



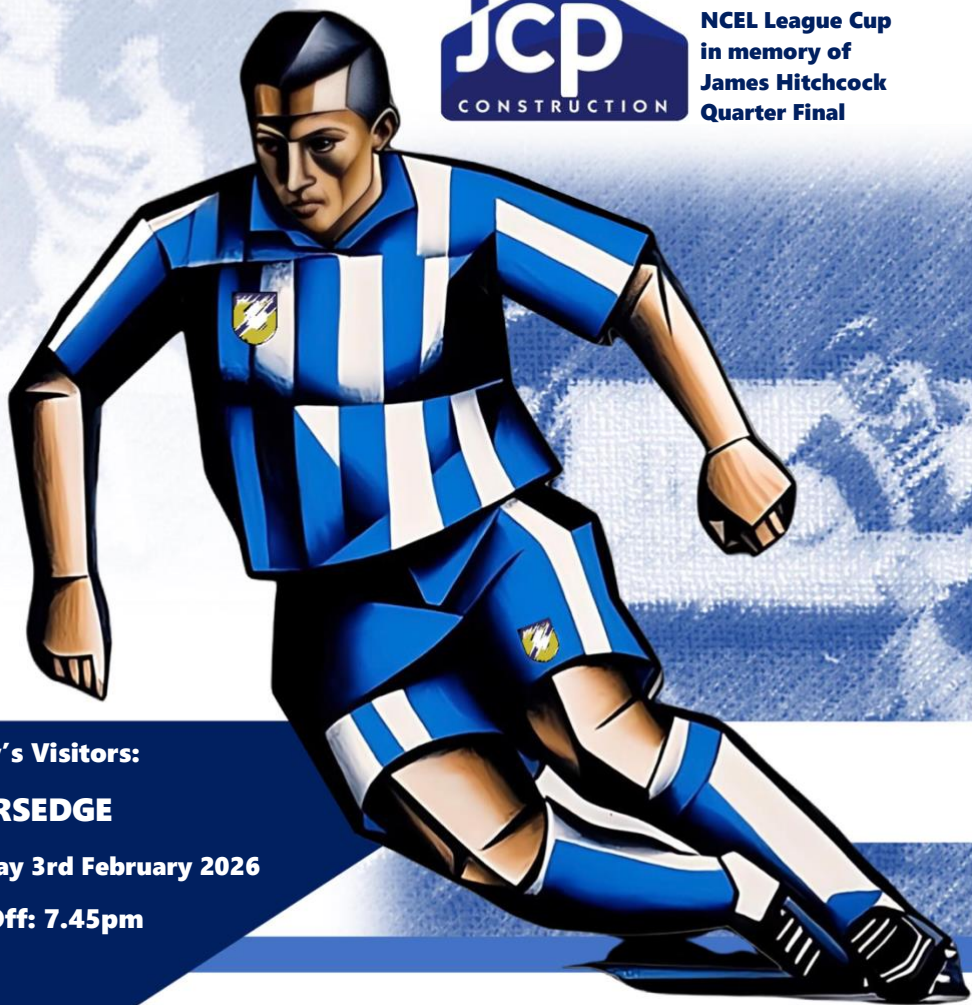

Bluescene

Good evening, ladies and gentlemen, welcome to The SALUS Stadium for this evening's JCP Construction NCEL League Cup in memory of James Hitchcock Quarter Final game against Liversedge. We give a warm welcome to Liversedge's players, officials and supporters and hope they have a safe trip home after the game.

This evening's visitors, Liversedge, reach this stage of the competition by virtue of a bye in the first round, in the second round they claimed a comfortable 5-0 home win over Maltby Main, then in the third round, it was a rather more close affair as a late own goal handed them a 3-2 victory at Pickering Town. And just to remind you, The Blues also had a first round bye, followed by a pair of home wins in the next 2 rounds, the crazy 7-6 against Bottesford Town and a fine 2-0 triumph over Golcar United.

Liversedge's form has seen them go 30 games unbeaten in 90 minutes from August until last Saturday! A pair of penalty shootout defeats in the cups were the only blots on their copybook. Sitting 5 points clear at the top of the league table, 5 of Sedge's last 6 games have been victories, 2-0 at Wombwell Town, 2-1 at home to Rossington Main, 4-3 at Horbury Town and 2-1 at home to Barton Town. But then they travelled to Thackley and were beaten by a goal to nil, with the goal being scored by ex-Blue Keanan Mannings. Not only did this end their long run but it was also the first time they had failed to score since September. However, at the weekend they got back to winning ways but it took 2 very late goals by another ex-Blue George Green to

nick it 4-3 against Bottesford Town.

