

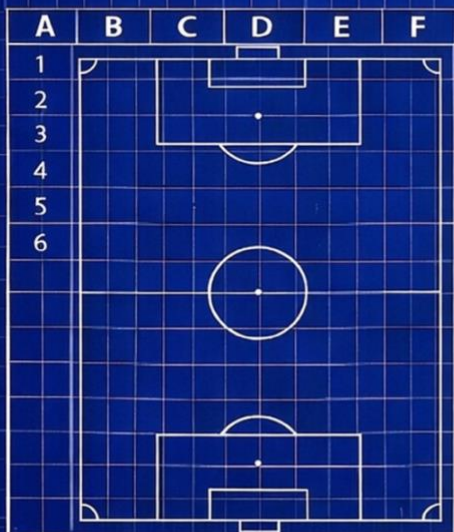

BLUESCENE

Good afternoon, ladies and gentlemen, welcome to Westfield Lane for today's Northern Counties East Premier Division game against Handsworth. We give a warm welcome to Handsworth's players, officials and supporters and hope they have a safe trip home after the game.

Today's visitors, Handsworth, are currently in 18th place on 5 points after 5 games. Handsworth's recent league form has seen them lose twice and draw once since their only win of the season so far, a 3-1 victory at Albion Sports. Then came a 7-2 drubbing at the hands of Dearne & District, after leading twice in the opening half hour, and a 3-2 defeat at Parkgate. However, last Saturday, The Ambers can consider themselves somewhat unfortunate not to take all 3 points as they were 3-1 up at Thackley, going into injury time, but the home side managed to score 2 to make it 3-3.

The Blues come into today's game in 17th place on 5 points after 7 games - a place above Handsworth on goal difference alone. Since taking a point at Tadcaster Albion from our 1-1 draw, courtesy of Sam Cable's late equaliser, The Blues have suffered 3 consecutive losses. A 3-2 defeat at Penistone Church, with our goals coming from Josh Dacre and Charlie Price, was followed by a 2-0 reverse against Retford FC in our last home game. Last weekend's

game against Barton Town (played at Winterton) ended with us going down by the same 2-0 scoreline.

Our most recent meetings with Handsworth were last season's pair of league games. In October, The Ambers were 3-0 victors at The Wezzie, although ex-Blue Josh Nodder's 2 injury time goals gave the scoreline rather more gloss than might have been earned. Then in February, The Blues returned the favour at Oliver's Mount by winning 2-1. Joel Spence and Charlie Clegg scored a pair of beauties before Josh Nodder got one for The Ambers in time added on again.

Expect The Blues to be going hell for leather to win our first game at The Wezzie in 2026/27 and climb the table.

Our next game sees The Blues travel to Champion again, but in the league this time, on Wednesday 9th September, 7.45pm kickoff, and then to FC St Helens on Saturday 12th September, 3pm ko, for a FA Vase 2nd Round Qualifying game. The Blues are next in action here at Westfield Lane on Tuesday 15th September when NCEL newbies Dearne & District are our visitors, 7.45pm ko, as we get back to league matters. We hope to see you all there.

We hope you enjoy today's game, and as ever, thank you for your unwavering support.

MEET THE VISITORS

Handsworth Parramore FC were formed at the start of the 2014/2015 season after the merger of two highly successful clubs, Handsworth FC of the S&H County Senior League Premier Division and Worktop Parramore of the NCEL Premier Division. The NCEL and the FA allowed the new club to take over the position of Worktop Parramore, who had just finished in 4th place in the Premier Division, whilst the S&H CFA allowed their reigning champions to continue under the name of Handsworth Parramore Reserves. The new club could not have begun life better as in their first game, under Manager Russ Eagle, they crushed Glasshoughton Welfare 6-0 and followed this up with a 5-1 victory over Oadby Town in their first ever FA Cup tie. After leading the table for a number of weeks, a downturn in fortunes led to a change at the top and the installation of the ex Belper Town management team of Peter Duffield and Mick Godber. The duo rebuilt the squad who ended their inaugural season in 7th place and with the club's first piece of silverware, the NCEL League Cup, secured after a thrilling 4-3 victory over Cleethorpes Town. Our second season started in positive fashion but halfway through the campaign, the difficult decision was made to relieve Duffield of his duties, with Mick Godber stepping up as caretaker manager. However, such was the impact that Godber made, including an unbeaten run of 17 games that propelled The Ambers to the top of the table, the decision to make the role permanent was taken. The Ambers eventually fell just short in their quest for the title, finishing a comfortable second behind champions Tadcaster Albion.

