



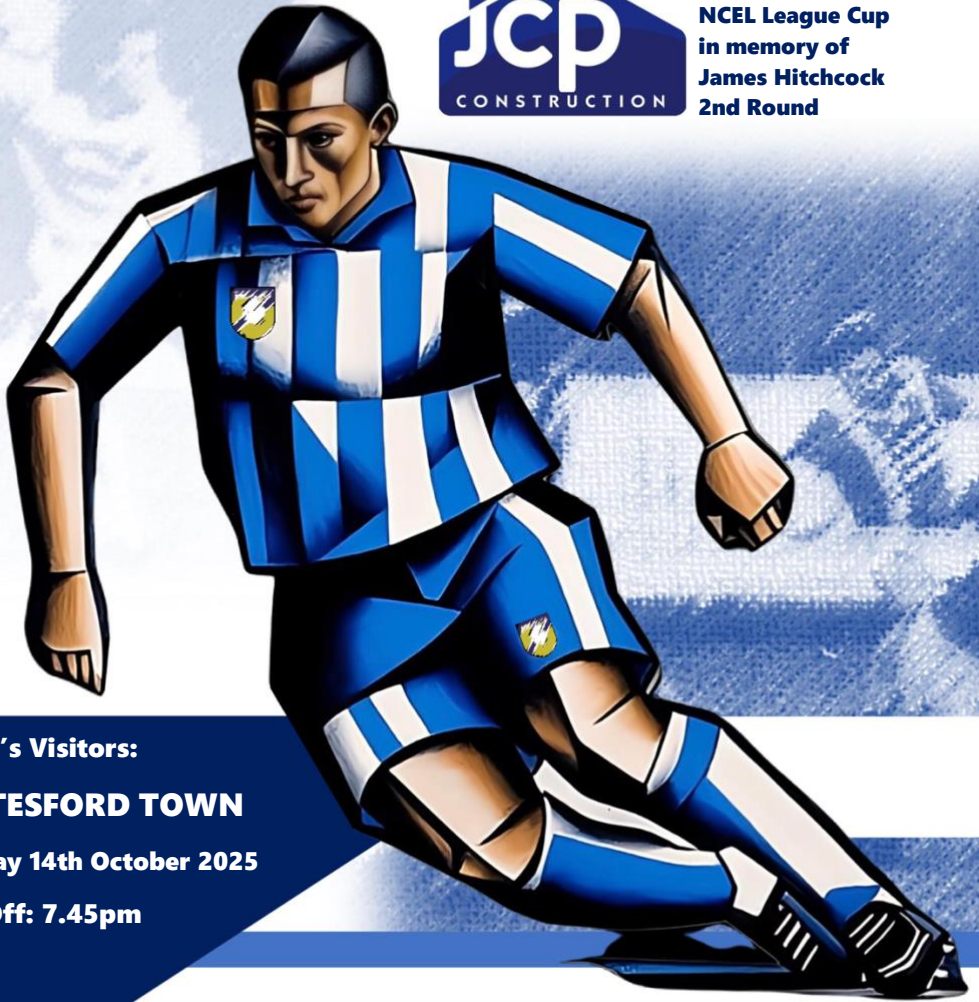

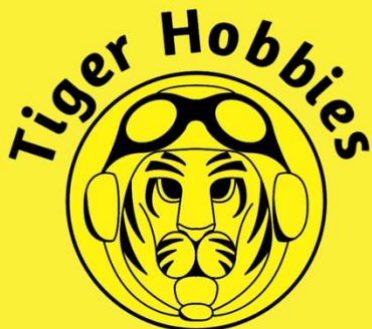

# Bluescene

Good afternoon, ladies and gentlemen, welcome to The SALUS Stadium for this evening's JCP Construction NCEL League Cup in memory of James Hitchcock 2nd round game against Bottesford Town. We give a warm welcome to Bottesford's players, officials and supporters and hope they have a safe trip home after the game.

