Bluescene

Good afternoon, ladies and gentlemen, welcome to The SALUS Stadium for today's Northern Counties East Premier Division game against Rossington Main. We give a warm welcome to Rossington's players, officials and supporters and hope they have a safe trip home after the game.

Today's match ball is sponsored by Juratek. We thank them for their kind support of the club.

This afternoon's visitors, Rossington, currently sit in 17th place on 15 points after 14 games. After a tough start to the campaign, Rossington's recent form has picked up with just 1 defeat in their 7 games in all competitions since the start of October. In their last 3 league outings, Rosso trounced Parkgate 5-2 at Roundwood before losing by the odd goal in 7 at home to highflying Liversedge, then last Saturday, they left it late to beat bottom placed visitors Horbury Town 2-1.

The Blues come into today's game in 15th place on 17 points after 16 games. Since we unexpectedly won 4-1 at Beverley Town, with the goals coming from Tom Alngohuru, Destiny Ifeanyi Nnenanua, Lucas Robinson and Tyler Sheard, league form took a nosedive, losing 3-0 at home to Handsworth before suffering a 6-0 rout at Golcar United. However, last weekend's derby game at Wombwell Town ended in a 2-0 victory to stop the rot, with Charlie Clegg coming off the bench to score, added to by a late Lucas Robinson strike.

Cup football has recently been altogether more positive. Sandwiched between the heavy defeats against Handsworth and Golcar, one of the most remarkable games ever witnessed at The Wezzie saw The Blues Edge out visitors Bottesford Town 7-6 in the NCEL League Cup – the highest aggregate score in the competition's 40-odd year history. Coming from 5-1 down, goals from Tom

Radley, Tom Alngohuru, Martyn Woolford, Destiny Ifeanyi Nnenanua and a Sam Cable hat trick, including his injury time winner, did just enough to get us into the next round where we will face Golcar, here at The Wezzie at the end of the month. And on Wednesday, we faced Jubilee Sports in the Sheffield Senior Cup, moving into the next round with a 3-0 win, courtesy of a Tom Alngohuru opener and a brace from Destiny.

Our most recent meetings with Rossington Main were last season's pair of league games. In our meeting in August 2024, a second half header from Callum Brook earned us a point at Oxford Street. In the return game at The Wezzie in December 2024, The Blues put in one of the best performances of the season, winning 4-0 with the goals coming from Marcel Chipamunga, Rob Guilfoyle, Al Keita and Jamie Tomlinson. Rosso will be bringing a few familiar faces as ex-Blues Will Sutton, Cody Prior, Cammy Hough, Reece Fielding, Liam King and record appearance maker Paul Sherburn are in their squad, along with boss Greg Young – another ex-Frickley man.

Expect The Blues to be doing all they can to continue last week's improvements and to take the spoils from this 6 pointer of a local derby.

In recruitment news, midfielder Sam Heselwood has signed from Selby Town and forward and local lad Charlie Clegg has re-signed from Club Thorne. Both announced themselves with a bang on their debuts at Wombwell Town. We wish both of them the best of luck.

Our next game sees The Blues travel to NCEL newbies Horbury Town on Saturday 8th November, 3pm kickoff. The Blues are next in action here at Westfield Lane on Tuesday 11th November when Pickering Town are our visitors, 7.45pm ko. We hope to see you all there. Enjoy the game and as always we thank you for your valued and continued support.

Meet The Visitors

Formed in 1919 when 'Rossington Colliery' entered the Sheffield Association League, playing their fixtures on ground at the back of the Colliery offices. A club had competed under the Rossington Colliery name in 1917, but only since 1919 has the club been in continued existence. The club moved to their current Oxford Street ground in 1923, and just a couple of years later enjoyed their best ever run in the FA Cup, reaching the 4th Qualifying Round in 1924/25, where they were beaten 3-0 at Lincoln City. The club enjoyed its most successful season at the end of the WWII when they won both the Doncaster Senior League and Cup in 1944/45. In 1948, due to nationalization of the mines, the club underwent a name change to Rossington Miners Welfare, and it was under this moniker they lifted the Doncaster Senior League Premier Division Cup in 1974.

