Good afternoon, ladies and gentlemen, welcome to The SALUS Stadium for today's Northern Counties East Premier Division game against Barton Town. We give a warm welcome to Barton's players, officials and supporters and hope they have a safe trip home after the game.

Today's match is sponsored by Elaine Wall and the match ball is sponsored by Jerry Wray. We thank this legendary pair of volunteers for their long-standing and kind support of the club.

Today's visitors, Barton Town, currently sit in 4th place on 57 points after 32 games. Barton Town's run from the beginning of February has been a mixed spell. Starting with a tough 4-0 defeat at Horbury Town, followed by a stronger display at Pickering Town that still ended in a narrow 2-1 loss. They hit back at home, sweeping aside Sheffield FC 4-0, but couldn't sustain that momentum and slipped to a 2-1 defeat against Champion AFC. Their response was positive once again, earning a deserved 3-1 win at Wombwell Town last weekend, then on Tuesday, Barton hosted Penistone Church and won by the odd goal in 5.

The Blues come into today's game in 11th place on 38 points after 32 games. After goals from Joel Spence and Charlie Clegg gave us a 2-1 win at Handsworth, we then played 3 home games. A pair of defeats, 3-1 against Beverley Town, with Cleggy netting a penalty, and 2-0 against Parkgate was followed by a 3-1 triumph over Eccleshill United last Saturday,

with Lucas Robinson bagging a pair and Elliott Andrew scoring from the spot. In our last game, in midweek, we travelled to table-topping Liversedge and put in a battling performance but were edged out by 2 goals to nil with both goals coming in the last half hour.

Our most recent meeting with Barton Town was our league game, earlier this season in August, when the Swans won by the only goal of the game at Marsh Lane. Our last meeting here at The Wezzie was in January 2024, when a Harry Lovick hat trick condemned us to a 4-0 defeat. We are yet to beat Barton here at The Wezzie in a competitive fixture, and our last victory over the Swans come in a NCEL League Cup 3rd round tie in January 2024 when Al Keita scored the goal in our 1-0 win at Marsh Lane.

Expect The Blues to be busting a gut to build some late season momentum.

In recruitment news, Niall Butchart has signed for Dronfield Town. A wholehearted utility player, Butch made 44 appearances for The Blues, scoring 1 goal. We wish him all the best at his new club.

Our next game sees The Blues travel to Eccleshill United on Saturday 14th March, 3pm kickoff. The Blues are next in action here at Westfield Lane on Friday 20th March when Wombwell Town are our visitors for a local derby under the floodies, 7.45pm ko. We hope to see you all there.

Meet The Visitors

Barton Town Old Boys Football Club was formed at the start of 1995/96 as a result of the amalgamation of Barton upon Humber, Barton Town FC and Barton Old Boys FC.

Barton Town had been in existence for well over 100 years, being formed in 1880, and playing out of their Marsh Lane ground, still the home of the new club, since 1927. Town was one of the founder members of the Lincolnshire League, winning it in 1960/61, before embarking on its golden era over the following two decades, in the Midlands League, the Yorkshire League and the Lincolnshire League again, winning the first division title in 1981/82.

Barton Old Boys had been a member of the Scunthorpe and District League since 1959. Over the ten year period from the mid-90s, Old Boys were consistently successful, culminating in 1994/95 with the winning of all four major Scunthorpe League competitions.

After the clubs merged, they joined the Lincolnshire League, finishing a very creditable fourth and winning the Lincs County Senior B Cup. 1996/97 saw the team win the League and Challenge Cup double. Since then another County Cup triumph and two more Challenge Cup titles have been added to the list of honours. After five seasons in the Lincolnshire League, the club moved to the newly-formed Humber Premier League for 2000/01, finished third, and moved on again to the Central Midlands League for the start of the 2001/02 season. The club was promoted to the Supreme Division at the first attempt. 2005/06 saw floodlights installed and a Supreme Division Championship win.

Off the field, further ground improvements were required to allow promotion to the Northern Counties East League after finishing Supreme Division runners-up in 2006/07. Three top ten finishes followed but promotion eluded the side until 2010/11 when a place in the Premier Division was secured.

In 2011/12, the team finished 11th and made it to two cup finals, the County Senior Trophy and President's Cup but missed out in both. 2013/14 saw the first team exceed expectations to claim the runners-up spot behind worthy winners, Brighouse Town.

