Good afternoon, ladies and gentlemen, welcome to The SALUS Stadium for this afternoon's Northern Counties East Premier Division game against Golcar United. We give a warm welcome to Golcar's players, officials and supporters and hope they have a safe trip home after the game.

This afternoon's visitors, Golcar United, currently sit in 19th place on 5 points after 9 games. After taking just 1 point from their first 6 league games, Golcar's recent form has seen them take a point from a 1-1 draw at Rossington Main before beating newly promoted Horbury Town 2-1 at home. Then, in midweek, Golcar travelled to Keighley to face Eccleshill United but returned empty handed, losing to the only goal of the game. However, despite a slow start, Golcar have been busy bolstering their ranks, with several signings that will no doubt help them rise up the table.

The Blues come into today's game in 9th place, on goal difference, on 11 points after 9 games. Since our 3-0 defeat at home to league leaders Tadcaster Albion, we saw an upturn as a fine 2-0 victory at Penistone Church with a dominant performance and goals from Destiny Ifeanyi Nnenanua and Luis, was followed by a pair of draws, a gritty 0-0 against highflying Liversedge and, on last Saturday, a pulsating 2-2 draw at Parkgate. The latter game saw The Azzurri 2-0 down but a Martyn Woolford penalty and a Tom Alngohuru worldly earned us a point in a game where we were in the ascendancy for most of the 90 minutes. But on Tuesday, The Azzurri had their wings clipped by Knaresborough Town who dished out a chastening 3-0 beating.

Our most recent meeting with Golcar United was our penultimate league game of 2024/25 in March of this year. Played at their Longfield Avenue ground, The Blues disappointingly lost 3-0. Our last meeting here at The Wezzie was in October 2024 when Golcar won 4-2. Golcar went 3-0 up inside quarter of an hour but The Azzurri almost pulled it pack with goals from Jack Varley and Jamie Tomlinson before a late Golcar strike made the result certain.

Expect The Blues to be putting in another shift and getting back to showing what they are capable of.

In recruitment news, winger Donnell Garrick joins from Huddersfield Town's academy. He's got good footballing genes as his uncle, Jordan Garrick, has played over 100 EFL games for Swansea City, Plymouth Argyle and Forest Green Rovers. Meanwhile, Reuben Brewin Hawkins has left to join Winterton Rangers. We wish both of them the best of luck.

And congratulations to our skipper and reigning Supporters', Players' and Manager's Player of the Season, Joel Spence, who reached 50 appearances for the club on Tuesday against Knaresborough.

Our next game sees The Blues travel to Campion on Wednesday 17th September, 7.45pm kickoff. We then have a Saturday off (20th September) before The Blues are next in action here at Westfield Lane on Tuesday 23rd September when SJR Worksoop are our visitors in the 1st round of the Sheffield & Hallamshire Senior Cup 7.45pm ko. We hope to see you all there.

Enjoy the game and as always we thank you for your continued support throughout this season.

Meet The Visitors

Golcar United were established in 1904 in Huddersfield and played in the Huddersfield District League for many years. They won their first piece of silverware in 1920 when they won the Huddersfield Invitation Cup and won it again in 1923. By the 1930s, the club were popular and would often see crowds in excess of 1000, even going as far as to feature on a cigarette card back in 1935. Golcar won their third Huddersfield Invitation Cup a year later in 1936 and their fourth in 1937. Eventually, the club moved to Longfield Avenue in 1955 and it remains their home today. After small successes in the intervening years, such as winning the Huddersfield Invitation Cup in 1971, the Barlow Cup in 1973 and the Groom Cup in 1991, the club joined the West Riding County Amateur League in 1993.

The odd cup final appearance and league win followed, namely the Groom Cup in 1999, the West Riding County FA Cup in 2001 and the West Riding League championship in 2005. The club found themselves experiencing increasing success towards the end of the 2010s. This period of success coincided with the appointment of Gavin Connor as manager in 2014, he was quickly joined by his brother Ashley Connor as joint-manager and they both steered Golcar to the Double in the 2017/18 season where they won the West Riding League and the Huddersfield Invitation Cup. The 2018/19 season wasn't much different as the Connors replicated their success by retaining both the title and the cup, winning 20 out of 22 league games whilst scoring 105 goals and conceding just 20.

