Bluescene

Good evening, ladies and gentlemen, welcome to The SALUS Stadium for this evening's Sheffield & Hallamshire Senior Cup First Round game against SJR Worksop. We give a warm welcome to SJR Worksop's players, officials and supporters and hope they have a safe trip home after the game.

This evening's visitors, SJR Worksop, ply their trade in the Abacus Lighting Central Midlands Alliance League. SJR currently sit in 14th place (out of 17) in the Camper UK Premier Division North on 5 points after 8 games. Since their first win of 2025/26, a 3-0 victory at Steveley Miners Reserves, SJR have suffered 2 reverses, losing 5-1 at Dinnington Town, and 2-0 at Kinsley Boys on Saturday.

The Blues come into today's game in 14th place on 11 points after 11 games. The Blues are on a run of 5 games without a win. Our remarkable 2-0 victory at Penistone Church with goals from Destiny Ifeanyi Nnenanua and Luis Afonso Ferreira, was followed by a pair of draws, a gritty 0-0 against Liversedge and a 2-2 draw at Parkgate. The latter game saw The Azzurri 2-0 down but a Martyn Woolford penalty and a Tom Alngohuru worldy earned us a point in a game where we were largely in the ascendancy. The Azzurri have lost 3 on the bounce since then. Our wings were clipped by Knaresborough Town who dished out a 3-0 beating here at The Wezzie, then Golcar United were our visitors and trounced us 6-1, Tom Alngohuru's goal being the sole bright spot. Last Wednesday, affairs got little better as we lost 4-0 at Campion.

The big news at the club was that following the

said defeat at Campion, Frickley Athletic parted company with first team manager Tom Claisse. We thank Tom for his hard work since being appointed in November 2024. We also thank Tom's assistant Lee Crooks who has left the club as well. We wish them both the best of luck for the future. The club will make further announcements regarding the manager's position in due course. For the time being, Martyn Woolford will be caretaker manager.

Tonight's game is our first meeting with SJR Worksop. They last competed in the Sheffield Cup in 2023/24 when they received a bye in the 1st round, then won 1-0 at Swinton Athletic in the 2nd round. Unfortunately, the wheels fell off in the 3rd round when SJR had the misfortune of being drawn against an in form Emley side who proceeded to dismantle them by 11 (eleven) goals to nil. As for ourselves, we disappointingly exited last season's competition in the 2nd round, after a bye in the 1st, losing 3-1 at local rivals Hemsworth MW.

Expect The Blues to be doing nothing less than puffing their chests out and playing with all the pride they can muster tonight.

Our next game sees The Blues get back to league football as we travel to Sheffield FC on Saturday 27th September, and then to Beverley Town on Saturday 4th October, both 3pm kickoffs. The Blues are next in action here at Westfield Lane on Tuesday 14th October when Bottesford Town are our visitors in the 2nd round of the NCEL League Cup, 7.45pm ko. We hope to see you all there.

Enjoy the game and as always we thank you for your continued support throughout this season.

Meet The Visitors

The first guise of SJR Worksop Football Club was founded in 1984. By the early 2000s, the side, known as St Joseph's, later St Joseph's Rockware, played in the Worksop Sunday League at St Joseph's Catholic Club. The club soon developed a reputation for competitiveness, with early successes in league and cup competitions. A pivotal figure of that era was Chris Rawson, who joined in 2003 and went on to become captain, leading the team through more than a decade of success.

In 2005, the club formally re-established itself as St Joseph's Rockware of Worksop or SJR Worksop, marking the beginning of its development into a community-based organisation. Throughout the late 2000s and early 2010s, the men's side became one of the dominant forces in local Sunday football, collecting a string of league titles and cup triumphs. One of the high points came in 2012, when SJR had a perfect season, going unbeaten in the league, and adding a cup win too.

As the club grew, its ambitions expanded. Under new leadership in the mid-2010s, particularly with the influence of Andrew Guest, SJR Worksop modernised its structure, improved coaching, and sought to move beyond Sunday football.

After years of success in Worksop's Sunday League, SJR Worksop took a bold step in 2019 by entering the Central Midlands League, moving into the Saturday semi-professional football. The challenge of joining the National League System was significant, but the club adapted quickly and the transition was smooth and successful.