The following season, and despite a best ever run in the FA Cup, halted only at the 3rd Qualifying Round stage, inconsistent league form resulted in Godber stepping down as manager in April, with striker Jon Froggatt being put in temporary charge until the end of the season, and a creditable 4th placed finish was achieved. In April 2017, the club announced that former player James 'Jas' Colliver was to return to take over as the new manager, and with another rebuilt squad, another 4th placed finish was secured in his first season in charge, with promotion missed by just one place for the second time, alongside a run to the semi finals of the League Cup. Unfortunately, the 2018-19

season was really one to forget with The Ambers finishing in their lowest ever position of 8th and with poor showings in the cup competitions. Colliver departed the club in the Autumn and, despite their best efforts, the interim management team of Steve Istead and Jon Froggatt were unable to lift the general malaise that had set in around the club.

At the end of the campaign, the decision was made for the club to continue on a much-reduced budget and to return to Olivers Mount. Russ Eagle was invited back to the club as manager alongside Aiden Spowage, and to strengthen ties with the junior sporting club, the new management board sought and gained approval from the NCEL to change the club's name to Handsworth FC.

The 2019/20 and 2020/21 campaigns saw the club suffer some highs and lows as was to be expected with such a young and changing squad, and after a hit and miss start to the 2021/22 season, The Ambers parted company with Eagle in October, with Aiden Spowage and Jason Dodsworth named as joint managers, with Louis Axcell strengthening the management team later. An excellent run to the 3rd Qualifying Round of the FA Cup underpinned a highly respectable 8th placed finish, but despite the efforts of everyone involved, they were unable to build on this and a disappointing 2022/23 campaign saw The Ambers finish in their lowest ever position of 16th, leading to the inevitable departure of the management team.

Ambers' legend Jon Froggatt was handed the reins alongside Mark Ward ahead of the 2023/24 season, and an excellent start saw The Ambers within touching distance of top spot, before a desperate run of form through the winter saw the team drop alarmingly before a late resurgence claimed an improved 13th placed finish. Improvement continued in 2024/25, with The Ambers securing an excellent 7th placed finish after an enjoyable, if sometimes frustrating season. 2025/26

saw the exact same – 7th again.

Consistent, at least. With some tweaking during the summer, The Ambers are looking to improving their final position in 2026/27.





FRICKLEY'S HISTORY

Frickley Athletic FC is based in the former coal mining village of South Elmsall. Recent research has shown that the first South Elmsall football team was formed in 1905 but was superseded in 1908 by the newly formed Frickley Colliery Athletic Club and joined the South Yorkshire league which comprised of works, church and village teams. In 1910, the football club moved to the Sheffield Association League and first played in the FA Cup.

The club remained in the Sheffield Association League (except for the war years) until 1922, finishing runners up in 1911/12, and winners in 1920/21, our only ever league title.

In 1922/23 Frickley joined the Yorkshire league and after finishing runners up in 1923/24, the club were elected into the Midland League. Although the club had to apply for re election several times pre war (and didn't play in any league in 1933/34) it was kept going by the support of the mineworkers and the sale of players.

1936/37 was Frickley's worst ever league season when the club finished bottom with only 8 points, but amazingly reached the FA Cup 1st round proper for the first time.

Post war, Frickley remained in the Midland league gaining its best finish, 7th, in 1945/46, but left the league on its break up at the end of 1959/60.

