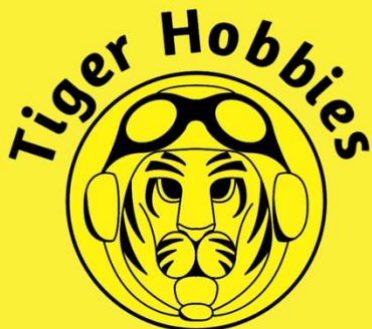

Bluescene

Good evening, ladies and gentlemen, welcome to The SALUS Stadium for this evening's Northern Counties East Premier Division game against Knaresborough Town. We give a warm welcome to Knaresborough's players, officials and supporters and hope they have a safe trip home after the game.

This evening's visitors, Knaresborough, currently sit in 7th place on 11 points after 7 games. Knaresborough's recent form has had a bit of everything. A 2-2 home draw with Bottesford Town preceded a 2-1 defeat at Tadcaster Albion. They bounced back with a 4-2 victory at home to Penistone Church. Then, at the weekend, Knaresborough travelled to Liversedge but returned empty handed, losing 3-1.

The Blues come into today's game neck and neck with Knaresborough, also on 11 points but after 8 games, leaving us in 8th place on goal difference. Since our 1-0 win against Thackley, here at The Wezzie, courtesy of Luis Afonso Ferreira's goal of the season contender, The Blues lost 2 on the trot in the league, 1-0 at Bottesford and 3-0 at home to league leaders Tadcaster Albion. But like all rollercoaster rides, this has been followed by an upturn. We saw a resounding response, winning 2-0 at Penistone Church with a dominant

performance and goals from Destiny Ifeanyi Nnenanua and Luis, then a pair of draws, a gritty 0-0 against highflying Liversedge and, on Saturday, a pulsating 2-2 draw at Parkgate. The latter game saw The Azzurri 2-0 down but a Martyn Woolford penalty and a Tom Alngohuru worldy earned us a point in a game where we were in the ascendancy for most of the 90 minutes.

Our most recent meeting with Knaresborough Town was our league game in March of this year. Played at their Manse Lane ground, The Blues disappointingly lost 3-0. Enough said. Our last meeting here at The Wezzie was in October 2024 when goals from Jack Cawthorn, Jack Varley (a penalty) and Marcel Chipamaunga eased The Azzurri to a decent 3-1 win.

Expect The Blues to be looking to continue their unbeaten run and to take all 3 points.

Our next game sees The Blues in action here at Westfield Lane again, on Saturday 13th September, when Golcar United are our visitors, 3pm ko. We hope to see you all there.

Enjoy the game and as always we thank you for your continued support throughout this season.

Meet The Visitors 1

The club was almost certainly formed as "Trinity" in 1898. The name change to "Knaresborough Association Football Club" took place in 1900 and, apart from the two World War periods, a club has existed in the town.

Much of its early football was played in the York & District League before joining the Northern League in 1909. After only two seasons, escalating costs forced a move back to the York League and Harrogate League through the 1920s and 1930s. At the outbreak of World War Two, the club, like many at the time, folded temporarily, and it was as Knaresborough Rovers that they reformed in 1946. The Harrogate League was the first competition played until the early 1950s when the York League was joined once more.

The club again reverted to the Harrogate League when they set up a Premier Division and that title was won three years in succession from 1965 to 1967. After two more runners-up seasons, the club entered the West Yorkshire League for six further years which saw a title in Division Two before promotion from Division One for two seasons in the Premier Division before another return to the Harrogate League. From 1976 to 1993, the club continued in the Harrogate League but ambitions were high and the West Yorkshire League was re-joined in 1993. The League Cup was won in the first season, but the league title had to wait until 2009.

In 2010, the club won the West Riding County FA Challenge Cup final for the first and only time and then made the decision to invest in ground developments to upgrade to Step Six standards, and were elected to the Northern Counties East League in 2012.

The club built steadily, the early highlight being the triumph in the League Cup in

2014 when Eccleshill United were defeated at Bradford City's Valley Parade ground.

2017/18 saw progression for the club when they reached the 2nd round of the FA Vase for the first time and went on to take the NCEL Division One title. 2018/19 saw the club's best FA Cup run as they reached the Second Qualifying round only to bow out to Workington.

In their first season in the NCEL Premier Division in 2019/20, the club achieved a very respectable 9th position.

Then covid resulted in 2 abandoned seasons before the club finished 17th in the 2021/22 season, narrowly avoiding relegation.

A 10th place finish in 2022/23 was a significant improvement. But in 2024, the team went even higher, achieving its highest place to date, finishing 8th in the NCEL Premier Division.

The current management team of Simon Parkes and Colin Heath oversaw a lower but still creditable 12th place finish in 2024/25.

They and their squad will be hoping to be competitive and cement another position in the top half of the table in 2025/26.