1983 saw a name change to Rossington Main, and as founder members of the Central Midlands League, they won the Premier Division and Premier Division Cup in the second year in that league.

In 1984, floodlights were erected at the Oxford Street ground, which have been upgraded to new LED lights. And in 1991, new changing rooms were built at Oxford Street, and a crowd of 1200 attended the inaugural match against Leeds United. That same year, the club earned promotion to the NCEL (Northern Counties East League), Division 1, and remained in the same division until the end of last season.

The club merged with CML neighbours Rossington FC in 1998. Rossington FC were formed as Station FC in the 1970s as a Sunday team, but progressed rapidly, joining the CML in 1986. They had early success but League expectations and finances led to the merger.

The early noughties were possibly the most successful period for the new merged club with 9 trophies in the first 13 years along with 9 Runners/up spots in that time.

Highlights included the Reserves winning the Doncaster & District FA Challenge Cup in 2003 and the first team being runners up in the NCEL Wilkinson Sword Trophy in 2011. Also, the first team had their best season, breaking club goalscoring and points records to finish 7th. During 2008, long time Chairman Carl Stokes took over the running of the club and wasted no

time in introducing changes on and off the pitch. Off the field, improvements to the ground were rewarded with a prestigious preseason friendly in 2008 against Doncaster Rovers. A record crowd of 1245 enabled the club to start the season on a sound financial footing.

The club took major step forward in 2014 with the joining together with the junior sections with them rebranding as Rossington Main Juniors and the Reserves as the Development Squad, with the intention of bringing through the best of the local talent, hopefully to play for the first team and beyond. Further to this, in 2015 Main entered into a scheme run by Doncaster Rovers to promote sport and education amongst youngsters.

As with all clubs, managers come and go. Recent managers have included former Scarborough Athletic Reserves manager Steve Brennan, record goal scorer Lee Holmes, Chris Glarvey and Ryan Hindley, all of whom have crucially overseen NCEL survival.

Ben Hunter took charge in 2019, assisted by Matt Ellison and Sam Parkin, and they brought in a group of promising young footballers. In 2022, Rossington Main had a successful season in Division One, finishing 5th in the league with 81 points from 40 games. However, they lost 2-0 in the playoff semi final against North Ferriby.

For the 2022/23 season, Hunter made changes to his backroom and playing staff. The team achieved promotion to non-league step 5 for the first time in the club's history after winning the NCEL Division 1 playoffs, defeating Horbury 3-1 at home in front of a crowd of 1164 spectators. 2023/24 started with the experienced Zeph Thomas, ex-Frickley and a St Kitts & Nevis international, being added as assistant manager. The club then announced their arrival at step 5 with their attractive football, achieving an amazing 4th place finish. Unfortunately, a defeat on penalties in the playoff semi final to eventual winners Garforth Town was to follow.

Ben Hunter stepped down after a disappointing first month of the 2024/25 season and former Grimsby Town (and Frickley) defender Greg Young took up the hot seat and they recovered to achieve a mid-table finish.

Greg and his team will be looking to build on Rosso's achievements of recent seasons.





Frickley's History

Frickley Athletic FC is based in the former coal mining village of South Elmsall. Recent research has shown that the first South Elmsall football team was formed in 1905 but was superseded in 1908 by the newly formed Frickley Colliery Athletic Club and joined the South Yorkshire league which comprised of works, church and village teams. In 1910, the football club moved to the Sheffield Association League and first played in the FA Cup.

The club remained in the Sheffield Association League (except for the war years) until 1922, finishing runners up in 1911/12, and winners in 1920/21, our only ever league title.