This evening's visitors, Bottesford Town currently sit in 19th place with 9 points after 12 games. Bottesford's recent form has seen them go 9 games without a win since a 4-2 victory at Thackley at the beginning of September. Their last 3 games have been a 3-0 loss at home to highflying Liversedge, a creditable 1-1 draw at Campion and, last weekend, a 3-1 reverse in the Lincolnshire Senior Trophy at Boston Town.

The Blues come into today's game in 15th place on 14 points after 14 games. Since the departure of Tom Claisse, new boss Martyn Woolford has overseen a win sandwiched by 2 defeats, in the league. We suffered a fourth consecutive heavy league defeat when we travelled to Sheffield FC, disappointingly going down 5-0. But then we unexpectedly trounced the division's form team as goals from Tom Alngohuru, Destiny Ifeanyi Nnenanua, Lucas Robinson and Tyler Sheard carried us to a 4-1 victory at

Beverley Town. Last Saturday saw us beaten 3-0 by visitors Handsworth in a game that only got away from us at the death when ex-Blue Josh Nodder scored a brace in time added on.

Like ourselves Bottesford reach this stage of the competition by virtue of a bye in the first round. If tonight's game is drawn after 90 minutes it will go straight to a penalty shootout.

Our most recent meeting with Bottesford was our league game earlier this season in August when we lost 1-0 at Birch Park. Our last meeting here at The Wezzie was last season, in February, as Keanan Mannings's early goal wasn't enough to prevent a narrow 2-1 defeat.

Expect both sides to be looking to gain some momentum by getting a win under their belts.

Our next game sees The Blues get back to the bread and butter of league football as we travel to Golcar United on Saturday 18th October, and to Wombwell Town on Saturday 25th October, both 3pm kickoffs. The Blues are next in action here at Westfield Lane on Saturday 1st November when Rossington Main are our visitors, 3pm ko. We hope to see you all there.

Enjoy the game and as always we thank you for your valued and continued support.

# Meet The Visitors 1

The club was formed in 1974 and joined the Lincolnshire League. In 1977/78 they finished bottom of the Premier Division, but were not relegated as it was expanded from 14 to 16 clubs. However, after finishing second-from-bottom the following season, they were relegated to Division One. In 1987 the league was reduced to a single division, which the club became members of. In 1986/87 they won the League Cup, a feat they repeated in 1988/89 and 1989/90. The latter season also saw them win the league for the first time, and they went on to retain the title for the next two seasons. They were runners-up in 1993/94, and in 2000 they joined the Premier Division of the Central Midlands League. After finishing third in their first season in the division, they were promoted to the Supreme Division. However, they were relegated back to the Premier Division at the end of the 2002/03 season after finishing bottom of the Supreme Division.

In 2005/06 Bottesford finished third in the Premier Division, earning promotion to the Supreme Division. The following season saw them crowned league champions, resulting in promotion to Division One of the Northern Counties East League. The club finished a very creditable third in 2007/08, their first season in the NCEL. In 2015/16 they finished third again, qualifying for the promotion playoffs. After beating Hallam 2-0 in the semi finals, they won the final against AFC Emley 4-3 on penalties following a 1-1 draw to earn promotion to the Premier Division where they have played for the last 6 seasons, mainly hovering around mid-table.

The original base was at the Dolphin pub, with the football being played at Frederick Gough School in Scunthorpe. The Club moved to its current Birch Park home in 1983. It currently holds 1,000, of which 90 is seated and 300 covered.

The club has for many years supported the local Scunthorpe and district adult football leagues. The year 2000 saw the amalgamation of the junior and senior clubs clearly demonstrating that players starting with the club at the age of 6 could be encouraged to stay with the club for their progress in football. The club today has 26 teams both boys and girls playing mini-soccer in the local Caparo League, 11 a-side teams in the Kalsen League, Lincolnshire County Girls League, youth football being played in the

Lincolnshire Intermediate Premier League, and a development squad playing in the Central Midlands Football League.

In 2018, a new addition to the club was the introduction of the DS Active team for individuals who are Down's Syndrome. The team has grown from strength to strength and they now participate in league football with a target of representing England in the Special Olympics.