With Golcar doing very well on the pitch, the committee decided to try and take the club to a new level and in 2018 applied to the FA to gain promotion. In order to gain promotion, the club had to undertake a great deal of development work. This included fencing of the pitch, obtaining a clubhouse, adding hard standing, installing female changing rooms, applying and installing floodlights and levelling the pitch due to the considerable slope across the field. This work was completed on time and the club were accepted into the NWCFL in April 2019.

The club started their first ever season in semi-professional football very well with a 2-1 home win against Prestwich Heys in August 2019. The club began to attract big crowds, with a record (at the time) 556 people turning up to watch the side

beat Shelley 1-0 in October 2019. Unfortunately, the club wouldn't play another game at home until January 2020. Pitch problems eventually forced a ground share with Avro, located in Oldham, from January onwards. Despite the 21 mile trip to home games, over 100 Golcar fans would regularly make the journey until the Covid 19 pandemic curtailed the season in March 2020. Golcar were sat in 5th place, 10 points behind 3rd with 3 games in hand.

The pandemic was perhaps a blessing in disguise for the club as it allowed them to get to work off the pitch to continue the development work and sort out the pitch. A 100 seater stand and a standing section behind the goal were installed, alongside a walkway and railings on the bottom touchline. The clubhouse has been extended and the pitch has been dug up and completely re-laid. The ground has been re-named The Skye Direct Stadium and their first game of the 2020/21 season was in the FA Vase, their first involvement with the competition, where they took on Northwich Victoria in front of a sell-out crowd of 300.

The pandemic put paid to the 2020/21 season as well and it was later cancelled in early 2021. After twiddling their thumbs for a few months, Golcar took part in the inaugural Yorkshire Trophy. The first game saw them take on Liversedge and a club record crowd of 575 saw a 1-1 draw. Golcar eventually finished 3rd in the competition.

The 2021/22 season saw the club continue their rise up the pyramid as a 3rd place finish in NWCFL First Division North lead to a playoff place where they triumphed over Holker Old Boys in the final to gain promotion to Step 5.

Allocated to the NCEL Premier Division for 2022/23, achieving a creditable 9th place finish, followed by a 12th in 2023/24. Then 2024/25 was a great season for the club but was a case of so near but yet so far as they finished 3rd in the league, losing in the playoff semi final, and reached the West Riding County Cup Final, losing on penalties. Golcar United will be looking to go one step further in 2025/26.

Elsewhere, Golcar United boast a ladies team, a U6s to U15s junior section and a new academy, offering a pathway through to the 1st team as the village roots remain at the forefront of the club's thoughts.





Frickley's History

Frickley Athletic FC is based in the former coal mining village of South Elmsall. Recent research has shown that the first South Elmsall football team was formed in 1905 but was superseded in 1908 by the newly formed Frickley Colliery Athletic Club and joined the South Yorkshire league which comprised of works, church and village teams. In 1910, the football club moved to the Sheffield Association League and first played in the FA Cup.

The club remained in the Sheffield Association League (except for the war years) until 1922, finishing runners up in 1911/12, and winners in 1920/21, our only ever league title.

In 1922/23 Frickley joined the Yorkshire league and after finishing runners up in 1923/24, the club were elected into the Midland League. Although the club had to apply for re election several times pre war (and didn't play in any league in 1933/34) it was kept going by the support of the mineworkers and the sale of players.

1936/37 was Frickley's worst ever league season when the club finished bottom with only 8 points, but amazingly reached the FA Cup 1st round proper for the first time.

Post war, Frickley remained in the Midland league gaining its best finish, 7th, in 1945/46, but left the league on its break up at the end of 1959/60.

From 1960/61 to 1969/70, Frickley Colliery played in the Cheshire County League. However, financial considerations led the club to join the Midland Counties League for 1970/71. They finished runners up in 1972/73, and were eventually elected into the NPL for the 1976/77 season as Frickley Athletic.

After finishing 3rd in 1979/80, the club was promoted into the Alliance Premier League, now the National League. Here they remained for 7 years, the most successful in the club's history, and in 1985/86 reached the FA Cup 3rd round proper, after beating a Football League club, Hartlepool Utd, only to lose 3-1 at home to Rotherham Utd. The club also finished as Gola League runners up. The following season saw a reversal as we were relegated back to the NPL. From 1987/88 to 1991/92 the club consistently finished around mid-table in the NPL, but did manage to reach the league cup final in 1991/92, losing 1-0 to Marine at Maine Road.

