Good evening, ladies and gentlemen, welcome to The SALUS Stadium for today's Northern Counties East Premier Division game against Bottesford Town. We give a warm welcome to Bottesford's players, officials and supporters and hope they have a safe trip home after the game.

Today's match ball is sponsored by Barry Johnson. We thank him for his kind support of the club.

Today's visitors, Bottesford Town, currently sit in 11th place on 28 points after 23 games. After the disappointment of losing 3-1 to Barton Town in the North Lincs derby, the Poachers have climbed the table with 3 wins on the trot. A 2-1 triumph at Rossington Main was followed by a pair of 1-0 wins, at Eccleshill United and, last weekend, at home to Horbury Town.

The Blues come into today's game in 12th place on 28 points after 22 games. Our last few games have been a bit of a rollercoaster. Since we were trounced 6-0 at Knaresborough Town, we beat one of our bogey teams, Golcar United, 2-0 in the NCEL League Cup, thanks to a brace by Josh Lindley, before turning around our league form at Thackley, last Saturday. A remarkable 4 goal haul by Lucas Robinson plus goals from Tom Alngohuru, Destiny Ifeanyi Nnenanua and Elliott Andrew, carried us to a 7-0 victory. Then on Tuesday, we travelled to Albion Sports and

Tom Radley, Martyn Woolford, Lucas Robinson and Charlie Clegg scored in our 4-1 win.

Our most recent meeting with Bottesford Town was our NCEL League Cup game in October. In one of the most heart stopping games ever seen at The Wezzie, we came from 5-1 down (ex-Blue Jack McMenemy scoring 4 of those for the Poachers) to nick it 7-6! Strikes by Tom Radley, Tom Alngohuru, Destiny, Martyn Woolford and a Sam Cable hat trick sealed a comeback that made it onto local radio. Our most recent league game with Bottesford was a rather more sedate affair, earlier this season in August, when we lost 1-0 at Bottesford's Birch Park.

Expect both sides to be going all out to continue their winning runs and further climb the table.

Our next game sees The Blues travel to Tadcaster Albion on Saturday 20th December, 3pm kickoff. The Blues are next in action here at Westfield Lane on Saturday 27th December when Penistone Church are our visitors for a Christmas cracker, 3pm ko. We hope to see you all there.

Enjoy the game and as always we thank you for your valued and continued support.

# Meet The Visitors 1

The club was formed in 1974 and joined the Lincolnshire League. In 1977/78 they finished bottom of the Premier Division, but were not relegated as it was expanded from 14 to 16 clubs. However, after finishing second-from-bottom the following season, they were relegated to Division One. In 1987 the league was reduced to a single division, which the club became members of. In 1986/87 they won the League Cup, a feat they repeated in 1988/89 and 1989/90. The latter season also saw them win the league for the first time, and they went on to retain the title for the next two seasons. They were runners-up in 1993/94, and in 2000 they joined the Premier Division of the Central Midlands League. After finishing third in their first season in the division, they were promoted to the Supreme Division. However, they were relegated back to the Premier Division at the end of the 2002/03 season after finishing bottom of the Supreme Division.

In 2005/06 Bottesford finished third in the Premier Division, earning promotion to the Supreme Division. The following season saw them crowned league champions, resulting in promotion to Division One of the Northern Counties East League. The club finished a very creditable third in 2007/08, their first season in the NCEL. In 2015/16 they finished third again, qualifying for the promotion playoffs. After beating Hallam 2-0 in the semi finals, they won the final against AFC Emley 4-3 on penalties following a 1-1 draw to earn promotion to the Premier Division where they have played for the last 6 seasons, mainly hovering around mid-table.

The original base was at the Dolphin pub, with the football being played at Frederick Gough School in Scunthorpe. The Club moved to its current Birch Park home in 1983. It currently holds 1,000, of which 90 is seated and 300 covered.

The club has for many years supported the local Scunthorpe and district adult football leagues. The year 2000 saw the amalgamation of the junior and senior clubs clearly demonstrating that players starting with the club at the age of 6 could be encouraged to stay with the club for their progress in football. The club today has 26 teams both boys and girls playing mini-soccer in the local Caparo League, 11 a-side teams in the Kalsen League, Lincolnshire County Girls League, youth football being played in the

Lincolnshire Intermediate Premier League, and a development squad playing in the Central Midlands Football League.

