Good afternoon, ladies and gentlemen, welcome to The SALUS Stadium for today's Northern Counties East Premier Division game against Eccleshill United. We give a warm welcome to Eccleshill's players, officials and supporters and hope they have a safe trip home after the game.

Today's match ball is sponsored by The Grateful Dudes. We thank them for their kind support of the club. (And if anyone wishes to return that support then they are playing at The Greystones on Friday 6th March).

Today's visitors, Eccleshill United, currently sit in 16th place on 32 points after 29 games. Scoring goals has been a recent problem for Eccleshill, with just 2 in their last 9 games. On the final day of last month, 1 of these gave them a 1-0 win at home to Albion Sports, ending a 4 game losing streak. Since then they have lost both of their subsequent games at Golcar United and, last weekend, Horbury Town by a 4-0 scoreline.

The Blues come into today's game in 13th place on 35 points after 30 games. The Blues form has been remarkably similar to that of our visitors, with a run of 4 defeats being halted by our 2-1 win at Handsworth, courtesy of a pair of stunning strikes from Joel Spence and

Charlie Clegg. Then a pair of defeats followed, losing 3-1 at home to Beverley Town last Saturday, with Cleggy netting our goal from the penalty spot, and on Tuesday, we hosted Parkgate and went down 2-0. And likewise, goals have been a little hard to come by of late too, with 3 in our last 6 games

Our most recent meetings with Eccleshill United were our leagues games last season. In September 2024, we travelled to Eccleshill's then ground, Kingsway, and The Azzurri took an early lead with a Joel Spence goal. However, the home side turned it around to make it 2-1 by half time and that was how it stayed. In the return fixture, here at The Wezzie in February 2025, we played out a 0-0 stalemate.

Expect The Blues to be showing their mettle with a robust response to recent results.

Our next game sees The Blues travel to top of the table Liversedge on Wednesday 3rd March, 7.45pm kickoff. The Blues are next in action here at Westfield Lane on Saturday 7th March when Barton Town are our visitors, 3pm ko. We hope to see you all there.

Enjoy the game and as always we thank you for your valued and continued support.

Meet The Visitors

There is evidence of an Eccleshill United football club in existence pre 1910 and they played at Eccleshill Recreation Ground. This was a youth team with a maximum age of 20 years.

The present Eccleshill United did have a team before the Second World War, but it had to be disbanded when most of the players and officials joined the armed forces.

The club was reformed in 1948 and during the 1950's played in the Bradford Amateur League. The club won the Bradford Amateur League Cup in 1961/62.

During this time, a move was made from the Recreation Ground to a pitch on Acre Fields. In 1963, land was purchased at a former quarry at Plumpton Park, which was developed into two football pitches.

The club joined the West Riding County Amateur League, progressing to the Premier Division in 1972, before a licensed clubhouse was built in 1974. The club went on to win the league in 1976/77.

The club applied to join the Northern Counties East League in 1982, a bid which proved unsuccessful. New terracing was built and the dressing rooms upgraded and at the end of the 1984/85 season the club were accepted into Division Three of the Northern Counties East. The 1984/85 season also saw the club win the Bradford & District Senior Cup, which was retained in 1985/86.

At the end of the 1985/86 season Division Three was abolished and Eccleshill were moved up to Division Two. They finished as runners-up in 1986/87 and were promoted to Division One. Despite only finishing fifth in 1990/91, they were promoted to the Premier Division. The club spent three seasons in the Premier Division before being relegated at the end of the 1993/94 season. After winning Division One in 1996/97, the club were promoted back to the Premier Division. In 2008/09 they finished bottom of the Premier Division and were relegated back to Division One. The club then narrowly avoided finishing in the bottom two and being forced to leave the league the season after.