One of the club's proudest moment was in 2003 when they became a FA Charter Standard Community Club, being one of the first clubs in the country at that time to get the achievement. The club had to work very hard to meet all of the FA criteria and is now reaping the benefits and rewards.

In 2009, the club achieved the distinction of being named the FA Charter Standard Club of the Year by the Lincolnshire Football Association, a reward for the efforts of the members of the club.

This massive involvement in grassroots football and its development has seen the provision of enhanced facilities to support the same, with the development of magnificent changing rooms and a meeting room facility in 2009 for the use of all those who play their sport at Birch Park. More recently with the aid of grant support from both the North Lincolnshire and Bottesford Town Councils, together with the Football Foundation, 2019 witnessed the acquisition of a new tractor and grass cutting maintenance equipment plus the replacement of the floodlights for the main pitch with a modern LED installation.

The floodlighting was designed with the conversion to a 3G playing surface in mind. The 3G pitch was finally installed during the second half of 2022/23, in time for the start of the 2023/24 season. The club played its home games at Winterton Rangers and Appleby Frodingham during this time, and finished 18th in the division. A new catering facility was also completed to serve the needs of Birch Park's future visitors. The return to Birch Park in 2023/24 promised to be an exciting juncture in the history of the club and the improved standard of football belied the eventual 17th and 16th place finishes in the league over the past 2 seasons.

Manager Leigh Herrick will be looking to continue the club's exciting progress and climb the table in 2025/26.





## Meet The Visitors 2

**James Leverton (Goalkeeper):** James joins the club from Grantham, having previously been at Gainsborough Trinity. Manchester United paid Barnsley for James's services when he was in Barnsley's academy and he is now looking to establishing himself as the club's new number 1.

**Harry Stabler (Goalkeeper):** Harry is a confident young keeper who has been promoted to the first team this season after 2 successful seasons with the club's U18s.

**Luke Bullement (Defender):** Luke has a few year's experience in the NCEL with Hall Road Rangers and Bottesford, and has the qualities to be a real top player in this league.

**Mason Chaffer (Defender):** A fit, strong and talented left back, Mason has come back for a third season and showed why he had interest from numerous step 4 clubs.

**Taron Hare (Defender):** An ex-professional at Scunthorpe United, York City and Boston United, Taz joins the club having spent the last few seasons at Barton Town. Taz made the centre half position his own from day one with his commanding presence and leadership qualities.

**Clay Bryant (Defender):** Clay rejoined the football club this summer having previously being captain. A leader, a proper defender, Clay's never say die attitude will rub off on everyone around him.

**Steve Ridley (Coach/Midfielder):** Steve joined the club last season, following his departure as Winterton Rangers manager. At 43 years of age, he brings a wealth of experience to the club. Steve also coaches our under 16's team and everyone at the club is delighted he is part of the first team set up.

**Scott Matthews (Midfielder):** Scott is another that has returned to the club this season. Scott is a experienced player who has been given the skipper's armband this year. Scott has experience at this level and steps 3 and 4 and is a proven winner and will be looking to carry that on this season.

**Josh Eccles (Midfielder):** Josh has experience in this league with Barton Town but has also won all there is to win in Hull with the

very successful Chalk Lane FC side. Josh is all energy, box to box midfielder and will bring bundles of energy to this season's midfield.

**Eddie Rodgerson (Midfielder):** Eddie is an experienced centre midfielder who dictates play from a holding role. Eddie has experience at this level and steps 3 and 4 with North Ferriby, Bridlington Town, Grimsby Borough and Barton Town.

**Jaxon Borland (Midfielder):** Jaxon is a product of the Bottesford Town U18s JPL team who has broken into the 1st team. Energetic, confident and determined to succeed, Jaxon has great potential to improve in our environment.

**Kieran McCaffrey (Midfielder):** Kieran has the qualities on and off the pitch that make him an extremely popular team member, Caff gives real strength down the spine of the team.

**Josh Nichol (Midfielder):** Josh is no nonsense, aggressive and has an excellent football brain. Can operate in numerous positions, Josh will be a vital part of the group this season.

