

Bluescene

Good afternoon, ladies and gentlemen, welcome to The SALUS Stadium for today's Northern Counties East Premier Division game against Beverley Town. We give a warm welcome to Beverley's players, officials and supporters and hope they have a safe trip home after the game.

Today's visitors, Beverley Town, currently sit in 2nd place on 60 points after 29 games. Bev are on an impressive run of 7 consecutive league wins and are unbeaten in the 14 league games since losing to ourselves at the beginning of October. Since the turn of the year, Beverley have triumphed 5-1 at home to Albion Sports, then nicked a last minute goal to win 1-0 at Eccleshill United, before 2 more home victories, 6-1 against Wombwell Town and, last weekend, 1-0 against Horbury Town.

The Blues come into today's game in 10th place on 35 points after 28 games. Our last 4 league games have seen us lose 3 before ending that disappointing run with a great win. Goals from Will Jenkinson and Tom Alngohuru weren't enough to prevent a 3-2 defeat against visitors Penistone Church in front of a big crowd, just after Christmas. Then following a weather-enforced month-long break, Champion were 4-0 winners here at The Wezzie, and we were beaten 2-0 at Pickering Town. But last Saturday we travelled to 3rd placed Handsworth and put in one of the performances of the season to win 2-0, courtesy of a pair of stunning strikes from Joel Spence and Charlie Clegg.

Our most recent meeting with Beverley Town

was our league game in October 2025 at Norwood Park. After losing 4-0 there in January 2025, and having lost our previous 4 league games by a combined score of 18-1, our hopes weren't high, but in an almost complete reversal of fortunes, The Azzurri eased to a 4-1 victory. Tom Alngohuru, Destiny Ifeanyi Nnenanua, Lucas Robinson and Tyler Sheard were our scorers. Our most recent league game with Beverley here at The Wezzie was in September 2024. Jack Varley's penalty and further goals from Rob Guilfoyle and Jamie Tomlinson put us ahead 3 times but each time Bev equalised, the last of these coming in the final minute to make it 3-3.

Expect The Blues to be doing their utmost to produce another fine performance and take 3 more points against very tough opposition.

In recruitment news, fan favourite Destiny Ifeanyi Nnenanua has signed for Bridlington Town in the league above ourselves, the Northern Premier League East, although we retain his NCEL registration. Conversely, midfielder Charlie Price and forward Feyi Afuape have joined us on loan from Barnsley, and midfielder Harry Carmody has also signed for The Blues. All 3 made solid debuts in our game at Handsworth. We wish them all the best whether they are on their way in or out of the club.

Our next game sees The Blues in action here at Westfield Lane on Tuesday 24th February when Parkgate are our visitors, 7.45pm ko. We hope to see you all there. Enjoy the game and as always we thank you for your valued and continued support.

Meet The Visitors

Beverley Town Football Club, nicknamed the Beavers, has been in existence since 1902, when the club became registered as a member of the East Riding County League. The first recorded honours for Town, came in 1905/6 when they won the Senior Cup which is the East Riding's most prestigious cup tournament when they beat the Hull Botanic Swifts by a 3-0 margin in a game played at Hull City's Anlaby Road Ground. The Beavers won the same trophy again in 1912/13 when they beat the First Battalion of the East Yorkshire Regiment by the same scoreline. The club was forced to disband in 1914, upon declaration of World War One. The club reformed after the war ended and remained in sporadic existence until 1939, when football was once again suspended following the commencement of World War Two. Some momentum was finally gained in 1948, after a merger with local side Beverley Rangers, which saw the team move to its current home at the Norwood Recreation Ground. This came after former chairman Jack Gittoes, persuaded his fellow cricket committee members to allow football onto the ground for the first time. In 1954, a further merger with Beverley United occurred and the club became highly competitive on the East Riding County League scene for the next two decades. The highlight was the team winning three East Riding Stanley Wilson Cup Finals - a trophy which was named after the local MP - during this era. After disagreements with the grounds committee, the club left Norwood circa 1970 and a nomadic existence was to follow, with Beverley Town playing at various venues over the ensuing years. These included the former Victoria Barracks, now a Morrisons Supermarket, Hodgsons Recreation Ground, Longcroft School, and Orchard Park Playing Fields in nearby Hull. It was not until 2000, when a Beverley Town team was formed from the former Beverley Old Grammarians side and became a founder member of the Humber Premier League that it became established as a presence of note once again. The Beavers returned to their