In addition, there continues to be further development of Manse Lane as the club look to consolidate its place at this level in the non-league pyramid.





Meet The Visitors 2

Ed Hall (Goalkeeper): Experienced custodian who has represented many local teams including Stocksbridge Park Steels, Farsley Celtic, Sheffield, Bradford Park Avenue and Silsden before joining Knaresborough during the summer.

Amar Mohsen (Goalkeeper): Swedish stopper in his third year at i2i college in York and has played at Pickering Town and Retford prior to joining Town during the summer.

Josh Hardcastle (Defender): Right back Josh joined this summer following his time at Harrogate Railway, Tadcaster Albion and Parkgate.

Jack Powis (Defender): Formerly at Harrogate Town, Jack joined Knaresborough back in late 2015 and made his first team debut the following September at Brigg Town.

James Beaston (Defender): Experienced defender, James, joined in summer 2023 from Tadcaster Albion having had spells at Sherburn White Rose, Glasshoughton Welfare, Nostell Miners', Garforth Town and Yorkshire Amateur.

Will Lenehan (Defender): Will first joined the club in 2013 and was a mainstay for the next eight years, before work took him to Manchester and away from the game. Returned in October 2024.

Dan Thirkell (Defender): Holds the record for most appearances at Harrogate Railway over two spells, but re-joined Knaresborough in the summer after two seasons at Tadcaster Albion. Originally joined us after a brief spell at Scarborough in 2017, helping the club to Division One success that season.

Sam Cook (Defender): Sam played for Harrogate Railway through the junior ranks before breaking into the senior side. Joined Knaresborough but briefly went to Thackley before a return in early 2016.

Dan McDaid (Defender): Played at Manse Lane as a junior, and broke through to senior level in 2011, before leaving in 2017 for Railway and then Tadcaster, from where he re-joined the club in 2024.

Luke Stewart (Forward): Luke is now in his second spell having joined from Harrogate Railway in 2018. Transferred to Penistone Church before returning to Railway and then back to Manse Lane in 2024.

Sam Leverett (Midfielder): Sam was a junior with Leeds United then joined Swansea City, where he spent 2 years, captaining their U23s, before spells at both Farsley Celtic and Bridlington Town.

Jack Lazenby (Midfielder): Jack joined in summer 2024, following in the footsteps of his dad, Ben, who helped the club to the West Yorkshire League title in 2009. Formerly a junior at Leeds United, Middlesbrough and Bradford City before representing Guiseley, Garforth Town, Harrogate Railway and Pontefract Collieries.

Theo Hudson (Midfielder): A local lad, Theo was a junior at Leeds United before injuries struck. He had short spells at Guiseley, Liversedge and Marske United before turning to Knaresborough in 2024.

Slater Barnes (Midfielder): Another summer recruit, he has had spells at Golcar United, Wakefield and Thackley before crossing to Knaresborough.

Cole Carter (Forward): Cole joins the club having had spells in the NCEL at Glasshoughton Welfare, Yorkshire Amateur and Harrogate Railway.

Max Barnard (Midfielder): Young midfielder who has been with the reserves since 2022 having previously played for Knaresborough Celtic.

Joel Barker (Midfielder): Joined the club in early 2025 after spells with Harrogate Railway and Ilkley. Was a junior at both Pannal Ash and Pannal Sports.

Jack Dyche (Forward): Jack spent five seasons at Scunthorpe United in non-League days before spells at Guiseley, Hyde United, Curzon Ashton and Liversedge. Has contributed several important goals in the past couple of seasons.

Brad Walker (Forward): Brad has been a part of the Manse Lane set up for many years having played at Harrogate Railway all through the junior ranks before spending 3 years in the Harrogate Town academy.

Aaron White (Forward): After a season with the reserves, Aaron stepped up 2 seasons ago before becoming a regular contributor last season.

Ezio De Santis (Forward): Winger Ezio joined Knaresborough last season from Harrogate Railway. Previously played at Brighouse and Barnoldswick.

Ben Gelder (Forward): Ben joined in the summer having played at Hemsworth Miners' Welfare, Goole, Wakefield, Frickley Athletic and Doncaster City.

Simon Parkes (Manager): Played at Harrogate Railway before switching to Manse Lane in 2016 where he became a regular member until injuries brought an end to his playing career. After acting as assistant manager from the start of 2021/22, he took over the reins for the last few games of that season.

Colin Heath (Forward/Coach): Colin joined in 2011. Formerly a junior at Leeds United and Manchester United, he spent time on loan at Royal Antwerp, Swindon Town and Cambridge United. After being released by the Reds, Colin played for Chesterfield and Macclesfield before moving to Farsley Celtic. Hit his 100th goal for the club in early 2018.

Loz Hunter (Coach): Loz returned to Manse Lane last season after a short playing spell in 2018. Spent his playing career around the area, most notably with Harrogate Railway and Thackley.