**Luke Ayris (Forward):** Luke is a product of the club's youth system. Luke has great speed and a real eye for goal from the wide areas. Luke is a really dangerous player at this level.

**Jack Mcmenemy (Forward):** A real coup for Bottesford Town to bring Jack Mac back to the club after a spell away. Jack has scored goals wherever he has been and was a pivotal part of Lincoln United recent success.

**Jake Brown (Forward):** Jake is an exciting young player who joined from Grimsby Borough. Jake is a quick, tricky, direct player who was on the books at Hull City spending 10 years there from the age of 8 to 18.

**Blake Gregory (Defender/Forward):** Blake is his 3rd season now after making the step up to 1st team football from the clubs U18s. He is versatile, playing left back, left wing and as a central forward and one of the best trainers in the group.

**Aris Cunha Jr (Forward):** Aris's arrival at the club last season took the league by storm. A strong striker with great ability.





# Frickley's History

Frickley Athletic FC is based in the former coal mining village of South Elmsall. Recent research has shown that the first South Elmsall football team was formed in 1905 but was superseded in 1908 by the newly formed Frickley Colliery Athletic Club and joined the South Yorkshire league which comprised of works, church and village teams. In 1910, the football club moved to the Sheffield Association League and first played in the FA Cup.

The club remained in the Sheffield Association League (except for the war years) until 1922, finishing runners up in 1911/12, and winners in 1920/21, our only ever league title.

In 1922/23 Frickley joined the Yorkshire league and after finishing runners up in 1923/24, the club were elected into the Midland League. Although the club had to apply for re election several times pre war (and didn't play in any league in 1933/34) it was kept going by the support of the mineworkers and the sale of players.

1936/37 was Frickley's worst ever league season when the club finished bottom with only 8 points, but amazingly reached the FA Cup 1<sup>st</sup> round proper for the first time.

Post war, Frickley remained in the Midland league gaining its best finish, 7<sup>th</sup>, in 1945/46, but left the league on its break up at the end of 1959/60.

From 1960/61 to 1969/70, Frickley Colliery played in the Cheshire County League. However, financial considerations led the club to join the Midland Counties League for 1970/71. They finished runners up in 1972/73, and were eventually elected into the NPL for the 1976/77 season as Frickley Athletic.

After finishing 3<sup>rd</sup> in 1979/80, the club was promoted into the Alliance Premier League, now the National League. Here they remained for 7 years, the most successful in the club's history, and in 1985/86 reached the FA Cup 3<sup>rd</sup> round proper, after beating a Football League club, Hartlepool Utd, only to lose 3-1 at home to Rotherham Utd. The club also finished as Gola League runners up. The following season saw a reversal as we were relegated back to the NPL. From 1987/88 to 1991/92 the club consistently finished around mid-table in the NPL, but did manage to reach the league cup final in 1991/92, losing 1-0 to Marine at Maine Road.

The next few seasons saw Frickley finish in the lower reaches of the table. Then, in 2005/06 The

Blues had their best league season for 20 years, finishing 2nd to Blyth Spartans. Unfortunately, the Blues lost on penalties in the playoff semi.

In the following seasons Frickley returned to the lower half of the table, but 2015/16 saw the club have a great season to finish 7<sup>th</sup>.

In 2016/17, most of the players who had brought this success were attracted to more affluent clubs. The club were relegated from the NPL Premier Division after a 30 year stay.

2017/18 saw the club enter the NPL Division 1 South, finishing 3<sup>rd</sup> in the league, scoring a record 117 goals. Additionally, Jacob Hazel broke the club record for individual goals in a season with 47 strikes. The season ended disappointingly with playoff semi final defeat at the hands of Stamford.

2018/19, in the new NPL East Division, was less successful, seeing managerial changes and a 12<sup>th</sup> place finish. However, the season had its highlights, with victory at highflying Morpeth and a 10-1 win over Liversedge in the FA Cup.

More change followed prior to the start of 2019/20. A further league reorganisation which put The Blues into the NPL South East Division was accompanied by a new manager. An inauspicious start lead to the appointment of Dave Frecklington in September 2019.