Their debut campaign in 2019/20 started brilliantly. Playing in Division One North, SJR Worksop were unbeaten at the point the season was abandoned due to Covid. But at least this confirmed that their blend of local talent and strong organisation was more than capable of competing beyond the Sunday circuit.

The seasons that followed brought the inevitable ups and downs of non-league football as the club consolidated its place in the Central Midlands structure, competing against more experienced sides while bedding in new players and systems. By 2023/24, the Central Midlands League had undergone restructuring, becoming the Central Midlands Alliance, and SJR were placed in the Premier North Division. Here they faced a higher calibre of opposition, including ambitious outfits

like Doncaster City. Highlights included frustrating the aforementioned title-chasing Doncaster City with a spirited draw and completing league doubles over local rivals such as Rossington Reserves. These results underlined the team's ability to punch above its weight, even while still developing pathways from their extensive youth and development squads into the first team.

The 2024/25 season saw further progress, with SJR maintaining their place in the Premier North. There were more local derbies and tightly contested fixtures that demonstrated just how competitive the division had become. While trophies have not yet come at this level, SJR Worksop's stability is a good foundation for long-term growth, both on the pitch and as part of the club's broader community vision.

Alongside the men's first team, SJR Worksop has grown into a true community football club, with the creation of dozens of junior teams, an academy system, and additional senior sections, including an over 35s veterans' team and a thriving women's programme. By the mid-2020s, the club has fielded more than 40 teams, making it one of the largest grassroots organisations in the Worksop area.

While the men's first team continued to consolidate their position in the Central Midlands Alliance, other parts of the club brought further recognition. The women's first team achieved promotion in 2024 after winning the East Midlands Women's Regional League, while in April 2025 the over-35s lifted the Sid Butterfield Cup in at Parkgate.

The club now plays at Rockware Glass Sports and Social Club on Sandy Lane, not far from Worksop Town's present ground. This site started life as the works sports ground of Rockware Glass but has developed into a multi-sport community hub, home to ourselves SJR Worksop (men's, women's and juniors), Rockware Glass Cricket Club and other local groups. Our home includes modern changing facilities, a kitchen, meeting rooms, clubhouse, etc., as a result of grant-supported upgrades over recent years.

Long may SJR Worksop FC continue to embody its founding principle that football in Worksop should be open and accessible to all.





Frickley's History

Frickley Athletic FC is based in the former coal mining village of South Elmsall. Recent research has shown that the first South Elmsall football team was formed in 1905 but was superseded in 1908 by the newly formed Frickley Colliery Athletic Club and joined the South Yorkshire league which comprised of works, church and village teams. In 1910, the football club moved to the Sheffield Association League and first played in the FA Cup.

The club remained in the Sheffield Association League (except for the war years) until 1922, finishing runners up in 1911/12, and winners in 1920/21, our only ever league title.

In 1922/23 Frickley joined the Yorkshire league and after finishing runners up in 1923/24, the club were elected into the Midland League. Although the club had to apply for re election several times pre war (and didn't play in any league in 1933/34) it was kept going by the support of the mineworkers and the sale of players.

1936/37 was Frickley's worst ever league season when the club finished bottom with only 8 points, but amazingly reached the FA Cup 1st round proper for the first time.

Post war, Frickley remained in the Midland league gaining its best finish, 7th, in 1945/46, but left the league on its break up at the end of 1959/60.

From 1960/61 to 1969/70, Frickley Colliery played in the Cheshire County League. However, financial considerations led the club to join the Midland Counties League for 1970/71. They finished runners up in 1972/73, and were eventually elected into the NPL for the 1976/77 season as Frickley Athletic.

After finishing 3rd in 1979/80, the club was promoted into the Alliance Premier League, now the National League. Here they remained for 7 years, the most successful in the club's history, and in 1985/86 reached the FA Cup 3rd round proper, after beating a Football League club, Hartlepool Utd, only to lose 3-1 at home to Rotherham Utd. The club also finished as Gola League runners up. The following season saw a reversal as we were relegated back to the NPL. From 1987/88 to 1991/92 the club consistently finished around mid-table in the NPL, but did manage to reach the league cup final in 1991/92, losing 1-0 to Marine at Maine Road.

