# Bluescene

Good afternoon, ladies and gentlemen, and a happy New Year to you all. Welcome to The SALUS Stadium for today's first Northern Counties East Premier Division game of 2026 against Campion. We give a warm welcome to Campion's players, officials and supporters and hope they have a safe trip home after the game.

Today's mascots are Pontefract Wildcats U10s. We hope have a great day at The Wezzie. Give 'em a big cheer when they come out!

Today's visitors, Campion, currently sit in 7th place on 41 points after 26 games. A run of 6 wins in all competitions, scoring 23 goals, came to an end with a goalless draw at home to Golcar United, then Beverley Town inflicted a 5-0 drubbing at Scotchman Road. This was followed by a recovery and a pair of 1-0 victories on the road at Eccleshill United and, last weekend, at Horbury Town

The Blues come into today's game in 10th place on 32 points after 25 games. Our last 3 games have seen us win 1, draw 1 and lose 1, the defeat ending a 5 match unbeaten run and our first at home since October. We edged past Bottesford Town, here at The Wezzie, thanks to Lucas Robinson and Tom Alngohuru strikes, despite being down to 10 men for

half the game, before a first half own goal allowed us to grind out a 1-1 draw at Tadcaster Albion. Then in front of 786 fans, here at HQ, our biggest home crowd in over 17 years, Will Jenkinson's first Frickley goal and Tom Alngohuru's 10th of the season weren't enough to prevent us losing by the odd goal in 5 to visitors Penistone Church.

Our most recent meeting with Campion was our league game in September at Scotchman Road. Campion won 4-0, a third heavy defeat in a week, and was the final nail in former boss Tom Claisse's managerial coffin. Our most recent game with Campion here at The Wezzie was back in August 2024 when a last minute goal made it 2-1 and gave Campion all 3 points after Will Sutton had equalised in the first half.

Expect The Blues to be going all out to start 2026 with a win, which would be our first against Campion in the NCEL.

Our next game sees The Blues are in action here at Westfield Lane on Tuesday 27th January when Liversedge are our visitors for a NCEL League Cup Quarter Final tie, 7.45pm ko. We hope to see you all there.

# Meet The Visitors

Based at the Manningham Mills Sports Association on Scotchman Road, in the shadow of the iconic Lister's Manningham Mills, Campion are perhaps the most successful amateur team over recent years to hail from Bradford. Since the turn of the century the club has won various cups with the 2006/07 victory in the WRCFA Challenge Cup final undoubtedly being the highlight. Formed in 1963 by Michael Mahoney, taking its players from the members of St Edmund Campion Youth club, in 1976 through Peter Kennelly the club was renamed Campion AFC. The club moved into open age football in 1975 entering the Bradford Sunday League 4th division and gained promotion over five years to the 1st Division. In 1976 the club entered the Red Triangle League, a local Bradford Saturday league, and after steady years of progress moved up to the Premier Division in 1979. The following season saw Campion lift the Premier Division league cup and finish runners up in the league. 1981 saw the clubs policy change to concentrate on Saturday football only as they entered the West Riding County Amateur League and in 1983 both its open age teams were in the WRCAFL. Due to financial difficulties and the resignation of both the 1st and 2nd team managers along with the club secretary the club withdrew from the WRCAFL in 1985. Under new secretary Andy Shepherd the club re-formed and entered the premier division of the Red Triangle League for the 1985/86 season. The club were accepted again back into WRCAFL in 1986. Steady progress was made during the next few seasons and by 1989 they were established in Division 2. At the start of the 1989/90 season former player Delroy Dacres was appointed manager a position he held for many years. In his first season in charge the Division 2 League and cup was won. This was followed by the Division 1 league and cup in 1992/93 bringing premier Division football to the club. Since then the club has continued to see improvement both on and off the field of play. 2006 saw the club enter a new era with the opening of a £1.5 million club house. In 2007 Heaton Juniors changed their name to Campion Juniors to ensure a flow of home grown players through the ranks. 2005/06 saw the club miss out on the League title by 1 point despite winning 20 league matches on