With the exception of 2016/17 when a late reprieve due to the winding up of Ilkeston lead to avoiding relegation, the next few seasons were

largely a story of mid-table safety.

The club was also renamed Barton Town in 2017. This period was certainly not devoid of high points. For example, the away win at Worksop Town in April 2018 saw the club celebrate the success of club legend Gaz Barlow, who scored his 300th goal for the club. A great achievement at any level of football.

After covid had done its worst, Peter Mitchell and Ian Durnian were appointed as Co- Directors of Football in 2021 as Chairman Mark Gregory wanted to put his focus into the commercial side of the club and entrust on the field matters to two Barton stalwarts. Their first job was to hire a new manager in time for the 2021/22 season. The pair appointed former Grimsby Town strikers Nathan Jarman (ex- Frickley too) and Danny North to be Manager and Assistant Manager respectively. Following a slow start to the season, the Swans soon found their feet. Going on an 18 game unbeaten league run, as well as progressing to the Third Round Proper of the FA Vase, the furthest the club has ever been in the competition. A defeat at home to North Shields ending the Swans' historic run. Barton finished the league season in seventh place, the highest the club has been for a few years. The club also made it to the League Cup Final played at Doncaster Rovers' Eco-Power Stadium. For the first time in ten years, the Swans were in the Final of a competition, and following a tense affair with Garforth Town, the Swans prevailed. Tom Waudby's winning goal in extra-time securing some silverware. Jarman and North delivered in their first season in charge. Their second season was another sound one with a second consecutive 7th place finish.

A good start to 2023/24 was hampered by a series of postponements due to the weather which saw the club drop back to mid-table. Nathan Jarman departed the club and Danny North took over the reins for the remainder of the season, overseeing a 14th place finish. The beginning of 2024/25 saw a major rebuild and Anthony Bowsley was appointed manager. He soon set about recruiting some new faces. So after a season's consolidation, finishing in 14th place again, The Swans will be looking to make progress up the league table again.





Frickley's History

Frickley Athletic FC is based in the former coal mining village of South Elmsall. Recent research has shown that the first South Elmsall football team was formed in 1905 but was superseded in 1908 by the newly formed Frickley Colliery Athletic Club and joined the South Yorkshire league which comprised of works, church and village teams. In 1910, the football club moved to the Sheffield Association League and first played in the FA Cup.

The club remained in the Sheffield Association League (except for the war years) until 1922, finishing runners up in 1911/12, and winners in 1920/21, our only ever league title.

In 1922/23 Frickley joined the Yorkshire league and after finishing runners up in 1923/24, the club were elected into the Midland League. Although the club had to apply for re election several times pre war (and didn't play in any league in 1933/34) it was kept going by the support of the mineworkers and the sale of players.

1936/37 was Frickley's worst ever league season when the club finished bottom with only 8 points, but amazingly reached the FA Cup 1st round proper for the first time.

Post war, Frickley remained in the Midland league gaining its best finish, 7th, in 1945/46, but left the league on its break up at the end of 1959/60.

From 1960/61 to 1969/70, Frickley Colliery played in the Cheshire County League. However, financial considerations led the club to join the Midland Counties League for 1970/71. They finished runners up in 1972/73, and were eventually elected into the NPL for the 1976/77 season as Frickley Athletic.

After finishing 3rd in 1979/80, the club was promoted into the Alliance Premier League, now the National League. Here they remained for 7 years, the most successful in the club's history, and in 1985/86 reached the FA Cup 3rd round proper, after beating a Football League club, Hartlepool Utd, only to lose 3-1 at home to Rotherham Utd. The club also finished as Gola League runners up. The following season saw a reversal as we were relegated back to the NPL. From 1987/88 to 1991/92 the club consistently finished around mid-table in the NPL, but did manage to reach the league cup final in 1991/92, losing 1-0 to Marine at Maine Road.

The next few seasons saw Frickley finish in the lower reaches of the table. Then, in 2005/06 The

Blues had their best league season for 20 years, finishing 2nd to Blyth Spartans. Unfortunately, the Blues lost on penalties in the playoff semi.

In the following seasons Frickley returned to the lower half of the table, but 2015/16 saw the club have a great season to finish 7th.

In 2016/17, most of the players who had brought this success were attracted to more affluent clubs. The club were relegated from the NPL Premier Division after a 30 year stay.

