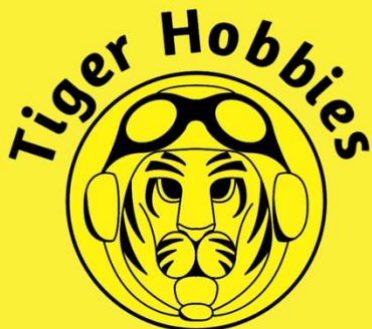

Good evening, ladies and gentlemen, welcome to The SALUS Stadium for this evening's Sheffield & Hallamshire Senior Cup Third Round game against Rossington Main. We give a warm welcome to Rossington's players, officials and supporters and hope they have a safe trip home after the game.

This evening's visitors, Rossington have reached this stage of the competition without yet kicking a ball. They received a bye in the first round, like ourselves, and then their opponents in the second round, Wombwell Main, were unable to field a team and forfeited the tie.

Rossington's recent form, since a 2-1 home win over Horbury Town, has seen them lose their last 2 league games, 4-1 against ourselves and 1-0 against visitors, Handsworth, either side of a superb triumph in the FA Vase. Rosso made the very long trip to Carlisle City but were rewarded with progression to the third round proper of the competition by virtue of a penalty shootout win after a battling back from 2 down to draw 2 apiece.

The Azzurri are currently on a 5 game unbeaten run. A 2-0 victory at Wombwell Town, courtesy of late Charlie Clegg and Lucas Robinson strikes, was followed by a 3-0 triumph in the Sheffield Cup against visitors Jubilee Sports, with Tom Alngohuru and Destiny Ifeanyi Nnenanua (2) getting on the scoresheet. Then tonight's visitors, Rossington Main, were dispatched 4-1, here at The Wezzie in the league, with goals from Shaun Heselwood, Destiny, Lucas Robinson (a

penalty), and Charlie Clegg. Our last 2 games have been a pair of draws, a 0-0 stalemate at Horbury Town, Will Jenkinson's red card being the only event of note, and a 1-1 home draw against Pickering Town, as a soft last minute penalty denied us all 3 points after dominating much of the game.

Our most recent meeting with Rossington Main was our aforementioned league game, The Blues winning 4-1, here at HQ, earlier this month. Our last meeting in the Sheffield Senior Cup was in November 2005 at Rossington's Oxford Street ground, The Blues shaded it 2-1 with goals from Simon Collins and Andy Evans.

Expect a good, old fashioned cup tie as both sides look to cement a place in the quarter finals.

Please note, if tonight's game is drawn after 90 minutes it will go straight to a penalty shootout.

In recruitment news, midfielder Josh Lindley has signed on dual registration from/with Pontefract Collieries. Josh will be no stranger to The Wezzie as he is the son of ex-Blue Phil Lindley. We welcome him to the club and wish him the best of luck.

Our next game sees The Blues get back to league matters as we travel to Knaresborough Town on Saturday 22nd October, 3pm kickoff. The Blues are next in action here at Westfield Lane on Tuesday 25th November when Golcar United are our visitors for another helping of cup football, the 3rd round of the NCEL League Cup on this occasion, 7.45pm ko. We hope to see you all there.

Enjoy the game and as always we thank you for your valued and continued support.

Meet The Visitors

Formed in 1919 when 'Rossington Colliery' entered the Sheffield Association League, playing their fixtures on ground at the back of the Colliery offices. A club had competed under the Rossington Colliery name in 1917, but only since 1919 has the club been in continued existence. The club moved to their current Oxford Street ground in 1923, and just a couple of years later enjoyed their best ever run in the FA Cup, reaching the 4th Qualifying Round in 1924/25, where they were beaten 3-0 at Lincoln City. The club enjoyed its most successful season at the end of the WWII when they won both the Doncaster Senior League and Cup in 1944/45. In 1948, due to nationalization of the mines, the club underwent a name change to Rossington Miners Welfare, and it was under this moniker they lifted the Doncaster Senior League Premier Division Cup in 1974.