In 2018, a new addition to the club was the introduction of the DS Active team for individuals who are Down's Syndrome. The team has grown from strength to strength and they now participate in league football with a target of representing England in the Special Olympics.

One of the club's proudest moment was in 2003 when they became a FA Charter Standard Community Club, being one of the first clubs in the country at that time to get the achievement. The club had to work very hard to meet all of the FA criteria and is now reaping the benefits and rewards.

In 2009, the club achieved the distinction of being named the FA Charter Standard Club of the Year by the Lincolnshire Football Association, a reward for the efforts of the members of the club.

This massive involvement in grassroots football and its development has seen the provision of enhanced facilities to support the same, with the development of magnificent changing rooms and a meeting room facility in 2009 for the use of all those who play their sport at Birch Park. More recently with the aid of grant support from both the North Lincolnshire and Bottesford Town Councils, together with the Football Foundation, 2019 witnessed the acquisition of a new tractor and grass cutting maintenance equipment plus the replacement of the floodlights for the main pitch with a modern LED installation.

The floodlighting was designed with the conversion to a 3G playing surface in mind. The 3G pitch was finally installed during the second half of 2022/23, in time for the start of the 2023/24 season. The club played its home games at Winterton Rangers and Appleby Frodingham during this time, and finished 18th in the division. A new catering facility was also completed to serve the needs of Birch Park's future visitors. The return to Birch Park in 2023/24 promised to be an exciting juncture in the history of the club and the improved standard of football belied the eventual 17th and 16th place finishes in the league over the past 2 seasons.

Manager Leigh Herrick will be looking to continue the club's exciting progress and climb the table in 2025/26.

**Harry Stabler (Goalkeeper):** Harry is a confident young keeper who has been promoted to the first team this season after 2 successful seasons with the club's U18s.

**Josh Render (Goalkeeper):** Twin brother of Alex, Josh was in the academy at Sheffield Wednesday and was most recently on the books of Gainsborough Trinity. Josh has the quality to be a real stand out performer.

**Oakley Hill (Defender):** Oakley is a young, confident fullback who has been promoted to the first team this season after 2 successful seasons with the U18s.

**Jonathon Gjoshie (Defender):** Signed from Scunthorpe United in September on dual reg. He brings defensive solidity, work rate, and a willingness to learn and develop.

**Harry Roddis (Defender):** Signed from Worksop Town in September on dual reg. Harry was previously at Rotherham United and has made a fantastic first impression.

**Alex Render (Defender):** Twin brother of goalkeeper Josh, Alex joined the club on his return from the USA. Alex came through the ranks of Hull City and Sheffield Wednesday and is an ex-professional at Chesterfield, and will add quality to the team.

**Mason Chaffer (Defender):** A fit, strong and talented left back, Mason has come back for a third season and showed why he had interest from numerous step 4 clubs.

**Taron Hare (Defender):** An ex-professional at Scunthorpe United, York City and Boston United, Taz joins the club having spent the last few seasons at Barton Town. Taz made the centre half position his own from day one with his commanding presence and leadership.

**Clay Bryant (Defender):** Clay rejoined the football club this summer having previously being captain. A leader, a proper defender, Clay's never say die attitude will rub off on everyone around him.

**Jaxon Borland (Midfielder):** Jaxon is a product of the Bottesford Town U18s JPL team who has broken into the 1st team. Energetic, confident and determined to succeed, Jaxon has great potential to improve in our environment.

**Steve Ridley (Coach/Midfielder):** Steve joined the club last season, following his departure as Winterton Rangers manager. At 43 years of age, he brings a wealth of experience. Steve also coaches our U16s.

**Scott Matthews (Midfielder):** Scott is another that has returned to the club this season. Scott is a experienced player who has been given the skipper's armband this year. Scott has experience at this level and steps 3 and 4 and is a winner and will be looking to carry that on this season.

**Kieran McCaffrey (Midfielder):** Kieran has the qualities on and off the pitch that make him an extremely popular team member, Caff gives real strength down the spine of the team.