The Azzurri's last 3 games have seen us fail to take a point. After own goal gave us a 1-1 draw at Tadcaster Albion, Penistone Church won 3-2 here at The Wezzie in front of a crowd of 786, our biggest home attendance in over 17 years. The goals came from Will Jenkinson and Tom Alngohuru. The Blues were beaten 4-0 by Champion, although 3 goals in the last 12 minutes ensured a scoreline that rather flattered the Bradford club. Then on Saturday, The Azzurri suffered an undeserved 2-0 reverse. at Pickering Town.

Our most recent meeting with Liversedge was our league game earlier this season, here at The Wezzie, in September when we played out a goalless stalemate. Our last meeting in a cup competition was also here at HQ, in August 2018, when The Azzurri came from a goal down to trounce Sedge 10-1 in the FA Cup Preliminary Round. Jacob Hazel helped himself to a hat trick whilst Tyler Walton, Dan Palmer and Jack Burton each bagged a brace before Sam Liversedge got in on the act with the 10th goal to give us the highest score in the entire 2018/19 FA Cup competition.

Expect The Blues to be meeting this huge test head on, in their quest for silverware.

Please note that if tonight's game is drawn after 90 minutes it will go straight to a penalty shootout.

Our next game sees The Blues in action here at Westfield Lane on Saturday 7th February when old foes Sheffield FC are our visitors, 3pm ko. We hope to see you all there.

Enjoy the game and as always we thank you for your valued and continued support.

Meet The Visitors

Liversedge Football Club was founded in 1910 following the demise of the old Liversedge Rugby Club which had been a member of the Northern Union which, in turn, was the forerunner to the Rugby League. It was one of a number of clubs which switched codes around that time.

Liversedge started in the Bradford League for three years and won it in 1920/21 season.

The club was a founder member of the West Riding County Amateur League in season 1922/23 and went on to be the most successful club in the league's infancy, taking the league title three times in the first five seasons

1923/24, 1925/26, 1926/27 and again in 1964/65, 1965/66.

The long association with the County Amateur League was maintained until the early 1970s by which time the club had kept up their position as a top local side and winning it in 1968/69 season.

The decision was taken to apply for membership of the Yorkshire League and the club's acceptance for season 1972/73 was followed by immediate promotion from Division Three. While not winning trophies around this time, success did come the club's way as promotion to Yorkshire League Division One was achieved prior to the amalgamation of the Midland and Yorkshire League to form the Northern Counties East League in 1982. The early years in the new set-up saw Sedge struggle both on and off the pitch but large strides were made in the late 1980s. In 1988/89, they were promoted to NCEL Division One but a lack of floodlights the following season saw them miss out on promotion to the Premier Division. A great club effort the following season by players, officials and supporters alike saw them promoted to the Premier Division. The disappointment of missing out the previous season had been tempered by the winning of the West Riding County Cup for the first time in the club's history.

Life in the top flight brought fluctuating fortunes but under Manager Eugene Lacy, the high spot of 2004/2005 was undoubtedly a fine FA Cup run to the Fourth Qualifying Round, beating three higher-ranked opponents along the way before being knocked out by Coalville Town.

The 2005/06 season saw a new look to Sedge's ground, as the famous Clayborn Slope was removed. The club's epic FA Cup run had enabled the club to finance, with the help of the

FA, the levelling of the playing area, a fitting reminder of their FA Cup exploits.

On the field also brought success, by way of the winning of the NCEL League Cup for the first time, as victors over Selby Town, and Sedge's highest ever placing of runners-up spot in the NCEL Premier Division behind Buxton.

Unfortunately promotion was not to be gained, as the club's changing rooms did not meet the requirements of the Unibond NPL.

2007/08 saw another trophy win as Sedge defeated Armthorpe in the NCEL President's Cup Final over two legs.