1983 saw a name change to Rossington Main, and as founder members of the Central Midlands League, they won the Premier Division and Premier Division Cup in the second year in that league.

In 1984, floodlights were erected at the Oxford Street ground, which have been upgraded to new LED lights. And in 1991, new changing rooms were built at Oxford Street, and a crowd of 1200 attended the inaugural match against Leeds United. That same year, the club earned promotion to the NCEL (Northern Counties East League), Division 1, and remained in the same division until the end of last season.

The club merged with CML neighbours Rossington FC in 1998. Rossington FC were formed as Station FC in the 1970s as a Sunday team, but progressed rapidly, joining the CML in 1986. They had early success but League expectations and finances led to the merger.

The early noughties were possibly the most successful period for the new merged club with 9 trophies in the first 13 years along with 9 Runners/up spots in that time.

Highlights included the Reserves winning the Doncaster & District FA Challenge Cup in 2003 and the first team being runners up in the NCEL Wilkinson Sword Trophy in 2011. Also, the first team had their best season, breaking club goalscoring and points records to finish 7th. During 2008, long time Chairman Carl Stokes took over the running of the club and wasted no

time in introducing changes on and off the pitch. Off the field, improvements to the ground were rewarded with a prestigious preseason friendly in 2008 against Doncaster Rovers. A record crowd of 1245 enabled the club to start the season on a sound financial footing.

The club took major step forward in 2014 with the joining together with the junior sections with them rebranding as Rossington Main Juniors and the Reserves as the Development Squad, with the intention of bringing through the best of the local talent, hopefully to play for the first team and beyond. Further to this, in 2015 Main entered into a scheme run by Doncaster Rovers to promote sport and education amongst youngsters.

As with all clubs, managers come and go. Recent managers have included former Scarborough Athletic Reserves manager Steve Brennan, record goal scorer Lee Holmes, Chris Glarvey and Ryan Hindley, all of whom have crucially overseen NCEL survival.

Ben Hunter took charge in 2019, assisted by Matt Ellison and Sam Parkin, and they brought in a group of promising young footballers. In 2022, Rossington Main had a successful season in Division One, finishing 5th in the league with 81 points from 40 games. However, they lost 2-0 in the playoff semi final against North Ferriby.

For the 2022/23 season, Hunter made changes to his backroom and playing staff. The team achieved promotion to non-league step 5 for the first time in the club's history after winning the NCEL Division 1 playoffs, defeating Horbury 3-1 at home in front of a crowd of 1164 spectators. 2023/24 started with the experienced Zeph Thomas, ex-Frickley and a St Kitts & Nevis international, being added as assistant manager. The club then announced their arrival at step 5 with their attractive football, achieving an amazing 4th place finish. Unfortunately, a defeat on penalties in the playoff semi final to eventual winners Garforth Town was to follow.

Ben Hunter stepped down after a disappointing first month of the 2024/25 season and former Grimsby Town (and Frickley) defender Greg Young took up the hot seat and they recovered to achieve a mid-table finish.

Greg and his team will be looking to build on Rosso's achievements of recent seasons.





Frickley's History

Frickley Athletic FC is based in the former coal mining village of South Elmsall. Recent research has shown that the first South Elmsall football team was formed in 1905 but was superseded in 1908 by the newly formed Frickley Colliery Athletic Club and joined the South Yorkshire league which comprised of works, church and village teams. In 1910, the football club moved to the Sheffield Association League and first played in the FA Cup.

The club remained in the Sheffield Association League (except for the war years) until 1922, finishing runners up in 1911/12, and winners in 1920/21, our only ever league title.

In 1922/23 Frickley joined the Yorkshire league and after finishing runners up in 1923/24, the club were elected into the Midland League. Although the club had to apply for re election several times pre war (and didn't play in any league in 1933/34) it was kept going by the support of the mineworkers and the sale of players.

1936/37 was Frickley's worst ever league season when the club finished bottom with only 8 points, but amazingly reached the FA Cup 1st round proper for the first time.