the trot. The following season saw the club bounce back to lift the biggest prize in the club's history when goals by former Bradford City and Newcastle United player Des Hamilton and a last minute winner by Micky Burke saw Campion Lift the County Cup against Golcar United. In 2007/08 Campion won the WRCAFL Premier Division League Cup for the 4th time in 5 years. Campion have since lifted the Bradford & District FA Cup three times in 2010 and 2012 and 2016. In 2013 Delroy Dacres announced that he was to retire as first team manager after 25 years in charge. James Bicknell took over as manager for the 2013/14 season which saw Campion lose their first game 5-0 to bitter rivals Tyersal However, form picked up and the club finished third and also reached the League Cup final losing to League winners Overden WR and the next season Campion again reached the District and League cup finals. In 2016 both the First team and Reserves made it to the District FA Cup semi-final and were drawn against each other, the game going to penalties, with the Firsts winning a place in the final. Field were the opponents for the final but again after 90 minutes the scores were level and again Campion won the penalty shoot out to see Bicknell lift his first trophy as Campion Manager. The club also formed a U21 team after a merger with Wibsey Lions U18s which took part in the WRCFA Floodlit League for in 2015/16. In December 2015 the Club committee made the decision to apply for Membership of the Toolstation NCEL. Following a lot of hard work the ground passed an inspection in March 2016 and were proposed for promotion and duly elected to the NCEL in June. A series of very commendable NCEL Division One top half finishes followed. At the end of the 2020/21 season the club were transferred to Division One North of the North West Counties League for a single season. Back in the NCEL in 2022/23, Campion were Division One champions and were promoted to the Premier Division. The club gave a good account of themselves in their first season at step 5, with a runners up spot and a playoff place. 2024/25 was tougher but 9th place was still a solid performance. The club will be looking to continue to build in 2025/26.





# Frickley's History

Frickley Athletic FC is based in the former coal mining village of South Elmsall. Recent research has shown that the first South Elmsall football team was formed in 1905 but was superseded in 1908 by the newly formed Frickley Colliery Athletic Club and joined the South Yorkshire league which comprised of works, church and village teams. In 1910, the football club moved to the Sheffield Association League and first played in the FA Cup.

The club remained in the Sheffield Association League (except for the war years) until 1922, finishing runners up in 1911/12, and winners in 1920/21, our only ever league title.

In 1922/23 Frickley joined the Yorkshire league and after finishing runners up in 1923/24, the club were elected into the Midland League. Although the club had to apply for re election several times pre war (and didn't play in any league in 1933/34) it was kept going by the support of the mineworkers and the sale of players.

1936/37 was Frickley's worst ever league season when the club finished bottom with only 8 points, but amazingly reached the FA Cup 1<sup>st</sup> round proper for the first time.

Post war, Frickley remained in the Midland league gaining its best finish, 7<sup>th</sup>, in 1945/46, but left the league on its break up at the end of 1959/60.

From 1960/61 to 1969/70, Frickley Colliery played in the Cheshire County League. However, financial considerations led the club to join the Midland Counties League for 1970/71. They finished runners up in 1972/73, and were eventually elected into the NPL for the 1976/77 season as Frickley Athletic.

After finishing 3<sup>rd</sup> in 1979/80, the club was promoted into the Alliance Premier League, now the National League. Here they remained for 7 years, the most successful in the club's history, and in 1985/86 reached the FA Cup 3<sup>rd</sup> round proper, after beating a Football League club, Hartlepool Utd, only to lose 3-1 at home to Rotherham Utd. The club also finished as Gola League runners up. The following season saw a reversal as we were relegated back to the NPL. From 1987/88 to 1991/92 the club consistently finished around mid-table in the NPL, but did manage to reach the league cup final in 1991/92, losing 1-0 to Marine at Maine Road.

The next few seasons saw Frickley finish in the lower reaches of the table. Then, in 2005/06 The

Blues had their best league season for 20 years, finishing 2nd to Blyth Spartans. Unfortunately, the Blues lost on penalties in the playoff semi.

In the following seasons Frickley returned to the lower half of the table, but 2015/16 saw the club have a great season to finish 7<sup>th</sup>.

In 2016/17, most of the players who had brought this success were attracted to more affluent clubs. The club were relegated from the NPL Premier Division after a 30 year stay.