The next few seasons saw Frickley finish in the lower reaches of the table. Then, in 2005/06 The

Blues had their best league season for 20 years, finishing 2nd to Blyth Spartans. Unfortunately, the Blues lost on penalties in the playoff semi.

In the following seasons Frickley returned to the lower half of the table, but 2015/16 saw the club have a great season to finish 7th.

This was not repeated in 2016/17 as most of the players who had brought this success were attracted to join more affluent clubs. The club were relegated from the NPL Premier Division after being members for 30 years.

2017/18 saw the club enter the NPL Division 1 South, finishing 3rd in the league, scoring a record 117 goals. Additionally, Jacob Hazel broke the club record for individual goals in a season with 47 strikes. The season ended disappointingly with playoff semi final defeat at the hands of Stamford.

2018/19, in the new NPL East Division, was less successful, seeing managerial changes and a 12th place finish. However, the season had its highlights, with victory at highflying Morpeth and a 10-1 win over Liversedge in the FA Cup.

More change followed prior to the start of 2019/20. A further league reorganisation which put the Blues into the NPL South East Division was accompanied by a new manager. An inauspicious start led to the appointment of Dave Frecklington in September 2019.

Frecks rapidly turned the side's fortunes around, before lockdown ended the season. 2020/21 ultimately suffered the same fate.

Frecks built what looked like strong squad for the 2021/22 season, able to compete for promotion from the newly formed NPL East Division.

However, things didn't pan out the way that was hoped. Key departures led to a run of form that saw the club relegated to the Northern Counties East League for the first time in our history.

In the summer of 2022, former Blue, Wayne Benn, was appointed as manager, with ex-Frickley goal scoring legend Andy Hayward as his assistant. There were occasional highs but Benn resigned in early 2023 so Patrick McGuire came in to avoid a second successive relegation.

2023/24 started well, and included an 8-0 win at Goole, but ended with the release of McGuire. James Baxendale was in the hot seat for the start of 2024/25 but left in October.

Tom Claisse took the reins in November 2024 and successfully avoided

relegation. Tom and his team will be looking to bring back winning ways to Westfield Lane in 25/26.





Memory Match

As usual, we've got 2 memory matches for you. This week we have an 'on this day' game and one that almost was. The first match was against Gainsborough Trinity, here at The Wezzie, in the FA Cup 1st Round Qualifying, played on Saturday 13th September 1975. It was a highly eventful day but The Azzurri went into the hat for the next round with a fairly comfortable 3-0 victory. Then the second game is from Tuesday 17th September 2002 when The Azzurri won by 2 goals to 1, against now EFL League Two side Harrogate Town in the NPL Premier Division. Paul Burke's goal on the stroke of half time clinched it for The Blues at Harrogate's Wetherby Road ground. With thanks to JL.

Frickley 3 Gainsborough 0

FRICKLEY humbled Northern Premier League side, Gainsborough Trinity in the F.A. Cup 1st Qualifying Round on Saturday in a game packed with incident and drama both on and off the field.

A penalty, a sending off, a missile thrown at Roger Chapman, three goals for the home side, and unruly crowd scenes were the main ingredients in a match that will be remembered for a long time.

Frickley showed more character and determination to win convincingly — upholding player-manager Frank Beaumont's decision to sit out Wednesday's Midland League game and concentrate on the Cup tie.

The South Elmsall club ran the entire 90 minutes, no-one slacking until the final whistle was blown.

Gainsborough were reduced to ten men five minutes into the second half. Centre half T. Rose, brought down Brian Fidler in the penalty area. The referee, Mr J. Grinsill, of Wakefield, immediately pointed to the spot and then booked Rose for the offence. Rose appeared to argue and was sent off.

SETTLED

Phil SYRAT hammered the penalty into the bottom right hand corner to put Frickley 2-0 ahead. That settled the issue. Although they never gave up, Gainsborough faced an impossible task.

Yet they could have gone in at half-time with a lead instead of trailing 1-0. They created four golden chances in the first half but scored none.