The last decade or so saw a number of managerial changes and relegation has been flirted with on a couple of occasions but Sedge is still proud of their record of never ever being relegated. Development of the facilities has been ongoing as well. Current manager Jonathan Rimmington has been in charge for several years and has brought more stability to the club. This culminated in the club succeeding in its ambition to join the NPL, promoted from the NCEL as a result of performances in the Covid-hit 2019/20 and 2020/21 seasons to the expanded Step 4. Sedge hit the ground running in 2021/22, their first ever Northern Premier League season, winning the league following a tight title battle with Marske United, and gaining promotion to the NPL Premier Division. Jonathan Rimmington's side made it a league and cup double with a 3-1 West Riding County Cup Final win against local rivals Brighouse Town.

Sedge had it rough in 2022/23 in the NPL Premier Division, as Sedge was relegated.

Sedge made some crucial appointments, including ex-Premier League footballer Ross McCormack, who joined in 2023/24 as a player/director of football.

However, a 10th place finish in 2023/24 was only a hiatus as 21st place and relegation followed again in 2024/25.

Back in the NCEL in 2025/26, Liversedge, under current manager Danny Forrest, will be looking to halt the slide and use the knowledge gained over the last few years to climb up the pyramid again.





Frickley's History

Frickley Athletic FC is based in the former coal mining village of South Elmsall. Recent research has shown that the first South Elmsall football team was formed in 1905 but was superseded in 1908 by the newly formed Frickley Colliery Athletic Club and joined the South Yorkshire league which comprised of works, church and village teams. In 1910, the football club moved to the Sheffield Association League and first played in the FA Cup.

The club remained in the Sheffield Association League (except for the war years) until 1922, finishing runners up in 1911/12, and winners in 1920/21, our only ever league title.

In 1922/23 Frickley joined the Yorkshire league and after finishing runners up in 1923/24, the club were elected into the Midland League. Although the club had to apply for re election several times pre war (and didn't play in any league in 1933/34) it was kept going by the support of the mineworkers and the sale of players.

1936/37 was Frickley's worst ever league season when the club finished bottom with only 8 points, but amazingly reached the FA Cup 1st round proper for the first time.

Post war, Frickley remained in the Midland league gaining its best finish, 7th, in 1945/46, but left the league on its break up at the end of 1959/60.

From 1960/61 to 1969/70, Frickley Colliery played in the Cheshire County League. However, financial considerations led the club to join the Midland Counties League for 1970/71. They finished runners up in 1972/73, and were eventually elected into the NPL for the 1976/77 season as Frickley Athletic.

After finishing 3rd in 1979/80, the club was promoted into the Alliance Premier League, now the National League. Here they remained for 7 years, the most successful in the club's history, and in 1985/86 reached the FA Cup 3rd round proper, after beating a Football League club, Hartlepool Utd, only to lose 3-1 at home to Rotherham Utd. The club also finished as Gola League runners up. The following season saw a reversal as we were relegated back to the NPL. From 1987/88 to 1991/92 the club consistently finished around mid-table in the NPL, but did manage to reach the league cup final in 1991/92, losing 1-0 to Marine at Maine Road.

The next few seasons saw Frickley finish in the lower reaches of the table. Then, in 2005/06 The

Blues had their best league season for 20 years, finishing 2nd to Blyth Spartans. Unfortunately, the Blues lost on penalties in the playoff semi.

In the following seasons Frickley returned to the lower half of the table, but 2015/16 saw the club have a great season to finish 7th.

In 2016/17, most of the players who had brought this success were attracted to more affluent clubs. The club were relegated from the NPL Premier Division after a 30 year stay.

2017/18 saw the club enter the NPL Division 1 South, finishing 3rd in the league, scoring a record 117 goals. Additionally, Jacob Hazel broke the club record for individual goals in a season with 47 strikes. The season ended disappointingly with playoff semi final defeat at the hands of Stamford.

2018/19, in the new NPL East Division, was less successful, seeing managerial changes and a 12th place finish. However, the season had its highlights, with victory at highflying Morpeth and a 10-1 win over Liversedge in the FA Cup.

More change followed prior to the start of 2019/20. A further league reorganisation which put The Blues into the NPL South East Division was accompanied by a new manager. An inauspicious start lead to the appointment of Dave Frecklington in September 2019.

Frecks rapidly turned the side's fortunes around, before lockdown ended the season. 2020/21 ultimately suffered the same fate.

Frecks built what looked like strong squad for the 2021/22 season in the newly formed NPL East Division. However, things didn't pan out as hoped. Key departures lead to a run of form that saw the club relegated to the Northern Counties East League for the first time in our history.