Sammy Lambert (Head of Medical): Sammy joined the club during the summer after spells with Harrogate Railway and Tadcaster Albion.





Frickley's History

Frickley Athletic FC is based in the former coal mining village of South Elmsall. Recent research has shown that the first South Elmsall football team was formed in 1905 but was superseded in 1908 by the newly formed Frickley Colliery Athletic Club and joined the South Yorkshire league which comprised of works, church and village teams. In 1910, the football club moved to the Sheffield Association League and first played in the FA Cup.

The club remained in the Sheffield Association League (except for the war years) until 1922, finishing runners up in 1911/12, and winners in 1920/21, our only ever league title.

In 1922/23 Frickley joined the Yorkshire league and after finishing runners up in 1923/24, the club were elected into the Midland League. Although the club had to apply for re election several times pre war (and didn't play in any league in 1933/34) it was kept going by the support of the mineworkers and the sale of players.

1936/37 was Frickley's worst ever league season when the club finished bottom with only 8 points, but amazingly reached the FA Cup 1st round proper for the first time.

Post war, Frickley remained in the Midland league gaining its best finish, 7th, in 1945/46, but left the league on its break up at the end of 1959/60.

From 1960/61 to 1969/70, Frickley Colliery played in the Cheshire County League. However, financial considerations led the club to join the Midland Counties League for 1970/71. They finished runners up in 1972/73, and were eventually elected into the NPL for the 1976/77 season as Frickley Athletic.

After finishing 3rd in 1979/80, the club was promoted into the Alliance Premier League, now the National League. Here they remained for 7 years, the most successful in the club's history, and in 1985/86 reached the FA Cup 3rd round proper, after beating a Football League club, Hartlepool Utd, only to lose 3-1 at home to Rotherham Utd. The club also finished as Gola League runners up. The following season saw a reversal as we were relegated back to the NPL. From 1987/88 to 1991/92 the club consistently finished around mid-table in the NPL, but did manage to reach the league cup final in 1991/92, losing 1-0 to Marine at Maine Road.

The next few seasons saw Frickley finish in the lower reaches of the table. Then, in 2005/06 The

Blues had their best league season for 20 years, finishing 2nd to Blyth Spartans. Unfortunately, the Blues lost on penalties in the playoff semi.

In the following seasons Frickley returned to the lower half of the table, but 2015/16 saw the club have a great season to finish 7th.

This was not repeated in 2016/17 as most of the players who had brought this success were attracted to join more affluent clubs. The club were relegated from the NPL Premier Division after being members for 30 years.

2017/18 saw the club enter the NPL Division 1 South, finishing 3rd in the league, scoring a record 117 goals. Additionally, Jacob Hazel broke the club record for individual goals in a season with 47 strikes. The season ended disappointingly with playoff semi final defeat at the hands of Stamford.

2018/19, in the new NPL East Division, was less successful, seeing managerial changes and a 12th place finish. However, the season had its highlights, with victory at highflying Morpeth and a 10-1 win over Liversedge in the FA Cup.

More change followed prior to the start of 2019/20. A further league reorganisation which put the Blues into the NPL South East Division was accompanied by a new manager. An inauspicious start led to the appointment of Dave Frecklington in September 2019.

Frecks rapidly turned the side's fortunes around, before lockdown ended the season. 2020/21 ultimately suffered the same fate.

Frecks built what looked like strong squad for the 2021/22 season, able to compete for promotion from the newly formed NPL East Division.

However, things didn't pan out the way that was hoped. Key departures led to a run of form that saw the club relegated to the Northern Counties East League for the first time in our history.

In the summer of 2022, former Blue, Wayne Benn, was appointed as manager, with ex-Frickley goal scoring legend Andy Hayward as his assistant. There were occasional highs but Benn resigned in early 2023 so Patrick McGuire came in to avoid a second successive relegation.

2023/24 started well, and included an 8-0 win at Goole, but ended with the release of McGuire. James Baxendale was in the hot seat for the start of 2024/25 but left in October.

Tom Claisse took the reins in November 2024 and successfully avoided

relegation. Tom and his team will be looking to bring back winning ways to Westfield Lane in 25/26.





Memory Match

As usual, we've got 2 memory matches for you. This week we have a pair of 'on this day' games. The first match was a NPL Premier Division game against Burscough, played here at The Wezzie on Saturday 9th September 2000. A goalkeeping masterclass ensured that The Blues won by the only goal of the game. Then the second game is from Saturday 9th September 1950, when The Azzurri trounced Halifax Town Reserves 6-1 in the old Midland League at The Shay, courtesy of a star performance by Cutts on the wing. Wilkinson is the hero for Blues

MARK Wilkinson was the hero of Frickley Athletic, pulling off a superb penalty save in the fourth minute of injury time to give them a 1-0 victory over Burscough and their first Unibond Premier Division scalp of the season.