The next few seasons saw Frickley finish in the lower reaches of the table. Then, in 2005/06 The

Blues had their best league season for 20 years, finishing 2nd to Blyth Spartans. Unfortunately, the Blues lost on penalties in the playoff semi.

In the following seasons Frickley returned to the lower half of the table, but 2015/16 saw the club have a great season to finish 7th.

In 2016/17, most of the players who had brought this success were attracted to more affluent clubs. The club were relegated from the NPL Premier Division after a 30 year stay.

2017/18 saw the club enter the NPL Division 1 South, finishing 3rd in the league, scoring a record 117 goals. Additionally, Jacob Hazel broke the club record for individual goals in a season with 47 strikes. The season ended disappointingly with playoff semi final defeat at the hands of Stamford.

2018/19, in the new NPL East Division, was less successful, seeing managerial changes and a 12th place finish. However, the season had its highlights, with victory at highflying Morpeth and a 10-1 win over Liversedge in the FA Cup.

More change followed prior to the start of 2019/20. A further league reorganisation which put The Blues into the NPL South East Division was accompanied by a new manager. An inauspicious start lead to the appointment of Dave Frecklington in September 2019.

Frecks rapidly turned the side's fortunes around, before lockdown ended the season. 2020/21 ultimately suffered the same fate.

Frecks built what looked like strong squad for the 2021/22 season in the newly formed NPL East Division. However, things didn't pan out as hoped. Key departures lead to a run of form that saw the club relegated to the Northern Counties East League for the first time in our history.

In the summer of 2022, former Blue, Wayne Benn, was appointed as manager, with ex-Frickley goal scoring legend Andy Hayward as his assistant. There were occasional highs but Benn resigned in early 2023 so Patrick McGuire came in to avoid a second successive relegation.

2023/24 started well, and included an 8-0 win at Goole, but ended with the release of McGuire.

James Baxendale was in the hot seat for the start of 2024/25 but left to be replaced by Tom Claisse in November 2024 and successfully avoided the drop before being relieved of his duties in September 2025.

At time of writing, the new manager is yet to be appointed but whoever he is, he'll be looking to bring winning ways back to Westfield Lane.

Frickley gain sweet revenge

FRICKLEY ATHLETIC gained revenge for their defeat in the opening Unibond Premier Division fixture with a 2-1 triumph over Alfreton Town at Westfield Lane last Tuesday.

Visiting keeper Paul Norton was soon in action, smothering a neat back flick by Gary Duffy in the ninth minute, but was given no chance when Miles Thorpe flicked on a cross by Duffy for James O'Donnell to rifle in a 15 yarder and give the Blues the lead after 15 minutes.

Scott Armstrong shaved a post with a 25 yards drive seven minutes later, and Norton did well to hold a 30 yarder from Duffy on the half hour.

Just before the interval, Chris Hilton sprayed a ball to Thorpe, who slipped it inside to Armstrong and his first time effort flew across

the face of the Town goal.

Former Frickley manager Mark Dempsey tested Richard Coyles with a low drive straight after the resumption, but rarely got an opportunity to shine, and it was the home side who continued to threaten, Armstrong going close with a 12 yards drive in the 51st minute, following good work by Duffy and Thorpe.

Fortunate

Alfreton grabbed a fortunate equaliser in the 70th minute, a corner being forced in at the near post by Carl Cunningham, but their

joy was short lived, the Blues regaining the advantage four minutes later.

Thorpe collected a through ball and got into a shooting position only to be wrestled to the ground by Lee Faulkner, and skipper Mark Hancock drilled in the resultant penalty.

The visitors made a double substitution, but Frickley were determined not to allow them to poach a point and almost struck again in the 88th minute, when a 20 yards drive by O'Donnell beat the keeper but went inches too high.

The Sheffield & Hallamshire Senior Cup

The Sheffield & Hallamshire Senior Cup is a county cup competition involving teams within the Sheffield & Hallamshire County Football Association.

Originally named the Sheffield Challenge Cup, it was first competed for in 1876/77 making it the 4th oldest surviving cup competition in the world, after the FA Cup (1871/72), Scottish FA Cup (1873/74) and East of Scotland Shield (1875/76).