roots at Norwood and steady progress has been made since. The club lifted its first Humber Premier title in 2012/13, losing only one game in the process. A year later, Town won the Northern Counties Senior Cup, as they became one of only two East Riding County FA sides to have won this trophy its 40-year history.

Beverley Town won a second Humber Premier title in 2020/21 and the following season the club were league runners-up, but gained promotion to the NCEL Division One as improvements to the Norwood ground meant it finally fulfilled league eligibility. This included the installation of a 56-seater stand named in honour of former player and local school teacher Ivan Usher. Beverley Town were the best supported side in its debut 2022/3 NCEL Division One season.

A year later on the 11th May, 2024, the club was promoted to the NCEL Premier League after a thrilling penalty shootout in a playoff final against Shirebrook Town, which was played in front of a bumper 1500 crowd. This came after Beverley Town took 103 points during the regular season which saw them finish runners-up behind champions Parkgate. The 2024/25 season saw a league finish of fourth in the NCEL Premier Division, and defeat on penalties in the playoff final against Hallam. Success soon followed though, with a 3-2 victory in the NCEL League Cup final against Knaresborough Town at Scunthorpe United

Over the years, several players who have represented Beverley Town at either junior or senior level, have gone on to play in the professional game. These include former Leeds, Tottenham and England goalkeeper, Paul Robinson, as well as former Hull City players John Hawley; Ray Clubley, Linton Brown, Darren France, and Gavin Kelly. The team were also trained for a period in the 1960s by Hull City players John McSeveney and Andy Davidson. The latter of whom remains Hull City's record appearance holder with 579 games for the Tigers.





Frickley's History

Frickley Athletic FC is based in the former coal mining village of South Elmsall. Recent research has shown that the first South Elmsall football team was formed in 1905 but was superseded in 1908 by the newly formed Frickley Colliery Athletic Club and joined the South Yorkshire league which comprised of works, church and village teams. In 1910, the football club moved to the Sheffield Association League and first played in the FA Cup.

The club remained in the Sheffield Association League (except for the war years) until 1922, finishing runners up in 1911/12, and winners in 1920/21, our only ever league title.

In 1922/23 Frickley joined the Yorkshire league and after finishing runners up in 1923/24, the club were elected into the Midland League. Although the club had to apply for re election several times pre war (and didn't play in any league in 1933/34) it was kept going by the support of the mineworkers and the sale of players.

1936/37 was Frickley's worst ever league season when the club finished bottom with only 8 points, but amazingly reached the FA Cup 1st round proper for the first time.

Post war, Frickley remained in the Midland league gaining its best finish, 7th, in 1945/46, but left the league on its break up at the end of 1959/60.

From 1960/61 to 1969/70, Frickley Colliery played in the Cheshire County League. However, financial considerations led the club to join the Midland Counties League for 1970/71. They finished runners up in 1972/73, and were eventually elected into the NPL for the 1976/77 season as Frickley Athletic.

After finishing 3rd in 1979/80, the club was promoted into the Alliance Premier League, now the National League. Here they remained for 7 years, the most successful in the club's history, and in 1985/86 reached the FA Cup 3rd round proper, after beating a Football League club, Hartlepool Utd, only to lose 3-1 at home to Rotherham Utd. The club also finished as Gola League runners up. The following season saw a reversal as we were relegated back to the NPL. From 1987/88 to 1991/92 the club consistently finished around mid-table in the NPL, but did manage to reach the league cup final in 1991/92, losing 1-0 to Marine at Maine Road.