It was no more than the Blues deserved, although the finale was not for the faint-hearted as the home keeper guessed the right way to block a thundering spot kick by Lee McEvilley.

Gary Duffy, a dynamo in midfield, whipped an angled shot across the face of goal in the 22nd minute, following good work by Peter Owen, an acquisition from Barnsley's Academy, and Andy Hayward, and he was just off target three minutes later with a glancing header.

There was a let-off for the Blues in the 33rd minute when McEvilley beat Mark Wilkinson to a ball on the edge of the penalty area and saw his header come back off the far post before the ball was cleared by Brendan West, while it needed a good save from the home keeper to deny Robbie Talbot in the 43rd minute.

Frickley resumed in lively fashion, Owen testing Paul Blasbery in the Burscough goal in the first minute while Martin Fox had a 25 yarder deflected off target a minute later.

A triple substitution in quick succession midway through the half gingered up the Blues, Joe McAreavey having a couple of stinging efforts go close before collecting a through ball from Chris Hilton in the 73rd minute, beating his man and sending in an angled drive which was turned behind.

From the resultant corner, Chris Hurst was fouled and Andy Hayward made no mistake with the spot kick to give Frickley the advantage.

Nicky Cranston lashed an angled drive across the face of goal and then had another fierce effort pushed away by Blasbery in the 87th minute before Burscough started a series of raids which led to their opportunity to level after Fox brought down John Lawless, but Wilkinson was not to be denied a clean sheet.

Tomorrow, Frickley travel to Hyde United in the league, kick off 3pm, and next Tuesday entertain Worksop Town, kick off 7.45pm.

Frickley attacked from the start, and after a near miss when he headed just over from a centre by Davis, FITZGERALD made amends after five minutes, when he headed a perfect goal from Cutts's centre. Very lively in attack, Frickley kept Halifax busy defending for a time, but the home team fought back and, when Priestley took a pass

from Young, Vaux had to concede a corner to stop the winger's progress. Williams punched away from Priestley's header and Kirkby drove just over the bar in another Halifax attack, then Young worked his way into the penalty area, only to shoot over. Town were on top at this stage, but Frickley defended well, and in one attack were awarded a penalty. CUTTS made no mistake with the spot-kick. Two minutes later FLYNN headed in a Cutts centre. Halifax reduced the arrears after 40 minutes through SMYTHE.

Frickley increased their lead again after the resumption, VIZARD scoring with a terrific drive from just outside the penalty area. MacDONALD scored a fifth after 65 minutes and a sixth was added later.

NCEL News

Macron NCEL Premier Division leaders Tadcaster Albion have seen their lead at the top cut to two points after they were held to a 1-1 draw at home by Thackley.

Oliver Green put the Brewers ahead in the 48th minute but Thomas Whelan ensured it was a point apiece as he levelled the scores for the Dennyboys with just over a quarter-of-an-hour remaining.

Second-placed Barton Town closed the gap as they won 2-0 at Penistone Church, Craig King's first half opener added to from the penalty spot by Thomas Waudby in the second period.

A further point behind in third are Liversedge who, thanks to a double from Ryan Watson, defeated visitors Knaresborough Town 3-1 after Daniel Hartley had given the hosts the breakthrough whilst Ezio de Santis grabbed a late consolation for the visitors.

Pickering Town replace Penistone in fourth after their 2-1 win at home to Wombwell Town on Friday night, Ben Silburn and Roan Shirley with their goals sandwiching an equaliser from Jack Wilson.

At the other end of the table, Golcar United and Albion Sports got their league seasons underway with their first victories of the campaign. Alfie Wilkinson and Jerome Bedeau were the scorers for Golcar as they won 2-1 at home to Horbury Town on Friday night, the defeat dropping the away side down into the basement. And, Sports were 4-1 victors, Nathan Cartman netting twice along with one each for Thomas Ponter and Niall Heaton, as they took all three points from their trip to Bottesford Town.

Alexander Hardwick got both of Sheffield's goals in their 2-0 home win over Eccleshill United and Paul Sherburn popped up in stoppage time to grab a point for Rossington Main as they drew 1-1 with visitors Campion. And, Beverley Town came away from Handsworth with a 4-0 victory, courtesy of a goal each from Nathan Ofori, Samuel Opoku, Luke Suluburic and Glen Sani.

The top five in Division One remains the same

as they all won with Dearne & District keeping their place at the top of the pile following a single-goal victory at Route One Rovers.

Adam Baskerville's 40th minute decider means they stay a point ahead of Harrogate Railway Athletic who won 5-0 at Glasshoughton Welfare, Harris Eggleston striking twice with Dominic Creamer, Harry Atkinson and Alex Burton adding to the Rail's tally. Wakefield AFC maintain third spot after Max Rhodes' opener, added to by Ashley Flynn twice and one each from Tom Hinton and James Tetley, in a 5-1 home victory against Armthorpe Welfare.