Post war, Frickley remained in the Midland league gaining its best finish, 7th, in 1945/46, but left the league on its break up at the end of 1959/60.

From 1960/61 to 1969/70, Frickley Colliery played in the Cheshire County League. However, financial considerations led the club to join the Midland Counties League for 1970/71. They finished runners up in 1972/73, and were eventually elected into the NPL for the 1976/77 season as Frickley Athletic.

After finishing 3rd in 1979/80, the club was promoted into the Alliance Premier League, now the National League. Here they remained for 7 years, the most successful in the club's history, and in 1985/86 reached the FA Cup 3rd round proper, after beating a Football League club, Hartlepool Utd, only to lose 3-1 at home to Rotherham Utd. The club also finished as Gola League runners up. The following season saw a reversal as we were relegated back to the NPL. From 1987/88 to 1991/92 the club consistently finished around mid-table in the NPL, but did manage to reach the league cup final in 1991/92, losing 1-0 to Marine at Maine Road.

The next few seasons saw Frickley finish in the lower reaches of the table. Then, in 2005/06 The

Blues had their best league season for 20 years, finishing 2nd to Blyth Spartans. Unfortunately, the Blues lost on penalties in the playoff semi.

In the following seasons Frickley returned to the lower half of the table, but 2015/16 saw the club have a great season to finish 7th.

In 2016/17, most of the players who had brought this success were attracted to more affluent clubs. The club were relegated from the NPL Premier Division after a 30 year stay.

2017/18 saw the club enter the NPL Division 1 South, finishing 3rd in the league, scoring a record 117 goals. Additionally, Jacob Hazel broke the club record for individual goals in a season with 47 strikes. The season ended disappointingly with playoff semi final defeat at the hands of Stamford.

2018/19, in the new NPL East Division, was less successful, seeing managerial changes and a 12th place finish. However, the season had its highlights, with victory at highflying Morpeth and a 10-1 win over Liversedge in the FA Cup.

More change followed prior to the start of 2019/20. A further league reorganisation which put The Blues into the NPL South East Division was accompanied by a new manager. An inauspicious start lead to the appointment of Dave Frecklington in September 2019.

Frecks rapidly turned the side's fortunes around, before lockdown ended the season. 2020/21 ultimately suffered the same fate.

Frecks built what looked like strong squad for the 2021/22 season in the newly formed NPL East Division. However, things didn't pan out as hoped. Key departures lead to a run of form that saw the club relegated to the Northern Counties East League for the first time in our history.

In the summer of 2022, former Blue, Wayne Benn, was installed as manager, with ex-Frickley goal scoring legend Andy Hayward as his assistant. There were occasional highs but Benn resigned in early 2023 so Patrick McGuire came in to avoid a second successive relegation.

2023/24 started well, and included an 8-0 win at Goole, but ended with the release of McGuire.

James Baxendale was in the hot seat for the start of 2024/25 but left to be replaced by Tom Claisse in November 2024 and successfully avoided the drop before being relieved of his duties in September 2025.

Club legend Martyn Woolford has taken the reigns and he'll be looking to roll back the years and bring winning ways back to Westfield Lane.

The first match was against Market Drayton Town in the Northern Premier League Division 1 South, played on Saturday 18th November 2017 at the Greenfields Sports Ground. Then the second game is a Midland League fixture from Saturday 19th November 1938 against Newark Town. Allott leads goal spree as he reaches his Blues century

THE HAMMERING that has been promised came last Saturday when Frickley Athletic were in fantastic attacking form to improve their away record in emphatic fashion at Market Drayton Town.

The Blues possess a powerful array of strikers and they all came good to end the Blues' run without an away win in the Evo-Stik First Division South, which had seen them fail to win on their travels since September 12.

While Jacob Hazel has been leading the scoring in recent weeks it was long time Frickley favourite Gavin Allott who grabbed the headlines this time with a hat-trick that took him past 100 goals for the club and paved the way for a fantastic 6-0 win.