It was not poor finishing on the part of the Gainsborough forwards but courageous and daring goalkeeping by Roger Chapman. In the tenth and

14th minutes he was forced out of his goal first diving at the feet of an opponent and then to cut out a shot from Mick Wadsworth. And, when he was beaten, there was always captain, Ron Pounder, to clear off the line as he did twice, once in each half.

Also outstanding in Frickley's defence was centre half Paul Turner. Often he headed Frickley out of dangerous situations and intercepted menacing low crosses.

BUSINESS

Frickley showed Gainsborough they too meant business when Turner's cracking 30 yard drive caught a deflection almost deceiving goalkeeper W. Rose in the 20th minute. Rose also did well to cut out a shot hit on the turn by Brian Moran five minutes later.

The Colliery's attacks became more frequent with the best being Alan Wilcockson hitting the side netting with a header from Peter Brannan's cross after 34 minutes.

MORAN put Frickley ahead two minutes from half-time to celebrate his return from injury. Frank Beaumont pumped upfield a free kick that Fidler touched on to Wilcockson, Moran picking

his team mate's shot to, send Rose the wrong way.

A minute later, Chapman was hit on the back of the head by an empty beer can but was not seriously hurt.

VERSATILE

T. Rose's sending off took the competition out of the game. Tactics changed with Wagstaffe given the job of harrassing Fidler and Whiteley, playing at full back for the first time this season, being able to roam upfield.

Frickley lost Moran, who received a knock on his troublesome toe, 15 minutes from time. He was replaced by the versatile Alan Jones who grabbed Frickley's third goal in the 87th minute.

W. Rose left the goalline unoccupied to save from Beaumont and although JONES mis-kicked from five yards out, the ball bobbed over the line.

Player-manager, Frank Beaumont, who took Macclesfield to victory in the F.A. Trophy Final at Wembley a few seasons ago, summed up Frickley's fine win. "We had a better balanced side and worked harder than Gainsborough did," he said.

Blues taste victory

FRICKLEY Athletic gained a 2-1 victory at Harrogate Town in the Unibond Premier Division with all the goals coming before the break.

Manager Phil Sharpe introduced new signings Scott Kerr and Nigel Hemstock, and it was Kerr who put the Blues ahead in their first threatening raid after ten minutes.

Andy Evans sprayed a pass to Ryan Williams and ran on to flick his cross into the path of Kerr who found the bottom corner of the net from 12 yards.

Kerr went close again two minutes later, but Town responded and Mark Thompson headed the ball down to Scott Russell whose angled shot was well-saved by Mark Samways in the 21st minute.

Harrogate equalised on the half hour when Mark Hancock scored an own-goal, but Frickley continued to look dangerous. A long ball from Chris Gowen was flicked on by Evans in the 44th minute and Paul Burke pounced to drill in a 20-yard drive and restore the Blues advantage.

Samways smothered a strong shot by Colin Hunter in the 53rd minute and, at the other end, a storming 35-yard drive from Gowen beat the Town keeper but swerved wide.

A free kick by Hancock produced a powerful header by Paul Marquis which clipped the bar in the 74th minute and Lee Morris was put clear by Hemstock two minutes later, but his lob over the Town keeper came back off an upright.

Harrogate never looked like snatching a share of the spoils.

If you want to see some goals, it looks like Whitley Bay and Retford United are the places to be.

That was certainly the case in July and August. This season we're teaming up with the guys at Non-League HQ - find them on X - to bring monthly stats from across the Pyramid.

It promises to show a snapshot into how teams and players are performing each calendar month.

Perhaps the table shows they're struggling but a deeper look may show a team is in fact one of the most in-form sides around. Our first instalment shows Whitley Bay scored 27 times in the opening period of the season as did Retford at Step 6 - although Cranfield are just a goal behind them. Of course Steps 1-4 started a little after Steps 5

and 6 but it will be fascinating to see how things unfold throughout the campaign. We'll also be highlighting the players. At the end of August, the top scorer across Non-League football was Zak Khan. The Route One Rovers man hit 13 goals including three hat-tricks for the Northern Counties East League Division One side. He was a closely followed by Alnwick's Euan Potts and Step 5's leading scorer from Penrith, Luke Hunter, who both ended

August on 12. Potts has also grabbed two trebles, while Hunter led the way when it comes to consecutive games he scored in with nine. The closest player to that sequence is Oxhey Jets' James Barnett with six games on the spin.