Benjamin Pike, Josh Brown, Finley Durkin and Connor Glavin were the scorers for fourth-placed Wosbrough Bridge Athletic as they defeated visitors Brigg Town 4-2 in the division's Friday night game.

And, Club Thorne Colliery continue to complete the top five after Dominic Mellor, Lewis Walker, Nathaniel Muenda and William Gomes found the net in a 4-0 victory at Selby Town.

South Leeds have been overtaken by four clubs after their 2-0 loss at Maltby Main, Harry Middleton and Curtis Morrison with the goals that move the Muglet Lane side above their visitors into eighth.

Crowle Colts replace South Leeds in sixth after Sam Goodhand, Lee Ridley, Henry Cook and finally a penalty from Declan Becon saw them beat away side Winterton Rangers 4-1.

A Luke Sellars penalty was added to by Mitchell Carlton and Ashley Worsfold for Goole AFC who climb to seventh after their 3-0 win at a Doncaster City side that played most of the game with nine men after two sendings off.

Leeds UFCA are up into ninth after they came from behind to win comfortably 5-1 at home to Athersley Recreation, Omar Sanyang with a brace for the hosts after the Rec had taken the lead through Shay Bould.

Meanwhile, in the only draw in Division One this weekend, Will

Pennell's opener for Louth Town was cancelled out by an own goal for hosts Ilkley Town as they shared two goals and the points.





Match Reports

Frickley 0 Liversedge 0

If you look in the dictionary under "hard won point," you'll see a picture of this game. The Azzurri and highflying Liversedge went toe to toe in a pulsating 0-0 draw at The Wezzie, with the visitors forced to play half the match with 10 men.

Liversedge arrived in 4th place and in red hot form, having won 4 straight games without conceding. From the opening whistle both sides went hell for leather, with little time to breathe in a fiercely competitive first half.

The visitors created the early chances. On 7 minutes a George Green free kick found a head in the box but the effort bounced inches over. Moments later Frickley keeper Sykes was called into action twice in quick succession, first fielding a low drive, then blocking a very dangerous close range effort after a Green cross before pushing the resulting corner over the bar.

The Blues looked to have had a stonewall penalty on 15 minutes when Luis AF burst clear and was hauled back by his shirt, but astonishingly the referee waved play on. Liversedge continued to threaten. Green was again involved on 18 minutes, cutting back smartly only for Radz to block the shot. Sykes then produced a fine save, clawing the ball away from another Green free kick before a Liversedge had the ball in the net from the ensuing corner, but was ruled out for a push

At the other end, The Azzurri came close themselves when Spence's cross-cum-shot came back off the bar.

In the stroke of half time there was a flashpoint. Jenko's foul lead to the Liversedge number 6 appearing to headbutt him, right in front of the referee. The Azzurri came away from Parkgate with just a point, but the 2-2 scoreline scarcely told the story of a game in which we were dominant from start to finish. But questionable officiating meant that we were forced to settle for a share of the spoils.

Inside 2 minutes, Spence almost produced the perfect start, hitting a strike from 20 yards that fizzed inches over the bar.

Minutes later, Woolly and Luis AF combined cleverly down the flank, and Luis's cross was cut out.

Parkgate struggled to get out of their own half, and when they did on 13 minutes, Gagen was alert to snuff out the danger after the onrushing Sykes was bypassed. However, in the 15 minute came the first of the day's contentious moments. A Parkgate forward pushed Radz to the ground with a 2 handed shove before going on to score. No foul given and The Blues were a goal down. The setback didn't dent the rhythm of The Blues Band. Luis AF, lively throughout the half, bent in a teasing cross, before forcing the goalkeeper into an awkward save with a swerving effort from distance. The NLP Column: FA Cupsets...

Last year's FA Cup concluded with one of the bigger final shocks in modern history after Crystal Palace stunned Manchester City at Wembley. And this year's episode has started in much the same vein with cup shocks aplenty already whetting the appetite for the campaign ahead. Take the recent preliminary round. Atherton Laburnum Rovers were handed the dream tie against higher ranked town rivals Atherton Collieries in what was the first ever competitive Flat Cap derby.

Michael Clegg's Collieries, from Northern Premier League Division One West were strong favourites to show their superiority but it was Step 5 LR who turned on the style in front of a near 1,000 crowd to come through 5-1 to complete one of the most famous days in the club's history. Victory earned Dave Jones (pictured) and his North West Counties League side a potentially lucrative second qualifying round trip to Clegg's former club, Macclesfield, where an estimated 3,000 crowd will welcome them to Moss Rose.



"Winning the league [last season] will take some topping, but this is a close second," Jones told our reporters afterwards. "These lads have played in so many big games now, and they just weren't fazed."

