BLUESCENE

Good afternoon, ladies and gentlemen, welcome to Westfield Lane for today's Northern Counties East Premier Division game against Horbury Town. We give a warm welcome to Horbury's players, officials and supporters and hope they have a safe trip home after the game.

It's early doors but today's visitors, Horbury Town, are currently in 5th place on 4 points after 2 games. Horbury had a generally positive preseason (WLWDW) with some big wins, putting 5 and 6 past Kinsley Boys and Marsden respectively, with only the one defeat, losing 5-1 to Route One Rovers. Horbury then kicked off the season proper last weekend with a 2-0 triumph over Parkgate, followed by a nil-nil draw at Thackley on Wednesday to remain undefeated.

The Blues come into today's game in 3rd place on 4 points after 2 games, 2 places above Horbury on goal difference alone. The Blues had a similarly encouraging preseason (WWLWW), the 4-0 defeat against Gainsborough Trinity being the one dampener amongst some like the determined wins over Club Thorne and Barnsley's Academy side. Our league opener on Saturday saw Sam Cable's second half header cancel out Keighley Town's first half lead to take a point from

a 1-1 draw. Then on Tuesday, we travelled to bogey club Knaresborough Town and ended the hoodoo with a 3-0 victory, our first at Manse Lane in 6 attempts. After a tense first half, it was goals from Luke Williams, Harry Gagen, his first for The Blues in over 50 appearances, and Martyn Woolford that settled matters in our favour.

Our most recent (and only) meetings with Horbury Town were last season's pair of league games. In November, we played out a goalless stalemate on a heavy surface at Horbury's Slazenger Sports ground. Then in the final game of the 2025/26 season, at the beginning of April, it was another draw, Charlie Clegg's late free kick equaliser making it 1-1, here at Westfield Lane.

Expect The Blues and our visitors Horbury to be doing all they can to extend their unbeaten start to the season.

Our next game sees The Blues in action here at Westfield Lane on Saturday 1st August as The Blues set out on the road to Wembley with Campion our visitors for an Emirates FA Cup Extra Preliminary Round tie, 3pm ko. We hope to see you all there.

We hope you enjoy today's game, and as ever, thank you for your unwavering support.

MEET THE VISITORS

Horbury Town was officially formed in the 1964/65 season, but the football team can trace its origins to earlier Horbury sides which were known as the 'Three Castles'. During the 60s and 70s, Horbury Town had a successful period, winning several minor trophies along the way.

During the 80s, the club had to endure some difficult years, plying their trade in the Wakefield Leagues but finally found glory in 1988, winning the Wakefield Division 2 and being accepted into the West Yorkshire League the following season.

In the summer of 1994, the club secured a permanent residence at Slazengers Sports Club, where they still reside to this day. This was a major development for the club, allowing them to build both on and off the field

After securing the Wakefield & District Invitation Challenge Cup in the 2007/08 season, the most successful period at the club came in the 2010s, winning the Wakefield & District Cup (also known as the Cyril Craven Challenge Cup) on 5 occasions - 2011/12, 2013/14, 2014/15, 2017/18 and 2019/20.

Success also followed for our reserve team in 2021/2022, when they created history, winning the West Yorkshire Country Trophy for the first time.

In 2022, the club applied for a position in the Northern Counties East Football League, which required a top 5 finish in the West Yorkshire Premier Division, along with FA ground requirements. Those requirements were achieved, with a second place finish, narrowly missing out on the league title to Horsforth St Margarets by just 2 points, who would also go on to beat the club in the West Yorkshire League Cup final that season.

The club's first season in the NCEL Division 1 was a successful one as the club secured a playoff spot on the final game of the

regular season, beating Beverley Town 3-1 and results in other fixtures going the club's way. A victory at Harrogate Railway the following week meant the club had the opportunity to be promoted at the first time but fell to a defeat against Rossington Main. In the West Yorkshire League, the reserve team also won promotion from Division 2, to Division 1, despite a fifth place finish, thanks to a restructure of all 3 leagues, due to the application of several new clubs.

2023/24 had seen our reserve side promoted once again to the West Yorkshire Premier but due to commitments beyond the club's control, the unfortunate decision to fold the side was made.