The next few seasons saw Frickley finish in the lower reaches of the table. Then, in 2005/06 The

Blues had their best league season for 20 years, finishing 2nd to Blyth Spartans. Unfortunately, the Blues lost on penalties in the playoff semi.

In the following seasons Frickley returned to the lower half of the table, but 2015/16 saw the club have a great season to finish 7th.

In 2016/17, most of the players who had brought this success were attracted to more affluent clubs. The club were relegated from the NPL Premier Division after a 30 year stay.

2017/18 saw the club enter the NPL Division 1 South, finishing 3rd in the league, scoring a record 117 goals. Additionally, Jacob Hazel broke the club record for individual goals in a season with 47 strikes. The season ended disappointingly with playoff semi final defeat at the hands of Stamford.

2018/19, in the new NPL East Division, was less successful, seeing managerial changes and a 12th place finish. However, the season had its highlights, with victory at highflying Morpeth and a 10-1 win over Liversedge in the FA Cup.

More change followed prior to the start of 2019/20. A further league reorganisation which put The Blues into the NPL South East Division was accompanied by a new manager. An inauspicious start lead to the appointment of Dave Frecklington in September 2019.

Frecks rapidly turned the side's fortunes around, before lockdown ended the season. 2020/21 ultimately suffered the same fate.

Frecks built what looked like strong squad for the 2021/22 season in the newly formed NPL East Division. However, things didn't pan out as hoped. Key departures lead to a run of form that saw the club relegated to the Northern Counties East League for the first time in our history.

In the summer of 2022, former Blue, Wayne Benn, was installed as manager, with ex-Frickley goal scoring legend Andy Hayward as his assistant. There were occasional highs but Benn resigned in early 2023 so Patrick McGuire came in to avoid a second successive relegation.

2023/24 started well, and included an 8-0 win at Goole, but ended with the release of McGuire.

James Baxendale was in the hot seat for the start of 2024/25 but left to be replaced by Tom Claisse in November 2024 and successfully avoided the drop before being relieved of his duties in September 2025.

Club legend Martyn Woolford has taken the reigns and he'll be looking to roll back the years and bring winning ways back to Westfield Lane.





Memory Match

As usual, we've got 2 memory matches for you, a pair of 'on this day' games. The first match was a Midland League game against Grantham Town, played on Saturday 21st February 1959 at London Road. In similar fashion to the current senior team's first win at Handsworth last week, The Old Azzurri claimed their first win at Grantham in 20 years, and then some, as they came from a goal down to win 5-1 with Irish international Eddie McMorrán scoring a brace. Then the second game is another Midland League game against Mansfield Town from Saturday 21st February 1931. In their final season before they joined the Football League, the Stags were were handed a 7-1 farewell drubbing, here at The Wezzie. All 7 were scored by Fitzpatrick with 4 goals and Jackson with the other 3. With thanks to JL.

FRICKLEY v. MANSFIELD.

Frickley Colliery gave a remarkable display on Saturday, when they entertained Mansfield. Playing clever football, they kept the visitors on the defensive for 80 of the 90 minutes, and eventually the Mansfield defence cracked up under the strain, only the smartness of the goalkeeper, H. Chambers, preventing a double-figure score. Frickley introduced a new inside-right, Armitage, of Hoyland Common. The teams were:—Frickley—Calvert; Chipperfield, Linley; Meads, Cook, Stephenson; Tucker, Armitage, Fitzpatrick, Whiteley and Jackson. Mansfield — H. Chambers; White, Poyser; Hargreaves, C. Chambers, Burrows; Goddard, Frith, Hill, Trotman and Murphy. Referee: Mr. W. G. Taylor, of Chesterfield. Frickley won the toss and advanced on the right, Poyser locking Tucker's shot. The right winger again obtained possession and centred, White having to concede a corner to ward off Jackson. The corner-kick ended in Armitage heading over. Mansfield got going on the left, but Chipperfield cleared and sent the ball down to Jackson, who kicked it high over the bar. Mansfield were being kept on the defensive. After ten minutes Fitzpatrick centred, only for the referee to