At Steps 1 to 4 - having not played as many games - National League North duo Michael Gyasi, the King's Lynn Town striker, and Scarborough Athletic's Stephen Walker were the most profitable in the opening month with seven goals each.

The stats will focus on different areas throughout the season but we can't wait to

see how the Golden Boot races unfold. And who knows where these goal getters might end up. In last week's NLP, Tony Incenzo spoke to QPR's new signing Richard Kone (pictured).

It seems incredible the striker, who the Hoops recently signed from Wycombe Wanderers, was playing for Athletic Newham in the Essex Senior League a couple of years ago. The 22-year-old scored

125 goals for the non-leaguers while visa issues were sorted to allow him to move into the full-time game.

"I was playing against tough men week in, week out," he said. "It helped me discover how to overcome physical defenders." His rapid rise will be a real inspiration to so many. After all, goals pay the bills. And they also help draw in the crowds! Whitley Bay and Retford are certainly on our ones to watch in September!



Match Reports

Frickley 0 Knaresborough Town 3

The Blues endured a disappointing evening as we fell to a 3-0 defeat against Knaresborough in a game where we never quite found a rhythm.

Despite gaining some good field position, The Blues were made to pay for loose play in front of goal as the visitors were ruthless when opportunities presented themselves.

The Blues began the contest on the front foot, with Luis AF looking lively from the off. Just 4 minutes in, he streaked past his marker and whipped in a dangerous cross, signalling intent. At the other end, only a fingertip save from Sykes denied Knaresborough an opener as he reacted brilliantly to a deft flick from a cross.

Luis AF continued to cause problems down the flank, jinking past his defender on 10 minutes only to stick his shot into the runner beans at the allotted end. He went agonisingly close soon after, striking the upright from a tight angle. Knaresborough showed their own signs of threat, going close when they also rattled the woodwork in the 18th minute.

Luis AF fizzed a tantalising ball across the face of goal that begged for a finishing touch but evaded everyone in Blue.

Woolly then tried his luck from distance, sending a drive narrowly wide from around 20 yards as The Azzurri pressed for the breakthrough. But then the missed chances came back to haunt us. So it was that The Blues fell behind. A 28th minute defensive header failed to clear the danger, dropping kindly for the visitors' number 11, who volleyed beyond Sykes to make it 1-0. Frickley had chances to respond. Woolly slid a perfectly weighted through ball into the path of Destiny, who looked set to equalise, but the away side's keeper got down quickly to stop the shot. Moments later, break for The Blues should have yielded more, but instead of squaring, the chance was wasted with an early shot.

The punishment for that miss was swift and harsh. In the 44th minute, a suspiciously offside looking Knaresborough forward was allowed to run on and score. The flag stayed down, and he slotted past Sykes to double the lead. HT 0-2. Les Bleus came out after the break looking to claw their way back. Shots were blocked, Robbo drilled a low effort that was comfortably saved, and Ceesay threatened with a header from close

range. There were appeals when Robbo was bundled over as he charged through, but the referee waved play on, judging it to be shoulder to shoulder.

At the other end, however, Knaresborough were clinical. On 66 minutes, they carved through again, with a hint of a foul on Collins in the build up, before drilling the ball home to all but end the game as a contest.

There was still time for the introduction of Donnell Garrick for his debut. The newcomer almost made an immediate impact, linking neatly with Ceesay before seeing his shot blocked. Further fresh legs in TK and Butch gave The Blues renewed energy, and Destiny remained lively, beating defenders with his direct running. On 77 minutes he wriggled through but dragged his shot wide, then 8 minutes later forced the keeper into a point blank save from Robbo's cross, though the keeper knew little about it. Knaresborough might have added a fourth when they rolled an effort just wide in the closing stages, while Radz had one final opportunity for The Blues deep into stoppage time, heading narrowly off target. FT 0-3.