However, the club set up an U23s side in the West Riding County FA Development League (Centralised Division) to continue to build the pathway between junior and senior football at the club for up and coming young talent, ensuring and continuing the rise of the club.

The 24/25 season was another historic one for the club, gaining promotion to step 5 of the non-league pyramid. A 4-1 victory away at Maltby Main on the final game of the season saw Horbury clinch the NCEL Division 1 title.

Our U23s side also had a positive season with a third placed finish. The majority of the squad came from the juniors at U17 and U18 level, showing the talent present in the junior section.

The club found going quite tough in its first ever season at step 5 in the NCEL Premier Division in 2025/26 but successfully avoided relegation. So in 2026/27, the club will be looking to consolidate and continue its progress.





FRICKLEY'S HISTORY

Frickley Athletic FC is based in the former coal mining village of South Elmsall. Recent research has shown that the first South Elmsall football team was formed in 1905 but was superseded in 1908 by the newly formed Frickley Colliery Athletic Club and joined the South Yorkshire league which comprised of works, church and village teams. In 1910, the football club moved to the Sheffield Association League and first played in the FA Cup.

The club remained in the Sheffield Association League (except for the war years) until 1922, finishing runners up in 1911/12, and winners in 1920/21, our only ever league title.

In 1922/23 Frickley joined the Yorkshire league and after finishing runners up in 1923/24, the club were elected into the Midland League. Although the club had to apply for re election several times pre war (and didn't play in any league in 1933/34) it was kept going by the support of the mineworkers and the sale of players.

1936/37 was Frickley's worst ever league season when the club finished bottom with only 8 points, but amazingly reached the FA Cup 1st round proper for the first time.

Post war, Frickley remained in the Midland league gaining its best finish, 7th, in 1945/46, but left the league on its break up at the end of 1959/60.

From 1960/61 to 1969/70, Frickley Colliery played in the Cheshire County League. However, financial considerations led the club to join the Midland Counties League for 1970/71. They finished runners up in 1972/73, and were eventually elected into the NPL for the 1976/77 season as Frickley Athletic.

After finishing 3rd in 1979/80, the club was promoted into the Alliance Premier League, now the National League. Here they remained for 7 years, the most successful in the club's history, and in 1985/86 reached the FA Cup 3rd round proper, after beating a Football League club, Hartlepool Utd, only to lose 3-1 at home to Rotherham Utd. The club also finished as Gola League runners up. The following season saw a reversal as we were relegated back to the NPL. From 1987/88 to 1991/92 the club consistently finished around mid-table in the NPL, and managed to reach the league cup final in 1991/92, losing 1-0 to Marine at Maine Road.

The next few seasons saw Frickley finish in the lower reaches of the table. Then, in 2005/06 The

Blues had their best league season for 20 years, finishing 2nd to Blyth Spartans. Unfortunately, the Blues lost on penalties in the playoff semi.

In the following seasons Frickley returned to the lower half of the table, but 2015/16 saw the club have a great season to finish 7th.

In 2016/17, most of the players who had brought this success were attracted to more affluent clubs. The club were relegated from the NPL Premier Division after a 30 year stay.

2017/18 saw the club enter the NPL Division 1 South, finishing 3rd in the league, scoring a record 117 goals. Additionally, Jacob Hazel broke the club record for individual goals in a season with 47 strikes. The season ended disappointingly with playoff semi final defeat at the hands of Stamford. 2018/19, in the new NPL East Division, was less successful, seeing managerial changes and a 12th place finish. However, the season had its highlights, with victory at highflying Morpeth and a 10-1 win over Liversedge in the FA Cup.

More change followed prior to the start of 2019/20. A further league reorganisation which put The Blues into the NPL South East Division was accompanied by a new manager. An inauspicious start lead to the appointment of Dave Frecklington in September 2019.

Frecks rapidly turned the side's fortunes around, before lockdown ended the season. 2020/21 ultimately suffered the same fate.

Frecks built what looked like strong squad for the 2021/22 season in the newly formed NPL East Division. However, things didn't pan out as hoped and the club was relegated to the Northern Counties East League for the first time.

Since the summer of 2022, the club has been managed by Wayne Benn, with ex-Frickley goal scoring legend Andy Hayward as his assistant, Patrick McGuire, whose tenure included a superb 8-0 win at Goole, James Baxendale and Tom Claisse. All presided over finishes between 15th and 18th place in the NCEL Premier Division, but crucially avoided relegation.