It could have been an even bigger margin as Athletic hit the woodwork twice and had several efforts cleared off the line or saved by the home keeper on a day when it all came together. A clean sheet too will please manager Spencer Fearn.

Frickley were straight onto the attack and could have been ahead well before the opening goal arrived on 14

minutes. Allott was the scorer, poking in from Jameel Ible's cross after Steve Hopewell had initially hit the post.

Tom Dugdale hit the post after making a good run onto a through ball, but it was 2-0 when talented youngster Cameron Hough found the net with a superb volley from 20 yards out.

Hazel went close before the moment fans had been waiting for arrived as Allott's looping header found the back of the net for his 100th goal in Frickley colours.

Not to be outdone, strike partner Hazel made it 4-0 just before half-time, netting his 19th goal of the season after brushing aside two defenders.

In the second half the hosts briefly had a go before Frickley got back on top and scored again with Allott completing his hat-trick at the second attempt from Hopewell's cross.

Substitute Danny Frost came on to inflict more pain on the home team and he put the icing on the cake with the Blues' sixth and final goal, outstripping the defence as he raced through before smashing the ball past the over-worked Market Drayton keeper for his fourth in five games since joining the club.

FRICKLEY COLLIERY VICTORS IN 12-GOAL MATCH.

Frickley Colliery put up a much better show on visiting Newark Town on Saturday, and won 7—5. The team was hardly recognisable as the one which lost so heavily at Gainsborough the previous week, so much had their work improved. A strong wind baffled the players throughout, but despite this handicap the Colliery were on the attack for most of the first half, and led by three clear goals after only 12 minutes' play, Lawson and Pearce (2) being the scorers. Kerr reduced the lead, but Brewer added a further goal, and Lawson scored twice to complete his "hat-trick." Ranshaw scored twice for Newark, who were behind 6—3 at the interval. Goals in the second half came from Searby and Ranshaw for Newark, while Lawson replied with a seventh for Frickley.

The Sheffield & Hallamshire Senior Cup

The Sheffield & Hallamshire Senior Cup is a county cup competition involving teams within the Sheffield & Hallamshire County Football Association. Originally named the Sheffield Challenge Cup, it was first competed for in 1876/77 making it the 4th oldest surviving cup competition in the world, after the FA Cup (1871/72), Scottish FA Cup (1873/74) and East of Scotland Shield (1875/76).

Frickley have reached the final on 27 occasions, winning the cup on 14 of those, which is the joint second most wins with Sheffield Wednesday, after Worksop Town's 15 wins.

Tonight's visitor's Rossington Main are yet to win the competition or reach the final. Their best performance to date was in 2021/22 when they reached the semi final.

The NLP Column: 3UP!

Last Saturday, managers had an extra three minutes to deliver the finishing touches to their pre-match team talks.

For fans, it was a chance to grab a quick coffee or spend a little longer in the warmth of the clubhouse bar.

Three minutes. One hundred and eighty seconds. It doesn't sound like much, but it may prove crucial to the National League's 3UP campaign as the pressure on the EFL to finally put a third promotion spot into League Two on the agenda continues to grow.

At 3.03pm last Saturday afternoon, more than 200 clubs from Steps 1 to 4 kicked off in a coordinated 'Day of Action' to raise awareness of the issue, taking advantage of the spotlight with the Premier League and a large percentage of the EFL away on international duty.

National League chiefs and clubs have been pushing for an extra promotion place for a number of years to bring the system in line with the rest of the English pyramid.

But while the EFL acknowledge the matter should be discussed, it has still not been formally brought to the table, despite chairman Rick Parry's promise to "look downwards as well as upwards". A recent Football Supporters' Association poll showed 93 per cent of supporters favour the move, including 83 per cent of fans at EFL clubs. However, Football League bosses insist that any agreement must form part of wider funding negotiations with the Premier League. National League leaders have upped the stakes amid fears it could be years before EFL clubs vote on any change.