It was a scrappy game, and the scoreline perhaps flattered the visitors but underlined the difference in composure between the 2 sides. However, we need to dust ourselves down, go again, and find the cutting edge that eluded us here. And it was still better than watching England on the box! WEBMASTER MOTM - Well, we've been better. This certainly wasn't the high standards that we've seen in past games. Martin Woolford is really getting his eye back in. Joel Spence was a leader, scrapping for everything in midfield. Despite an early mistake, Sam Kilner put in another quality performance, showing great mental strength. Radz continued to head away bricks while Gagen was always there and thereabouts. And Luis AF worried defenders every time he gets on the ball. But the Glitterball has to go to Kieran Ceesay. He was head and shoulders above the rest with his quick feet and creativity. Everywhere We Go

Parkgate

Well, it was a lovely day for football at Parkgate last weekend, shirt sleeves weather and it didn't rain. What more could you ask for? Unfortunately, for the second year on the trot, the officiating was, how shall we say, 'interesting'. I'll have to leave it as that for legal reasons ;) Otherwise it was a good day out.

Roundwood is a nice little complex, also used by a golf club and Rotherham United next door and over the hedge - more of that in a mo. Inside the ground itself, or not as the clubhouse is just outside the ground, there's a little

covered stand at one end, and hard standing at the other, as you'd expect. Along one long side there's a bit of covered standing for when the weather throws it worst at you, not needed on this occasion. Then on the fourth side, there is a long hedge, very Brechin-like in appearance (Google it, kids), separating Parkgate facilities from those of Rotherham's.

Parkgate is just a short jaunt down the road from SESKU. and I had the honour of a nice little chat with Will Jenkinson's mum, although his dad and brother had gone to Rotherham United's game. Boo. The game itself was one of the most one sided affairs that I've

witnessed, so to come away with a 2-all draw after being 2-0 down (I'll say no more here) felt a big disappointment. But I'll always take an away point coz you never know how important that point will be come the final reckoning next April. And the manner in which we played was encouraging in the extreme, we just need to take a whetstone to that cutting edge of ours. The bar has been set high, these boys can genuinely play, they are proper footballers. Can't wait for the next time...





Linked to The Lane

I'm an incorrigible collector of old A&BC, Panini, Merlin, Topps, etc. football cards and stickers, and it struck me how many of the players pictured had links to Frickley Athletic. They might have played for or against us at some point, or are related to one of The Azzurri past or present. Or the connection might be even more tenuous! But you can be sure it was the highlight of their career ;)

In a week when Martyn Woolford has set records for his goalscoring longevity for The Blues (the longest goalscoring career span of 19 years and 50 weeks), it seems only right that this page feature another couple of giants of the game that Woolly has graced the turf with. Back in 2009, Woolly's Scunthorpe United side travelled to The Etihad Stadium to face the might of a Manchester City team that we're on the way up and on the verge of the great things we've seen over the last 15 years. There were plenty of glittering stars on show but I'm taking the opportunity to give a little love for the pair of defensive rocks at centre half, Vincent Kompany and Joleon Lescott. Born in Brussels in Belgium in 1986, Vincent Kompany rose through the ranks at Anderlecht, making his professional debut as a teenager.

From the start, his composure, athleticism, and maturity stood out, and by the age of 18 he was already considered one of Europe's brightest young defenders. His performances earned him two Belgian league titles and the Golden Shoe, the award for the best player in Belgium, before he moved to Germany to join Hamburg in 2006. In 2008, Manchester City signed him for just £6 million, a transfer that would prove transformative for both player and club. As City's ownership shifted and ambitions grew, Kompany became the heartbeat of the team. Appointed captain in 2011, he embodied the new City, ambitious,

disciplined, and hungry for success. Under his leadership, the club ended its 44-year league title drought in 2012, and he went on to lift 4 Premier League trophies in total, plus 2 FA Cups and 4 League Cups. His leadership was matched by iconic moments, none more so than his thunderous long range strike against Leicester City in May 2019, a goal that helped City secure another title in his final season. Though injuries plagued him throughout his time in Manchester, his influence was immense, both as a defender and as a leader who set the


standards in the dressing room. Internationally, Kompany was equally important for Belgium's "Golden Generation." He won 89 caps, captaining the team at major tournaments and playing a key role in their third place finish at the 2018 World Cup, the best result in Belgium's history. When his playing career wound down,

Kompany returned to Anderlecht in 2019 as player-manager, before quickly stepping into coaching full time. His first real breakthrough came at Burnley, where he reinvented a relegated side, guiding them back to the Premier Leagues in 2023 with a dynamic, attacking style of football. Though Burnley's return to the top flight was short lived, his style attracted admiration.