Frecks rapidly turned the side's fortunes around, before lockdown ended the season. 2020/21 ultimately suffered the same fate.

Frecks built what looked like strong squad for the 2021/22 season in the newly formed NPL East Division. However, things didn't pan out as hoped. Key departures lead to a run of form that saw the club relegated to the Northern Counties East League for the first time in our history.

In the summer of 2022, former Blue, Wayne Benn, was installed as manager, with ex-Frickley goal scoring legend Andy Hayward as his assistant. There were occasional highs but Benn resigned in early 2023 so Patrick McGuire came in to avoid a second successive relegation.

2023/24 started well, and included an 8-0 win at Goole, but ended with the release of McGuire.

James Baxendale was in the hot seat for the start of 2024/25 but left to be replaced by Tom Claisse in November 2024 and successfully avoided the drop before being relieved of his duties in September 2025.

Club legend Martyn Woolford has taken the reigns and he'll be looking to roll back the years and bring winning ways back to Westfield Lane.

## Keeper saves cup tie penalty

**KEEPER** Ian Taylor saved a penalty as Frickley Athletic beat Stourbridge 2-1 in the F.A. Umbro Trophy 1st round with two goals in as many minutes in an explosive finale.

The tie got off to a lively start although neither side was able to stamp their authority on exchanges and the Beazer Homes Central Division side suffered a setback in the 24th minute when keeper Matt Lowe was stretchered off with an ankle injury.

Substitute David Daley was soon in action, saving efforts by Adrian Wells and Miles Thorpe, while the Blues made a substitution in the 40th minute, Scott Armstrong coming on for Chris Hilton and immediately giving the visiting attack some extra vigour.

Two minutes after the interval Stourbridge had a chance to break the deadlock when Thorpe tripped Jason

Smith in the penalty area but Taylor flung himself to the right to hold Smith's spot kick. Frickley came more into exchanges and went in front after 62 minutes, a free kick by Mark Dempsey finding Thorpe who powered in a header from eight yards.

Four minutes later Billy Whitehurst came on for Simon Fuller, who was still carrying an injury, and the Blues tried hard to improve their advantage.

They were rocked in the 82nd minute, however, when Stuart Payne broke down the middle and finished his solo run with a cracking drive which left Taylor stranded and levelled the scores.

But Frickley's response was immediate, Armstrong weaving his way along the goal-line before hitting an angled shot which Daley could only parry and Wells raced in to knock home the rebound and earn the Blues a visit to Great Harwood Town in the 2nd round on November 4.

# Match Report

## Frickley 0 Handsworth 3

Martyn Woolford's first game as permanent Frickley Athletic manager ended in a harsh 3-0 defeat at home to Handsworth, a scoreline that flattered the visitors and did little justice to the Blues' encouraging performance.

The Blues started the game looking sharp in possession, playing the kind of neat, attacking football Woolly is keen to instill.

The opposition should've been down to 10 men inside the opening 6 minutes as Spence was scythed down by a 2 footed tackle but there wasn't even a yellow card shown. The same player was yellow carded for another lesser foul minutes afterwards. Hmm...

Gagen went close with a powerful attempt that flew just inches over the bar after a tricky run into the box. At the other end, ex-Blue Tyler Williams drew a smart save from Sykes, but Frickley

responded through Sheard, who beat the Williams down the flank but saw his cross overshoot everyone in the middle.

Handsworth had a speculative donkey bothering effort from distance around the 25 minute mark from nearly 40 yards. Otherwise, Sykes remained largely untroubled thanks to some excellent defending from TK and Jenko at the heart of the defence.

There was chaos in the box following a Butch free kick, and just before the break, Tom and Destiny both went close, the latter hitting the side netting after a lively run by the former.

At the break it remained goalless, with The Azzurri arguably the better side. HT 0-0.

The visitors started the second half well, heading wide from a long ball, but The Blues soon regained composure. Gagen's cross found Sheard, who nodded down for Butch, but the midfielder couldn't quite connect cleanly.