When Tom Claisse was relieved of his duties in September 2025, club legend Martyn Woolford took the reigns and lead the club to a 15th place finish. And in one of his early games, he masterminded a remarkable 7-6 triumph over Bottesford Town in the league cup after being 5-1 down! He'll be looking to build on that fighting spirit in 2026/27, and bring winning ways back to Westfield Lane.





MEMORY MATCH

This week, we've got 2 memory matches for you, both early season games, with a few firsts on offer. The first match was our first game of the 2021/22 season, played on Saturday 14th August 2022. The Blues travelled to FA Vase winners Hebburn Town for their first ever NPL Division 1 East game, but a Lee Frecklington penalty earned us a 1-0 victory and spoiled the hosts' day. The second game is a NPL Premier Division game. Played on Saturday 18th August 1990, when Steve Myles's hat trick made sure that The Azzurri won on the opening day of the season for first time in over a quarter of a century, downing South Liverpool 5-2. A dream start ends. 26-year run for Blues

FRICKLEY got its HFS Loans League off to a dream start with Steve Myles getting a hat-trick in their 5-1 triumph over South Liverpool.

The Blues dominated exchanges, stamping authority on the game before South had Andy Green sent off for foul and abusive language in the 37th minute.

They went on to end a 26-year run without an opening league win in emphatic style.

The hard ground may have helped Myles get his first goal from the penalty spot in the 21st minute — a cross by Colin Bishop bobbing up and hitting Steve Joel's arm. But there was only skill as Myles whipped across a ball for Simon Lowe to lash in the team's second from 15 yards after 29 minutes.

Adrian Walker reduced the arrears in the 35th minute, only to see Myles volley in a 20-yarder within 60 seconds to restore Frickley's two goal advantage.

After a couple of close

shaves Myles completed his hat-trick with a low drive in the 65th minute, while Lowe took a pass from Peter Howey and fired wide of Routledge to complete the rout after 73 minutes.

It was a sound display by Frickley, Mike Fletcher handling well between the posts with Sam Kitchen and Ian Thompson excelling in defence.

The overlapping and finishing of Myles gave the Blues attack an added dimension which delighted the majority of the 341 fans.

MATCH REPORTS

Frickley 1 Keighley Town 1

The Blues opened the 2026/27 league campaign with a hard earned point against the newly named Keighley Town, The Azzurri fighting back to claim a more than deserved share of the spoils at The Wezzie.

Both sides took a little time to settle. The visitors had the first opening when a soft 8th minute free kick took a deflection wide. The Azzurri responded well. A neat move in the 16th minute saw Spence feed Cable, who skipped inside before seeing his effort blocked. Keighley tried their luck from range midway through the half but it went just over. Keighley had a moment of fortune in the 27th minute when the ball was taken to the byline and hit across the 6 yard box, evading everyone until it reached an unmarked Keighley player. He gave Allinson no chance as he finished from close range. Les Bleus looked for an immediate response. Kilner whipped over a dangerous cross that was headed clear, before Cable produced a moment of outrageous skill, leaving his man for dead with a sublime turn before attempting an ambitious lob from almost 50 yards that came to nought. The Boys in Blue continued to ask questions before the interval. Cable's delivery picked out Wright, whose shot was blocked inside the area, while moments later Cable raced through on goal only for an awkward bobble to take the ball away from him at the crucial moment. HT 0-1.

The Azzurri emerged after the interval with renewed purpose. Cable was inches away from levelling shortly after the restart when his header drifted agonisingly wide, and Wright then found him again, although Cable's headed ball back into the danger area couldn't quite be turned home.

The equaliser finally arrived in the 54th minute and it was a goal worthy of opening our league account for the new season. Wright released



Carmody, whose cross was met by a diving header from Cable to spark celebrations. The momentum was now with The Blues. Cable's next shot took a deflection wide before Dacre headed the resulting corner back across goal. The ball appeared to strike a Keighley hand, but the ref waved away the appeals. Les Blues came within a whisker of completing the turnaround when Wright crashed a superb 25 yard free kick against the crossbar just after the hour. Flanagan replaced Wright soon afterwards, with Price coming on for Cleggy and Roberts taking over from Andrew as the De Blauwen searched for a winner. Keighley reminded everyone they remained a threat with an long shot that cleared the bar, but it was The Blues who looked the more likely to snatch all 3 points. Roberts embarked on a fine run before seeing his shot well saved, Cable's late header was comfortably gathered, and deep into stoppage time Sheard produced a sumptuous diagonal pass to release Cable, only for the keeper to race out and smother the chance. FT 1-1.