From 1960/61 to 1969/70, Frickley Colliery played in the Cheshire County League. However, financial considerations led the club to join the Midland Counties League for 1970/71. They finished runners up in 1972/73, and were eventually elected into the NPL for the 1976/77 season as Frickley Athletic.

After finishing 3rd in 1979/80, the club was promoted into the Alliance Premier League, now the National League. Here they remained for 7 years, the most successful in the club's history, and in 1985/86 reached the FA Cup 3rd round proper, after beating a Football League club, Hartlepool Utd, only to lose 3-1 at home to Rotherham Utd. The club also finished as Gola League runners up. The following season saw a reversal as we were relegated back to the NPL. From 1987/88 to 1991/92 the club consistently finished around mid-table in the NPL, and managed to reach the league cup final in 1991/92, losing 1-0 to Marine at Maine Road.

The next few seasons saw Frickley finish in the lower reaches of the table. Then, in 2005/06 The

Blues had their best league season for 20 years, finishing 2nd to Blyth Spartans. Unfortunately, the Blues lost on penalties in the playoff semi.

In the following seasons Frickley returned to the lower half of the table, but 2015/16 saw the club have a great season to finish 7th.

In 2016/17, most of the players who had brought this success were attracted to more affluent clubs. The club were relegated from the NPL Premier Division after a 30 year stay.

2017/18 saw the club enter the NPL Division 1 South, finishing 3rd in the league, scoring a record 117 goals. Additionally, Jacob Hazel broke the club record for individual goals in a season with 47 strikes. The season ended disappointingly with playoff semi final defeat at the hands of Stamford. 2018/19, in the new NPL East Division, was less successful, seeing managerial changes and a 12th place finish. However, the season had its highlights, with victory at highflying Morpeth and a 10-1 win over Liversedge in the FA Cup.

More change followed prior to the start of 2019/20. A further league reorganisation which put The Blues into the NPL South East Division was accompanied by a new manager. An inauspicious start lead to the appointment of Dave Frecklington in September 2019.

Frecks rapidly turned the side's fortunes around, before lockdown ended the season. 2020/21 ultimately suffered the same fate.

Frecks built what looked like strong squad for the 2021/22 season in the newly formed NPL East Division. However, things didn't pan out as hoped and the club was relegated to the Northern Counties East League for the first time.

Since the summer of 2022, the club has been managed by Wayne Benn, with ex-Frickley goal scoring legend Andy Hayward as his assistant, Patrick McGuire, whose tenure included a superb 8-0 win at Goole, James Baxendale and Tom Claisse. All presided over finishes between 15th and 18th place in the NCEL Premier Division, but crucially avoided relegation.

When Tom Claisse was relieved of his duties in September 2025, club legend Martyn Woolford took the reigns and lead the club to a 15th place finish. And in one of his early games, he masterminded a remarkable 7-6 triumph over Bottesford Town in the league cup after being 5-1 down! He'll be looking to build on that fighting spirit in 2026/27, and bring winning ways back to Westfield Lane.





MEMORY MATCH

This week, we've got 2 memory matches for you, as usual, a pair of NPL Premier Division games from early September. The first match was played on Wednesday 6th September 1995. The Blues travelled to York Street to face old foes, Boston United, and came away with 3 points after an Ian Taylor inspired 3-1 victory. The second game is from Tuesday 6th September 2005, when The Azzurri held onto an 18th minute lead to win 1-0 against Farsley Celtic, here at The Wezzie, to maintain an unbeaten start to the season. Taylor inspires Athletic

STRETCHERED OFF in the previous game, Ian Taylor recovered to inspire Frickley Athletic to a superb 3-1 victory at Boston United in the Unibond Premier Division last Wednesday.

Taylor pulled off a string of superb saves just after the interval as the Pilgrims threatened to overwhelm the Blues, and received strong support from the rest of the side which fully deserved its first away triumph.

Frickley almost grabbed a fourth minute lead when Viv Rayson whacked a shot from the edge of the penalty area, which Bastock did well to turn away, while Boston showed their fangs in the eighth minute, Andy Gray shaving the bar.