2017/18 saw the club enter the NPL Division 1 South, finishing 3<sup>rd</sup> in the league, scoring a record 117 goals. Additionally, Jacob Hazel broke the club record for individual goals in a season with 47 strikes. The season ended disappointingly with playoff semi final defeat at the hands of Stamford.

2018/19, in the new NPL East Division, was less successful, seeing managerial changes and a 12<sup>th</sup> place finish. However, the season had its highlights, with victory at highflying Morpeth and a 10-1 win over Liversedge in the FA Cup.

More change followed prior to the start of 2019/20. A further league reorganisation which put The Blues into the NPL South East Division was accompanied by a new manager. An inauspicious start lead to the appointment of Dave Frecklington in September 2019.

Frecks rapidly turned the side's fortunes around, before lockdown ended the season. 2020/21 ultimately suffered the same fate.

Frecks built what looked like strong squad for the 2021/22 season in the newly formed NPL East Division. However, things didn't pan out as hoped. Key departures lead to a run of form that saw the club relegated to the Northern Counties East League for the first time in our history.

In the summer of 2022, former Blue, Wayne Benn, was installed as manager, with ex-Frickley goal scoring legend Andy Hayward as his assistant. There were occasional highs but Benn resigned in early 2023 so Patrick McGuire came in to avoid a second successive relegation.

2023/24 started well, and included an 8-0 win at Goole, but ended with the release of McGuire.

James Baxendale was in the hot seat for the start of 2024/25 but left to be replaced by Tom Claisse in November 2024 and successfully avoided the drop before being relieved of his duties in September 2025.

Club legend Martyn Woolford has taken the reigns and he'll be looking to roll back the years and bring winning ways back to Westfield Lane.

# Blues in control of fine game

FRICKLEY Athletic's superb home record, which has seen their colours lowered on only three occasions this season, continued on Saturday with Jamie O'Donnell's fourth goal of the season — enough to give them a 1-0 win against lowly Radcliffe Borough.

Blues started the stronger and forced two corners in the 6th minute with Mark Haran heading wide following the second. Five minutes later, a Gary Hatto free-kick was only half-cleared into the path of Ian Frank, who rifled a 20 yarder just wide. In the 18th minute, Hatto saw his shot saved by Borough keeper Steve Berryman and Chris Annan — in his first appearance for Frickley at Westfield Lane — saw an effort go just over the bar as Blues sought an opener.

A rare raid by the visitors saw David Goldsbrough make a full-

stretch save to deny Jock Russell.

Blues finally broke the deadlock on the half-hour when Annan sent Scott Armstrong clear down the right, who cut in to send over a low cross tapped home at the far post by James O'Donnell.

The dangerous Russell then tested Goldsbrough again following a fine solo run, while a Simon Fuller free-kick before the break sent Annan racing clear with his shot crashing into the side-netting.

After the break anxiety crept into Frickley's play as they took time to settle — although they almost added their second goal on the hour when Hatto seized onto a loose ball before firing a 25 yarder just over. In the 66th minute, O'Donnell cut in to set up Annan, whose powerful header was stopped at the far post by Berryman.

Blues managed to up the tempo during the final quarter of the game and they almost made the game safe

in the 83rd minute, when O'Donnell weaved his way through again to find Fuller, whose shot was well saved with Kevin Kelly's rebound effort deflected.

From the resulting corner, Annan thought he had endeared himself to the home fans with a debut goal, but referee David Birkett ruled that his shot hadn't crossed the line. Immediately after, Chris Hilton broke clear to find Fuller, whose shot on the turn was saved by Berryman.

With two minutes to go, Annan beat two players before firing in an angled drive which hit the post. Fuller's follow-up attempt was again stopped by Berryman as Blues finished with a flourish — in front of a crowd of 142.

On Saturday, Blues travel to North Wales for their rearranged fixture at Colwyn Bay, originally postponed on January 3, kick-off 3pm.

In the last minute HOOD added the third goal with a swerving shot from the left wing.

# The NLP Column: Hughes News!

Liam Hughes has always been one of those players who is a pleasure to interview. Part of Cambridge United's double winners in 2014 – they beat Gosport in the FA Trophy and Hughes scored in the promotion final victory over Gateshead – it feels like he's been around for ages.