But you can't talk cup upsets without mentioning Tadley Calleva. The Combined Counties League side hosted a Weymouth team who were playing National League South football last season and welcoming popular boss Steve Claridge back in their dugout for the first time in 21 years.

But, in a lunchtime kickoff in front of the BBC cameras, Joe Lawlor's Calleva rallied to a 4-2 victory to reach the second qualifying round for the first time in their history.

Whitstable Town know all about performing on the big occasion as they lifted the FA Vase at Wembley last season with an extra time success over AFC Whyteleafe.

And the Oystermen were at it again when travelling a Dulwich Hamlet side who have started their Isthmian Premier season strongly under boss Mark Dacey and came away with an impressive 3-2 victory at Champion Hill. Next up for them is a home tie against another club from the same Step 3 division, Chichester City, conquerors of Havant & Waterlooville. While Whitstable will fancy their chances of pulling off another upset, there are a number of other clubs with one eye on a third qualifying round berth.

Stalybridge Celtic, already conquerors of former Football League clubs Bury and Workington, will be looking to add a third when they host Chester, while Step 5 Chadderton, have been rewarded for seeing off Bishop Auckland in the last round with a glamour trip to NPL Premier leaders FC United of Manchester.

Ben Herd's Hertford Town will relish a trip to full timers Chelmsford City, while Jersey Bulls manager Elliott Powell describes his side's visit of Worthing as "absolutely massive" and "the biggest fixture we have ever had". The Rebels represent the highest-ranked side that Jersey will have faced since their foundation in 2018.

Two Step 5 sides are gearing towards huge ties against Step 2 opponents.

In the south west, Torpoint Athletic have reached this stage for the first time in their history and make the trip to Penydarren Park to face Southern Premier Central champions Merthyr Town, while Wessex League Laverstock & Ford head to the Ray Mac Stadium to take on Salisbury.

But, arguably, the standout tie of the round sees Step 2 Enfield FC host their rivals from Step 2, Enfield Town in an intriguing match up.

This will be the first competitive match between the two sides for over 14 years, although the pair were drawn to each other in 2021 before Enfield Town lost their replay to Hadley.

Alex Salmon's FC underdogs need only look to Atherton LR for inspiration in a competition which just keeps producing the unexpected.

Who will be next to step up to the plate?

Reuben Brewin-Hawkins (Defender/Midfielder):

RBH was with Gainsborough's U21s and 1st team in 23/24, whilst also playing in the NCEL at Rossington and Armthorpe, before joining us in 2024. A man-mountain, he's developing into quite some player.

Joel Spence (Midfielder): Joel 90 was at Armthorpe before joining us and he's been on the books of Rotherham United before plenty of experience at Belper Town, Ossett United and Wakefield.

Deservedly won player of the season in 24/25.

Will Sykes (Goalkeeper): The Holy Goalie is a highly rated young stopper who joined us from Hallam, against whom he saved a penalty towards the end of last season.

Niall Butchart (Defender/Midfielder/Forward): The Butcher is a versatile squad member. He is a former youth teamer at Altrincham, then was at Winsford United, Swallownest, Armthorpe and Goole.

Tom Alngohuru (Midfielder/Forward): The Guru is a defender's nightmare. He joined last season from Ossett United. Prior to that he was at the York City and i2i academies, and has played almost 80 games for Pickering Town.

Harry Gagen (Defender): Gadge is a Rolls Royce of a defender who started out at Barnsley but has joined us from Ossett United.

Luis Afonso-Ferreira (Midfielder/Forward): The Ferrari is a rapid forward who puts teams on the back foot. He has plenty experience from time at the likes of Retford United, Parkgate and Albion Sports.

Sam Cable (Forward): The Power is a handful of an attacker. Since starting out in our U19s over a decade ago, he is now in his 3rd spell with the club after spells at Barton Town, Garforth and others.

Will Jenkinson (Defender): Jenko is a footballing defender who joins us from Parkgate, having started out at Rotherham United.

Takunda Katsere (Defender): The Thunder is a big, strong defender with loads of potential. Has previous NCEL experience at Goole, Selby Town, Athersley Rec and Wombwell Town.

Sam Kilner (Defender): A NCEL title winner at Silsden last season, Killer is a highly proficient fullback who has also been at Buxton, Mossley, Hemsworth and Knaresborough.

Ifeanyi Nnenanua (Forward): Goes by the name of Destiny, he's a committed young striker who is always in the thick of it. He's been at the i2i academy and has previously played for Pickering Town.

Martyn Woolford (Midfielder/Forward): The Woolfman started at The Wezzie in 2005. He is a very classy attacking midfielder who has been in the EFL with the likes of York, Scunthorpe and Blades since then but back home now for a 3rd spell.

Thomas Radley (Defender): A long time target, Radz is a big centre half who was skipper at Shelley last season so brings quality and leadership into our back line.