The breakthrough came for Handsworth on 55 minutes, when Les Blues failed to clear the ball pinging around the box. We paid the price when the visitors' number 10 reacted quickest to convert from a couple of yards after the ball came back off the post.

The Azzurri pushed for an equaliser with TK, Cable, Jenko and Tom all going close, with Tom's header the pick of the bunch, shaving the top of the bar, after fine link up play from Kilner and Butch.

Despite the pressure, Handsworth continued to threaten on the break. Sykes was called into action again as a Handsworth forward inexplicably hit the post when through 1 on 1, after going 10 yards clear.

As the game entered stoppage time, Frickley were still in the contest, but two quick goals on the counter attack in the dying minutes saw Handsworth seal the points. Another ex-Blue Josh Nodder scored in the 93rd minute and then put away a carbon copy in the 95th minute to add insult to injury. FT 3-0.

It was a cruel ending for Woolly's side that had shown plenty of promise and intent in the new incumbent's first outing as permanent boss. The Blues' football was easy on the eye and, for long spells, they matched and outplayed their

opponents. I left determined to inwardly bask in the glory, coz it never lasts long enough, does it?



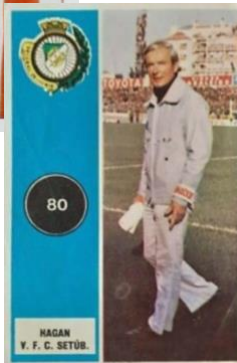
## Linked to The Lane

I'm an incorrigible collector of old A&BC, Panini, Merlin, Topps, etc. football cards and stickers, and it struck me how many of the players pictured had links to Frickley Athletic. They might have played for or against us at some point, or are related to one of The Azzurri past or present. Or the connection might be even more tenuous! But you can be sure it was the highlight of their career ;)

Jimmy Hagan played at The Wezzie in a charity game with Sheffield United and managed old Midland League foes Peterborough United here too. Let me tell you more about this footballing legend.

Jimmy was born in 1918 in Washington, County Durham, into a footballing family, his father Alfie having played for Newcastle United, Cardiff City and Tranmere Rovers. From an early age Hagan displayed considerable footballing talent, representing England at schoolboy level before joining Washington Colliery and later Usworth Colliery. His ability soon attracted professional attention, and he joined Liverpool's ground staff before moving to Derby County at 15 years of age. Hagan remained at Derby until 1938, when Sheffield United signed him.

He made an immediate impact at Bramall Lane, scoring on his debut against Swansea Town and quickly establishing himself as one of United's best players. In his first season, United won promotion to the First Division. The outbreak of the Second World War interrupted his career, but on resumption of league football in 1946 Hagan rejoined the Blades, and became a club talisman over the next decade. His loyalty was legendary, in 1951 he rejected a transfer to Sheffield Wednesday despite United having agreed to sell him for what would have been a British record fee of £32,500. Instead, he stayed with the Blades, eventually retiring in 1957 after 361 league appearances and 117 league goals, placing him firmly among the club's greats.



His solitary England cap came in 1948 in a goalless draw with Denmark. After hanging up his boots, Hagan embarked on a managerial career that would see him achieve international renown. His first post came with Peterborough United in 1958. There, he oversaw the club's election to the Football League and had immediate success, winning the Fourth Division title in 1960/61 with his side scoring 134 goals, still a record for any EFL team in a season. This earned him the attention of higher level clubs,

and in 1963 he was appointed manager of West Bromwich Albion. At the Hawthorns, he guided Albion to victory in the 1966 League Cup, though he left the club shortly after.

It was in Portugal, however, that Hagan truly left his mark. When he took the job as manager of Benfica in 1970, he inherited a talented side filled in need of renewed drive. Hagan's tough approach bore spectacular results. He led Benfica to 3 consecutive Primeira Liga titles between 1970 and 1973, as well as the Portuguese Cup in 1972. His

greatest domestic triumph came in 1972/73 when he guided the Lisbon giants to an unbeaten league season, winning 28 out of 30 matches and scoring over 100 goals - Eusébio was Europe's top scorer with 40 goals. Hagan also led Benfica to the semifinals of the European Cup, where they were narrowly beaten by Johan Cruyff's Ajax, one of the great teams of the era.