2017/18 saw the club enter the NPL Division 1 South, finishing 3rd in the league, scoring a record 117 goals. Additionally, Jacob Hazel broke the club record for individual goals in a season with 47 strikes. The season ended disappointingly with playoff semi final defeat at the hands of Stamford.

2018/19, in the new NPL East Division, was less successful, seeing managerial changes and a 12th place finish. However, the season had its highlights, with victory at highflying Morpeth and a 10-1 win over Liversedge in the FA Cup.

More change followed prior to the start of 2019/20. A further league reorganisation which put The Blues into the NPL South East Division was accompanied by a new manager. An inauspicious start lead to the appointment of Dave Frecklington in September 2019.

Frecks rapidly turned the side's fortunes around, before lockdown ended the season. 2020/21 ultimately suffered the same fate.

Frecks built what looked like strong squad for the 2021/22 season in the newly formed NPL East Division. However, things didn't pan out as hoped. Key departures lead to a run of form that saw the club relegated to the Northern Counties East League for the first time in our history.

In the summer of 2022, former Blue, Wayne Benn, was installed as manager, with ex-Frickley goal scoring legend Andy Hayward as his assistant. There were occasional highs but Benn resigned in early 2023 so Patrick McGuire came in to avoid a second successive relegation.

2023/24 started well, and included an 8-0 win at Goole, but ended with the release of McGuire.

James Baxendale was in the hot seat for the start of 2024/25 but left to be replaced by Tom Claisse in November 2024 and successfully avoided the drop before being relieved of his duties in September 2025.

Club legend Martyn Woolford has taken the reigns and he'll be looking to roll back the years and bring winning ways back to Westfield Lane.

On-loan striker aids Blues win

FRICKLEY grabbed a goal in each half to bounce back from their defeat at Workson Town and edge closer to securing their Unibond Premier Division status with victory over Witton Albion at Westfield Lane.

Lee Morris opened the scoring for the Blues before Knox grabbed his second goal in as many outings for Frickley since arriving on loan from Eastwood Town last week.

A strong wind was in the visitors' favour and helped them force three quick corners in the opening exchanges before the Blues created their first threatening attack of the game.

Morris pulled the ball back for Danny Clarke to fire a shot which was saved by Witton stopper Jamie Speare.

Adam Nicklin grasped a 10-yard header from Brian Pritchard in the ninth minute, but play switched back to the other end two minutes later, Knox and Morris combining for the latter to fire an angled drive across the face of goal.

The visitors' appeals for a penalty were turned down when a shot struck Dean Jones' hand in the 21st minute and from the clearance Knox drilled a shot only inches wide of the target.

Frickley broke the deadlock in the 36th minute.

A long throw from Steve Robinson on the right was flicked on by Jonathan Groome to Morris, who controlled and hit the target from 10 yards to register his 17th goal of the campaign.

A 40-yard free-kick from Dean Jones two minutes later was helped on by Knox and Morris nodded inches wide at the far-post as the hosts looked to extend their advantage.

Sub Lee Thompson tested Nicklin with an angled 20-yarder in the 39th minute and was then foiled by a superb point-blank save at full stretch from the Blues' stopper two minutes later.

In the 47th minute a throw by Shaun Pierrepont was guided on by Knox to Morris, who struck a 25-yard drive on the run but Speare saved well, and the 'keeper distinguished himself again nine minutes later, turning a shot from Knox round a post after he had burst clear.

Chris Davies almost scored direct from a corner in the 68th minute, but Speare managed to flick the ball from under the bar.

But the visiting stopper blotted his copy book a minute later when the hosts doubled their advantage.

Knox raced onto a through ball and Pritchard lost his footing as he tried to tackle, leaving the on-loan Frickley frontman to steer the ball into an empty net.

Knox appeared to get stronger as the game progressed and he broke clear again in the 78th minute but saw Speare save his shot at full stretch.

Albion got very little change from a miserly home cover but, when Mick Moseley received the ball unmarked in the 84th minute, he shot straight at Nicklin from eight yards.

The victory was a welcome boost for the Blues,

FRICKLEY ATHLETIC boss Dave Frecklington hailed his side's performance in Saturday's thumping 5-0 win at Lincoln United.

After a couple of below-par displays, the Blues romped back to winning ways in the BetVictor South East Division with a thoroughly convincing win.

Frecklington said: "We have worked really hard in the past couple of weeks on making sure we were more clinical in the final third.

"We changed our shape to try and be a bit more adventurous and I thought we did that. If it wasn't for their keeper we could scored a few more."