In 1922/23 Frickley joined the Yorkshire league and after finishing runners up in 1923/24, the club were elected into the Midland League. Although the club had to apply for re election several times pre war (and didn't play in any league in 1933/34) it was kept going by the support of the mineworkers and the sale of players.

1936/37 was Frickley's worst ever league season when the club finished bottom with only 8 points, but amazingly reached the FA Cup 1st round proper for the first time.

Post war, Frickley remained in the Midland league gaining its best finish, 7th, in 1945/46, but left the league on its break up at the end of 1959/60.

From 1960/61 to 1969/70, Frickley Colliery played in the Cheshire County League. However, financial considerations led the club to join the Midland Counties League for 1970/71. They finished runners up in 1972/73, and were eventually elected into the NPL for the 1976/77 season as Frickley Athletic.

After finishing 3rd in 1979/80, the club was promoted into the Alliance Premier League, now the National League. Here they remained for 7 years, the most successful in the club's history, and in 1985/86 reached the FA Cup 3rd round proper, after beating a Football League club, Hartlepool Utd, only to lose 3-1 at home to Rotherham Utd. The club also finished as Gola League runners up. The following season saw a reversal as we were relegated back to the NPL. From 1987/88 to 1991/92 the club consistently finished around mid-table in the NPL, but did manage to reach the league cup final in 1991/92, losing 1-0 to Marine at Maine Road.

The next few seasons saw Frickley finish in the lower reaches of the table. Then, in 2005/06 The

Blues had their best league season for 20 years, finishing 2nd to Blyth Spartans. Unfortunately, the Blues lost on penalties in the playoff semi.

In the following seasons Frickley returned to the lower half of the table, but 2015/16 saw the club have a great season to finish 7th.

In 2016/17, most of the players who had brought this success were attracted to more affluent clubs. The club were relegated from the NPL Premier Division after a 30 year stay.

2017/18 saw the club enter the NPL Division 1 South, finishing 3rd in the league, scoring a record 117 goals. Additionally, Jacob Hazel broke the club record for individual goals in a season with 47 strikes. The season ended disappointingly with playoff semi final defeat at the hands of Stamford.

2018/19, in the new NPL East Division, was less successful, seeing managerial changes and a 12th place finish. However, the season had its highlights, with victory at highflying Morpeth and a 10-1 win over Liversedge in the FA Cup.

More change followed prior to the start of 2019/20. A further league reorganisation which put The Blues into the NPL South East Division was accompanied by a new manager. An inauspicious start lead to the appointment of Dave Frecklington in September 2019.

Frecks rapidly turned the side's fortunes around, before lockdown ended the season. 2020/21 ultimately suffered the same fate.

Frecks built what looked like strong squad for the 2021/22 season in the newly formed NPL East Division. However, things didn't pan out as hoped. Key departures lead to a run of form that saw the club relegated to the Northern Counties East League for the first time in our history.

In the summer of 2022, former Blue, Wayne Benn, was installed as manager, with ex-Frickley goal scoring legend Andy Hayward as his assistant. There were occasional highs but Benn resigned in early 2023 so Patrick McGuire came in to avoid a second successive relegation.

2023/24 started well, and included an 8-0 win at Goole, but ended with the release of McGuire.

James Baxendale was in the hot seat for the start of 2024/25 but left to be replaced by Tom Claisse in November 2024 and successfully avoided the drop before being relieved of his duties in September 2025.

Club legend Martyn Woolford has taken the reigns and he'll be looking to roll back the years and bring winning ways back to Westfield Lane.

The first match was against Chester Reserves in the Cheshire County League, played on Saturday 3rd November 1962, here at The Wezzie. Frickley were superior

CHESTER RESERVES are the latest victims of the much improved Frickley Collery, and they had to admit defeat by 3-0 to superior opponents in a Cheshire County League match at Westfield Lane, on Saturday.