National League vice-chairman and 3UP steering committee chair Steve Thompson MBE has been at the forefront of the push, and he says last Saturday's action sent a clear message. He told The NLP ahead of the weekend: "The games kicking off at 3.03pm are really going to shine a spotlight on it. We've got MPs from all over the country going to these games.

"It's not just the 12 National League games. While the National League North and South aren't playing league matches because of the FA

Trophy, the Trident Leagues are supporting it too. That's fantastic.

"The whole football family at Non-League level sees how important it is."

Such is the importance that, in recent months, clubs and the league have been engaging with their local MPs, with more than 100 (plus members of the London Assembly) pledging their backing.

And just days before the Day of Action, Sir Keir Starmer "commended" 3UP during Prime Minister's Questions, with more than 60 MPs now actively supporting the campaign.

The Department for Digital, Culture, Media and Sport has formally recognised that 3UP's ambitions align with the objectives of the incoming football regulator.

"I was blown away," Thompson said of the political backing.

"So many MPs are season ticket holders at their local club. They understand how much their clubs do in the community — and how much the owners and chairs contribute.

"The fear is that if this bottleneck continues and owners don't believe they have a realistic chance of being promoted, they'll walk away. You need competitiveness. It creates a healthy ecosystem in football — and that's what we risk losing.

"The EFL say they've got to look down as well as up. Well, look down a bit more."

History shows there is no competitive imbalance between the National League and League Two. No club has ever been relegated back to Non-League the season after promotion. Luton Town rose all the way to the Premier League, while others - including Yeovil, Doncaster, Burton and now Wrexham - have reached the Championship. "There are more than 30 clubs in the EFL that have been in the National League at one stage or another," Thompson added.

"Wrexham are in the Championship now.

Nineteen League Two clubs have been in the National League. Half of the National League has been in the EFL.

"There's nothing to fear, but there is a bottleneck."

Last Saturday afternoon, supporters up and down the country played their part, on the terraces and across social media, making their voices heard.

For 180 seconds, at least, the floor was theirs.

And that's certainly worth raising a glass to.





Match Report

Frickley 1 Pickering Town 1

The Blues were left to rue a string of missed chances as a late and highly questionable penalty denied us a deserved victory in what turned out to be a lively draw with Pickering Town in damp, windy conditions.

The opening exchanges were bright despite the dreary weather, with both sides probing but creating little of note.

In the 14th minute, Sykesy was called into action, comfortably pushing away a tame free kick. Moments later, he reacted sharply again to parry a dangerous cross before a Pickering forward lashed the loose ball over although the flag was up for offside anyway.

Radz took one for the team in the 17th minute as he went into the book for a foul on an onrushing Pikes forward.

The Azzurri increasingly began to assert dominance, with a Tom Alngohuru free kick on 24 minutes eventually falling to Destiny, whose shot was blocked. Then the breakthrough came just 2 minutes later. Destiny produced a powerful run down the Pikes' right flank and struck the post with a fierce effort. The rebound fell kindly for Tom Alngohuru, who kept his composure to steer home from close range to make it 1-0.

Pickering offered little in response before the break, save for one awkward moment in the 33rd minute when Pickering's forward had a sight of goal but the Wezzie bobble deceived him and Sykes fell on the gentle shot.

The Blues felt mightily aggrieved in the 41st minute when Destiny was barged over in the box, only for the referee to award the visitors a free kick instead. The challenge warranted a penalty far more than either 2 of those that were awarded to the visitors in the second half. HT 1-0.

After the restart, The Blues continued to look the more dangerous side. Destiny went close from 25 yards on 48 minutes, before Spence embarked on a lung busting run that was halted by a last ditch tackle 8 minutes later. The Pikes then reminded the hosts they were still around by skimming the top of the bar with a dipping shot. The Azzurri kept kept up the pressure. Destiny charged down the visiting keeper's clearance on 58 minutes, the rebound spinning agonisingly wide. Then, at 65 minutes, Destiny burst clear only to see his shot hit the keeper. Robbo

followed up, but the keeper recovered to save again.