After falling behind we showed determination to earn a point from the opening afternoon of the season. A battling display and honours even.

Knaresborough Town 0 Frickley 3

Having lost on each of their previous 5 visits, The Blues finally laid the hoodoo to rest with a clinical second half display as they claimed a deserved 3-0 victory at bogey club Knaresborough Town to record their first ever win at Manse Lane.

The Boys in Blue kicked the game off on a sun baked surface that made fluent football difficult for either side. Following an early corner that caused a pinball scramble inside the Frickley penalty area, Les Bleus launched a swift counter attack that ended with Wright lifting his shot over the crossbar with 6 minutes played. A minute later, the hosts thought they had taken the lead when they found the net, only for an offside flag to cancel it out.

The Azzurri had a whiff of an opening in the 19th minute. Good persistence from Cable closed down a defender and created uncertainty in the home defence, but despite the loose ball falling kindly, The Blues were unable to force it home.

The hosts continued to enjoy a spell of pressure midway through the half, seeing one effort blocked inside the penalty area before winning successive corners.

The home side came closest to breaking the deadlock after 33 minutes. A dangerous move down the right ended with the ball being flicked back to the edge of the area, but with the goal at his mercy, the final effort was sliced wide.

2 minutes later Frickley enjoyed another escape. A volley from the edge of the box had Allison scrambling, only for the dipping strike to clip the bar and bounce over. The Blues stood firm and reached the interval with the scores still level. HT 0-0.

The second half started with The Azzurri beginning to find some rhythm. In the 53rd minute, Spence drove purposefully through midfield before feeding Andrew, whose shot forced a smart save before the keeper reacted quickly to gather the rebound. Moments later, Cable burst through on goal only to see another promising effort blocked.

The breakthrough finally arrived on 69 minutes. Price produced a great run before sliding the perfect pass into the path of Luke Williams. Willo kept his composure to guide a precise finish into the bottom left corner. With the momentum now behind them, The Blues continued to threaten. Cable was cynically chopped down just outside the penalty area, but Flanagan curled the free kick agonisingly wide. Flanagan remained key to our creativity, delivering an inviting cross that was diverted behind for a corner before Cable saw yet another shot blocked. Soon afterwards, Flanagan's delightful backheel released Cable, whose drive was tipped over. The pressure eventually told 5 minutes from time. Flanagan's corner was met by Harry Gagen, whose header was fumbled over the line to double the Blue advantage.

There was still time for one final flourish. Deep into stoppage time, Martyn Woolford showed why he's the gaffer, putting the icing on the cake with a sublime finish that left the keeper helpless. And in the process he extended his record for the longest Frickley career goalscoring span to 20 years, 10 months and 8 days.

The final whistle confirmed an impressive first victory of the campaign and the end of our miserable record at Knaresborough. FT 0-3. It was a commanding second half performance from The Blues. After surviving sustained first half pressure, we eventually overwhelmed the hosts with 3 unanswered goals.

NCEL NEWS

The 2026/27 Macron NCEL season got underway in entertaining fashion last Saturday, with an average attendance of more than 220 across 21 matches and plenty of goals to launch the new campaign.

Promoted pair Dearne & District and Worsbrough Bridge Athletic both made winning starts to life in the Premier Division. Dearne came from behind to beat Tadcaster Albion 3-1 through goals from Justin Circuit, Adam Baskerville and Owen Fieldsend, whilst Oliver Green had levelled for the Brewers before they finished with ten men. Worsbrough edged Rossington Main 1-0 thanks to Keelan Grist's second-half winner.

Returning clubs Retford FC and Retford United experienced contrasting afternoons. Bernard Nsiah Yaa earned Retford FC a 1-1 draw at home to Handsworth after Rion Arbouin had put the visitors ahead, whilst Retford United were beaten 3-1 at Golcar United despite a late reply from Oliver Wilson.