Frickley have reached the final on 27 occasions, winning the cup on 14 of those, which is the joint second most wins with Sheffield Wednesday, after Worksop Town's 15 wins.

Tonight's visitor's SJR Worksop are yet to reach the final or win the competition. All finals involving Frickley are listed below:

Match Reports

Frickley 1 Golcar United 6

It was tough afternoon at The Wezzie as The Azzurri were on the end of a 6-1 drubbing as Golcar United ran out comfortable winners in a game where defensive errors proved costly. The visitors took the lead inside two minutes in unfortunate fashion. A clearance from Frickley's young debutant goalkeeper was charged down by Golcar's number 9, and though the ball rebounded off the post, he reacted quickest to bundle it over the line. The Blues looked to respond, with Robbo swinging in a couple of dangerous deliveries, while Butch forced some uncertainty from the Golcar keeper with a dipping free kick. However, more disaster struck on 13 minutes when Jenko, attempting to deal with a cross, sent a powerful header past his own keeper to double the deficit. Golcar threatened sporadically from distance, but Frickley stayed in the contest through to half time, despite Woolly picking up a booking just before the break. HT 0-2. Destiny was introduced at half time, and he quickly made an impact down the right, although his cut back went behind the onrushing Tom A. Moments later, Ceesay jinked into the box but couldn't get a clean strike away. The Blues were rewarded for their brighter start to the second half on 51 minutes. Tom A, who had been lively all afternoon, produced a moment of magic, hitting a swerving effort with the outside of his boot from the corner of the area into the top corner. It was his second spectacular strike in as many Saturdays, and it gave The Azzurri hope. That hope proved to be short lived as Golcar netted another 4 times in the following 20 minutes. In the 54th minute, Golcar's number 10 was allowed to get goal side of his marker and

finished neatly into the bottom corner to restore their 2 goal lead. On the hour, indecision at the back gifted the number 10 another, extending the visitors' advantage to 4-1. Ceesay almost pulled one back with a low drive that flashed just wide of the upright. But Golcar then moved further ahead as a 66th minute move ended with another composed finish past the exposed keeper. There was some controversy on 70 minutes. Radz fouled near the edge of the area with the Golcar man going nowhere. However, he was adjudged to have fouled inside the box and the ref pointed to the spot. It didn't matter, with the result settled by this point, but Golcar's number 9 duly converted to make it 6-1. Radz headed over from a corner soon after, but the last quarter of an hour petered out without further incident. FT 1-6. It was a chastening experience for The Boys in Blue, who showed glimpses of attacking threat but were undone by defensive lapses and individual mistakes. But that's football and we're bloody Frickley, so we'll learn lessons, regroup, dig deep, and play for the badge next time out. WEBMASTER MOTM - the execution might have been lacking but the endeavour was never in doubt. Radz, Spence and Kilner sweated blood, and Spence was in constant motion. Match Reports (cont.)

Campion 4 Frickley 0

The Azzurri's trip to Bradford ended in a 4-0 defeat, with the contest heavily influenced by an early red card that left The Blues battling for over 75 minutes with 10 men.

The game began normally enough, with Tom A swinging in a dangerous cross inside 2 minutes that narrowly evaded teammates.

But on 15 minutes the match turned as Campion broke through on goal and Radz, as last man, pulled down the striker. The ref had little hesitation in showing a straight red and (you have no idea how much actual physical pain it causes me to write this) it looked the correct decision. From the resulting free kick, Campion failed to take advantage, missing the target by a yard. Then Frickley reshuffled with Tom A withdrawn from the wing to be replaced by defender Cody Collins.

Despite the numerical disadvantage, The Blues dug in. Robbo nearly improvised a breakthrough from a corner, his backheel scooped up by the home keeper, while Sykes twice denied Campion with safe stops. The hosts were restricted largely to long range efforts until the 41st minute, when a cross was hooked over Sykes to give them the lead.

Luis AF almost levelled it immediately when he raced clear but a defender got across to get a toe in.

In time added on, Campion doubled their advantage, pouncing on a rebound after Sykes' initial save, though Blues protests about the probable offside went ignored. HT 2-0.