Though Chester had a fair share of the game their forwards lacked the shooting ability of the Frickley men, who were denied more success only by Barton's sound goalkeeping.

Chester had a clever inside-right in Hewitt, but the remaining forwards were unable to exploit the openings he created for them owing to a cast-iron Frickley defence. Centre-half Bunn kept a tight grip on centre-forward Jones, and wing halves Roberts and Orange, and full-backs Haughton and Collinson, gave little latitude to the remaining forwards.

The Chester defence had a trying time against a fast moving, sharpshooting Frickley attack in which Swann and Holmes, the left wing pair, were prominent.

In an even first half HOLMES gave Frickley the lead after 12 minutes from an opening made by Davies.

Chester were outclassed in the second half, and SWANN added the second goal after 50 minutes.

A penalty awarded against Barton for pulling down Davies was converted by ORANGE for the third goal after 68 minutes.

Frickley win FA Cup replay

Chorley..... 0 Frickley Athletic..... 1

FRICKLEY reached the first round proper of the FA Cup for the tenth time in their history with a magnificent display at Chorley on Tuesday evening.

Battling striker Micky Downing grabbed the vital goal two minutes into the second-half but really Athletic had heroes in every position.

Central-defenders John Peachey and Mally Wright were towers of strength at the back even under the most intense pressure, Peter Howey and Colin Bishop ran and tackled their hearts out in midfield and the front-men chased everything on a glorious night for the Blues.

Frickley travelled to Lancashire as underdogs and their task seemed very much an uphill one as early as the first minute when Keeper Gary Weighill was forced to pull off a brilliant one-handed save to deny Brian Ross.

It was certainly a hectic start for Weighill who was unbelievably booked before the kick off for shouting something the referee did not wish to hear. The keeper made amends many times over however with a commanding display.

The GM Vauxhall Conference outfit dominated the first-half with best chances falling to Redshaw and Brady. Redshaw was denied by the inside of the post while Brady was unable to beat the superb Weighill.

Frickley on the other hand only hinted at what was to come with Woodhead and Downing both going close with opportunist efforts.

Two minutes after the break they more than hinted. The classy Birch was fouled wide on the right and the quick free-kick into the area was won by Downing.

He beat a defender in the air, then held off another and the over-committed keeper before stabbing home a typical cup-tie goal with his left foot.

From then on the game followed a tension-packed pattern. Chorley used the long ball to throw everything up-front while Frickley relied on some excellent quick breaks which almost brought them more goals.

Birch saw a fine effort go just over the bar and Downing had a shot fumbled by unhappy keeper Colin Ridler. At the other end Frickley survived several anxious moments before claiming a deserved passage into the first round and a home tie with Northwich Victoria.

Match Reports

Frickley 7 Bottesford Town 6 (NCEL League Cup)

The Azzurri secured the most astonishing victory in recent history, roaring back from a seemingly hopeless 5-1 deficit against Bottesford Town to win a 13-goal thriller 7-6.

The match exploded into life immediately. In the first 12 seconds, Cable signalled Frickley's attacking intent, charging down a pass only to skew his one-on-one shot wide.

The Blues seized the advantage in the 12th minute when Woolly's corner was partially cleared, allowing Tom to pick up the loose ball and cross for Radz to head home for 1-0.

However, the lead was short-lived, marking the start of a devastating spell for the visitors. Bottesford hit back in the 18th minute with ball over the top and a 15-yard strike by ex-Blue Jack McMenemy, to equalize. This was quickly followed by a carbon copy McMenemy goal for Bottesford in the 22nd minute.

Despite a brief spell of pressure, with Cable going one-on-one again only to be blocked twice.

Bottesford were clinical as McMenemy netted 2 more goals in the 42nd minute to complete his hat trick, and again in the 43rd minute, to give his side a 3 goal lead going into the break. HT 1-4. When Bottesford headed in from a corner in the 54th minute to make it 5-1, the game appeared well and truly done as a contest.