In the summer of 2022, former Blue, Wayne Benn, was installed as manager, with ex-Frickley goal scoring legend Andy Hayward as his assistant. There were occasional highs but Benn resigned in early 2023 so Patrick McGuire came in to avoid a second successive relegation.

2023/24 started well, and included an 8-0 win at Goole, but ended with the release of McGuire.

James Baxendale was in the hot seat for the start of 2024/25 but left to be replaced by Tom Claisse in November 2024 and successfully avoided the drop before being relieved of his duties in September 2025.

Club legend Martyn Woolford has taken the reigns and he'll be looking to roll back the years and bring winning ways back to Westfield Lane.

Skipper strikes twice as winning run continues

A SECOND half double from Gavin Allott saw Frickley Athletic come from behind at Corby Town to extend their winning run to eight in all games and seven in the Evo-Stik South.

Spencer Fearn's men looked in danger of losing their unbeaten 2018 record as they fell behind to a controversial penalty, but hit back superbly to win 2-1 and hold onto their second place in the table.

Allott's double takes him to 107 career goals for the Blues and he is now the club's fifth all-time highest scorer.

He was short on chances in a goalless opening half when both teams struggled to find their rhythm, but he did force the home keeper to make a good save after getting his head onto a Tom Dugdale cross.

Allott also created another opening as he broke down the left and pulled the ball back for Jacob Hazel, but the top scorer saw his shot deflected over.

Dugdale sent a shot over while at the other end, keeper Hugo Warhurst pulled off a great save on the stroke of half-time when standing tall to keep the ball out of the net after being faced

with a one-on-one with a Corby forward who had gone clear.

The hosts took the lead on the hour when awarded a penalty for a foul by Jameel Ible after it had looked like the player had run into him. Steven Leslie put the spot kick away and Athletic were left to chase the game.

They responded well, however, and equalised 10 minutes from time as Ishmael Dawson and Hazel combined to set up Allott and the big striker made no mistake from 10 yards out.

Frickley were not satisfied as they went for a winner and were rewarded seven minutes later with Allott taking advantage of hesitation in the home defence to control the ball, round the keeper and put the ball in the net.

They saw out the remainder with little fuss and had another important three points in the bag against opponents who still have ambitions of gaining a play-off place.

They were not at their best, but are making a habit of winning matches with late goals, Saturday's being six out of the last seven when they have scored in the last 10 minutes, highlighting why the manager labelled his players the fittest in the division.

Frickley Colliery gave one of their best displays of the season when they entertained Lincoln City Reserves on Saturday. Several changes were made in the Frickley team and they proved successful. The defensive trio of McManus, Goodison and Williams was sound, and the half-back line of Mellows, Lee and Hart was the most satisfactory of the season.

The Lincoln forwards made little impression on the defence apart from a short spell near the end in which they scored twice within half a minute.

The Frickley forwards also had more dash than usual, and the experiment of playing Wilkinson

at inside-left was justified for he introduced speed into the attack and scored two goals.

Frickley began in dashing style when Wilkinson had a shot deflected from a corner by Warrington in the first few seconds. **WILKINSON** gave Frickley the lead after eight minutes and put them further ahead 25 minutes later.

Frickley continued their superiority in the second half and **SMITH** added their third goal after 52 minutes with a shot which went in off a Lincoln defender.

A sudden spurt by Lincoln brought goals by **JONES** and **SHAW** within 30 seconds, eight minutes from the end, but their hopes of forcing an equaliser were dashed in the next minute when **HART** headed in Frickley's fourth goal.

Match Report

Frickley 0 Campion 4

A harsh scoreline did little justice to The Azzurri's performance as a frustrating afternoon against one of our perennial bogey sides unravelled in the final quarter of an hour.

The Blues started well and were on the front foot early. Ex-Blue Ben Bodle slipped inside the opening 2 minutes, allowing a foray forward by Tom A, although he scuffed the resulting cross. Then Jenko's throw picked out Destiny, who laid the ball off to Woolly, but his effort lacked the power to trouble the keeper.

However, the game's key moment came early and controversially. In the 7th minute, Campion's number 7 appeared to control the ball with his hand before unleashing an unstoppable strike into the top corner. Despite protests, the goal stood and we found ourselves behind, against the run of play.