Lucas Robinson (Midfielder/Forward): A rangy winger with an eye for goal, Cool Hand Lucas comes to us from Harrogate Railway but has been at Goole and Barton too.

Willey Woodham (Midfielder): Win-win is a top midfielder making the step up from our U23s side.

Tyler Sheard (Defender/Midfield/Forward): VersaTyler is another who can do a job anywhere on the park, team before self every time. And he's another of our U23s stepping up for 1st team duties.

Alfie Studd (Defender/Midfielder): The Studd Wall is a confident performer who has come right through our academy system. He's a local lad - his dad once lived 2 doors down from our head of media!

Tom Cotson (Defender/Midfielder): Top Cat is also hot off our U23s production line. Wherever he plays, his composure belies his years.

Harley Wilson (Midfielder): Hells Angel is a midfielder who knows his way round at this level with time served at Rossington Main, Penistone Church, Wombwell Town and Dinnington Town.

Sam Tingle (Midfielder): The Sting is a smart and energetic midfielder who joins from Retford FC but also has experience at Hemsworth MW, Ponte Colls and Ossett Utd, where he played with Tom Claisse.

Cody Collins (Defender): The Force is a defender with pedigree, his dad was a pro and 2 uncles played for the club. Comes to us from Bottesford after time at Mansfield Town, Gainsborough and Rossington.

Harold Edjangue (Goalkeeper): The Mantis is a talented keeper from Yorkshire Amateurs.

Lewis Binns (Defender/Midfielder/Coach): Binno is a rock of a defender/midfielder. This local lad has played for a number of clubs, including South Kirkby and Armthorpe. Already a Frickley legend, the Supporters' Player of the Season in 22/23 is back from injury, and is part of the coaching team too.

Lee Crooks (Defender/Midfielder/Asst Manager): When Crooksy came on as sub in the final game of 24/25, he became one of the oldest players ever to appear for The Blues. Having played many times in the EFL for Man City, Barnsley, Bradford City and Rochdale, the muscle memory is second to none.

Tom Claisse (Defender/Midfielder/Manager): Claisse Act was appointed manager in November 2024. He started out at Leeds United then Bradford City. Since then he's been at a host clubs in the NPL and NCEL (winning it 4 times), most recently at Hallam, and has played for the RAF and Armed Forces. He was coach at Emley and joint manager at Ossett. And he carried the FA Cup to the Royal Box in 2018!

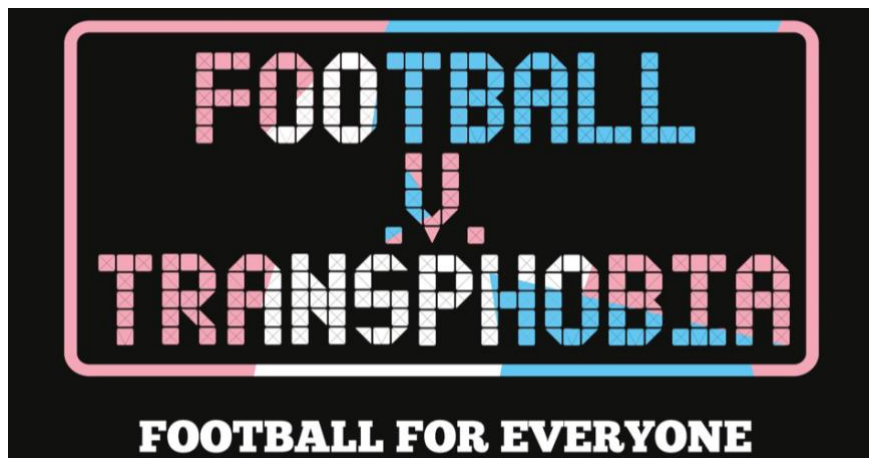

Linked to The Lane

I'm an incorrigible collector of old A&BC, Panini, Merlin, Topps, etc. football cards and stickers, and it struck me how many of the players pictured had links to Frickley Athletic. They might have played for or against us at some point, or are related to one of The Azzurri past or present. Or the connection might be even more tenuous! But you can be sure it was the highlight of their career ;)

John Burridge wasn't just a goalkeeper, he was a footballing institution. A career spanning nearly 30 years, representing a record number of clubs, setting age records, pioneering fitness and training techniques, and entertaining fans wherever he went. And crucially, for this page, he crossed paths with The Blues in the 1990s as player-manager of Blyth Spartans in the Northern Premier League.

Born in Workington in December 1951, his dad was a rugby league fan and had ambitions that young John would play for his hometown club. Burridge had other ideas, and whilst he made his debut as a teenager with Workington in 1969, it was for the football club. In 1971 he moved to

Blackpool, where he won the Anglo-Italian Cup and earned cult status among fans. Transferring to Aston Villa in 1975, Burridge helped win the League Cup in 1977. He moved on to Crystal Palace in 1978, where he earned promotion to the First Division and became known for pre-match stunts, including somersaults, handstands and sitting on the crossbar to entertain the crowd. At the time, warming up on the pitch before the game was not something that was commonplace but Budgie made it so, and now is seen before just about all games.