In the 23rd minute, the Blues were awarded a free kick, Scot Whitehead placing a 35 yards cross perfectly for Mark Canning to rise and head the Blues in

front, and they improved their tally seven minutes later, Mark Dempsey lashing another free kick through the home 'wall' and past the stranded keeper.

United resumed strongly after the break, Taylor soon being in action and he was unlucky in the 52nd minute when he managed to parry a sizzling effort, only to see Phil Brown stick away the rebound.

This saw the home side really threaten, Taylor saving well from Gray and then tipping another strong shot off target.

Frickley kept their cool and, when Taylor launched a long clearance in the 71st minute, Viv Rayson collected and raced through to beat the home keeper with a low shot on the run.

The tempo continued to the end, an angled shot by Gray beating Taylor in the 89th minute but Gary Hatto was on hand to clear off the line.

Blues the only unbeaten side left in the league

FRICKLEY Athletic became the last unbeaten side in the Unibond Premier Division after a 1-0 home victory over Farsley Celtic on Tuesday.

The Blues began determinedly, Ashley Scothern beating two men before firing in a curling shot which was headed off the line by Celtic skipper Chris Stabb, and a free-kick by Alex Callery was yard free-kick narrowly over the target in the 15th minute, Frickley took the lead three minutes later, Andy Evans powering in a header from 10 yards following a corner kick from Callery.

Former Blues striker Curtis Bernard made a good run down the right in the 37th minute and picked out Simeon Bambrook and he fired over, but it was the home side calling the tune, Callery going close exchanges in the second half, but could make little impression on a solid Blues back four, and Frickley almost scored again in the 79th minute, Matt Daly sending Scothern down the left but his shot was blocked, and Callery then had two efforts punched from under the bar by visiting keeper Paul Cuss.

Celtic nearly snatched an equaliser in the 88th minute, but Daly cleared a shot from James

THE NLP COLUMN: MOVING ON UP

Non-league talents Abdul Abdulmalik and Danny Ormerod have been making headlines all summer.

They were making them last season as well in fairness, with their performances on the pitch. Abdulmalik starred for Boreham Wood in their run to the National League promotion final, his dazzling quick-feet lighting up Wembley back in May.

Ormerod (pictured) fired 31 goals as AFC Fylde, where he came through the academy, won the National League North title to return to Step 1.

Unsurprisingly, the scouts had noticed and clubs higher up the food chain wanted in.

Both clubs were public in saying they didn't want to sell their starlets.

And that's been the position until last week where both were eventually sold within a matter of days of each other. Abdulmalik to Swedish side Djurgardens IF for a reported £1.5million fee – a new record – and Ormerod to well-known diamond polishers Peterborough United for £600,000.

It shows the level of non-league football and the talent of both players they are able to command such fees – with both clubs potentially bagging future revenue like sell-ons down the line.

The pursuit of Abdulmalik has turned into a bit of a saga with an unfortunate end where he was no longer training or playing for Wood – he did score against FC Halifax – and the club frustrated by “press leaks” around his situation. But upon departure the 23-year-old, who won The NLP's Young Player of the Year at our National Game Awards last season, said: “The club means a lot to me because of how I've been supported here by fans, players and



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staff.

“Something I didn't expect was to make as many great connections with staff and teammates who are either still at the club or have left, it really is a great place.

“The support I was shown allowed me to express myself so freely on the pitch and produce memorable moments, and I can't thank them enough.

“My relationship with the supporters was good, I'd say. We'd interact in the 'Glass House' sometimes and have positive conversations.

“I enjoyed playing in front of you all and I wish the club all the best. I can't wait to see the club in the EFL and progress as far as they can.”

Ormerod scored in two of his three games for Fylde this season and made his Posh debut

last Saturday in their League One defeat at Blackpool.

“We had a chat with him in the office a couple of days after getting promoted,” Fylde boss Craig Mahon told The NLP.

“Obviously there was all talk about him then. I know he was injured but he was coming back and loads of people were talking about him, what he could do and where he could go.