Since then he's had spells at north of the border with Inverness as well as a few more Non-League stops including Frickley Athletic, Barrow, Guiseley and Matlock among others.

A couple of weeks ago he moved to Cleethorpes Town after a hugely successful period helping Worksop Town rise from Step 4 to the National League North with 95 goals in 145 games. He even copped the NLP's Step 3 / 4 player of the year at our National Game Awards in 2023.

Over the years he's become a huge outspoken advocate for mental health and trying to help younger players navigate the pitfalls of a football career.

And it's that bigger impact he highlighted when chatting to us about moving onto Cleethorpes and looking back on his time at Worksop.

"The stats speak for themselves and you don't get that from an unhappy player but I like to look at the wider picture," Hughes, who won a promotion-FA Trophy double with Cambridge United in 2014, said. "The whole community feel, the relationship I had with fans, supporting people with issues on the mental health side that I am a big advocate for.

"I always say this, there is a bigger picture than just a game of football. It's how you integrate with people, how to communicate with fans and make the whole place feel like you're all in it together.

"That's something I want to try and achieve at Cleethorpes as well. I don't just see myself as a cog in a machine on a football pitch, there is more to what I hope to bring to a football team than just knocking in a goal every now and then.

"It's bringing people together, sharing success together. Having that impact off the pitch is something I am really excited to try and bring to Cleethorpes."

And Hughes is steadfast in his belief of the power of Non-League football and the people involved.

"For me, it's why you make sacrifices, travel up and down the county," Hughes said. "Non-

League football is the epitome of togetherness. It's the backbone of English football. Die hard fans who play their hard earned money to support you.

"When you're trying to achieve things it's sometimes easy to forget why you do it. Non-League is why we love the game. It brings people together.

"Someone could be going through some of the hardest things in your

life and that togetherness on a Saturday or Tuesday night, whatever it may be, is enough sometimes to break the back of some really difficult times.

"It certainly saved my life – having a goal to achieve and work towards with my friends and family supporting me.

"It's something I am really passionate about. Non-League football is bigger than just a game. It's people's lives, volunteers sacrificing their time to make a football club what it is. If we can repay that a little bit on the football pitch I am absolutely here for it.

"The reason I play the game is for my friends, my family and all the fans who dedicate their lives to the club. That's not just the Cleethorpes Towns and the Worksops, it's every Non-League supporter across the country. My hat goes off to you! It's amazing."

## Linked to The Lane

I'm an incorrigible collector of old A&BC, Panini, Merlin, Topps, etc. football cards and stickers, and it struck me how many of the players pictured had links to Frickley Athletic. They might have played for or against us at some point, or are related to one of The Azzurri past or present. Or the connection might be even more tenuous! But you can be sure it was the highlight of their career ;)

In February 1989, Boston United, replete with ex-Blues legends Paul Shirtliff and Paul Wilson in their side, played a handy Newcastle United team in a mid-season friendly. The Magpies had some that could play a bit too, the standouts being John Hendrie and Mirandinha.

John Grattan (seriously) Hendrie was born in 1963 in Lennoxton, Scotland, although he spent his entire playing career in England, primarily as a forward/winger.

Hendrie began his career with Coventry City in 1981 after coming through as an apprentice, but found first-team opportunities limited, apart from a short loan at Hereford United.

In 1984 he moved to Bradford City, where he became a mainstay, playing the best part of 200 games, winning the Football League Third Division championship in 1984/85.

After 4 seasons at Bradford, Hendrie signed for Newcastle United in 1988 and was the club's player of the year in his only season

on Tyneside. He then spent a single season at Leeds United, contributing to their 1989/90 Second Division title win and promotion to the First Division.

JH joined Middlesbrough in 1990 and found a more permanent home, becoming a key player over 6 years, helping the club secure promotion to the Premier League as First Division champions in 1994/95 and famously scoring the final goal at the historic Ayresome Park.

In 1996 Hendrie signed for Barnsley, and again took a player of the season in his first season at a new club. And at Oakwell, Hendrie was part of their ascent to the Premier League via the playoffs. He ended his playing career there in

1999, with a brief spell as player-manager, finishing with over 500 league appearances and more than 100 goals.