Budgie was teetotal and followed a diet regimen to give him an edge and doubtlessly contributed to his eventual and impressive longevity. Burridge studied sports science, avoided the then usual pre-match meals to eat high-carb foods like pasta and baby food. Unusual for the era but now

considered the norm in the professional game. Burridge was also one of the first goalkeepers to wear specialist gloves to aid his grip, quickly popularising their use throughout the game. After transferring to Wolverhampton Wanderers, Burridge famously wore a Superman outfit during a match as part of a bet with Kevin Keegan, in front of a full crowd at Molineux. He then signed for Sheffield United in 1984 and Southampton in 1987, before joining Newcastle United in 1989. He is fondly remembered at all 3 clubs.

In 1991 he moved to Hibernian in Scotland, where he won the Scottish League Cup and became their oldest ever player at age 41 years and 163 days.

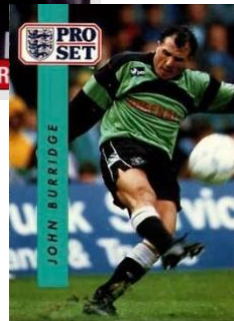
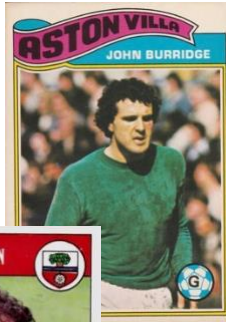
Determined not to retire, Burridge signed for an astonishing 14 clubs between 1993 and 1997, including Lincoln City, Aberdeen, Falkirk, Dumbarton, Grimsby, Darlington, and more. Many

of these were short-term emergency stints of a game or two. In May 1995, at 43 years and 162 days, he became the oldest player to ever appear in the Premier League, for Manchester City against QPR.

He wrapped up his playing career with a spell at Blyth Spartans as player-manager in 1997, finally retiring at 46. By the time his playing days came to an end, Budgie had played for 29 clubs across the English and Scottish leagues, a record for a goalkeeper, and played over 770 league games and was

past the 1000 mark if you factor in non-league football too.

Post-playing, Burridge became a respected goalkeeping coach, working with Newcastle United, and abroad in Oman, UAE, Singapore and India. He has also battled depression and has written his autobiography. Burridge's legacy endures as one of the most dedicated, eccentric, and memorable figures in British football history.

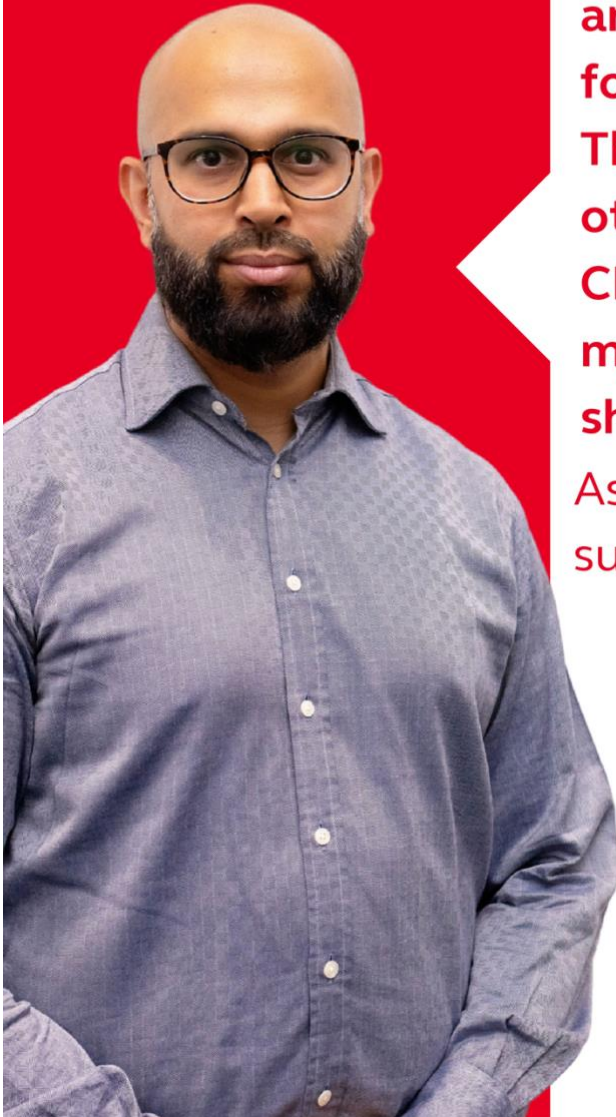