**Josh Nichol (Midfielder):** Josh is no nonsense and has an excellent football brain. Can operate in numerous positions, Josh will be a vital part of the group this season.

**Luke Ayris (Forward):** Luke is a product of the club's youth system. Luke has great speed and a real eye for goal from the wide areas. Luke is a really dangerous player at this level.

**Jack McMenemy (Forward):** A real coup for Bottesford Town to bring Jack Mac back to the club after a spell away. Jack has scored goals wherever he has been and was a pivotal part of Lincoln United recent success.

**Jake Brown (Forward):** Jake is an exciting young player who joined from Grimsby Borough. Jake is a quick, tricky, direct player who was on the books at Hull City spending 10 years there from the age of 8 to 18.

**Blake Gregory (Defender/Forward):** Blake came from U18s 3 season ago. He is versatile, playing left back, left wing and central forward and one of the best trainers in the group.

**Okera Simmonds (Forward):** Simmonds came through several youth systems including Liverpool, Blackburn Rovers and Accrington Stanley. He has also featured for Flint Town United in the Welsh Premier League. Okera has made a great start to life at the club with goals and assists.





# Frickley's History

Frickley Athletic FC is based in the former coal mining village of South Elmsall. Recent research has shown that the first South Elmsall football team was formed in 1905 but was superseded in 1908 by the newly formed Frickley Colliery Athletic Club and joined the South Yorkshire league which comprised of works, church and village teams. In 1910, the football club moved to the Sheffield Association League and first played in the FA Cup.

The club remained in the Sheffield Association League (except for the war years) until 1922, finishing runners up in 1911/12, and winners in 1920/21, our only ever league title.

In 1922/23 Frickley joined the Yorkshire league and after finishing runners up in 1923/24, the club were elected into the Midland League. Although the club had to apply for re election several times pre war (and didn't play in any league in 1933/34) it was kept going by the support of the mineworkers and the sale of players.

1936/37 was Frickley's worst ever league season when the club finished bottom with only 8 points, but amazingly reached the FA Cup 1<sup>st</sup> round proper for the first time.

Post war, Frickley remained in the Midland league gaining its best finish, 7<sup>th</sup>, in 1945/46, but left the league on its break up at the end of 1959/60.

From 1960/61 to 1969/70, Frickley Colliery played in the Cheshire County League. However, financial considerations led the club to join the Midland Counties League for 1970/71. They finished runners up in 1972/73, and were eventually elected into the NPL for the 1976/77 season as Frickley Athletic.

After finishing 3<sup>rd</sup> in 1979/80, the club was promoted into the Alliance Premier League, now the National League. Here they remained for 7 years, the most successful in the club's history, and in 1985/86 reached the FA Cup 3<sup>rd</sup> round proper, after beating a Football League club, Hartlepool Utd, only to lose 3-1 at home to Rotherham Utd. The club also finished as Gola League runners up. The following season saw a reversal as we were relegated back to the NPL. From 1987/88 to 1991/92 the club consistently finished around mid-table in the NPL, but did manage to reach the league cup final in 1991/92, losing 1-0 to Marine at Maine Road.

The next few seasons saw Frickley finish in the lower reaches of the table. Then, in 2005/06 The

Blues had their best league season for 20 years, finishing 2nd to Blyth Spartans. Unfortunately, the Blues lost on penalties in the playoff semi.

In the following seasons Frickley returned to the lower half of the table, but 2015/16 saw the club have a great season to finish 7<sup>th</sup>.

In 2016/17, most of the players who had brought this success were attracted to more affluent clubs. The club were relegated from the NPL Premier Division after a 30 year stay.

2017/18 saw the club enter the NPL Division 1 South, finishing 3<sup>rd</sup> in the league, scoring a record 117 goals. Additionally, Jacob Hazel broke the club record for individual goals in a season with 47 strikes. The season ended disappointingly with playoff semi final defeat at the hands of Stamford.

2018/19, in the new NPL East Division, was less successful, seeing managerial changes and a 12<sup>th</sup> place finish. However, the season had its highlights, with victory at highflying Morpeth and a 10-1 win over Liversedge in the FA Cup.

More change followed prior to the start of 2019/20. A further league reorganisation which put The Blues into the NPL South East Division was accompanied by a new manager. An inauspicious start lead to the appointment of Dave Frecklington in September 2019.