A new committee was formed and they resolved to take the club forward and a relationship was formed with RIASA (Richmond Development Academic and Soccer Academy) which allowed access to many foreign, mainly American players. Several high profile managers were appointed over the next few years including Ian Banks, Bobby Davison and Lee Duxbury. This culminated in Eccleshill's most successful season 2013/14 seeing them narrowly missing out on promotion, but winning the West Riding County Cup final and losing on penalties in the NCEL League Cup final. Both finals were held at Bradford City's Valley Parade ground. At the end of the 2014/15 season, Eccleshill ended its association with RIASA and decided to embark on a more traditional pathway with mostly local based players. The 2017/18 season saw them finish fourth in Division One, qualifying for the promotion play-offs. After beating Shirebrook Town 4-2 after extra time in the semi-finals, they defeated Grimsby Borough 3-2 in the final, earning promotion to the Premier Division. After 3 mid-table finishes, two of which were covid-affected, the 2021/22 season was a blistering campaign, in which the club finished second. This meant that the side travelled to Bedfordshire's Kempston Rovers in an Inter-Step Play-Off final fixture to gain promotion to Step Four. However, the Eagles narrowly lost 5-4 on penalties after drawing 2-2.

The last 3 seasons from 2022/23 to 2024/25 have been consistent but a little disappointing by comparison, finishing in 15th, 16th and 15th again, although the club did have a good run to the fifth round of the FA Vase in 2022/23 before going down 2-0 to Atherstone Town. The 2025/26 season has brought a big change as the club has moved to Keighley, to groundshare with Keighley Cougars at Cougar Park in an attempt to swell the attendances and ensure the club's sustainability. Boss Lee Elam and his squad will be hoping for a more successful season like 2021/22 and to push for the top half of the table again.





Frickley's History

Frickley Athletic FC is based in the former coal mining village of South Elmsall. Recent research has shown that the first South Elmsall football team was formed in 1905 but was superseded in 1908 by the newly formed Frickley Colliery Athletic Club and joined the South Yorkshire league which comprised of works, church and village teams. In 1910, the football club moved to the Sheffield Association League and first played in the FA Cup.

The club remained in the Sheffield Association League (except for the war years) until 1922, finishing runners up in 1911/12, and winners in 1920/21, our only ever league title.

In 1922/23 Frickley joined the Yorkshire league and after finishing runners up in 1923/24, the club were elected into the Midland League. Although the club had to apply for re election several times pre war (and didn't play in any league in 1933/34) it was kept going by the support of the mineworkers and the sale of players.

1936/37 was Frickley's worst ever league season when the club finished bottom with only 8 points, but amazingly reached the FA Cup 1st round proper for the first time.

Post war, Frickley remained in the Midland league gaining its best finish, 7th, in 1945/46, but left the league on its break up at the end of 1959/60.

From 1960/61 to 1969/70, Frickley Colliery played in the Cheshire County League. However, financial considerations led the club to join the Midland Counties League for 1970/71. They finished runners up in 1972/73, and were eventually elected into the NPL for the 1976/77 season as Frickley Athletic.

After finishing 3rd in 1979/80, the club was promoted into the Alliance Premier League, now the National League. Here they remained for 7 years, the most successful in the club's history, and in 1985/86 reached the FA Cup 3rd round proper, after beating a Football League club, Hartlepool Utd, only to lose 3-1 at home to Rotherham Utd. The club also finished as Gola League runners up. The following season saw a reversal as we were relegated back to the NPL. From 1987/88 to 1991/92 the club consistently finished around mid-table in the NPL, but did manage to reach the league cup final in 1991/92, losing 1-0 to Marine at Maine Road.

The next few seasons saw Frickley finish in the lower reaches of the table. Then, in 2005/06 The

Blues had their best league season for 20 years, finishing 2nd to Blyth Spartans. Unfortunately, the Blues lost on penalties in the playoff semi.

In the following seasons Frickley returned to the lower half of the table, but 2015/16 saw the club have a great season to finish 7th.

In 2016/17, most of the players who had brought this success were attracted to more affluent clubs. The club were relegated from the NPL Premier Division after a 30 year stay.

2017/18 saw the club enter the NPL Division 1 South, finishing 3rd in the league, scoring a record 117 goals. Additionally, Jacob Hazel broke the club record for individual goals in a season with 47 strikes. The season ended disappointingly with playoff semi final defeat at the hands of Stamford.