Boss Martyn Woolford immediately gambled, introducing Butch and Destiny for El Binno and Robbo. The impact was instantaneous. What followed was a 5-minute, 4-goal flurry to cancel out a 4 goal def and turned the game on its head. A 59th minute corner fell to Tom A, who rocketed the ball in from 25 yards. Just 60 seconds later, Destiny's tricky run and low cross were converted by the Gaffer, Woolly, himself. 2 minutes on and the momentum was unstoppable as Destiny went clear to slot home the 4th. And the equaliser arrived on 64 minutes when Destiny crossed, Cable controlled, and found the net.

This was not the end of the drama. Bottesford regained the lead in the 70th minute with a shot from the edge of the box.

The Boys in Blue weren't done. Tension was building in the 87th minute as Sheard (on as sub) made a run into the box and was flattened, but the ref waved away penalty appeals.

Undeterred, The Blues found a remarkable equaliser in stoppage time, a long ball to Cable, who then fired home to make it 6-all!

With the tie heading toward spot kicks, The Azzurri had one final opportunity, 6 minutes into time added on when Cable was fouled 30 yards from goal. Sam picked himself up to take the resulting free kick and in a moment of pure brilliance, he stuck the ball into the top corner, completing his hat trick and securing a scarcely believable win by the odd goal in 13! FT 7-6.

What. A. Comeback!! And absolute carnage on a legendary night for Martyn Woolford's Blue & White Army! This Woolly-ball is alright, ain't it? WEBMASTER MOTM – team spirit was through the roof. Every one of them played a full role but standouts included a lively Lucas Robinson, and a dogged midfield and defensive unit. Tom Alngohuru and Destiny were forces of nature. And Woolly was the architect of The Wezzie Miracle.

However, the Glitterball goes to Sam Cable. After a tough first half, his head never dropped and his hat trick sealed an amazing win. Electric, Cable! Golcar United 6 Frickley 0

It was a chastening afternoon for The Blues, falling to a comprehensive 6-0 defeat against a clinical Golcar United side. Early goals in both halves left The Blues chasing the game.

The game got off to the worst possible start for The Azzurri in the 4th minute when TK sliced in an unfortunate own goal. The hosts doubled their advantage just 8 minutes later when a cross was glanced into the top corner by a flying header. Despite the early setbacks, The Blues managed to create openings. Destiny registered the first shot on target, saved, in the 9th minute. Later, Cable rounded the keeper, passed to Robbo but his shot was blocked by a defender. And Robbo went through but his stinging drive was pushed away. Frickley efforts were continuously thwarted. As the first half concluded, Sykes was forced into a crucial save to stop a ball diverted towards his own net by Jenko. HT 2-0.

Hopes of a comeback were extinguished less than 30 seconds from the restart, as a defensive mixup led to Golcar poking in a third.

The Azzurri tried to react, with Cable halving a couple of half, nay, quarter chances.

The hosts' momentum continued, as they added 3 in the final 20 minutes. After a 70th minute run, Golcar cut inside and fired in, followed by a spectacular strike from out wide by their number 9 that soared into the top corner, leaving Sykes with no chance, just 3 minutes later. Golcar finished the scoring in the 90th minute, as their number 9 netted from a corner at the back post to complete his hat trick and the 6-goal rout. FT 6-0.

Wombwell Town 0 Frickley 2

The Blues secured a massive 3 points, grinding out a gritty 2-0 victory over a Wombwell Town side managed by former Frickley boss Karl Rose, to distance ourselves from the relegation zone.

The opening half was a cagey affair, with both sides sizing each other up. Frickley goalkeeper Sykes was tested early, comfortably holding out to a tame shot in the 1st minute before Tom A fired well over at the other end, seconds later.

Robbo showed tenacity to rob former Blues man, Morgan James, and drive into the box in the 7th minute, only to see his shot flash just wide.