Frecks rapidly turned the side's fortunes around, before lockdown ended the season. 2020/21 ultimately suffered the same fate.

Frecks built what looked like strong squad for the 2021/22 season in the newly formed NPL East Division. However, things didn't pan out as hoped. Key departures lead to a run of form that saw the club relegated to the Northern Counties East League for the first time in our history.

In the summer of 2022, former Blue, Wayne Benn, was installed as manager, with ex-Frickley goal scoring legend Andy Hayward as his assistant. There were occasional highs but Benn resigned in early 2023 so Patrick McGuire came in to avoid a second successive relegation.

2023/24 started well, and included an 8-0 win at Goole, but ended with the release of McGuire.

James Baxendale was in the hot seat for the start of 2024/25 but left to be replaced by Tom Claisse in November 2024 and successfully avoided the drop before being relieved of his duties in September 2025.

Club legend Martyn Woolford has taken the reigns and he'll be looking to roll back the years and bring winning ways back to Westfield Lane.

## Wyatt-Martin nets hat-trick in crucial win over Ilkeston

**NEW SIGNING** Curtly Wyatt-Martin made an instant impact for Frickley Athletic as he hit a hat-trick on his debut to help his new club to a vital victory in the Evo-Stik Premier League.

The latest addition to the Blues ranks took just five minutes to open his account as Lee Morris's men went on to end their poor run of home results in emphatic style with a 4-0 success in a six-pointer against Ilkeston.

The visitors started the game just two points behind fifth from bottom Frickley with as many as four games in hand so the hosts knew they could not afford another home slip up and went about their task in determined fashion.

They went ahead from their first serious attack as Wyatt-Martin latched onto a weak clearance by the visitors, taking the ball off a defender and shooting under the keeper.

The Blues soon threatened another goal when young loan player Kuda Muskwe went on a good run into the box to fire in a fierce shot that was just clawed away by the keeper. A well worked corner then led to Tyler Williams having a strong shot saved.

It was all Frickley and a defence splitting pass led to Williams outpacing the defence. His shot was blocked and the

ball fell to Gary Stohrer who hit a half-volley just over from outside the box.

Ilkeston's cause was not helped when they had Danny Gordon sent-off for a bad foul on Stohrer on 21 minutes, but they held onto half-time just one down. The Blues did go close through Julian Lawrence's header, Luke Hinsley and Rhys Meynell while Williams was proving a real handful.

Frickley were frustrated for a while after the break before they finally made their superiority tell with a second goal on 68 minutes. An inswinging corner by Macauley Parkinson was met by Meynell who sent a thumping header into the net.

Four minutes later it was 3-0 as Wyatt-Martin controlled the ball well in the area before firing past the keeper.

The Blues were into cruise control now and almost struck again when Hinsley hit a shot just over after a fine move and Wyatt-Martin hit the post.

Ilkeston were reduced to nine men five minutes from time as Tom Gamblen was red carded for a second bookable offence after saying something out of turn to the referee.

Frickley then put the icing on the cake when Wyatt-Martin made his debut all the more memorable with his third goal, putting away a penalty after Stohrer was brought down.

# Senior and Rogerson k.o. former club

**FORMER** Worksop players Roy Senior and Basil Rogerson played a prominent part in Frickley's thrilling 4—3 win at Worksop in the Midland League on Saturday.

Rogerson scored late in the first half and Senior got two after half-time, the second clinching the game in injury time.

Frickley left their defeat at Scarborough in the F.A. Challenge Trophy last week well behind them, and with seven positional changes, looked a sharper outfit.

Roy Vairy, brought out of retirement to replace the suspended Chapman in goal, had a good game and had to make a good full-length save before Frickley went ahead in the 12th minute when Rogerson's cross was headed home by TURNER.

Worksop had most of the first half and deservedly equalised when a half-hit shot by Alick JEFFREY, the former Doncaster Rovers' star, rolled past an unsuspected Vairy. Frickley were lucky not to go further behind three minutes later when Jeffrey missed a penalty after Reid had been brought down.

Two minutes after this miss, Worksop did take the lead when MARKS headed in. But Frickley weathered the storm,

and ROGERSON'S deflected shot which curled past the keeper put them back into the game. Just before half-time, Neil Holland had a shot cleared off the line with the goalkeeper nowhere.