Controversy followed on 69 minutes when Pickering handled in the own box, before going down theatrically. The ref initially pointed to the spot, but after consulting the liner, correctly reversed the decision to the The Blues' relief (and surprise). Justice was done.

The Blues introduced Butch and Cleggy for Heselwood and Woolly, with immediate impact as Cleggy combined with Destiny in the 78th minute only for the latter to drag his shot wide. Elliot Andrew replaced Destiny shortly after as The Boys in Blue looked to freshen up the attack.

Then, The Blues were dealt a cruel reminder of the importance of putting away the opportunities created in those long spells of dominance. In the final minute, Pickering were awarded a soft penalty, Jenko was deemed the perpetrator but I (and he) would struggle to tell you what his misdemeanour was. The visitors gratefully converted from the spot to level affairs. FT 1-1. A harsh result on The Blues after dominating much of the contest and looking the more cohesive side throughout. Missed chances proved costly. However, it shows our improvement that we're focusing on the points dropped rather than the point won. And that's a run of 5 games unbeaten in all competitions – our best since November 2023. The performance level offers plenty to be encouraged by, heading into the next outing.

WEBMASTER MOTM – it was a display full of energy, control, and commitment, and we created more than enough to win the game. So where do you start with the standouts? The defence was tough as teak, Joel Spence, Shaun Heselwood, Lucas Robinson and Tom Angohuru were indefatigable, while the gaffer, Martyn Woolford, simply gaffered it. But the Glitterball goes to Destiny Ifeanyi Nnenanua. He was a whirlwind, putting the defence on the back foot at every turn. The only thing missing was a goal. Delightful, Destiny!

Linked to The Lane

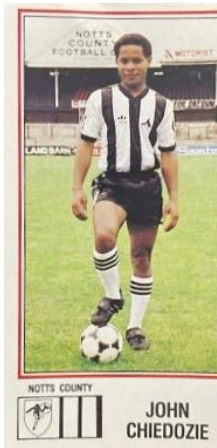
I'm an incorrigible collector of old A&BC, Panini, Merlin, Topps, etc. football cards and stickers, and it struck me how many of the players pictured had links to Frickley Athletic. They might have played for or against us at some point, or are related to one of The Azzurri past or present. Or the connection might be even more tenuous! But you can be sure it was the highlight of their career ;)

After his time at The Wezzie, Frickley's Gary Chapman went on to play over a hundred games in the

EFL. One of those games was for Notts County in 1990 and one of his teammates was John Chiedozie.

Chiedozie was playing his only game for County in his second spell at Meadow Lane and his final game for the club at which he was already a legend. John Okechukwu Chiedozie was born in 1960 in Owerri, Nigeria, and moved to England as a youngster, where he developed into a talented, pacey winger known for his skill, and willingness to take on defenders.

He began his professional career with Leyton Orient in 1977, joining the club as an apprentice before quickly breaking into the first team. Still a teenager, Chiedozie's electric pace and fearless dribbling soon made him a regular fixture at Brisbane Road. Over 4 seasons he made 145 league appearances and scored 20 goals, becoming one of the club's most exciting attacking players during a period when Orient competed in the Second Division. His performances drew attention from several top flight clubs, as he consistently created chances from wide areas and was capable of moments of individual brilliance that lifted supporters. Playing alongside the likes of Ralph Coates, Tony Grealish and Stan Bowles, his time at Orient established him as one of the most



promising young wingers in English football at the turn of the 1980s.

In 1981 he made the step up to the First Division, joining Notts County for £600,000 which was a significant fee that reflected both his growing reputation and the ambition of the Nottingham club. Chiedozie became a key attacking outlet for

County, using his blistering pace and direct style to stretch defences. He made 111 league appearances and scored 15 goals over three seasons. Chiedozie's performances were a bright spot in an otherwise difficult period as the club struggled against relegation. His form at Meadow Lane eventually bagged

him a transfer to Tottenham Hotspur in 1984, where he made an immediate impact by scoring on his debut in a 4-1 win over Everton. However, injuries limited his playing time over his 4 years at White Hart Lane, restricting him to 53 league appearances and 12 goals.