blow for offside. The Colliery now went on to score three times in two minutes. A smart movement by Fitzpatrick ended in Jackson obtaining the first, and the same player added a second in the next minute. Straight from the kick-off Fitzpatrick went through on his own to add a third. The visitors were being completely outplayed, Chambers having a busy time and saving well from Meads and Tucker, while Fitzpatrick and Whiteley missed by inches. Frickley went further ahead ten minutes before the interval, Fitzpatrick beating Chambers in a rush for the ball and shooting into an empty net. The pace slackened afterwards, Mansfield getting within dangerous reach. Half-time: Frickley 4, Mansfield 0. With the wind in their favour Mansfield shone more on resuming, and Chipperfield headed over from a centre by Murphy. Frickley again became aggressive, and a close range shot from Whiteley flashed just by the post. After six minutes Fitzpatrick completed his "hat-trick," cleverly heading in a low centre from Whiteley. Jackson added another shortly afterwards, and Fitzpatrick scored Frickley's seventh goal, Mansfield reducing the arrears through Hill five minutes from the end. Result: Frickley 7, Mansfield 1.

The NLP Column: Still kicking it out

Non-league football is the pillar of our communities and the true heartbeat of the game – there really is so much to be proud of.

But, whether we like it or not, it is also a giant mirror of our society and one that acts with anger and little fear of consequence.

Football brings out the best of us and we shouldn't forget that. The hours and hours of dedication people put in, simply for their love of their club or just the game itself.

But, here we are in 2026 and the same old problems continues to plague us. Racism, sadly, is still very much alive and kicking.

Over the years, The NLP have reported on countless stories of abuse levelled at players, officials and fellow supporters.

And once again, we recently followed up a statement issued by a club in support of one of their own.

It came after Jermaine Francis (pictured) posted a screenshot on X of the racist abuse he was sent on Snapchat after joining Sutton United.

The 23-year-old winger, who made the switch from Hartlepool United, said it was the second message he'd had received. "We regret to report that we have been made aware of racist abuse directed towards Jermaine Francis on social media," Sutton said.

"Following the completion of his transfer from Hartlepool United to Sutton United yesterday afternoon, Jermaine received a message on his Snapchat account that included racial abuse.

"As a club we condemn racism and discrimination in all forms, in the strongest possible manner. This behaviour has no place in football, or in society, and we are angered that Jermaine has been subjected to such disgusting abuse.

"We can't wait to welcome Jermaine to the VBS Community Stadium and we know our superb supporters will be fully behind him, as well as the whole team, as they have been all the season.



"We stand with Jermaine and all victims of online discriminatory abuse.

Kick It Out campaigns to make sure football is welcoming to everyone and are here to put an end to every form of discrimination. There is no place for racism in football, or anywhere."

At the same time, we were also contacted by a Hereford supporter who was left shaken by a chant from his fellow supporters when they took on Merthyr Town in National League North. Karan Rai has supported the Bulls for 21 years, chairs the London Bulls Supporters' Club and, after agonising over whether to do so, penned an open letter on Substack of how he felt that December afternoon and the impact it had.

"As an Asian Hereford fan, and as a proud Punjabi Sikh, I could not believe that after 21 years of following the club I love," he said.

"I witnessed a group of Hereford supporters singing "I'd rather be a P*ki than a Taff" loudly and repeatedly before kickoff at the Merthyr game," he wrote. "A game I was really looking forward to was totally ruined in seconds.

"Having a load of people sing that chant behind you when you're one of very few ethnic minorities in the ground is not a nice experience.

"What made it even more painful was recognising people I know among those singing it. Some of the same people who, only months earlier against Worksop, would have held up a "Give Racism the Red Card" placard. How do you make sense of that one?"

There has to never been a time with less of an excuse for not understanding the power of words. Hereford should be applauded for their statement on the matter, which is now a police investigation. Rai wants his story to become a positive too.