“My big thing to him was, ‘Just don't lose your hunger to be

the best player on the pitch’. That's what Danny has. If you watch his games, he never stops running, he never stops giving his all.

“I said to him, ‘You've got all the talent, just keep your hunger and you will go onto bigger and better things’.

“He's done that all through pre-season, he's started the season so well again. It's a shame for us to lose such a character and a great player in the dressing room. That's football. We have nothing but good things to say about Danny.”





NCEL NEWS

Last Saturday, Bottesford Town's perfect start to the NCEL Premier Division season continued with a 4-0 win at Retford FC, making it five victories from five. Jack Varley put the Poachers ahead before Owen Vincent completed a second half hat trick to restore them to top spot.

Worsbrough Bridge Athletic had briefly moved into first after a 5-0 home win over Tadcaster Albion. Charlie Austerfield opened the scoring in the third minute before Lance Friedrich, Lewis O'Connor and Lloyd Smith (2) completed the rout. The Briggers finish third, with fellow promoted side Dearne & District climbing back to second after Jamie Austin's goal secured a 1-0 win over Albion Sports - their fifth victory in six games. Knaresborough Town (and Barton Town) complete the top five. Knaresborough edged Golcar United 4-3 thanks to Alex Ingham's winner. George Doyle scored twice for Golcar. Penistone Church and Retford United drop to sixth and seventh after drawing 1-1. Retford's Jacob Carter opened the scoring before Penistone's Jack Cawthorn equalised. Parkgate and Pickering Town both picked up important wins. Harry Day scored twice as Parkgate won 2-1 at Champion, while Souleymane Coulibaly's hat trick helped Pickering beat bottom side Keighley Town 4-0.

Lucas Smith equalised for Horbury Town in a 1-1 draw at Rossington Main after Myron Gibbons had put the hosts ahead.

There was late drama at Dennyfield as Thackley scored twice in stoppage time to draw 3-3 with Handsworth. Luke Mangham made it 3-1 to Handsworth with an 80th minute goal, but Luke Brooks scored a penalty and Marcel Stephiewski netted for Thackley to rescue a point.

Brigg Town remain top of Division One after a seventh straight win, although their clean-sheet run ended at Club Thorne Colliery. Marc Newsham put Thorne ahead before Brigg levelled at 2-2 by half time. Reece York, Joshua Batty and Archie Davidson then struck for a 5-2 victory. Field Olympic and Goole AFC remain second and third after both scored six. Michael O'Brien, Jonathan Mwembie, Aidan Day, Joseph Colley, Kieran Suddards and Kieron Batey were all on target for Olympic in a 6-0 win over Crowle Colts. Goole beat South Leeds 6-1, with Ross Duggan scoring twice alongside goals from Callum Brooks, Taylor Nicholson and Igor Mlynarski, plus

an own goal for each side.

Joseph Rawcliffe's hat trick helped Selby Town beat Immingham Town 4-0 and climb to fourth. Leeds UFCA and Doncaster City complete the top six after both leapfrogged Armthorpe Welfare. Edward Tordoff, Kalaab Daniel and Dawud Shendi scored for UFCA in a 3-1 win over Armthorpe, while Doncaster beat Winterton Rangers 2-1 through Samuel Giles and Danny South, with Oliver Hakner replying late.

Ilkley Town got their first win of the season as Matthias Britton and Luke Baldwin scored twice each in a 5-2 victory over LIV. Appleby Frodingham did the same as a Joshua Fraiwald goal secured a 2-1 win at Wombwell Town. Alex Burton scored twice for Harrogate Railway Athletic in a 3-2 win over Kinsley Boys, while Nathaneal Dyer and Nathan Perks scored within minutes of each other after the hour as Athersley Recreation beat Wakefield AFC 2-1.

Hemsworth Miners Welfare drew 1-1 with Route One Rovers, Umar Ali Zahoor scoring for Rovers before Oliver Busfield equalised.