The Blues continued to battle after the restart, with Sykes again called into action to parry away an effort on 49 minutes. Luis AF whipped in a dangerous cross in the 64th minute, but with no one on hand to convert. Campion threatened from a corner soon after, hitting the post before firing over. With legs tiring, The Azzurri introduced

Tingle and Destiny, but Campion's pressure told, late on. An 82nd minute attack down the left ended with the ball being slid over the line by a forward in a suspiciously offside looking position.

The Boys in Blue had fleeting moments through Destiny's runs and Luis AF's bursts forward, but ultimately the uphill task of playing the majority of the game a man short proved decisive.

To rub salt into the wounds, a stoppage time Campion strike, high into the net from about 12 yards, completed the rout. FT 4-0. It wasn't a 4-0 game but once we were down to 10 men and behind then it was always going to be a big ask to get anything out of the evening.

Standouts included Sykes who kept the score down and Collins for coming on early to steady the ship after the dismissal. The reception at Campion was somewhat unexpected, a foot-high LED scrolling message board proclaimed a welcome from the window of the bar.

Campion's Scotchman Road ground is slowly improving. Last season's addition of covered standing has been complemented by a lot of pricey development of the playing surface which was noticeable and is bound to encourage better

football eventually.

The Blue Faithful was unsurprisingly depleted as a result of the considerable midweek trip, but still made up a decent and vocal percentage of the crowd of 80. Reported as nearly 140. The bar must've been heaving. Campion hospitality didn't extend much past the scrolling display and chocker clubhouse



as, on the pitch, Campion's side put us to the sword despite not ever really being dominant. As ever, Campion are a physical team who are very good at winning second ball and scoring twice in the final few minutes of each half

apparently. And we'll tell ourselves that none the goals were offside. If they balance out over the course of the season, then prepare

yourself for us scoring a lot of offside goals between now and April.

They say 24 hours is a long time in, erm, non-league football. And so it proved as Tom Claisse was relieved of his

duties the next day. Regardless of results and foibles, it's always a bit sad when managers go coz we grow to love 'em, don't we?

But we're Frickley, we go on!

Linked to The Lane

I'm an incorrigible collector of old A&BC, Panini, Merlin, Topps, etc. football cards and stickers, and it struck me how many of the players pictured had links to Frickley Athletic. They might have played for or against us at some point, or are related to one of The Azzurri past or present. Or the connection might be even more tenuous! But you can be sure it was the highlight of their career ;)

North Korea's qualification for the 1966 World Cup was itself a surprise. Withdrawals lead to the Asia/Oceania

qualification consisting of a 2-legged tie between Australia and North Korea, with both legs played in Cambodia. North Korea won the first game 6-1, their opening goal scored by a certain Pak Doo-Ik, and the second 3-1 to secure their spot at the finals in England. The beaten Australians included in their side the Barnsley-born future Frickley player-

manager, Geoff Sleight. Link ticked. Read on for more of Pak Doo-Ik and his North Korean teammates' story. North Korea arrived in England as complete outsiders. Few had heard of their players and drawn in a group with Italy, Chile, and the Soviet Union, they were expected to be nothing more than a footnote in the tournament's history.

But on 19th July 1966, the script was torn apart. In the 42nd minute, that fella Pak Doo-Ik collected the ball on the edge of the penalty area and calmly swept his shot past the Italian goalkeeper. It was a goal that stunned the world. Pak Doo-Ik was then a 30 year old from Pyongyang and a corporal in the North Korean army. Pak and his teammates hung on and at full time it was North Korea 1 Italy 0.

The Italians, twice world champions and favorites to progress, were out of the World Cup. The North Koreans, written off before a ball had been kicked, were through to the quarter finals.

Stationed on Teesside, the North Koreans had already won the affection of Middlesbrough's crowd. After a 3-0 defeat to the USSR and a battling 1-1 draw with Chile, the underdogs' courage and spirit resonated with the locals. Pak's goal sealed the bond forever. Middlesbrough fans cheered as if the team were their own. Almost 3,000 of them even traveled the 150 miles to Liverpool for the quarter final to spur on their adopted heroes.

When Pak returned with surviving teammates in 2002, he spoke about that famous night "It was the day I learnt football is not all about winning. I learnt that playing football can improve diplomatic relations and promote peace."