The response was positive. Robbo flashed a dangerous ball across the face of goal on 11 minutes with no one able to apply the finishing touch, before Woolly was presented with a gilt-edged chance moments later, going one on one with the keeper only to fire straight at him. And Radz went agonisingly close when his header from a corner was nodded off the line.

Much of the remainder of the first half was a physical, attritional battle in midfield, though The Azzurri continued to create the better openings. Tom A was played through on goal after good work from Robbo, only for play to be pulled back for a foul on the said Robbo, rather than advantage being applied.

Radz again caused problems from a set piece late in the half, heading back into the danger area from a corner before Campion scrambled clear. Thus it was that we went in a goal down, feeling we deserved more. HT 0-1.

The second period saw The Azzurri put the pressure on but we just couldn't score. Destiny produced a trademark slalom run in from the flank, drilling a dangerous ball across goal that was forced out for a corner. From the corner, Radz's aerial threat was evident again as his header was flicked over.

Campion did have a moment of their own when a scramble saw the ball strike the post and roll along the line, only for Kilner to track it until Sykesy had it safe in his grasp.

More chances fell the way of The Azzurri. Destiny robbed a defender and feinted past two more before unleashing a shot with the outside of his boot effort that went inches over. Tom A followed with two shots in quick succession, one blocked and the other held, as frustration grew.

Destiny forced a decent save with a fierce volley on 75 minutes. Yet, as The Blues looked to chase the equaliser, inevitable gaps opened up at the back. Campion capitalised, striking the killer blows with 3 goals in 10 minutes.

A Campion cross into the box was met with a header on 78 minutes to double the visitors' lead, a sucker punch after sustained Frickley intensity. The game slipped away rapidly thereafter. A low finish into the bottom corner made it 3-0 with 6 minutes remaining, before a defensive

/goalkeeping error allowed a Campion substitute to run through unchallenged and tap into an empty net late on.

Destiny blazed over in the closing seconds, summing up an afternoon where nothing quite fell our way. FT 0-4.

For much of the contest, we were the better side, but a highly contentious opener and a loose spell at the death proved decisive. To paraphrase the song, we need to accentuate the

positives and eliminate the negatives, and go again next time.

WEBMASTER MOTM - it was the result that was disappointing, not the performance. Gadge and Kilner were committed, Woolly and Spence were non-stop, and Robbo and Tom A were selfless. And then there's the poor matchday referees - the ones who make those all-important decisions to call a game off for whatever

reason, causing anger, frustration and often resentment for all concerned.

They simply can not win.

Safety of the players must come first and referees know that something does go wrong, then there are huge

consequences. The last thing they want is to call a game off - it isn't deliberate.

The NLP recently ran a guest column with Farnborough manager Spencer Day.

His team found themselves at the eye of a storm when their National League South game with Chelmsford City was postponed very late on. And their game wasn't the only one to fall, with other local matches at Eastleigh and on the 4G at Bracknell also falling at the 11th hour, along with Bath City v Southend United in the FA Trophy, much to the ire of the away contingent who had travelled almost the entire width of the country, only to be turned away.

A number of theories and unfounded suggestions have been thrown out there in a bid to combat such an eventuality, but according to the Boro boss, there is no resolution.

"We live in the UK and the truth of it is we are



bound by the weather," Day told us.

"Our games fell to the most bizarre conditions seen for quite some time.

"I saw our pitch on Friday and I was amazed by the excellent condition it was in.

I'd been communicating with Chelmsford and [manager] Angelo Harrop all week and when I got to the game on Saturday I walked it, as I always do, and didn't see any issue at all. The pitch looked fantastic.

"Then, 40 minutes later, the referee turns up and told us there was an area of the pitch that had frozen over that he wanted to look at. I mean, yes, it was hard, no question, but it was tiny, about a foot in area, and the temperatures weren't dropping.

"In theory, could we have tried something? Maybe, I'm not sure. Could we have chucked boiling water on it? Again, I don't know. But it was obvious at the time at that point that it had to be called off so I'm not blaming him.

After he called the game off, I left the ground at 5 and I decided I wanted to walk the pitch to see what it was like, and it had softened. It had actually got warmer. Crazy. It's the weather. I wish there was an answer."

With more bad weather on the way, don't expect this situation to

be brushed under the carpet anytime soon.