Later spells at Derby County, a very short return to Notts County, and Chesterfield followed, before he rounded off his career in non-league football with Bashley, retiring was in 1992.

Internationally, Chiedozie won an U18 cap for England in 1977 but then went on to represent Nigeria at full international level in the early 80s, one of the first from the EFL to do so,

earning 9 caps and scoring twice for the Super Eagles. As a result, he was awarded the title of Officer of the Order of Nigeria for his contribution to the country's football.

After retiring from football, he bucked the trend of running a pub and instead settled in Hampshire and ran a children's play and party business. He's obviously a braver man than me then ;)



Blues Squad 25/26

Joel Spence (Midfielder): Joel 90 was at Armthorpe before joining us and he's been on the books of Rotherham United before plenty of experience at Belper Town, Ossett United and Wakefield. Deservedly won player of the season in 24/25.

Will Sykes (Goalkeeper): The Holy Goalie is a highly rated young stopper who joined us from Hallam, against whom he saved a penalty towards the end of last season.

Niall Butchart (Defender/Midfielder/Forward): The Butcher is a versatile squad member. He is a former youth teamer at Altrincham, then was at Winsford United, Swallownest, Armthorpe Welfare and Goole.

Tom Alngohuru (Midfielder/Forward): The Guru is a defender's nightmare. He joined last season from Ossett United. Prior to that he was at the York City and i2i academies, and has played almost 80 games for Pickering Town.

Luis Afonso-Ferreira (Midfielder/Forward): The Ferrari is a rapid forward who puts teams on the back foot. He has plenty experience from time at the likes of Retford United, Parkgate and Albion Sports.

Sam Cable (Forward): The Power is a handful of an attacker. Since starting out in our U19s over a decade ago, he is now in his 3rd spell with the club after spells at Barton Town, Garforth Town and others.

Will Jenkinson (Defender): Jenko is a footballing defender who joins us from Parkgate, having started out at Rotherham United.

Takunda Katsere (Defender): The Thunder is a big, strong defender with loads of potential. Has previous NCEL experience at Goole, Selby Town, Athersley Rec and Wombwell Town.

Sam Kilner (Defender): A NCEL title winner at Silsden last season, Killer is a highly proficient fullback who has also been at Buxton, Mossley, Hemsworth and Knaresborough.

Ifeanyi Nnenanua (Forward): Goes by the name of Destiny, he's a committed young striker who is always in the thick of it. He's been at the i2i academy and has previously played for Pickering Town.

Lucas Robinson (Midfielder/Forward): A rangey winger with an eye for goal, Cool Hand Lucas comes to us from Harrogate Railway but has been at Goole and Barton Town too.

Tyler Sheard (Defender/Midfield/Forward): Versa Tyler is another who can do a job anywhere on the park, team before self every time. And he's another of our U23s stepping up for 1st team duties.

Harley Wilson (Midfielder): With time at Penistone Church, Rossington Main, Wombwell Town and Dinnington Town, Hells Angel is an experienced midfielder at this level.

Thomas Radley (Defender): Radz is a big centre half who was at Shelley last season and brings quality and leadership into our back line.

Harry Gagen (Defender): Gadge is a Rolls Royce of a defender who started out at Barnsley but joined us from Ossett United after an initial loan spell.

Alfie Studd (Defender/Midfielder): The Studd Wall is a confident performer who is a local lad and has come right through our academy system.

Jack Horobin (Defender): Jack The Lad has stepped up from the U18s to make his debut as very capable defensive cover.

Ashton Johnson (Midfielder): AJ is an exciting winger from our U18s who recently made his debut, getting an assist within 5 minutes of coming on!

Dylan Sefton (Goalkeeper): Safe-ton is a solid young keeper who returns after coming through our academy and spending time at Worsbrough Bridge.