Bottesford Town recorded the biggest Premier Division victory of the day as Owen Vincent scored twice in a 3-0 win over Pickering Town, whilst Horbury Town defeated Parkgate 2-0 through Joel Feirn and Zak Mallinson. Barton Town won 3-1 at Albion Sports, Campion snatched a dramatic 3-2 victory at Penistone Church thanks to two late goals from Corey Billy, and Knarborough Town recovered to beat Thackley 4-2.

In Division One, Brigg Town's Joshua Batty scored after just 14 seconds – the first goal of the new NCEL season – as the Zebras edged Appleby Frodingham 3-2.

Newcomers Field Olympic marked their first-ever NCEL game with a 3-1 home win over Goole AFC, whilst fellow newcomers LIV shared an entertaining 3-3 draw at Club Thorne Colliery. Kinsley Boys were beaten 3-1 at home by Crowle Colts, whilst returning clubs Hemsworth Miners Welfare and Immingham Town both lost, to Leeds UFCA and Doncaster City respectively.

Harrogate Railway Athletic attracted the day's biggest crowd of 524 as they came from behind to beat South Leeds 4-1. Elsewhere, Armthorpe Welfare defeated Route One Rovers 1-0, Selby Town overcame Athersley Recreation by the same scoreline and Wakefield AFC edged Winterton Rangers 1-0.

The JCP Construction NCEL Cup, in memory of James Hitchcock, began in midweek with the Division One clubs contesting the First Round, and home advantage proved decisive as six of the eight ties were won by the hosts.

The exceptions were Armthorpe Welfare, who won 3-1 at Crowle Colts through Kyle Fish, Jamie Simpson and Thomas Joynt, and Hemsworth Miners Welfare, who edged Wakefield AFC on penalties after a dramatic 3-3 draw that saw Bismark Osei equalise deep into stoppage time. Goole AFC defeated Field Olympic 3-1 with Ross Duggan scoring twice, Immingham Town beat South Leeds 4-2 despite a brace from South Leeds' Emre Can, and Leeds UFCA overcame Appleby Frodingham 4-2 thanks in part to two goals from Omar Sanyang. Kinsley Boys defeated Brigg Town 3-0, Selby Town beat Wombwell Town by the same scoreline, and LIV progressed with a 2-0 home victory over Athersley Recreation.

Meanwhile, in the Premier Division's midweek fixtures, only Bottesford Town and Dearne & District maintained perfect starts with two wins from two.

Bottesford produced the result of the week by thrashing Keighley Town 10-0, with Owen Vincent helping himself to four goals. Dearne & District also made it six points from six by coming from behind to beat Penistone Church 4-1.

Golcar United salvaged a 1-1 draw at Worsbrough Bridge Athletic through a stoppage-time equaliser from Ashley Flynn, Retford FC won 2-1 at Campion thanks to Aaron Sennett-Neilson and Iren Wilson, whilst Retford United beat Pickering Town 2-0 with goals from Oliver Wilson and Ben Ashall.

Tadcaster Albion claimed a 1-0 win at Parkgate through Charlie Owen, Albion Sports won by the same score at Rossington Main courtesy of Lewis Waddington, whilst Horbury Town and Thackley shared a goalless draw. Handsworth's home fixture with Barton Town was postponed after traffic problems prevented the visitors from reaching the ground.

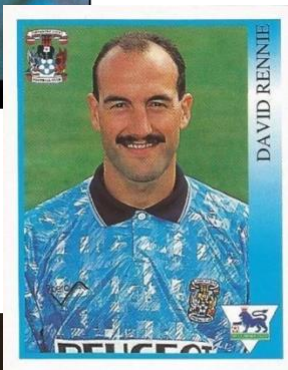
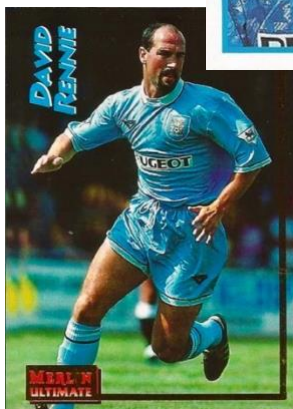
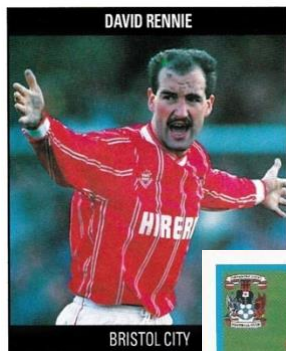
In 2001/02, Burton Albion, currently of EFL 2, were still in the NPL. When we locked horns, Albion won rather unsportingly 5-0 at The Wezzie and 4-0 in the return at Burton. One who was partly responsible for the '0' was defender David Rennie. Whilst not necessarily a household name, he was a dependable defender and CDM with a professional career spanning almost 2 decades.