He added: "In the last three or four games we haven't been good enough. A clean sheet was one thing we wanted to get and to get goals on top of that was brilliant."

Frickley dominated from the start and Brad McGowan had a shot blocked on the line as they launched waves of attacks.

The breakthrough came on 20 minute when Jonathon Margetts was felled in the box and he dusted himself down to convert from the spot.

The second goal followed five minutes later, Nyle Blake netting direct from a vicious, in-swinging corner, to give the visitors a 2-0 advantage at the break.

Margetts raced onto a through ball to slot home a third on 57 minutes and Blake bagged his second five minutes later, finding the net from a narrow angle to make it 4-0.

The rout was completed on 72 minutes when the ball was played across to Zephaniah Thomas and he found the bottom of the net with a slick finish.

The NLP Column: Another Pyramid Restructure?

Last week, The NLP reported on a proposed restructuring of the National League System which will ultimately ensure that clubs at Steps 5 and 6 will travel shorter distances to away games. At a meeting last month, the FA formally presented to league officials its plan to add seven new divisions at Step 6 – increasing the current number from 17 to 24.

The aim would be for each to have 18 clubs.

"It won't be a perfect fit, but it's probably the best fit for now," Chris Stirrup, North West Counties League chairman, told us. "This isn't an easy task."

A review by the FA, with the objective of reducing the geographical footprint of existing divisions at Step 6, has been ongoing for a while.

It hopes to conclude by the end of this season so changes to the relevant regulations for promotion and relegation can be made before the start of next term. Implementation could then follow for the 2027/28 campaign.

"The status quo isn't sustainable for clubs in certain areas of the country," said James Earl, head of National League System (NLS) at the FA, during an interview with The NLP last August.

"There are some that are really struggling with the travel distances, and we try to balance that with fluctuating division sizes, but I just don't think that's a palatable long-term solution.

"However, you can't make quick decisions to alter the pyramid because you must ensure you've gone through the unintended consequences, worked out the best solution, and how you put that into practice."

Currently, National League System regulations permit a maximum of 340 clubs at Step 6.

An increase of 92 would be needed at that level to fill 24 divisions with 18 members each.

While there has been discussion about how that could be achieved, no decision has been made.

One possibility is for the FA to reduce relegations from Step 6 in the run-up to implementation, while another suggestion is for the regulations permitting only one club to be considered for promotion from each regional feeder league to be amended.

However, the bad news for Step 7 clubs looking for a free pass into the NLS is that stadium accreditation criteria are unlikely to be relaxed for applicant clubs from those competitions.

It also isn't set in stone where the new divisions will be located, nor who might run them, but it is universally accepted there are some divisions in need of major surgery.

Take the Hellenic League Division One for example. Not long ago, this division was contested solely by clubs situated in the Thames Valley region of Berkshire and parts of Wiltshire alone, however, it has branched out to the counties of Gloucestershire, Herefordshire, Worcestershire and surrounding areas, such as parts of Oxfordshire, Shropshire, Northamptonshire and Warwickshire.

It means clubs like Redditch Borough face a 156-mile trip to face Wantage Town, yet Cradley Town, 12 miles away, ply their trade in the Midland League.

"It won't be everybody's cup of tea but if it's most people's shot of whisky then that's a good thing," said Stirrup, who succeeded Paul Lawler as NWCFL chairman last summer.

"As leagues, we have a responsibility to do what we can, the best we can. I've learned, even in my short time as chairman, that we can't be selfish on this issue and we mustn't lose sight of the bigger picture. "My impression is that the FA really wants to get this right, and is open to ideas from those of us tasked with running leagues."

Unfortunately, these proposed changes have come too late to save two Step 6 clubs from withdrawing from their respective divisions.

Last week, Truro City pulled their reserves from the South West Peninsula League after a "strategic partnership" with Helston Athletic failed to work out as planned. Labelled "groundbreaking", the joint venture saw the National League Tinnars' second team play their games at Kellaway Park, home of Western League Helston, and offer a pathway to play for the Blues at Step 5. It vowed to develop young footballers and help protect Truro's pitch ahead of Step 1, but on Tuesday Truro informed the SWPL they were pulling out with immediate effect.