The sides were level at the end of 90 minutes — SENIOR scoring for Frickley after 48 minutes and REID getting an equaliser in the 80th minute — but in the second minute of injury time, the Worksop defence got in a tangle and SENIOR slipped through to get a dramatic winner.

Frickley's forwards, with Senior outstanding, played much better than they did at Scarborough, despite Moran missing two open goals.

# The NLP Column: End of an era

There are eras and then there are Eras with a capital E.

Alan Devonshire's Maidenhead United reign certainly falls into the latter. After 913 games, the legendary West Ham United FA Cup winner called time on his Magpies Era last weekend. Alan is pictured in his playing days and recently. The 69-year-old has managed close to 1,500 matches across his career in the dug-out that started at Maidenhead where they won promotion to the Isthmian Premier in 2000, before eight years at Hampton & Richmond, who he guided from Isthmian South to the Conference South play-offs.

Four years at Braintree Town – fresh from promotion to Non-League's top flight – followed and his Iron defied the odds to survive and upset the big boys. In May 2015 the ex-England star made the trip back to York Road and, as underdogs again, took them to National League South title glory where they too made their mark at the top table.

Sean Marks, who played for Devonshire at Braintree and Maidenhead, can picture his former boss stood on the side of training before a big game, cup of tea in one hand, chocolate digestive in the other.

"We could be playing a really top, top professional team – a Stockport County, a Luton or any other big team – and you can imagine him looking at the boys thinking, 'It's alright, we've got this covered on Saturday,'" he told The NLP. "It was that mentality. Knowing the team he's got will do the business and he had every trust in his team to do it.



"I think that sums him up about right. Old school, with a great sense of humour and winning in the new form of football."

Dave Tarpey is another player who knows Devonshire very well and benefited from his methods.

The 1980 FA Cup winner gave him his big chance at Hampton & Richmond Borough, with the pair later reunited at Maidenhead after Tarpey had initially joined the Magpies in 2014.

In three years under Devonshire, Tarpey netted 87 goals in 124 appearances for the Magpies, including a league and club record 44 goals to help Maidenhead to promotion in the 2016-17 season.

"I remember a number of trips away on coaches where he will say he'll get you some protein food before the match and then he'd go and get us protein pizzas as a pre-match meal," Tarpey said.

"I remember a few away journeys as well where we had to stop at a certain restaurant because he wanted his ham, egg and chips before the game!"

Sam Barratt was at Maidenhead when Devonshire re-joined and has signed for him two more times since. Fittingly, he scored the final goal of Dev's reign in their win over Chippenham,

borrowed a flat cap from a fan in the crowd and saluted the boss.

"He's been very loyal to me and that can be rare in football," Barratt said. "It comes from honesty from both sides. He's repaid it with a lot of loyalty and I respect that a lot.

"Seeing where Maidenhead was as a club when I signed aged 18 to where it is now, it's almost unrecognisable – a lot of that is due to him – as well as the community side expanding. That comes hand-in-hand with the club growing, being promoted and sustaining their time in the National League."



# Match Reports

## Thackley 0 Frickley 7

After a dominating the first half, The Blues produced a ruthless attacking display in the second to dismantle Thackley 7-0 on their own patch, with Lucas Robinson bagging 4 goals in a sensational individual performance on a rain-soaked afternoon.

The Azzurri set their stall out early with a string of chances. In just the third minute, Spence whipped in a low cross which Destiny turned inches wide. 3 minutes on and Destiny's thunderous strike cannoned off the bar, the ball bouncing on the line and away.

Thackley's goalkeeper was called into action seconds later, pushing another Destiny effort behind, with Radz seeing his header blocked from the resulting corner. Radz also had a decent shout for penno when he was dragged to the ground at another set piece.

Despite clear pressure, the opening goal refused to come, though Tom A and Robbo both went close.

The Blues were almost made to pay when, against the run of play, Thackley threatened in the 25th minute as a wickedly dipping dipping shot smacked against the bar. Going towards half time, Robinson remained a menace, setting up chances for Tom A, the clearest of these hit the keeper at point blank range.