"It has been met with an outpouring of support and I ultimately want the letter to be an educational tool for good," he said. "I want to turn this situation into a positive and for some good to come out of it. I want this letter to encourage people to stand up to racism in football and to stop it's normalisation and to call it out."

It's that attitude that should empower us all to rid society of this disease in 2026 and beyond.

Pickering Town 2 Frickley 0

The Blues were left to rue missed opportunities as Pickering Town struck twice to claim the points on a frustrating afternoon for the Boys in Blue.

Both sides showed intent from the off. Inside the opening 5 minutes the hosts glanced a header wide and The Azzurri were nearly in on goal when Andrew squared the ball for Robbo (pictured), but a slip at the crucial moment saw his effort lifted inches over the bar.

However, it was against the flow when Pickering opened the scoring on 10 minutes. After a throw in from the left, their new player-manager was given too much room and was allowed to hit a 20 yarder that found the net.

Les Bleus responded well. Lindley delivered an excellent cross in the 18th minute and Robbo's deft flick looked destined for the corner until the Pickering keeper got down quickly to

push it away. Robbo was again at the heart of things just before the half hour, his shot forcing another smart save, while the home side threatened sporadically from set pieces, a corner on 31 minutes causing brief alarm.

The Blues continued to probe. In the 40th minute, Love whipped the ball into the box and Woolly attempted an audacious backheel that looped over the bar.

In the closing minutes of the half, Pickering headed wide at the other end and had a scuffed effort comfortably gathered by Sykes. HT 1-0.

Early in the second period, Sykesy was alert again as he smothered a loose ball, and moments later Radz glanced Tom A's free kick wide at the other end.

Radz thought he'd drawn us level on 51 minutes when he channelled his inner Zidane and volleyed past the keeper, only for the offside flag to cut celebrations short.

The Boys in Blue kept going at it. Andrew



gambled to run onto a through ball just before the hour, but his shot caught a defender's boot and flew over.

Despite The Blues enjoying their best spell, it was Pickering who scored again. A 64th minute cross took a wicked, and very fortunate, deflection off Gagen's outstretched leg, straight onto a teammate's head to nod it past Sykes for a 2-0 lead, against the run of play.

Down but not out, The Blues continued on the offensive. Butch fired over from distance, Gagen was denied when his attempt flashed wide, and Robbo tested the keeper again with a long range effort that was safely held. Several changes were made as The Azzurri looked for a way back into the game. The

closest we came arrived late on. Collins's corner on 88 minutes was poked wide a defender, and from the second corner the ball came back to him, his low shot hit the post as the keeper flapped at it. Deep into stoppage time, Cleggy curled a free kick towards the bottom corner only for the keeper to

pouch it and seal our fate. FT 2-0.

Again, we created chances and applied the pressure for long periods, but failure to take said chances cost us points.

Frickley 0 Liversedge 3 (NCEL League Cup QF)

Our League Cup journey came to an end at the quarter final stage as Liversedge left The Wezzie with a 3-0 win, the scoreline a touch harsh on a patched up Blues team who kept going to the final whistle in awful conditions. The Blues went into the tie stretched to the limit. With players cup tied, suspended, working and carrying knocks, it was a different looking side to the one that faced Pickering at the weekend. The reshuffle forced square pegs into round holes, with Woolly leading the line and Kilner switching sides, while at least there was the welcome sight of seeing Luis AF back in action for the first time since mid-November. All of this came against the backdrop of freezing cold, driving rain, a pitch that was cutting up, and opposition who are currently setting the pace in the league naming almost their strongest possible XI.



Lindley had the first effort inside 10 minutes, but his shot was blasted straight at the keeper. At the other end, Sykesy was soon into the action, producing a superb save with his legs to deny Liversedge and then following it up shortly after by tipping another rasping drive over the bar to keep things level.

That resistance was eventually broken midway through the first half. From a 24th minute corner, Liversedge's veteran number 6 was allowed enough time and space to bring down a low delivery, turn and fire a shot into the bottom corner for his 202nd goal for Sedge. The Azzurri were still trying to regroup when the deficit was doubled. A cross being met by a backheel from their number 7 that slipped past Sykesy, into the net, in the 31st minute. Despite the setback, The Boys in Blue continued to try and play. A neat passage involving Gadge, Lindley and Robbo ended with a corner late in the half, though it came to nothing. HT 0-2.