And at the same time, Allexton & New Parks pulled out of the Midland League Division One following a 15-0 hammering at Leicester St Andrews. In their 30th season, the Leicester-based side were bottom of the table with just six points and one win from 30 games, having conceded 128 goals and scoring just 24. As Leicestershire Senior League champions, they had moved up to the Midland League at Step 6 in 2024.

Both will be sorely missed at the level with their demises presenting a timely reminder to FA and league chiefs that a reshuffle at Steps 5 and 6 is long overdue.





NCEL News

A busy midweek of Macron NCEL action has seen Liversedge take another major step towards lifting the Premier Division trophy.

The leaders won 2-0 at home to Frickley Athletic whilst closest rivals Beverley Town were beaten 3-1 by visitors and promotion rivals Handsworth. It means that Sedge are now fourteen points clear with seven games left to play.

A double from Fernando Tavares was added to by Mitchell Dunne as Handsworth picked up a big win in their quest for a play-off place before Glen Sani got a late consolation for their hosts.

The Ambers leapfrog Tadcaster Albion into fifth spot after the Brewers drew 0-0 at Thackley. Barton Town have strengthened their grip on fourth following a 3-2 home victory over Penistone Church.

All five goals came in the opening period with Joshua McKiernan and Lewis Stephens putting the hosting Swans two up before Ryan Johnson and Leon Hurlles-Brook restored parity only for Thomas Waudby to get what proved to be the winner in the 38th minute.

Seventh-placed Sheffield drew 0-0 at home with Knarborough Town and they are four points away from the top five in the race for promotion. At the other end of the table, Wombwell Town's fate is almost sealed as they were beaten 2-0 at home by the side they are chasing for safety, Albion Sports.

Ryan Basi broke the deadlock early in the second half before Abubcar Balajo rubber-stamped the Lions' victory in stoppage time.

Wombwell are now sixteen points adrift with eight games remaining whilst Sports have opened up a four-point gap between themselves and the other side in the relegation zone, Rossington Main.

A 2-1 loss at Eccleshill United meant Rossington lost a little ground on the team above them but they do have games in hand as they try to avoid the drop. Ross Hannah's penalty was an equaliser for them in between a couple of goals from Steve Ellix, the first also from twelve yards, as the Eagles ultimately prevailed.

And, it was honours even between hosts Horbury United, who took a first minute lead through Ryan Makings, and Golcar United in a 1-1 draw, George Doyle with the equaliser on the half-hour. Dearne & District have extended their lead at the top of Division One to nine points as Adam

Baskerville, Cian Guest and Curtis Wilkinson added to a Hayden Blow own goal in a 4-1 victory at Louth Town.

Alex Carter had struck an equaliser for the White Wolves but they were to taste a defeat that leaves them in fifteenth.

Harrogate Railway Athletic are up into third after a 10-0 pummelling of visitors Glasshoughton Welfare. Alex Ingham's hat-trick and a double for Sam Clothier were added to by one each from Nathan Heaton, Joseph Navier, Elliot Holmes, Harry Lynn and Harry Lee as the misery was piled on the division's basement side.

The Rail's promotion challenge has been strengthened whilst Glasshoughton now know that a relegation place will be confirmed if results do not go their way this weekend.

Fifth-placed Brigg Town drew 1-1 at Selby Town, Joshua Batty with an equaliser for the Zebras after Lleyton Brown had broken the deadlock for the hosts.

But, they have Leeds UFCA breathing down their neck in sixth after a Harrison Rowley double and a Jaydan Sandhu strike gave UFCA a 3-2 win at Athersley Recreation, Tom Mestre and James Woodhouse with the home side's goals.

The Rec remain three points above the drop zone as the side just below the trapdoor, Winterton Rangers, were also beaten. Robert Guilfoyle got both of Crowle Colts' goals in a 2-0 win for the visitors at the MKM Stadium.

Club Thorne Colliery and Route One Rovers remain seventh and eighth, respectively, after picking up midweek wins. Dominic Mellor netted twice as Thorne defeated Doncaster City at home 4-2 and a Reece Thompson double, along with Zak Khan's 58th goal of the season, saw Rovers beat hosts Armthorpe Welfare 3-0.

And, Ryan McKendry's 73rd minute strike secured South Leeds a 3-2 home victory over Maltby Main in a game that was level at 2-2 at the interval.

Meanwhile, it was a historic midweek for Worsbrough Bridge Athletic as they reached the Final of the Sheffield & Hallamshire Senior Cup for the first time in over half a century.