At Goodison Park, North Korea stormed into a 3-0 lead against Portugal. But then Eusébio, one of the greatest players of all-time, took over. His 4 goals dragged Portugal back, and the North Korean dream ended in a 5-3 defeat.

Yet the North Koreans left as legends. And for his heroics, Pak was promoted from corporal to sergeant. Soon after, however, he retired from football altogether, leaving the army and

pursuing a quieter life as a gymnastics instructor. Still, his place in history remained. When Ayresome Park was demolished in 1997, a housing estate was built on the site. To mark the spot where Pak had struck his famous goal from, cast iron stud marks were embedded in the ground, a permanent reminder of the night Middlesbrough's adopted son stunned Italy. And a ticket from that game is displayed in the FIFA

World Football Museum in Zurich.

In 2008, Pak Doo-Ik was further honoured when he carried the Olympic torch on its journey through his hometown of Pyongyang. Pak Doo-Ik may not have had a long or glittering football career. He never lifted a World Cup, nor played for a glamorous European club. But with one swing of his boot, he carved out a legacy that endures to this day, a symbol of football's unique power to unite people across cultures and continents. And, as ever, a Frickley icon got in on the act and played their part ;)



Blues Squad 25/26

Joel Spence (Midfielder): Joel 90 was at Armthorpe before joining us and he's been on the books of Rotherham United before plenty of experience at Belper Town, Ossett United and Wakefield.

Deservedly won player of the season in 24/25.

Will Sykes (Goalkeeper): The Holy Goalie is a highly rated young stopper who joined us from Hallam, against whom he saved a penalty towards the end of last season.

Niall Butchart (Defender/Midfielder/Forward): The Butcher is a versatile squad member. He is a former youth teamer at Altrincham, then was at Winsford United, Swallownest, Armthorpe Welfare and Goole.

Tom Alngohuru (Midfielder/Forward): The Guru is a defender's nightmare. He joined last season from Ossett United. Prior to that he was at the York City and i2i academies, and has played almost 80 games for Pickering Town.

Luis Afonso-Ferreira (Midfielder/Forward): The Ferrari is a rapid forward who puts teams on the back foot. He has plenty experience from time at the likes of Retford United, Parkgate and Albion Sports.

Sam Cable (Forward): The Power is a handful of an attacker. Since starting out in our U19s over a decade ago, he is now in his 3rd spell with the club after spells at Barton Town, Garforth Town and others.

Will Jenkinson (Defender): Jenko is a footballing defender who joins us from Parkgate, having started out at Rotherham United.

Takunda Katsere (Defender): The Thunder is a big, strong defender with loads of potential. Has previous NCEL experience at Goole, Selby Town, Athersley Rec and Wombwell Town.

Sam Kilner (Defender): A NCEL title winner at Silsden last season, Killer is a highly proficient fullback who has also been at Buxton, Mossley, Hemsworth and Knaresborough.

Ifeanyi Nnenanua (Forward): Goes by the name of Destiny, he's a committed young striker who is always in the thick of it. He's been at the i2i academy and has previously played for Pickering Town.

Lucas Robinson (Midfielder/Forward): A rangey winger with an eye for goal, Cool Hand Lucas comes to us from Harrogate Railway but has been at Goole and Barton Town too.

Sam Tingle (Midfielder): The Sting is a smart and energetic midfielder who joins from Retford FC but also has experience at Hemsworth MW, Ponte Colls and Ossett United.

Thomas Radley (Defender): Radz is a big centre half who was skipper at Shelley last season so he naturally brings quality and leadership into our back line.

Harry Gagen (Defender): Gadge is a Rolls Royce of a defender who started out at Barnsley but has joined us from Ossett United after an initial loan spell.

Wilfey Woodham (Midfielder): Win-win is a top midfielder making the step up from our U23s side.

Tyler Sheard (Defender/Midfield/Forward): VersaTyler is another who can do a job anywhere on the park, team before self every time. And he's another of our U23s stepping up for 1st team duties.

Alfie Studd (Defender/Midfielder): The Studd Wall is a confident performer who is a local lad and has come right through our academy system.

Harley Wilson (Midfielder): With time at Penistone Church, Rossington Main, Wombwell Town and Dinnington Town, Hells Angel is an experienced midfielder at this level.