At the other end, Sykesy showed neat handling to deny Thackley when they did get a rare sight of goal.

The Blues went in at the break one up, but with the game still in the balance, well aware they could have been further ahead. HT 0-1.

The Boys in Blue had no intention of taking their collective foot off the gas though and started the second period with similar intent, pouring forward like grey tide.

The Blues showed intent from the off, testing the home keeper early as Robbo and Tom A both saw efforts held inside the opening 5 minutes.

The pressure continued when Robbo curled a

shot over the bar before turning provider for Destiny, whose shot went millimetres past the upright and rippled the side netting. On 20 minutes, The Azzurri broke the deadlock when Tom A floated in a teasing free kick that Radz met perfectly, guiding his header beyond the keeper to make it 1-0.

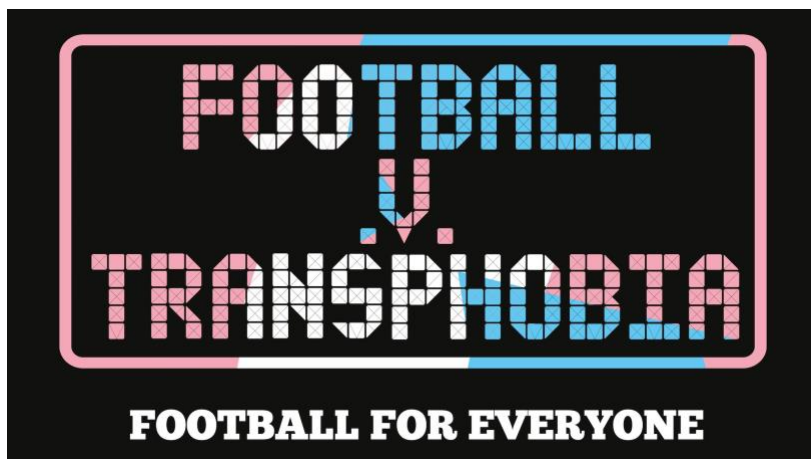

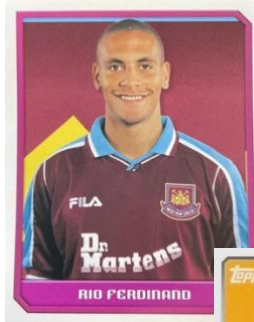


## Linked to The Lane

I'm an incorrigible collector of old A&BC, Panini, Merlin, Topps, etc. football cards and stickers, and it struck me how many of the players pictured had links to Frickley Athletic. They might have played for or against us at some point, or are related to one of The Azzurri past or present. Or the connection might be even more tenuous! But you can be sure it was the highlight of their career :)

It's more of Martyn Woolford's opponents this week. When his Scunthorpe team played Manchester United in the League Cup 3rd round in 2010, Woolly was up against a pair of defensive goliaths in Rio Ferdinand and Wes Brown.

London-born in 1978, Rio Ferdinand is widely regarded as one of the best centre halves of his generation. He began his career at West Ham United, progressing through the club's academy before making his professional debut in 1996. His composure on the ball, athleticism, and reading of the game quickly marked him out as a standout defender. After establishing himself as one of the Premier League's top prospects, he moved to Leeds United in 2000 for a then-world-record fee for a defender. At Leeds he became club captain and helped guide the team to the 2000/01 UEFA Champions League semifinals. In 2002, Ferdinand traitorously signed for Manchester United for another record-breaking fee of almost £30 million, beginning a 12 year spell in which he won 6 Premier League titles, the Champions League, 2 League Cups, and the FIFA Club World Cup. He became central to United's domestic and European success under Alex Ferguson, although he did have to serve an 8 month suspension in 2003/04 for missing a drug test – not his first or last run in with authority. Internationally, Ferdinand earned 81 caps for England from 1997 to 2011, featuring in the 2002 and 2006 World Cups. He was England's



youngest defender when he made his debut and would've done so even earlier had he not been dropped for a drink-driving offence.

After leaving Manchester United, he spent a final season with QPR before retiring in 2015.

Since then, he has built a career as a television pundit and media personality, while also engaging in charity and writing, along with some questionable political choices.