Born in Edinburgh in 1964, David Rennie began his footballing journey in Leicester City's youth system in 1980, signing pro forms 2 years later and making his Football League debut in 1983.

Although first-team opportunities were limited at Filbert

Street, his performances were sufficient to persuade Leeds United to pay £50k for his services in 1986.

Rennie became a regular at Elland Road, making 101 appearances in all competitions and scoring 7 goals before moving to Bristol



City for £175k in 1989. During his time with Leeds, he enjoyed one of the most memorable moments of his career by scoring in the 1986/87 FA Cup semi final against Coventry City at Hillsborough, although Leeds were narrowly beaten 3-2. At Ashton Gate he was again a consistent first-team performer, making 122 appearances and scoring 8 goals, helping Bristol City secure promotion from the Third Division in 1989/90.

His form earned him a move to Birmingham City in February 1992. Rennie made almost 40 appearances for Birmingham City, before moving down the road to Coventry City for in March

1993. At Highfield Road he stepped up to the Premier League, making 92 appearances in all competitions over 3 seasons.

He joined Northampton Town on a free transfer in 1996 and was part of the side that won the 1997 Third Division playoff final, securing promotion to the second tier. He later

had spells with Peterborough United, Boston United and Burton Albion, who signed him for a nominal £2k as his playing career drew to a close in 2002. Across his Football League career, Rennie made more than 400 league appearances, scoring 24 league goals, while his total in all senior competitions exceeded 500 games. Respect.

Following his retirement from football, Rennie chose not to enter coaching or management. Instead, he moved into the business sector, working in employment

law and health and safety, advising organisations on workplace compliance, human resources and legal matters. DR should've started complying with the rules in 2001/2 – give The Azzurri a goal or 3!

Joel Spence (Midfielder): Joel 90 was at Armthorpe before joining us and he's been on the books of Rotherham United before plenty of experience at Belper Town, Ossett United, Winterton and Wakefield. Won the supporters' player of the season in 24/25 for his consistency in the engine room.

Sam Cable (Forward): The Power is a handful of an attacker. Since starting out in our U19s over a decade ago, he is now in his 3rd spell with the club after spells at Barton Town and Garforth Town.

Charlie Clegg (Forward): Cleggy is a local boy and a fan favourite, in his third spell with us. Has experience with Ponte Colls youth programme, Emley, Athersley, Armthorpe and Club Thorne.

Will Jenkinson (Defender): Jenko is a footballing defender who joined us from Parkgate, having started out at Rotherham United.

Sam Kilner (Defender): A NCEL title winner at Silsden in 24/25, Killer is a highly proficient fullback who has also been at Buxton, Mossley, Hemsworth and Knaresborough.

Thomas Radley (Defender): Radz is a big centre half who joined from Shelley in 2025 and provides quality and leadership in our back line.

Harry Gagen (Defender): The HGV is a Rolls Royce of a defender who started out at Barnsley but joined us from Ossett United after an initial loan spell and is now in his 3rd season at The Wezzie. Gadge was the supporters' player of the season in 25/26.

Elliot Andrew (Forward): The Prince is a quality striker who started out at Doncaster Rovers then Nottingham Forest before more recent spells at Tadcaster, Beverley and Rossington Main.

Tyler Sheard (Defender/Midfield/Forward): VersaTyler came through our academy and can do a job anywhere on the park, team before self every time. Scored his first goal at Beverley last season.

Josh Lindley (Midfielder): J-Force is a midfielder signed from Ponte Colls. The son of ex-Blue, Phil, he started at Doncaster Rovers, and has been at Ossett, Wombwell Town and Dearne & Dist.

Harry Carmody (Midfielder): The Modfather is a solid young midfielder who has been at FC Halifax Town's academy, Goole and Glasshoughton.