2018/19, in the new NPL East Division, was less successful, seeing managerial changes and a 12th place finish. However, the season had its highlights, with victory at highflying Morpeth and a 10-1 win over Liversedge in the FA Cup.

More change followed prior to the start of 2019/20. A further league reorganisation which put The Blues into the NPL South East Division was accompanied by a new manager. An inauspicious start lead to the appointment of Dave Frecklington in September 2019.

Frecks rapidly turned the side's fortunes around, before lockdown ended the season. 2020/21 ultimately suffered the same fate.

Frecks built what looked like strong squad for the 2021/22 season in the newly formed NPL East Division. However, things didn't pan out as hoped. Key departures lead to a run of form that saw the club relegated to the Northern Counties East League for the first time in our history.

In the summer of 2022, former Blue, Wayne Benn, was installed as manager, with ex-Frickley goal scoring legend Andy Hayward as his assistant. There were occasional highs but Benn resigned in early 2023 so Patrick McGuire came in to avoid a second successive relegation.

2023/24 started well, and included an 8-0 win at Goole, but ended with the release of McGuire.

James Baxendale was in the hot seat for the start of 2024/25 but left to be replaced by Tom Claisse in November 2024 and successfully avoided the drop before being relieved of his duties in September 2025.

Club legend Martyn Woolford has taken the reigns and he'll be looking to roll back the years and bring winning ways back to Westfield Lane.





Memory Match

As usual, we've got 2 memory matches for you, a pair of 'on this day' games from the 1970s. The first match was a Midland League Cup quarter final against Eastwood, played on Saturday 28th February 1976 at their Coronation Park ground. The Azzurri upset the form book to come back from a goal down to win 2-1. Phil Rushton scored both goals as we progressed in a competition we would eventually win 6-5 on aggregate in the final against Boston United. Then the second game is a Cheshire County League game from Saturday 28th February 1970. Here at The Wezzie, The Blues had to ride their luck to beat Marine 3-1 as the Merseysiders failed to turn pressure into goals. With thanks to JL.

Two-goal Rushton earns semi place

EASTWOOD 1 FRICKLEY 2

Frickley turned Midland League form inside out to win 2-1 at Eastwood on Saturday and earn a place in the semi-finals of the Midland League Cup.

Newly signed striker Phil Rushton did the trick scoring twice inside three minutes to turn defeat into victory.

Injury, illness and player problems never unsettled the South Elmsall club as they gained a welcome win at Coronation Park against a side who recently completed the double over them.

Frickley dominated most of the game and after conceding an early goal through slack defensive work came good and did not repeat the mistake.

Goalkeeper Shaw was tested by the keen Frickley forwards in the opening stages but after 15 minutes, Eastwood went ahead.

A passing error by full back Paul Turner let in Eaton who centered for SMITH to score.

Brian Fidler missed a good chance soon afterwards and other chances came close to putting Frickley level before half-time. Midfield workers Brian Young and Nigel Long hit the woodwork and Stuart Senior went close with a header.

FOXED

Kicking against the slope for the second half, Frickley did not have long to wait for an equaliser, quickly followed by the winning goal.

Senior made a run down the right wing after 57 minutes putting the ball over for RUSHTON whose header bounced onto the goalline and flew into the roof of the net.

Just over two minutes later, a ball down the middle by Young foxed and confused the Eastwood defence. RUSHTON chased after it and capitalised on a hesitancy by the

advancing Shaw to shoot the ball home from a narrow angle.

The tie boiled to a nail-biting finish with Eastwood hitting the crossbar and Fidler curling a shot wide.

Fidler, suffering from the effects of flu, was substituted 15 minutes from time by new-signing Ian Preston (18) from Skellow of the Doncaster Sunday League. Preston, who has a reputation for scoring goals, twice went near in the dying minutes.

Keith Whiteley had a good game against Eastwood dangerman Martin Wright.