Similarly, Wes Brown is a defender best known for his long association with Manchester United. Born in Manchester in 1979, he was a product of his local club. United's youth academy, he made his first team debut in 1998. Strong in the tackle, quick across the ground, and capable of playing both centre back and right back, Brown became an important squad member throughout Alex

Ferguson's most successful years. He earned the club's Young Player of the Year award in both 1997/98 and 1998/99, the latter coinciding with United's historic treble winning season

Brown's peak period came in the mid-2000s, particularly the 2007/08 season, when he was a United regular during their Premier League and Champions League double. He supplied

the assist for Cristiano

Ronaldo's goal in the Champions League final that year. Across his Manchester United career, which lasted until 2011, Brown won an impressive array of silverware, 5 Premier League titles, 2 FA Cups, 2 League Cups, 2 Champions Leagues, and the FIFA Club World Cup. In 2011 he joined Sunderland, where he spent 5 more seasons.

After leaving Sunderland, he had a short stint with Blackburn Rovers in 2016 before ending his professional playing career.

On the international stage, Brown won 23 England caps between 1999 and 2010, appearing at the 2002 World Cup and Euro 2000.

Following retirement, he moved into coaching, punditry, and ambassadorial roles.

Rumour has it that despite the Irons being beaten 5-2 (after being a goal up), it was Woolly who made Ferguson realise that the days of Rio and Wes at football's top table were numbered ;)

## Next up – Tadcaster Albion

**Tadcaster Facts:** Famous for its breweries, Tadcaster is home to Samuel Smith's Old Brewery, aptly named as it is the oldest brewery in Yorkshire. Tadcaster's bridge was the site of the Battle of Tadcaster in 1642 during the Civil War. One of the most recent versions of the aforementioned bridge collapsed in late December 2015 as a result of severe flooding. The most famous former inhabitant of Tadcaster was the marine reptile, the plesiosaur, fossilised bone fragments of which have been unearthed at Tadcaster Mere, just to the south east of the town. Also, Jan Dalibor, co-creator of Pinky and Perky, worked as a quarryman in Tadcaster.

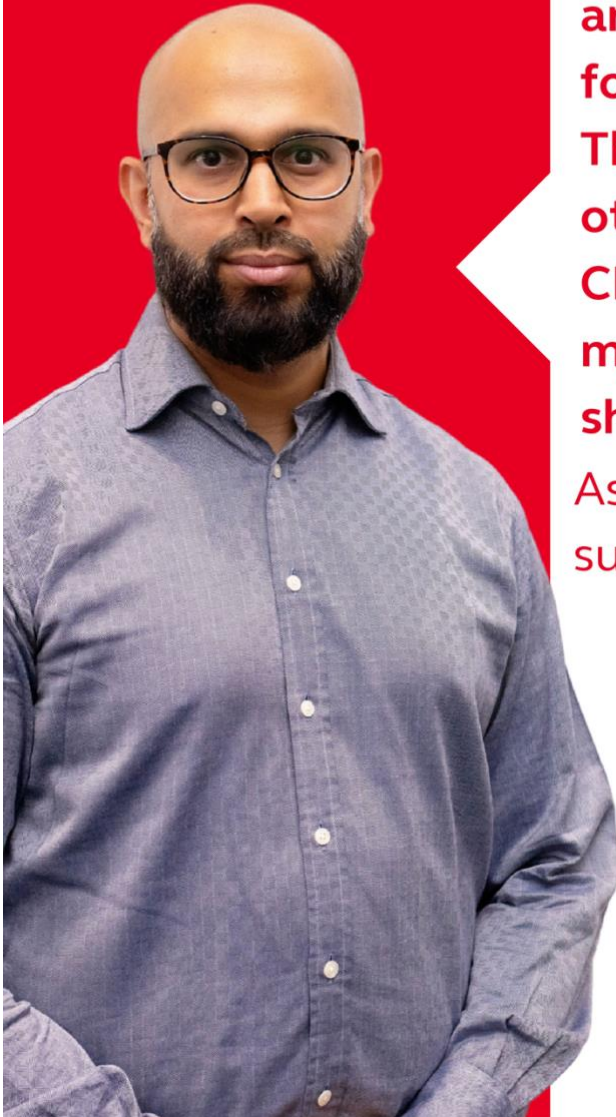