Although he left Benfica in 1973 following a dispute over Eusébio's testimonial, Hagan remained in Portugal for much of the rest of his managerial career. He managed Estoril Praia, Sporting Lisbon, Vitória de Setúbal, and Belenenses, before returning to prominence with Boavista, where he won the Portuguese Cup in 1979. This established him as one of the most successful foreign managers to work in Portugal. In 2001, after his passing a bronze statue of Jimmy Hagan was unveiled at Sheffield United's Bramall Lane, with Eusébio himself present to pay tribute to the man who had been both mentor and friend - his reputation forged in the white hot crucible of The Wezzie. You're welcome ;)

**Will Sykes (Goalkeeper):** The Holy Goalie is a highly rated young stopper who joined us from Hallam, against whom he saved a penalty towards the end of last season.

**Niall Butchart (Defender/Midfielder/Forward):** The Butcher is a versatile squad member. He is a former youth teamer at Altrincham, then was at Winsford United, Swallownest, Armthorpe Welfare and Goole.

**Tom Alngohuru (Midfielder/Forward):** The Guru is a defender's nightmare. He joined last season from Ossett United. Prior to that he was at the York City and i2i academies, and has played almost 80 games for Pickering Town.

**Luis Afonso-Ferreira (Midfielder/Forward):** The Ferrari is a rapid forward who puts teams on the back foot. He has plenty experience from time at the likes of Retford United, Parkgate and Albion Sports.

**Sam Cable (Forward):** The Power is a handful of an attacker. Since starting out in our U19s over a decade ago, he is now in his 3rd spell with the club after spells at Barton Town, Garforth Town and others.

**Will Jenkinson (Defender):** Jenko is a footballing defender who joins us from Parkgate, having started out at Rotherham United.

**Takunda Katsere (Defender):** The Thunder is a big, strong defender with loads of potential. Has previous NCEL experience at Goole, Selby Town, Athersley Rec and Wombwell Town.

**Sam Kilner (Defender):** A NCEL title winner at Silsden last season, Killer is a highly proficient fullback who has also been at Buxton, Mossley, Hemsworth and Knaresborough.

**Ifeanyi Nnenanua (Forward):** Goes by the name of Destiny, he's a committed young striker who is always in the thick of it. He's been at the i2i academy and has previously played for Pickering Town.

**Lucas Robinson (Midfielder/Forward):** A rangy winger with an eye for goal, Cool Hand Lucas comes to us from Harrogate Railway but has been at Goole and Barton Town too.

**Thomas Radley (Defender):** Radz is a big centre half who was skipper at Shelley last season so he naturally brings quality and leadership into our back line.

**Harry Gagen (Defender):** Gadge is a Rolls Royce of a defender who started out at Barnsley but has joined us from Ossett United after an initial loan spell.

**Tyler Sheard (Defender/Midfield/Forward):** VersaTyler is another who can do a job anywhere on the park, team before self every time. And he's another of our U23s stepping up for 1st team duties.

**Alfie Studd (Defender/Midfielder):** The Studd Wall is a confident performer who is a local lad and has come right through our academy system.

**Jack Horobin (Defender):** Jack The Lad has stepped up from the U18s to make his debut as very capable defensive cover.

**Ashton Johnson (Midfielder):** AJ is an exciting young winger from our U18s who recently made his debut, getting a booking and an assist within 5 minutes of coming on!

**Harley Wilson (Midfielder):** With time at Penistone Church, Rossington Main, Wombwell Town and Dinnington Town, Hells Angel is an experienced midfielder at this level.

**Harold Edjangu (Goalkeeper):** The Mantis is a talented keeper from Yorkshire Amateurs, great backup for Sykesy.

**Donnell Garrick (Midfield/Forward):** The Director General is a young winger who joins us from Huddersfield Town's academy. He has also played for Emley's youth setup and Ossett United on loan.