In the midweek fixtures, Bottesford Town moved 3 points clear at the top of the Premier Division after Clayton Bryant's 81st minute goal secured a 1-0 win at Horbury Town, while Dearne & District lost 2-0 at home to Barton Town. Danny Earl and Craig King, from the spot, scored for Barton. Retford United moved into fifth after a goalless draw with Tadcaster Albion, while Retford FC drew 2-2 with Thackley. Iren Wilson and Bradley Hexall scored for Retford FC before Marcel Stephiewski struck twice for Thackley.

Campion moved into seventh as Ewan Gregson and Sonny Whittingham both scored twice in a 4-3 win at Albion Sports, for whom Lewis Waddington, Talent Ndlovu and Joseph Poxon were on target.

In Division One, Goole AFC missed the chance to close the gap on leaders Brigg Town after Eric Onyeka's goal gave LIV a 1-0 win at the Vikings. Route One Rovers won 2-1 at Harrogate Railway, with Lucas Stephens and Bubacary Conteh Samateh scoring for Rovers either side of Elliot Holmes' goal for the Rail.

South Leeds and Club Thorne shared 6 goals in a 3-3 draw. Deven Hannan, Jackson Yates and Wilfey Woodham scored for Thorne, while Mark Ferguson, Charlie Parker and Emmanuel Amisshah replied for South Leeds.





MATCH REPORTS

Frickley 0 Retford FC 2

The Blues were left empty handed as newly promoted Retford FC emerged from our first competitive meeting between the two sides with all 3 points. This was despite The Blues creating enough opportunities to have taken something from an entertaining evening encounter. The Azzurri had the better of the opening exchanges and might have taken the lead inside 4 minutes. Sam Cable's cross found Flanagan with the goal gaping, but he couldn't bring the ball down and under control. A minute later, Cable was denied again when the ball was nicked off his toe just as he prepared to pull the trigger. Andrew then kept the Retford keeper awake with a shot from around 30 yards, before Les Bleus went agonisingly close in the 16th. Cable raced clear one-on-one, only to fire straight at the advancing keeper, and when the rebound fell to Roberts, a Retford defender managed to stop the follow up almost on the line, with a hint of handball.

Retford issued a warning of their own when a 24th minute header produced a superb reflex save from Allinson, who somehow tipped the ball onto the bar. But seconds later The Azzurri were caught cold when the visitors were awarded a soft free kick. The set piece was struck directly into the bottom corner to give Retford a fortuitous lead.

Allinson was called upon again 3 minutes later, with another excellent fingertip save to push a header over the bar. At the other end, Andrew tested the keeper from distance for a second time before Dacre produced a superb recovery run and tackle to halt a Retford attack.

Los Azules almost levelled before the break when Flanagan's 45th minute cross put a defender under pressure and nearly resulted in an own goal. HT 0-1.

The Blues continued to push for a leveller straight after the interval. Gagen found Flanagan very early in the second half and his cross was met by Roberts, whose header narrowly missed the target. Spence then worked the ball into the box, where Dacre controlled it brilliantly and twisted past his man, only for his shot to be blocked.

Retford briefly threatened to double their advantage when they tried to take the ball around Allinson, but the Azzurri keeper got a fingertip to it before quickly pouncing on the loose ball. And Dacre was at it again, making another excellent chase back to snuff out danger.

After Retford had seen one effort blocked and another fly wide, Les Bleus almost drew level in the 63rd minute. Flanagan attempted to round the keeper, who got a hand to his first effort before recovering to keep out the second.

Instead, Retford doubled their lead 2 minutes later on the counter. A break down the right ended with a cross to the back post, where the arriving attacker made no mistake.

The Blues looked to have pulled one back when Cable burst clear and fed Flanagan, who finished neatly, but the flag went up for offside. From the touchline, the decision looked extremely harsh. The visitors were on the attack again shortly afterwards, appearing well offside as they broke through, but Allinson wasn't waiting for the officials to intervene and produced another good

Barton Town 2-0 Frickley

After keeping it tight for the first 45 minutes, a pair of second half Barton goals downed The Blues on a frustrating afternoon at Winterton, as both sides finished with 10 men.