In 2024, he took the next step, accepting the challenge of managing Bayern Munich, one of Europe's most prestigious clubs, with the task of restoring them to dominance.

Kompany's story is defined not just by trophies, but by his character. As a player, he was a towering centre back who combined physicality with intelligence, a captain who inspired with words and actions. And as a coach, he has shown the same drive to lead, but now through ideas and tactical vision.

His influence on football is surely far from finished.

Then there's Joleon Lescott.

Birmingham-born in 1982, Lescott rose through the youth ranks at Wolverhampton Wanderers, and he also was still a teenager when making his professional.

His early years were shaped by a serious injury setback, but his determination and defensive talent saw him become a cornerstone of Wolves' back line.

Lescott played a vital role in their promotion to the Premier League in 2003, establishing himself as one of English football's hot defensive properties.

In 2006, his performances earned him a move to Everton, where he flourished under David Moyes. At Goodison Park, Lescott developed into a dependable and versatile defender, equally adept at centre half and left back. His aerial strength, positional awareness, and eye for a goal from set pieces made him a fan favourite, and he was twice named Everton's Players' Player of the Season.

His progression attracted the attention of Manchester City, who signed him in 2009 as part of their rebuild.

Though at times he might've appeared to be overshadowed by higher profile teammates, like Kompany, Lescott played a pivotal role in City's defensive unit. He was at the heart of the side that won the FA Cup against Stoke City in 2011, the club's first in 41 years, the side that clinched the dramatic 2011/12 Premier League title, as mentioned, the club's first in 44 years and the League Cup against Sunderland, the club's first in 38 years. Blimey!

It was his formidable partnership with Vincent Kompany gave City the defensive assurance they needed to complement their attacking flair in those early years of their transformation.


After his time at City, Lescott moved on to West Bromwich Albion and later Aston Villa, continuing

to provide leadership and experience in the latter stages of his career. He also ventured abroad briefly with AEK Athens before finishing at Sunderland.

On the international stage, Lescott earned over 25 caps for England, representing his country at UEFA Euro 2012, where he scored in the group stage against France. Though never the most flamboyant player, he was respected for his professionalism, consistency, and ability to perform at the highest level. And his no nonsense and 'team first' mentality was always going to make him a crucial cog wherever he went.

After retirement from playing, Lescott transitioned seamlessly into roles that kept him connected to football. He became a television pundit, offering thoughtful and measured analysis for outlets including BT Sport. He also

stepped into development and advisory roles, working with Manchester City's academy as a loan pathways manager, helping guide young players as they adapted to senior football. Later, he extended that expertise to the England setup, contributing to youth team development, mentoring emerging defenders, and sharing the insights



of a career spent at the top level.

More recently, Lescott has started to dabble in the music world as a DJ, having a set at this year's Reading Festival.

Kompany and Lescott must've been good coz they put the leash on Woolly in their 2009 meeting in the League Cup. City won 5-1, although rumour has it that all 5 were offside. Scunny and Woolly played City in the FA Cup, the following season. However, Lescott didn't play in that one. Was it that he didn't fancy facing The Woolfman again, or was it a conscious decision by Manchester City's management not to risk both of his best centre halves against The Big Bad Woolf? We can only speculate... :)



Blues Squad 25/26

Joel Spence (Midfielder): Joel 90 was at Armthorpe before joining us and he's been on the books of Rotherham United before plenty of experience at Belper Town, Ossett United and Wakefield. Deservedly won player of the season in 24/25.

Will Sykes (Goalkeeper): The Holy Goalie is a highly rated young stopper who joined us from Hallam, against whom he saved a penalty towards the end of last season.

Niall Butchart (Defender/Midfielder/Forward): The Butcher is a versatile squad member. He is a former youth teamer at Altrincham, then was at Winsford United, Swallownest, Armthorpe and Goole.

Tom Alngohuru (Midfielder/Forward): The Guru is a defender's nightmare. He joined last season from Ossett United. Prior to that he was at the York City and i2i academies, and has played almost 80 games for Pickering Town.