Josh Lindley (Midfielder): J-Force is a midfielder signed on dual reg with Ponte Colls. The son of ex-Blue, Phil, he started at Doncaster Rovers, and has been at Ossett, Wombwell Town and Deame & Dist.

Bailey Cowsell (Forward): Bails is an exciting goals scorer from our U23s. Made his first team debut in 2023/24 and has played for Athersley Rec and Wombwell Main since then.

Charlie Clegg (Forward): The Power is a local boy and a fan favourite, in his third spell with us. Has experience with Ponte Colls youth programme, Emley, Athersley, Armthorpe and Club Thorne.

Shaun Heselwood (Midfielder): Hez of The Wez joined us from Selby Town, after spells at Hemingbrough United and Goole AFC, to add drive in the middle of the park.

Elliot Andrew (Forward): The Prince is a quality striker who started out at Doncaster Rovers then Nottingham Forest before more recent spells at Tadcaster, Beverley and Rossington Main.

Lewis Binns (Defender/Midfielder/Coach): Binno is a rock. This local lad has played for local clubs, like South Kirkby and Armthorpe. A Frickley legend, the Supporters' Player of the Season in 22/23 is back from injury, and is part of the coaching team too.

Mike Carmody (Assistant Manager): As a player, MC Hammer was a top defender for Huddersfield and Tranmere in the EFL and for many years at Altrincham. Since retirement, he has managed Armthorpe Welfare and Goole AFC.

Martyn Woolford (Midfielder/Forward/ Manager): The Woolfman started at The Wezzie in 2005 after joining from Glasshoughton Welfare. He is a very classy attacking midfielder who has been in the EFL with the likes of York City, Scunthorpe United, Millwall, Bristol City and Sheffield United since then but he's back home now for a 3rd spell. Took over as player- manager in October 2025.

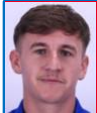

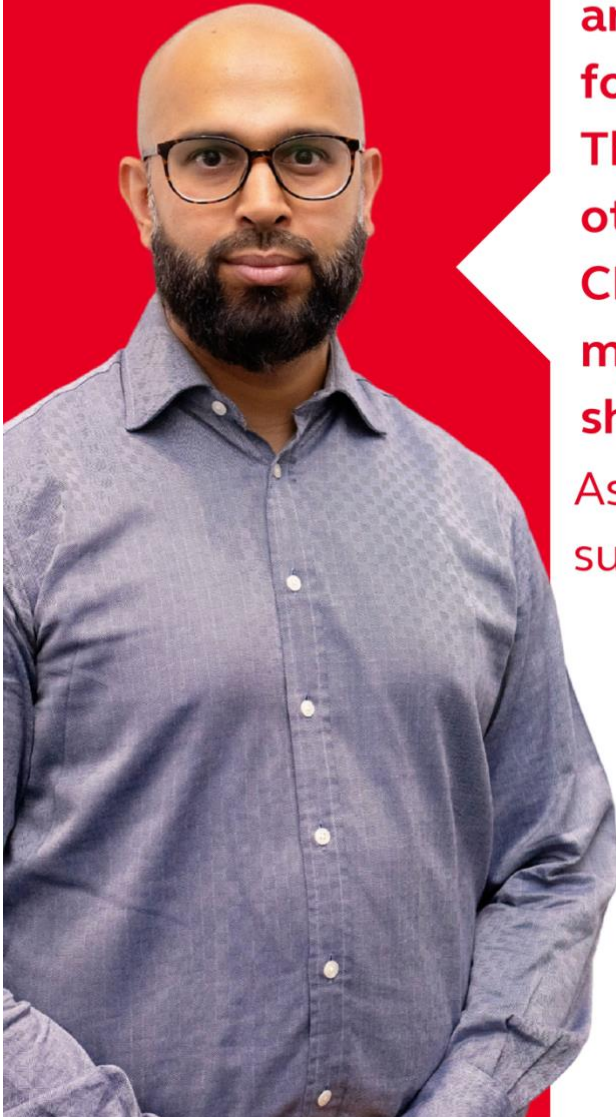