There was controversy in the 21st minute when a scramble in the Azzurri box was eventually cleared, leading to a break. Destiny was fouled, though the ref waved play on. The loose ball fell to Woolly who was clearly shoved over in the box, but shouts for a stonewall penalty were ignored. Wombwell's only real sight of goal came from a slip in the 26th minute, but Sykesy rushed out to smother the ball at the attacker's feet.

A long range effort from Destiny, hooking the ball over his shoulder, and a blocked shot from a Tom A, following a corner, kept the Wombwell keeper on his toes going into the break. HT 0-0.

The NLP Column: Life in the old dog yet

When Stuart Fleetwood dusted down his scoring boots to turn out for hometown club Newent Town a couple of months ago, he was preparing for his 23rd season in senior football.

It's a career which has taken the 39-year-old striker to a host of clubs, from League One down into Non-League, even managing Swindon Supermarine for the past two seasons.

Fleetwood, the former Hereford, Forest Green Rovers, Luton, Eastleigh and Sutton United striker, revealed to The NLP that he even had to borrow his son's shinpads to turn out for the Hellenic League Division One's Daffs, the club where he played most of his youth football before hewas spotted by Cardiff City. "I feel good in my body, I feel pretty fit and it's the club I used to play youth team football for so I've done a complete full circle," Fleetwood told us.

"Until any coaching jobs come up, I just want to go out and play on a Saturday. That's why I'll never retire – I'll probably always be knocking around looking for a game.

"I've actually had to borrow my son's shinpads for this week. Sonny is with the U12s at Forest Green. He's lent me his shinpads for the first game and told me to sort myself out after that." Fleetwood may be settling back into the old routine he knows so well – but there are a number of Golden Oldies out there, still playing, who can relate to the thrill of being put through their paces for another season.

Indeed, we reported on former Premier League striker Charlie Austin preparing for a fresh start at Southern League Premier South club Basingstoke Town and scoring on debut at the age of 36.

Alongside that, we ran a story on former Charlton, Nottingham Forest and Birmingham City striker Lyle Taylor following his move into National League South with Chelmsford City.

Also, we've seen another former top-flight big gun, Grant Holt, earn himself a new deal. At the ripe old age of 44, the former Norwich City and

Forest front man has teamed up with Eastern Counties Premier division side Dereham Town. Indeed, 40-plusses are commonplace in Non-League these days it seems.

Carlos Edwards, the former Sunderland and Ipswich wide man, is now 46 but turning out regularly for Hadleigh United, also in the Eastern Counties, similarly the great Kevin Ellison, an EFL stalwart with Tranmere Rovers and Morecambe who is leading Vauxhall Motors' front line at the same age, and Chris Dickson, now at Step 3 Cray Wanderers and proving that life does indeed continue to flourish at 40.

But perhaps the oldest playing regular still currently turning out is Jamie Cureton (pictured), now 50 years old and playing for step 10 Eastern Counties League Division One club Kings Park

Rangers. When he recently scored for them, he became the first man to score at all of the top 10 tiers of the English pyramid.

As someone just a few months older than Jamie and who gets tired just watching the game at that level, I'm amazed how that's even possible. Cureton now will have the record of another veteran frontman,

Barry Hayles, in his sights having played Step 6 football at Windsor FC at the age of 51 before the club resigned from the Combined Counties League this summer.

Elsewhere, strike pair Matt Rhead and Tom Pope hold joint player-manager roles at Kidsgrove Athletic at the ages of 41 and 39 respectively, while the effervescent Jon Challinor is in his 13th season at Southern League Premier Central side Stamford at the age of 44. The former York City and Aldershot midfielder led the England Over 40s side to World Cup glory in the summer.