Luis Afonso-Ferreira (Midfielder/Forward): The Ferrari is a rapid forward who puts teams on the back foot. He has plenty experience from time at the likes of Retford United, Parkgate and Albion Sports.

Sam Cable (Forward): The Power is a handful of an attacker. Since starting out in our U19s over a decade ago, he is now in his 3rd spell with the club after spells at Barton Town, Garforth and others.

Will Jenkinson (Defender): Jenko is a footballing defender who joins us from Parkgate, having started out at Rotherham United.

Takunda Katsere (Defender): The Thunder is a big, strong defender with loads of potential. Has previous NCEL experience at Goole, Selby Town, Athersley Rec and Wombwell Town.

Sam Kilner (Defender): A NCEL title winner at Silsden last season, Killer is a highly proficient fullback who has also been at Buxton, Mossley, Hemsworth and Knaresborough.

Ifeanyi Nnenanua (Forward): Goes by the name of Destiny, he's a committed young striker who is always in the thick of it. He's been at the i2i academy and has previously played for Pickering Town.

Martyn Woolford (Midfielder/Forward): The Woolfman started at The Wezzie in 2005. He is a very classy attacking midfielder who has been in the EFL with the likes of York, Scunthorpe and Blades since then but back home now for a 3rd spell.

Lucas Robinson (Midfielder/Forward): A rangy winger with an eye for goal, Cool Hand Lucas comes to us from Harrogate Railway but has been at Goole and Barton too.

Sam Tingle (Midfielder): The Sting is a smart and energetic midfielder who joins from Retford FC but also has experience at Hemsworth MW, Ponte Colls and Ossett Utd, where he played with Tom Claisse.

Thomas Radley (Defender): Radz is a big centre half who was skipper at Shelley last season so brings quality and leadership into our back line.

Harry Gagen (Defender): Gadge is a Rolls Royce of a defender who started out at Barnsley but has joined us from Ossett United.

Wilfey Woodham (Midfielder): Win-win is a top midfielder making the step up from our U23s side.

Tyler Sheard (Defender/Midfield/Forward): VersaTyler is another who can do a job anywhere on the park, team before self every time. And he's another of our U23s stepping up for 1st team duties.

Alfie Studd (Defender/Midfielder): The Studd Wall is a confident performer who has come right through our academy system. He's a local lad - his dad once lived 2 doors down from our head of media!

Tom Cotson (Defender/Midfielder): Top Cat is also hot off our U23s production line. Wherever he plays, his composure belies his years.

Harley Wilson (Midfielder): With time at Penistone, Rossington, Wombwell Town and Dinnington, Hells Angel is an experienced midfielder at this level.

Cody Collins (Defender): The Force is a defender with pedigree, his dad was a pro and 2 uncles played for the club. Comes to us from Bottesford after time at Mansfield Town, Gainsborough and Rossington.

Kieron Ceessay (Midfielder/Forward): KC is an exciting winger who started at Manchester United. Since then Guiseley, Ponte Colls, Brighouse and North Ferriby and others have been his home.

Harold Edjangue (Goalkeeper): The Mantis is a talented keeper from Yorkshire Amateurs.

Donnell Garrick (Midfielder/Forward): The Director General is a young winger who joins us from Huddersfield Town's academy. He has also played for Emley's youth setup and Ossett United on loan.

Lewis Binns (Defender/Midfielder/Coach): Binno is a rock. This local lad has played for local clubs, like South Kirkby and Armthorpe. A Frickley legend, the Supporters' Player of the Season in 22/23 is back from injury, and is part of the coaching team too.

Lee Crooks (Defender/Midfielder/Asst Manager): When Crooksy came on as sub in the final game of 24/25, he became one of the oldest players ever to appear for The Blues. Having played many times in the EFL for Man City, Barnsley, Bradford City and Rochdale, the muscle memory is second to none.

Tom Claisse (Defender/Midfielder/Manager): Claisse Act was appointed manager in November 2024. He started out at Leeds United then Bradford City. Since then he's been at a host of clubs in the NPL and NCEL (winning it 4 times), most recently at Hallam, and has played for the RAF and Armed Forces. He was coach at Emley and joint manager at Ossett. And he carried the FA Cup to the Royal Box in 2018!