Health & Safety is top of the priority list of football authorities and in these days of social media, such decisions come under scrutiny like never before, adding more pressure to the officials, part-time themselves more often than not.

Has the world has gone risk adverse? Day, for one, believes it has, but he also urges supporters to step back and look at the bigger picture when letting their frustrations be known.

"I'm a big supporter of the leagues, the FA and politicians - I think they have impossible jobs," he added. "They are damned if they do and damned if they don't in whatever decision they make.

"Everyone's trying their best to resolve what it an impossible situation, but sometimes your best isn't always the popular decision.

"All you can do is apologise to everyone but in some respects I don't know what we're apologising for. No-one can control the weather."

Linked to The Lane

I'm an incorrigible collector of old A&BC, Panini, Merlin, Topps, etc. football cards and stickers, and it struck me how many of the players pictured had links to Frickley Athletic. They might have played for or against us at some point, or are related to one of The Azzurri past or present. Or the connection might be even more tenuous! But you can be sure it was the highlight of their career :)

A man who has bookended his career with links to Frickley is Mark Smith. At the outset he was at Sheffield Wednesday with one of the finest footballers to ever grace the Wezzie's hallowed turf, Paul Shirtliff. And at the other end, in the early days of Wayne Benn's managerial reign in 2022/23 pre-season, Smithy came down to The Lane to take some of the training sessions, running his experienced eye over Benno's fledgling squad and putting them through their paces.

Mark Smith was born in Sheffield in 1960. Rising through the youth ranks at one of his local clubs, Sheffield Wednesday, Smith made his senior debut in 1977 and soon became a regular in the first team. Over the next decade, he established himself as a cornerstone of the club's defence during a period of revival and progress. At Hillsborough, Smith played a key role in 2 promotion campaigns, from the Third Division in the 1979/80 season, and then from the Second Division in 1983/84. His performances earned him a place in the PFA Team of the Year and the club's Player of the Year award in 1981, reflecting both his consistency and his importance to the side. He also became known for his composure from the penalty spot, setting a club record with 11 successful penalties in a single season. Smith was in the Owls' sides that reached the FA Cup semi finals in 1983 and again in 1986.



Although Wednesday fell short of reaching the final on both occasions, these runs marked the club's return to prominence in English football. During this era, Smith was also part of the team that finished an impressive 5th in the First Division in the 1985/86 season. By the time he left the club in 1987, he had made more than 280 league appearances and had become one of the most dependable defenders of his generation at Hillsborough.

In 1987, Smith moved to Plymouth Argyle, where he stayed for 3 seasons, adding experience and stability to the back line. He later moved back north, joining Barnsley in 1990, enjoying another productive spell and earning the club's Player of the Year award in 1992, a testament to his influence both on and off the pitch.

As his playing career entered its final years, Smith signed for Notts County, though his time there was limited, leading to loan spells with Port Vale, Huddersfield Town, and Chesterfield, where he made his debut one to remember by scoring a goal. He concluded his playing career with Lincoln City in 1994, bringing to an end a professional playing career that spanned nearly 2 decades

and over 500 league appearances.

At international level, Smith earned 5 caps for England U21s, highlighting the regard in which he was held during his peak years.

After hanging up his playing boots, Smudger remained in football, transitioning into coaching and management. He worked in various backroom and developmental roles,

including youth and academy coaching, and later took on caretaker managerial responsibilities at Sheffield Wednesday and Chesterfield.

Most recently, he was loans manager at Sheffield United and a coach at Ossett United.

And to any Owls fans out there, when he was down at The Wezzie, he was looking fit and well, and in all honesty I reckon he could've still done a job at the heart of the Azzurri defence :)



Blues Squad 25/26

Joel Spence (Midfielder): Joel 90 was at Armthorpe before joining us and he's been on the books of Rotherham United before plenty of experience at Belper Town, Ossett United and Wakefield.

Deservedly won player of the season in 24/25.

Will Sykes (Goalkeeper): The Holy Goalie is a highly rated young stopper who joined us from Hallam, against whom he saved a penalty towards the end of last season.

Niall Butchart (Defender/Midfielder/Forward): The Butcher is a versatile squad member. He is a former youth teamer at Altrincham, then was at Winsford United, Swallownest, Armthorpe Welfare and Goole.