Lloyd Allinson (Goalkeeper): In his time at the likes of Huddersfield Town, Chesterfield, FC United of Manchester, Guiseley, Ponte Colls and Wombwell Town, The Ginger Neuer has played at every level from EFL League One to NCEL Premier Division. He is currently on loan from Cleethorpes Town.

Harold Edjangue (Goalkeeper): HE-Man is a Cameroonian shot stopper who impressed in pre-season. Has been with Farsley Celtic U23s, Yorkshire Amateurs and Nostell MW amongst others.

Jayden Roberts (Midfielder): JR is a livewire in the middle of the park and has been at Parkgate and Athersley Rec.

Josh Dacre (Defender): Judgement Dacre joins us from Dearne & District, where he won the NCEL Division One title last season. This rugged defender brings with him plenty of experience, having played for Handsworth, Ponte Colls, Grimsby Borough, Garforth Town, Sheffield FC, Worksop Town, Selby and Worsbrough Bridge.

Liam Flanagan (Forward): Flanagoal is a highly experienced forward at NCEL level, having played for Goole, Glasshoughton Welfare, Selby Town, where he scored over 100 goals, and Worsbrough Bridge where he earned promotion via the playoffs.

Shaun Heselwood (Midfielder): Hez of The Wez joined us from Selby Town, after spells at Hemingbrough United and Goole AFC, to add drive in the middle of the park.

Luke Williams (Midfielder/Forward): Willo is a pacey winger and a proven goal scorer at this level, having been at Goole, Albion Sports, Winterton, Ponte Colls and Club Thorne. He returns to The Wezzie for a 3rd time.

Bailey Wright (Midfielder/Forward): The Wright Stuff is a former Barnsley trialist and Athersley Rec winger with pace to spare.

Jake Carrigan (Midfielder): Carra is a hard running box to box midfielder and a local lad as well.

Charlie Price (Midfielder): Priceless is an exciting prospect who joins us after his release from Barnsley despite interest from higher up the pyramid.

Lucas Brown (Midfielder): Cool Hand Lucas has come through our academy and looks ready to make an impression at first team level.

Freddie Dale (Midfielder): Ever Ready is another making the step up from our academy, after playing the odd game for South Elmsall United Services too.

Mike Carmody (Assistant Manager): As a player, MC Hammer was a top defender for Huddersfield and Tranmere in the EFL and for many years at Altrincham. Since retiring from playing, he has managed Armthorpe Welfare and Goole AFC.

Martyn Woolford (Midfielder/Forward/Manager): The Woolfman started at The Wezzie in 2005 after joining from Glasshoughton. He is a classy attacking midfielder who has been in the EFL with the likes of York, Scunthorpe, Millwall, Bristol City and Sheffield United since then but he's back home for a 3rd spell. It's was a great night at the Q&A / open training session down at the Wezzie. Massive thanks to Chairman Phil Cooper and the club for putting it on for us supporters.

What follows is a brief summary of some of the things that were raised and discussed.

Martyn Woolford (pictured left) spoke first and said initially, as we know, he came back to the club as a player. At the time he wasn't sure about resuming his playing career but this was the only club that he would've considered coming back for. He then spoke of his own surprise at becoming the manager, as football management wasn't actually something he had an interest in doing at the time. But he's enjoying it and also admitted to not knowing many players at this level, which is why he wanted someone working alongside him (Mike Carmody) that did have that knowledge.

Mike (pictured right) also spoke about the squad and the club in general. Both said they were happy with the current squad as a starting point for the season and were happy to have found a few gems over the summer. However, they will add to the squad if it's needed and have the support from the club to do that.

They also mentioned that they have created a good squad harmony and players are here because they want to be here. While we are also maintaining a good relationship with those who have departed (one of whom is currently with Scunthorpe United) as, if things don't work out for them, we will be the first club they contact should they need to seek regular football in the future. This approach has already paid dividends as this is how Charlie Price has returned to The Wezzie.

Woolly and Mike then left the Q&A to prep for training, so club Chairman Phil Cooper took over and spoke as the focus switched to matters more to do with the running of the club.

We were looking at other friendlies this summer but some clubs let us down late on, which is why we ended up with the games that we did.