Match Report

Frickley 0 Parkgate 2

It was a frustrating evening for The Blues as Parkgate stuck to their game plan of sitting deep, defending in numbers, and waiting for a break. It was strategy that ultimately paid dividends when the visitors' patience was rewarded with 2 goals in the last 20 minutes to take all 3 points.

The contest was barely 8 minutes old when Spence robbed a defender of possession. His pinpoint cross found the arriving Robbo, whose first time shot was parried by the keeper before a defender made an overhead clearance in front of goal to keep the scores level.

Gagen was soon called into action at the other end to clear a dangerous ball into the box, but the momentum remained marginally with ourselves.

Afuape showcased some sublime tekkers to win a free kick in the Parkgate half, though the resulting set piece came to nought. Just past the quarter of an hour mark, Andrew caused havoc when he beat the Parkgate custodian to a loose ball, but said keeper recovered well to smother 2 successive attempts.

The Boys in Blue kept up the pressure as the half progressed, with Harry Gagen (pictured) turning provider for Afuape, only for a last ditch block to deny him.

Parkgate offered a reminder of their threat with a 20 yard effort that whistled wide, but The Blues surged forward again as Spence made a lungbusting run from midfield. He fed Afuape, but the ball was nicked off the his toe as he was about to pull the trigger.

The visitors curled a free kick wide of the far post on the stroke of halftime when a. HT 0-0.

Les Bleus emerged for the second period with Lindley seeing a drive clear the crossbar.

But the longer it remained scoreless, the more the game began to noticeably tilt away from us.

Sykes was called into his action of the half, safely catching a shot on the turn, before Parkgate nodded over from close range after the ball had been headed back across goal.

The visitors broke the deadlock in the 70th

minute. Parkgate seized their opportunity when a ball over the top saw their number 11 get there first to toe poke it past Sykes.

Spence and Robbo combined to test the keeper once more, but Robbo's shot was held. When Tom A was scythed down, Andrew stepped up to take the free kick, only to see it shave the wrong side of the upright. A frantic goalmouth melee followed a long throw from Tom A, but the Parkgate defence scrambled the ball clear.

As the clock hit 90 minutes, Cleggy hit the side netting after being played in by Gagen, but the comeback wasn't to be. And in the 3rd minute of stoppage time Parkgate hammered a final nail into the coffin, by exploited the gaps left as we pushed forward for an equaliser. Their wide man dispossessed Tom A and charged down the left, Tom A darted back to make good his recovery but slipped. This allowed the Parkgate wing to cross

to a teammate at the back post who made no mistake, settling the result. FT 0-2.

After holding the edge in a competitive first half, our influence waned after the interval, and we were hit with a pair of sucker punches late on. Hopefully, we'll see a response next time out.

Linked to The Lane

I'm an incorrigible collector of old A&BC, Panini, Merlin, Topps, etc. football cards and stickers, and it struck me how many of the players pictured had links to Frickley Athletic. They might have played for or against us at some point, or are related to one of The Azzurri past or present. Or the connection might be even more tenuous! But you can be sure it was the highlight of their career :)

Lower division goal machines are a thing of wonder, legendary and lethal in equal measure, and they always seem a little less public property and a little more exclusive than the more household names like Greaves, Rush, Lineker or Kane. Ernie Moss is one such phenomenon. He visited The Wezzie on several occasions, most often as the manager of Gainsborough Trinity.

Born Ernest Moss, just outside Chesterfield, in 1949. A centre forward, Moss began his senior career with his hometown club, Chesterfield, signing professional forms in October 1968 after joining from the local tube works team.


He quickly became a key figure, playing a major role as the Spireites won the Fourth Division title in 1969/70, scoring 20 goals that season. Over his first 8-season spell at the club he played 300 games and his physical presence and aerial ability ensured that he established his goalscoring pedigree, passing the century for the Saltergate club.

In January 1976 Moss transferred to Peterborough United for what was then a club record fee. He played around 40 odd games, scoring a dozen goals before moving on later that year to Mansfield Town, where he was part of the side that won promotion from the Third Division to the Second Division in the 1976/77 season. After a season with Mansfield, he returned to Chesterfield in 1978 and continued to be an influential figure at the club until leaving for a second time in 1981. But not before Chesterfield had won the 1980/81 Anglo-Scottish Cup, beating Scottish giants Rangers 3-0 on the

way to the final which, needless to say, Ernie scored in.