After his retirement from the game, Hendrie worked as a sports consultant in the field of law. Hendrie's teammate, Brazilian striker Francisco Ernandi Lima da Silva, born in 1959, was better known as Mirandinha, and rewrote a few rules and regulations himself.

He began his career in his home country with several clubs, including Ferroviário, Ponte Preta, Palmeiras, Botafogo, Náutico and Portuguesa, establishing himself as a pacy and prolific forward in the Brazilian leagues.

In 1987 Mirandinha made history and became a trailblazer for Brazilian players as the first from the land Joga Bonito to play for a English club when he joined Newcastle United for almost £600k, a significant fee at the time.



During his 2 seasons with Newcastle he made over 60 appearances and scored at a rate of a goal every 3 games, endearing himself to supporters with his flair and direct style of play, although injuries and changes in management eventually saw him return to Brazil.

After his stint in England, he continued his playing career back in Brazil and in Europe and Asia, including brief periods with Os Belenenses in Portugal and later with Japanese sides such as Shimizu S-Pulse and Bellmare Hiratsuka. He eventually retired in the mid-1990s after an 18 year playing career incorporating 15 spells with 12 clubs.

Internationally, Mirandinha earned 4 caps for the Brazil national team in 1987, scoring his only goal for them against England at Wembley.

After retirement, Mirandinha continued his trend of not needing to unpack his suitcase with time spent at almost 20 different clubs in Brazil, Saudi Arabia, Malaysia and Sudan in 20 years in management.

In the event, Toon beat the Pilgrims 1-0, but Shirtliff's top defending against Hendrie was genuinely mentioned in the match report and Wilson hit the bar. The writing was on the wall and Hendrie and Mirandinha were shown the door at St James' Park at the end of the season ;)



# Blues Squad 25/26

**Joel Spence (Midfielder):** Joel 90 was at Armthorpe before joining us and he's been on the books of Rotherham United before plenty of experience at Belper Town, Ossett United and Wakefield.

Deservedly won player of the season in 24/25.

**Will Sykes (Goalkeeper):** The Holy Goalie is a highly rated young stopper who joined us from Hallam, against whom he saved a penalty towards the end of last season.

**Niall Butchart (Defender/Midfielder/Forward):** The Butcher is a versatile squad member. He is a former youth teamer at Altrincham, then was at Winsford United, Swallowhurst, Armthorpe Welfare and Goole.

**Tom Alngohuru (Midfielder/Forward):** The Guru is a defender's nightmare. He joined last season from Ossett United. Prior to that he was at the York City and i2i academies, and has played almost 80 games for Pickering Town.

**Luis Afonso-Ferreira (Midfielder/Forward):** The Ferrari is a rapid forward who puts teams on the back foot. He has plenty experience from time at the likes of Retford United, Parkgate and Albion Sports.

**Sam Cable (Forward):** The Power is a handful of an attacker. Since starting out in our U19s over a decade ago, he is now in his 3rd spell with the club after spells at Barton Town, Garforth Town and others.

**Charlie Clegg (Forward):** The Power is a local boy and a fan favourite, in his third spell with us. Has experience with Ponte Colls youth programme, Emley, Athersley, Armthorpe and Club Thorne.

**Will Jenkinson (Defender):** Jenko is a footballing defender who joins us from Parkgate, having started out at Rotherham United.

**Sam Kilner (Defender):** A NCEL title winner at Silsden last season, Killer is a highly proficient fullback who has also been at Buxton, Mossley, Hemsworth and Knaresborough.

**Ifeanyi Nnenanua (Forward):** Goes by the name of Destiny, he's a committed young striker who is always in the thick of it. He's been at the i2i academy and has previously played for Pickering Town.

**Lucas Robinson (Midfielder/Forward):** A rangey winger with an eye for goal, Cool Hand Lucas comes to us from Harrogate Railway but has been at Goole and Barton Town too.

## ON THIS DAY IN FOOTBALL – 24<sup>TH</sup> JANUARY

1912 - Watford, then in the Southern League, lost 10-0 to the mighty Wolves in a FA Cup First Round Replay.  
 1955 - Stoke beat Bury in the FA Cup in the 7th meeting between the two clubs in a month. 2 meetings in the league over Christmas were followed by 5 in the FA Cup Third Round. With no penalty shootouts in those days, the clubs played twice at the Victoria Ground, twice at Gigg Lane and the 2nd, 3rd and 4th FA Cup replays being played at Goodison, Anfield and Old Trafford.

