at the helm, and he was replaced in 1962 by Billy Wright. Swindin later managed Norwich City, Cardiff City, Kettering Town and Corby Town, and had a

brief stint in Cyprus. He eventually retired from football altogether, passing away in 2005 at the age of 90.



Sam Cable (Forward): The Power is a handful of an attacker. Since starting out in our U19s over a decade ago, he is now in his 3rd spell with the club after spells at Barton Town, Garforth and others.

Will Jenkinson (Defender): Jenko is a footballing defender who joins us from Parkgate, having started out at Rotherham United.

Takunda Katsere (Defender): The Thunder is a big, strong defender with loads of potential. Has previous NCEL experience at Goole, Selby Town, Athersley Rec and Wombwell Town.

Sam Kilner (Defender): A NCEL title winner at Silsden last season, Killer is a highly proficient fullback who has also been at Buxton, Mossley, Hemsworth and Knaresborough.

Ifeanyi Nnenanua (Forward): Goes by the name of Destiny, he's a committed young striker who is always in the thick of it. He's been at the i2i academy and has previously played for Pickering Town.

Martyn Woolford (Midfielder/Forward): The Woolfman started at The Wezzie in 2005. He is a very classy attacking midfielder who has been in the EFL with the likes of York, Scunthorpe and Blades since then but back home now for a 3rd spell.

Thomas Radley (Defender): A long time target, Radz is a big centre half who was skipper at Shelley last season so brings quality and leadership into our back line.

Lucas Robinson (Midfielder/Forward): A rangy winger with an eye for goal, Cool Hand Lucas comes to us from Harrogate Railway but has been at Goole and Barton too.

Willey Woodham (Midfielder): Win-win is a top midfielder making the step up from our U23s side.

Tyler Sheard (Defender/Midfield/Forward): VersaTyler is another who can do a job anywhere on the park, team before self every time. And he's another of our U23s stepping up for 1st team duties.

Alfie Studd (Defender/Midfielder): The Studd Wall is a confident performer who has come right through our academy system. He's a local lad - his dad once lived 2 doors down from our head of media!

Tom Cotson (Defender/Midfielder): Top Cat is also hot off our U23s production line. Wherever he plays, his composure belies his years.

Harley Wilson (Midfielder): Hells Angel is a midfielder who knows his way round at this level with time served at Rossington Main, Penistone Church, Wombwell Town and Dinnington Town.

Sam Tingle (Midfielder): The Sting is a smart and energetic midfielder who joins from Retford FC but also has experience at Hemsworth MW, Ponte Colls and Ossett Utd, where he played with Tom Claisse.

Cody Collins (Defender): The Force is a defender with pedigree, his dad was a pro and 2 uncles played for the club. Comes to us from Bottesford after time at Mansfield Town, Gainsborough and Rossington.

Harold Edjangue (Goalkeeper): The Mantis is a talented keeper from Yorkshire Amateurs.

Lewis Binns (Defender/Midfielder/Coach): Binno is a rock of a defender/midfielder. This local lad has played for a number of clubs, including South Kirkby and Armthorpe. Already a Frickley legend, the Supporters' Player of the Season in 22/23 is back from injury, and is part of the coaching team too.

Lee Crooks (Defender/Midfielder/Asst Manager): When Crooksy came on as sub in the final game of 24/25, he became one of the oldest players ever to appear for The Blues. Having played many times in the EFL for Man City, Barnsley, Bradford City and Rochdale, the muscle memory is second to none.

Tom Claisse (Defender/Midfielder/Manager): Claisse Act was appointed manager in November 2024. He started out at Leeds United then Bradford City. Since then he's been at a host clubs in the NPL and NCEL (winning it 4 times), most recently at Hallam, and has played for the RAF and Armed Forces. He was coach at Emley and joint manager at Ossett. And he carried the FA Cup to the Royal Box in 2018!


2006 - Steve McClaren took charge of his first match as England manager, dropping David Beckham for the friendly against European champions Greece at Old Trafford which England won 4-0.

Fixtures & Fittings

Every year, the release of the Premier League fixture list sparks excitement among fans eager to see when their teams will face each opponent. Ever wondered how they come up with the fixture list? Well, wonder no more....

Behind the scenes, the creation of this 380 match schedule is the result of a meticulous, months-long process involving the coordination of 2,036 games across the top 4 divisions of English football.

The responsibility for compiling the fixtures falls to Glenn Thompson of Atos, an international IT services company. His work begins early in the year, once the Premier League provides the playing dates. The process starts by mapping out the immovable elements: FIFA's international breaks, the European club competitions, now more complex under expanded formats, and the dates reserved by the Football Association for its tournaments. What remains are the available slots for league and League Cup fixtures.

Consultation also plays a role. Fan representatives from the Football Supporters' Federation and other stakeholders offer input. Around March, clubs receive a form from the Premier League to note any dates they would prefer not to play at home, often decided in collaboration with local police, and to specify whether they wish to avoid certain Boxing Day matchups.

After the Football League play-offs conclude and the composition of each division is finalised, Thompson and his team place each club into a "pairing grid," which determines their home and away sequences. The fixture computer then uses this grid to randomly generate matchups for each date, within strict rules: no team will play more than two consecutive home or away games; the season will never begin or end with two home or two away matches; and, wherever possible, home and away games will alternate around FA Cup ties. Special care is taken during the Christmas period so that clubs alternate home and away fixtures between Boxing Day and New Year's Day.

Travel logistics are another factor. To avoid congestion on rail and road networks, the scheduling team works to prevent multiple clubs from the same region travelling along the same routes on the same day. Boxing Day and New Year's Day fixtures are also chosen to minimise long journeys for supporters. In cities with multiple clubs, such as Liverpool and Everton in Merseyside, or the numerous teams across London, home matches are carefully staggered to avoid clashes.

Previous seasons can influence the new schedule. If a club faced a particularly unfavourable run of fixtures one year, efforts are made to avoid repeating that pattern the next. Yet even with all this planning, issues can arise that require the fixture list to be reworked entirely. Once the computer generates a draft, representatives from the Premier League, the Football League, and Atos spend days reviewing every date, checking that all requests and

constraints have been met. The software can quickly propose alternative dates for problematic fixtures, though a single change can sometimes trigger dozens of knock-on adjustments.


For Thompson, the task is a constant balancing act.

"You can't satisfy everyone," he admits. The aim is fairness, ensuring no club is favoured, and that all 2,036 matches can be

played as scheduled over the 9 month season. In the end, the fixture list that excites millions of fans is the product of careful planning, intricate rules, and countless compromises.

Then Sky Sports and the other TV companies get involved so that the likes of West Ham have to go to Everton on a Monday night. It's not easy. But that's just the Premier League. As mentioned, there's another 72 EFL clubs, and don't forget the 72 National League clubs and countless others in the pyramid and beyond. Alan Turing would have his work cut out.

We've seen fixture changes aplenty in the Frickley schedule already this season and it's barely the middle of August. Heaven forbid that the Frickley Massive and Worksop Homies end up crossing paths to or from a game in Sheffield or Leeds on a Tuesday night. Carnage... ;)

Bottesford Facts: Bottesford was historically a village, south of Scunthorpe, that now forms an urban area of Scunthorpe. Bottesford was mentioned in the Domesday Book as "Budlesford".