They caused a big upset by drawing with Barnsley U21s 0-0 before prevailing 4-2 in a dramatic penalty shoot-out to take them through to face either Worksop Town or Rossington Main.

Frickley 3 Eccleshill United 1

The Blues halted a run of 5 home defeats with a hard-earned triumph over Eccleshill United, a result that mattered far more than the aesthetics. It was a scrappy contest at times, but The Blues dug deep, showed character, and claimed a valuable 3 points.

The Azzurri were at it inside the opening half minute when Love whipped a teasing ball across the face of goal, only for it to evade everyone.

The early intent continued, and on 8 minutes a twice-taken free kick found Radz, whose thumping close range header was palmed away by the visiting keeper.

Eccleshill threatened sporadically, most notably when a cross found their striker unmarked on the penalty spot, but he skied his effort high over the bar. That miss proved costly, because moments later Les Bleus struck the opener. An incisive through ball released Robbo, who strode forward and dispatched a crisp finish from 20 yards.

The Boys in Blue looked about to double the lead when Andrew powered through the middle, only to be halted by a marginal offside call. No matter, The Azzurri's (and Robbo's) 2nd arrived soon after, in the 24th minute. Robbo threaded a low skidding shot, through a crowded area, that nestled into the far corner for his 12th goal of the season. Eccleshill hit the side netting with a free kick. Then just before the half hour, Robbo played in Lindley but his shot across goal, went inches wide of the upright.

In the 36th minute, Eccy forced Sykes into a superb point blank stop. However, the danger wasn't cleared, and when the ball was recycled into the box, the visiting number 5 headed home to reduce the deficit.

Carmody went into the book just before the interval, and the sides went in with Les Bleus holding a narrow advantage. HT 2-1.

After the break, The Boys in Blue had to show their resilience. Radz produced a perfectly timed

tackle inside the area, and Gadge followed suit shortly after with another crucial intervention. Eccleshill continued to press, heading towards goal at one point, only for an infringement to prevent any follow up. Sykes then pulled off a flying save before a goalmouth scramble from the resulting corner was eventually hacked clear. Spence kept the keeper on his toes with a driven attempt, but the decisive moment came with around 18 minutes remaining. Radz was hauled down in the box, the ref pointed to the spot, and Andrew (pictured) stepped up to roll the penalty kick past the keeper, restoring a 2 goal cushion. With 10 minutes to go, Sam Cable came on as sub, after 4 months out injured.

The Azzurri went close to adding a 4th late on when a fierce strike was parried into the path of Price, who hit the post. Nonetheless, the job was virtually done and The Azzurri saw out the final minutes to secure our first home win since December. The sense of relief and satisfaction was palpable at the full time whistle. FT 3-1.

It wasn't always pretty, but it was the response that we needed, with desire trumping dazzle, to tough it out and take the points. WEBMASTER MOTM - that was a performance

The Blues travelled to the league leaders and we came home empty handed after 2 Liversedge goals in the last half hour, both of which had a hint of fortune about them. But we gave them more of a game than they bargained for, matching them for long periods, producing a showing full of graft, endeavour and no shortage of defiance.

The Azzurri were fearless from the off. A 2nd minute corner was neatly recycled and found the head of Viggars, but he couldn't keep his header down. Moments later, a defensive slip allowed Liversedge to pinch possession, but Sykesy was alert and cut out the resulting cross with authority. After 11 minutes Robbo produced a fleet-footed run down the flank and whipped in a teasing ball. It broke to Price, but the ball wouldn't come down and he lofted his shot over the bar. Robbo was involved again shortly after, seeing a shot blocked, before linking with Lindley and Andrew in a flowing move that ended with Andrew dragging his attempt wide.

The Boys in Blue continued to carve out opportunities. Robbo jinked into the box on 23 minutes after a neat exchange with Andrew, only for the keeper to smother at his feet. At the other end, Gadge had to intervene decisively in the middle of a crowded box to clear a dangerous Sedge cross.

As the half wore on, the hosts began to show why they sit atop the table. They flicked the ball around in the area on 43 minutes, but Azzurri bodies threw themselves in the way to block the final strike. When we beat Liversedge 10-1 in the FA Cup in 2018, it was the biggest win in that year's competition and got us a mention in that season's FA Cups Final programme. In those days, Sedge had long been a middling NCEL club. Since then, there's been plenty of changes at their Clayborn home. More than one financial benefactors have overseen their boom and bust and start to boom again as they achieved 2 promotions followed by 2 relegations. Plenty of building work has gone on over recent years, mainly enlarging the terracing and main stand (bottom pic). Lucas Robinson (Midfielder/Forward): A rangy winger with an eye for goal, Cool Hand Lucas comes to us from Harrogate Railway but has been at Goole and Barton Town too.