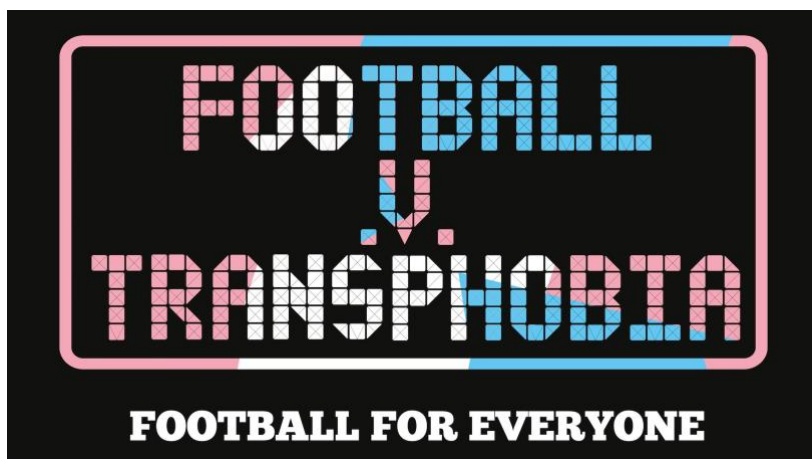
1976 - The first match in the UK to feature sponsored shirts was the Southern League match between Kettering Town and Bath City after player-manager and chief executive Derek Dougan signed a four-figure deal with Kettering Tyres to have their name printed on the playing shirts. The FA ordered the removal of the ads. When shirt sponsorship eventually became commonplace, it was not initially allowed in televised matches.

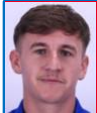

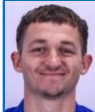

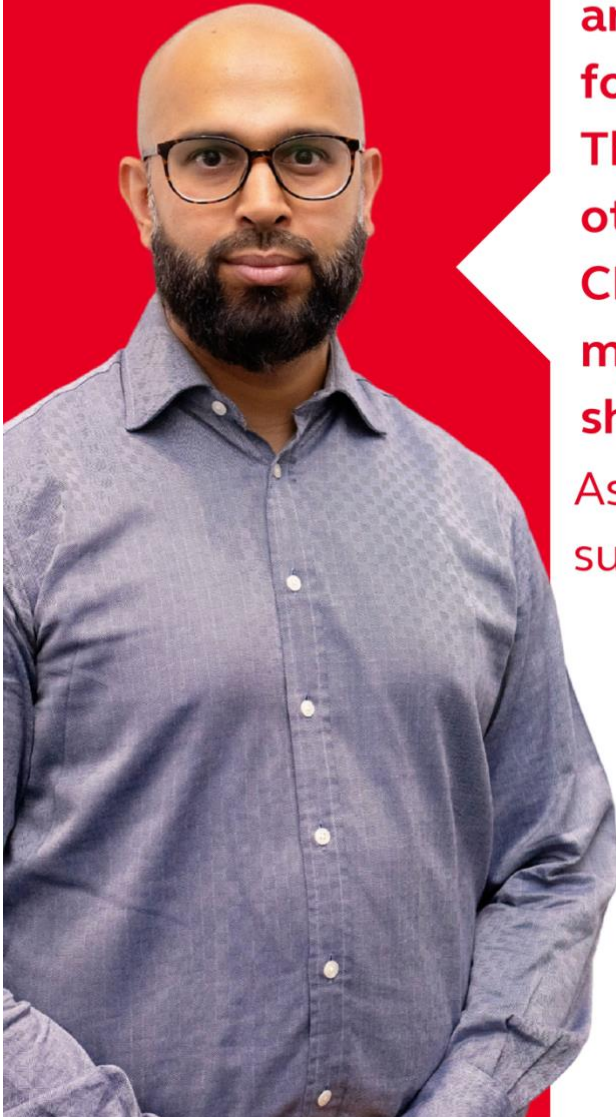