Moss later had spells with several other Football League clubs. These included Port Vale, where he became top scorer and was named Player of the Year in his debut season and helped the team win promotion from the Fourth Division in 1982/83, Lincoln City and Doncaster Rovers, playing a part in their promotion campaign in 1983/84. Then came a third stint at Saltergate, winning the Fourth Division again, followed by Stockport County, Scarborough, and Rochdale, before eventually retiring from League football after 850 appearances in all competitions and

scored over 280 goals, with no penalties! He then played on for another few years with Kettering, Matlock and Shepshed before finally hanging up his boots 24 years after his professional debut. Moss's association with Chesterfield was the most enduring. Across three separate spells with the club he amassed more than 500 appearances and became the club's



all-time record goalscorer with 192 goals. His performances, longevity and prolific goalscoring at Saltergate made him a club hero and a defining figure in the club's history. And in 2007, he was voted Chesterfield's PFA Fans' Favourite – their favourite player of all time.

After his playing days, Moss remained involved in football through coaching and management in non-league, including periods at Gainsborough Trinity, Leek

Town, Matlock Town, as an assistant and manager into the 2000s. He also owned a sports shop with Derbyshire cricketer Geoff Miller. In later life, Moss suffered from a form of dementia and he passed away in 2021 at the age of 71. His family became advocates for research into the long-term effects of heading footballs. Ernie was a proper centre forward, sticking his head where most wouldn't put their boots. His only failing was never playing for Frickley. Ah well, no one's perfect. RIP Ernie.





Blues Squad 25/26

Joel Spence (Midfielder): Joel 90 was at Armthorpe before joining us and he's been on the books of Rotherham United before plenty of experience at Belper Town, Ossett United and Wakefield.

Deservedly won player of the season in 24/25.

Will Sykes (Goalkeeper): The Holy Goalie is a highly rated young stopper who joined us from Hallam, against whom he saved a penalty towards the end of last season.

Niall Butchart (Defender/Midfielder/Forward): The Butcher is a versatile squad member. He is a former youth teamer at Altrincham, then was at Winsford United, Swallownest, Armthorpe Welfare and Goole.

Tom Alngohuru (Midfielder/Forward): The Guru is a defender's nightmare. He joined last season from Ossett United. Prior to that he was at the York City and i2i academies, and has played almost 80 games for Pickering Town.

Luis Afonso-Ferreira (Midfielder/Forward): The Ferrari is a rapid forward who puts teams on the back foot. He has plenty experience from time at the likes of Retford United, Parkgate and Albion Sports.

Sam Cable (Forward): The Power is a handful of an attacker. Since starting out in our U19s over a decade ago, he is now in his 3rd spell with the club after spells at Barton Town and Garforth Town.

Charlie Clegg (Forward): The Power is a local boy and a fan favourite, in his third spell with us. Has experience with Ponte Colls youth programme, Emley, Athersley, Armthorpe and Club Thorne.

Will Jenkinson (Defender): Jenko is a footballing defender who joins us from Parkgate, having started out at Rotherham United.

Sam Kilner (Defender): A NCEL title winner at Silsden last season, Killer is a highly proficient fullback who has also been at Buxton, Mossley, Hemsworth and Knaresborough.

Lucas Robinson (Midfielder/Forward): A rangey winger with an eye for goal, Cool Hand Lucas comes to us from Harrogate Railway but has been at Goole and Barton Town too.

Thomas Radley (Defender): Radz is a big centre half who was at Shelley last season and brings quality and leadership into our back line.

Harry Gagen (Defender): The HGV is a Rolls Royce of a defender who started out at Barnsley but joined us from Ossett United after an initial loan spell.

Elliot Andrew (Forward): The Prince is a quality striker who started out at Doncaster Rovers then Nottingham Forest before more recent spells at Tadcaster, Beverley and Rossington Main.