And talking of club legends, Ian Henderson is still banging in goals at Rochdale at the age of 40. After a decade at Spotland, over two separate spells, Henderson is easily Rochdale's record goalscorer and has been rewarded for his loyalty with a new deal from Dale boss Jimmy McNulty. All of these Golden Oldies, and many more still turning out in the Non-League game, continue to put their bodies on the line purely to continue their passion for the game they have loved their entire careers. They're an inspiration to us all.

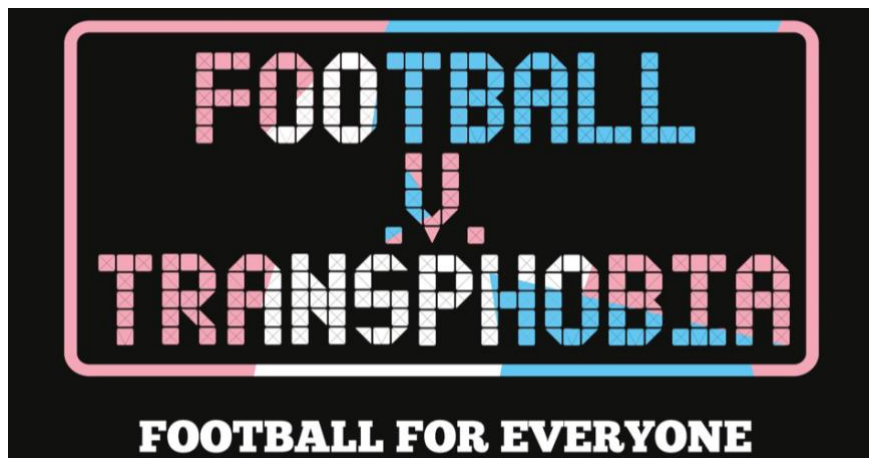

Linked to The Lane

I'm an incorrigible collector of old A&BC, Panini, Merlin, Topps, etc. football cards and stickers, and it struck me how many of the players pictured had links to Frickley Athletic. They might have played for or against us at some point, or are related to one of The Azzurri past or present. Or the connection might be even more tenuous! But you can be sure it was the highlight of their career :)

Back in the early 80s, in the days of the Gola Alliance, The Blues were travelling the length and breadth of the country

to face non-league's finest. As we know, it was a very decent standard of football, attracting some top pros at the end of their playing careers. One such fella was Jim Cumbes, who played against Frickley for Worcester City.

JC was one of those rare and enviable sportsmen whose talent allowed him to pursue 2 professional sporting careers at once. Born in Manchester in 1944, he was a Football League goalkeeper and a first class cricketer throughout the 1960s and 1970s, not something we see any more.

Cumbes started at Runcom but was spotted by Tranmere Rovers where he began his professional footballing journey in 1965. Over the course of 4 seasons at Prenton Park, he made more than 100 league appearances, quickly earning a reputation as a commanding and composed goalkeeper. His consistency soon caught the attention of clubs higher up the pyramid, and in 1969 he moved to West Bromwich Albion, then playing in the First Division, against the best in English football. In 1971, he left The Hawthorns and made the short move to join Aston Villa, where he would enjoy the most successful phase of his football career.

Cumbes spent 4 years at Villa Park, during a

crucial rebuilding period for the club as part of the side that won promotion from the Third Division in 1972. The highlight came in 1975, when he was in the starting lineup at Wembley as Aston Villa defeated Norwich City 1-0 to win the Football League Cup, the first Wembley final between 2 second division clubs. His composed performance that day helped secure the club's first major trophy in more than a decade, a fitting reward for his years of dedication and consistency.

Later, Cumbes had spells Portland Timbers in the North American Soccer League and Southport before ending his football career at Worcester City .

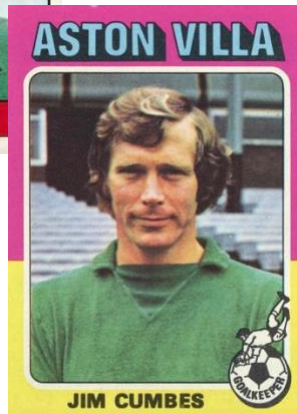
Meanwhile, in the footballing off-seasons, Jim Combes was playing county cricket, a demanding schedule that required remarkable fitness and mental discipline.