Tom Alngohuru (Midfielder/Forward): The Guru is a defender's nightmare. He joined last season from Ossett United. Prior to that he was at the York City and i2i academies, and has played almost 80 games for Pickering Town.

Luis Afonso-Ferreira (Midfielder/Forward): The Ferrari is a rapid forward who puts teams on the back foot. He has plenty experience from time at the likes of Retford United, Parkgate and Albion Sports.

Sam Cable (Forward): The Power is a handful of an attacker. Since starting out in our U19s over a decade ago, he is now in his 3rd spell with the club after spells at Barton Town and Garforth Town.

Charlie Clegg (Forward): The Power is a local boy and a fan favourite, in his third spell with us. Has experience with Ponte Colls youth programme, Emley, Athersley, Armthorpe and Club Thorne.

Will Jenkinson (Defender): Jenko is a footballing defender who joins us from Parkgate, having started out at Rotherham United.

Sam Kilner (Defender): A NCEL title winner at Silsden last season, Killer is a highly proficient fullback who has also been at Buxton, Mossley, Hemsworth and Knaresborough.

Ifeanyi Nnenanua (Forward): Goes by the name of Destiny, he's a committed young striker who is always in the thick of it. He's been at the i2i academy and has previously played for Pickering Town.

Lucas Robinson (Midfielder/Forward): A rangey winger with an eye for goal, Cool Hand Lucas comes to us from Harrogate Railway but has been at Goole and Barton Town too.

Thomas Radley (Defender): Radz is a big centre half who was at Shelley last season and brings quality and leadership into our back line.

Harry Gagen (Defender): Gadge is a Rolls Royce of a defender who started out at Barnsley but joined us from Ossett United after an initial loan spell.

Jack Horobin (Defender): Jack The Lad has stepped up from the U18s to make his debut as very capable defensive cover.

Tyler Sheard (Defender/Midfield/Forward):

VersaTyler is one of our U23s who can do a job anywhere on the park, team before self every time.

Elliot Andrew (Forward): The Prince is a quality striker who started out at Doncaster Rovers then Nottingham Forest before more recent spells at Tadcaster, Beverley and Rossington Main.

Ashton Johnson (Midfielder): AJ is an exciting winger from our U18s who recently made his debut, getting an assist within 5 minutes of coming on!

Dylan Sefton (Goalkeeper): Safe-ton is a solid young keeper who returns after coming through our academy and spending time at Worsbrough Bridge.

Josh Lindley (Midfielder): J-Force is a midfielder signed on dual reg with Ponte Colls. The son of ex-Blue, Phil, he started at Doncaster Rovers, and has been at Ossett, Wombwell Town and Deame & Dist.

Bailey Cowsell (Forward): Bails is an exciting goals scorer from our U23s. Made his first team debut in 2023/24 and has played for Athersley Rec and Wombwell Main since then.

Shaun Heselwood (Midfielder): Hez of The Wez joined us from Selby Town, after spells at Hemingbrough United and Goole AFC, to add drive in the middle of the park.

Shayan Keyghobadi (Midfielder): Once at Fulham, The Key is quite capable of unlocking a defence.

Spencer Booth (Goalkeeper): The Barrier joins us dual reg with Guiseley. He has also had a spell at Leeds UFCA earlier in the season.

Liam Love (Forward/Midfielder): The Heartbreaker is a goalscorer with experience at Pickering Town and most recently Selby Town.

Martyn Woolford (Midfielder/Forward/ Manager): The Woolfman started at The Wezzie in 2005 after joining from Glasshoughton Welfare. He is a classy attacking midfielder who has been in the EFL with the likes of York City, Scunthorpe United, Millwall, Bristol City and Sheffield United since then but he's back home for a 3rd spell. Took over as player-manager in October 2025.

Handsworth Facts: One unusual aspect of Handsworth, mentioned in the Doomsday Book as Handswrde, is that it is still the site of Yorkshire long sword dancing. This traditional dancing has ancient origins and sees a team of eight men, using long steel swords to perform a dance which lasts about nine minutes and ends with all the swords being interlocked and held aloft by one man. Music is played and the dancers wear a military style uniform. More mundanely, William Jeffcock, who became the first Mayor of Sheffield in 1843, was born in Handsworth and Sharpe, Lord of the Rings and Game of Thrones actor, Sean Bean, grew up and went to school in Handsworth.

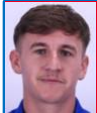