Phil said this has been one of the easiest pre-seasons he's had to oversee in the 5 years he's

been involved with the club and paid tribute to Martyn Woolford for that, who he says has just got on with the job.

Off the field, a lot of work has taken place at The Wezzie to make some changes over the summer. The revamped disabled area is the perfect tribute to Jim Aisbitt, who sadly passed away recently. The roof structure of the Frank Hill Stand has also had work done, as well as paintwork on the perimeter wall and new goal nets for 26/27.

We are also exploring more ambitious aspects of ground redevelopment, including a covered stand at the Pavilion end of the stadium. Phil stated that we already have the materials sourced for this but need to weigh up the cost of construction.

Phil then emphasised the importance of getting more fans to the Wezzie for matches and made one request to us as fans. To tell our mates, neighbours, people on the street about the club and to try to drag them along for a game!

Penny Wall then spoke about a recent FA ground survey relating to the safety of Westfield Lane.

After recent incidents involving players colliding with the perimeter wall at other grounds, the FA are clamping down on this and there is a strong chance that the current perimeter wall will have to come down. There are a couple of options here, including a new plastic perimeter fence replacing the existing wall, or a new fence in

front of the existing wall. Watch this space. And the FA has made us widen our pitch by 20 cm. Chris Long then spoke briefly, explaining the role he plays, acting as a link between the players and board. Chris spoke highly of the group and mentioned that Luke Williams had recently said how well the club was now being run.

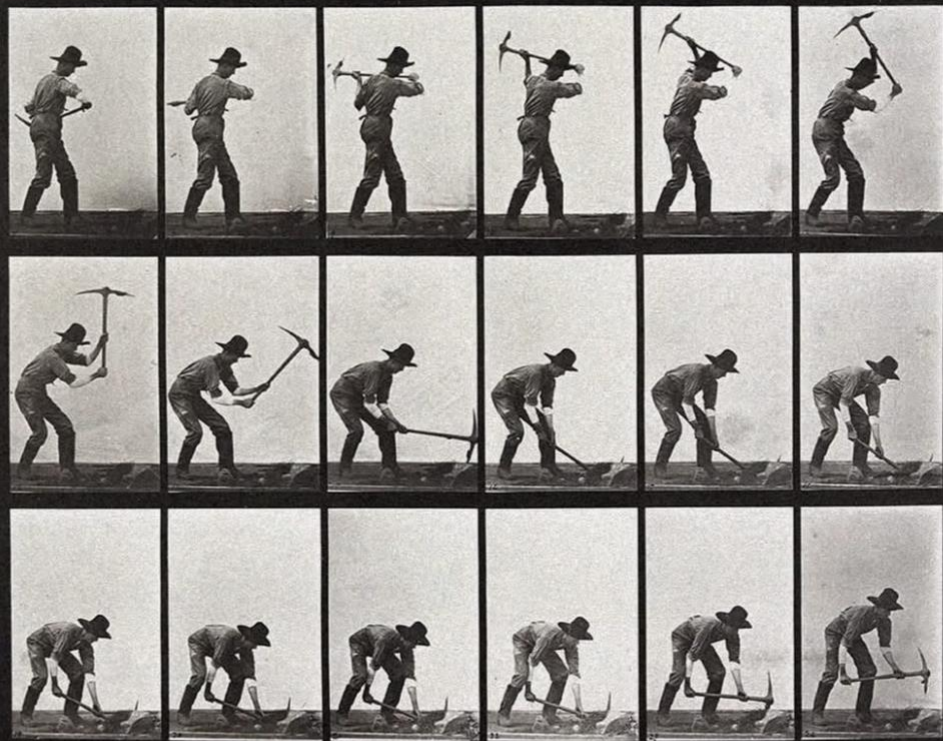

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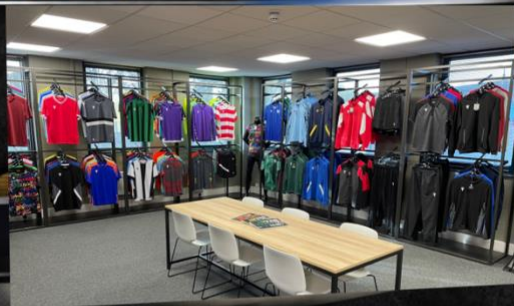
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