The restart saw The Blues have a real go at

shifting the momentum. Lindley sent a rising shot inches over, early on, while Sedge hit the post from the edge of the box not long after. The Azzurri were dealt another blow as Woolly went off injured to be replaced by Sheard. Defensively, there were still moments to admire. El Binno threw himself in to make a rock solid block, snuffing out a dangerous situation, and Sykesy was again grateful to see a Liversedge effort flash harmlessly across the face of goal, followed by another Sedge chance fluffed wide from a cross. The third goal arrived in the 72nd minute, Liversedge's number 9 side footing home to effectively end the game as a contest.

The Azzurri had a golden chance to grab a deserved consolation when Robbo was hauled down in the box. Penalty awarded. Sadly, Robbo lifted the 76th minute spot kick over the bar, summing up a frustrating night. FT 0-3

Took over as player-manager in October 2025.

2007 - Liverpool won 2-1 in Barcelona to become the first English club to win a Champions League match at the Nou Camp.



Linked to The Lane

I'm an incorrigible collector of old A&BC, Panini, Merlin, Topps, etc. football cards and stickers, and it struck me how many of the players pictured had links to Frickley Athletic. They might have played for or against us at some point, or are related to one of The Azzurri past or present. Or the connection might be even more tenuous! But you can be sure it was the highlight of their career ;)

The Blues were cruelly relegated from the Gola Alliance League (now called the National League) to the Northern Premier League in 1986/87. One of the earliest ex-EFL men that we faced at The Wezzie in that league was one Joe Bolton,


playing for Matlock Town, in October 1987. He might not have been a household name but he was a solid, respected, workaday pro. Joseph Bolton was born in February 1955 in Birtley. He came through the youth ranks at Sunderland, making his first-team debut in April 1972 in a 5-0 win against Watford and quickly

establishing himself as a regular in the side, predominantly as a left back.

Joe spent 9 seasons with Sunderland, becoming a consistent presence in defence and making well over 270 league appearances for the club. He was part of the team that won the Second Division title in 1976, securing promotion to the First Division and becoming a firm favourite and cult hero with Roker Park fans.



In 1981, Bolton moved down the coast to Middlesbrough for a transfer fee of around £200k. Over 2 seasons on Teesside, he made close to 60 league appearances and scored once, continuing to compete at the top levels of the Football League. He then left Ayresome Park to join Sheffield United in August 1983 on a free transfer, brought in by manager Ian Porterfield, a



former Sunderland teammate. At Bramall Lane, Bolton was a defensive stalwart and helped United secure promotion from the Third Division in his first season. However, persistent knee injuries eventually

curtailed his professional career, leading to his release in 1986 after over 100 appearances for the club. Following his professional playing career, Bolton dropped into non-league football with Matlock Town, where he played in the NPL from 1986 to 1988, before retiring from the game and taking a job as a lorry driver. Matlock's 1-0 defeat at the hands of The Blues is

believed to have largely been behind his decision to jack in the footy.

Outside of football, Bolton's name achieved a quirky, nay, legendary afterlife in popular culture, he was referenced on the back of The Housemartins' single 'Happy Hour', which claimed the band had "more striking power than Lineker, Platini and Joe Bolton all rolled together into a great big cuddly ball." Praise indeed.

Liversedge Facts: Noted for its part in the woollen industry, Liversedge is recorded in the Domesday Book as 'Livresed'. Despite being a town of almost 20,000 inhabitants, there is only one road sign in the entire area directing motorists towards Liversedge, situated on the A649 Halifax Road from Bailiff Bridge. Liversedge has been home to John Fozard who helped to design the first of the Harrier Jump jets, and the Burgess brothers, Sam, Luke, Tom and George, all of whom played rugby league for a variety of clubs in England and Australia.