Thomas Radley (Defender): Radz is a big centre half who was at Shelley last season and brings quality and leadership into our back line.

Harry Gagen (Defender): The HGV is a Rolls Royce of a defender who started out at Barnsley but joined us from Ossett United after an initial loan spell.



Linked to The Lane

I'm an incorrigible collector of old A&BC, Panini, Merlin, Topps, etc. football cards and stickers, and it struck me how many of the players pictured had links to Frickley Athletic. They might have played for or against us at some point, or are related to one of The Azzurri past or present. Or the connection might be even more tenuous! But you can be sure it was the highlight of their career :)

This year is the 40th anniversary of our famous meeting with Rotherham United in the FA Cup 3rd round proper. To get there we beat Hartlepool United in the 2nd round, our only FA Cup victory over EFL opposition. The Pools side included the gritty defender David Linighan. It must've been genetic as his older brother Andy was also a defender who played a bit ;) Between them they played more than a thousand professional games. And their younger brother, Brian, who only contributed 4 pro appearances (for Sheffield Wednesday and Bury) to the total, also played against The Blues for Workson Town in the early 2000s. Links abound!

David Linighan, born in Hartlepool in 1965, began his senior career at hometown club Hartlepool United, breaking into the first team at and making around 90 league appearances for them between 1982 and 1986. He then moved to Shrewsbury Town, playing 65 games over 2 seasons.

In 1988 David signed for Ipswich Town, where he spent the most significant portion of his career. In 8 seasons at Portman Road he made 277 league appearances and scored around a dozen goals. He served as club captain and was part of the team that won the Second Division title to gain promotion to the newly formed Premier League in 1991/92.

After several seasons in the Premier League, David joined Blackpool in 1995, where he stayed for 3 seasons. He then had a 1 game stint with Dunfermline Athletic before moving back to England with Mansfield Town.

In the final part of his playing career Linighan had periods in non-league football with Southport, Chester City and Hyde United in 2002 before retiring after over 600 games.

David's older brother, Andrew, was also born in Hartlepool, in 1962. He was also a centre half who started at Hartlepool United, making over 100 appearances before moving to Leeds United in 1984 then on to Oldham Athletic in 1986. In 1988, Andy joined Norwich City, becoming a

regular in defence and making around 100 league appearances over 2 seasons. His performances earned a move to Arsenal in July 1990. In his 7 seasons with the Gunners he won the First Division title in 1991, the 1993 FA Cup and League Cup, both against Sheffield Wednesday, and the European Cup Winners' Cup in 1994. All big achievements but his most


memorable moment was probably scoring the winning goal in the FA Cup final replay against Wednesday in the last minute of extra time.

In 1997 Andy signed for Crystal Palace, where he captained the side to promotion to the Premier League. He also had a short loan spell at Queens Park Rangers. Later in his career, Linighan joined Oxford United for the 2000/01 season, before moving into non-league with St Albans City.

When he hung up his boots, he had made over 500 appearances.

After the bright lights of football, the Linighan boys took up honest trades with David working in plumbing and Andy as a carpenter.

I like to think that when Andy wheels out his 'did I ever tell you about the time I scored the winner in the cup final?', Dave and Bri counter with glorious tales of facing The Mighty Blues of Frickley!

Keighley Facts: For a town of its size, Keighley - the new home of Eccleshill United - is the birthplace of an impressive array of the great and the good, ranging from sporting heroes to cultural figures such as Harry Brook, the Yorkshire and England cricketer who captains the national T20 side, Alastair Campbell, the former Labour Party spin doctor, the fearsome bearded Welsh international footballer Trevor Hockey, who turned out for Bradford City, Sheffield United and Birmingham City, amongst others (and is the grandfather of Blues legend Jacob Hazel's partner), BBC Look North's weather presenter Paul Hudson, Rugby World Cup winning England star Ellie Kildunne, much-loved comedy actress Mollie Sugden, who played Mrs Slocombe in *Are You Being Served?*, Timothy Taylor, founder of the Timothy Taylor Brewery, and Ricky Wilson, frontman of the band Kaiser Chiefs.