In a cricket career that spanned from 1964 to 1982, Cumbes played 161 first class matches for Lancashire, Surrey, Worcestershire and Warwickshire. He took 379 wickets at an average of 30.20, with best figures of 6 for 24.

In one day cricket, he played 127 matches, taking 136 wickets at an average of 29.38. His height and athleticism gave him bounce and accuracy, and he was a reliable strike bowler throughout his career. Among his cricketing honours, he was a member of Worcestershire's County Championship winning side in 1974. This meant he achieved a

remarkable double achievement of winning both the County Championship in cricket and the League Cup in football. He is also the only man to play in a Wembley final and a Lord's one day final.

After retiring from playing, he became the Chief Executive of Lancashire County Cricket Club for almost 15 years, bringing them into the modern day both in terms of facilities and the playing side. Howzat for a Linked to The Lane?

Next up – Horbury Town

Horbury Facts: Mentioned in the Domesday Book of 1086 as *Orberie*, its name means 'fortified place on muddy land'. Once a centre of wool weaving, Horbury grew into an industrial hub famed for railway wagons built by Charles Roberts & Co. The sports equipment makers, Slazengers, are another company who had a long-time presence in the town. The historic St Peter and St Leonard's Church was designed and paid for by the notable, and Horbury-born, architect John Carr in the 1790s, while nearby Horbury Hall, dates from the 15th century. 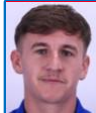

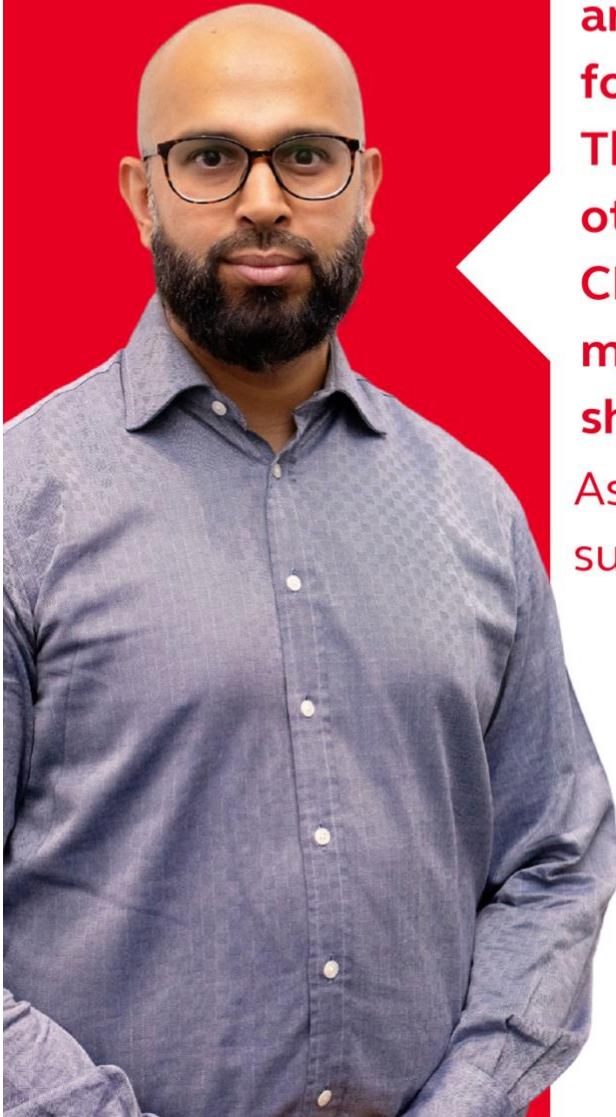