Les Bleus had the first opportunity inside 6 minutes when Joel Spence powered forward before squaring for Sam Cable, whose effort went wide. A minute later, Cleggy (pictured) saw his shot deflected behind. Then the home keeper had to produce an excellent save 2 minutes later, pushing Spence's shot around the post.

The hosts then began to turn the screw, with Allinson holding onto a couple of long range shots before Barton flashed a ball across goal.

A super Allinson stop was required in the 22nd minute as he got down to keep out a shot. On 25 minutes, Barton put the ball in the net, but the flag was raised for offside, although the forward was so far gone that it was a decision that didn't really require the benefit of VAR.

The Azzurri continued to be menacing on the break, with Liam Flanagan nipping in behind in the 27th minute and

sliding the ball across goal, but there were no Blues to convert it.

The home side headed wide from a free kick before seeing another effort deflected behind, then headed over from the resulting corner.

Flan kept the Barton keeper on his toes with a free kick, while a moment of uncertainty between the keeper and his defence in the 41st minute almost presented Spence with an opportunity, although his long range attempt went wide.

Jenko and Dacre then had to combine with a pair of perfectly timed tackles to snuff out another Barton attack to keep in goalless. HT 0-0.

The Blues were straight at it from the restart.

Flan's 46th minute cross was intended for Cable, only for a defender to get a crucial touch with his head to flick the ball over Sam's Napper.

Cable then tried his luck from around 25 yards but couldn't keep it down.

The goal Barton had threatened arrived in the 56th minute. A ball across the Frickley area was slotted away with a drive back across Allinson.

Gadge, Cable and Willo combined in the 63rd

minute, with Willo attempting an overhead kick that sailed over the bar. 5 minutes on Flan created an opening for Spence who shot wide. Cable almost escaped the Barton defence in the 69th minute, only to shoot over, under pressure.

The game then took a dramatic turn as Josh Dacre was shown a straight red card in the 70th minute for a perceived elbow, even though the Barton player got straight back up once the card was awarded. But the numbers were level again just 3 minutes later when the Barton keeper was also dismissed for a straight red after poleaxing Flan just outside the box.

Once a Barton centre half had donned the gloves, Flan took the resulting free kick but sent it narrowly over.

Allinson was called into action again in the 77th minute, making a good save at his near post. And

Barton headed wide before firing off target.

Carmody, Andrew and Roberts were introduced for Clegg, Willo and Price, with Carrigan also coming on for Flan as The Azzurri looked for a route back into the contest.

Instead, Barton protected their stand in keeper well and doubled their advantage in the 82nd minute, when a cross from the left was met by a close

range header.

Allinson remained determined to keep the deficit at 2, standing firm to push out a Barton effort in the 88th minute.

Deep into stoppage time, Jenko slipped, allowing Barton break clear, but Gagen produced a top recovery tackle to prevent a third goal. FT 2-0.

There can be no question about the effort from Les Bleus, but this was simply one of those afternoons when the inspiration failed to match the perspiration. We've had better days.

2014 - After a 503 day exile Coventry City finally returned to their home ground, the Ricoh Arena. A row with their landlords had seen them move home to Northampton Town's Sixfields ground. The 27,306 Friday night crowd for their homecoming vs Gillingham was more than 10 times the average for their games at Sixfields.

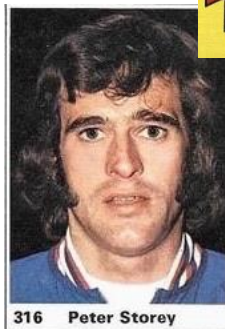
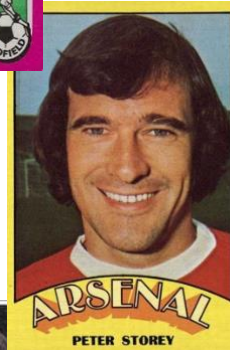
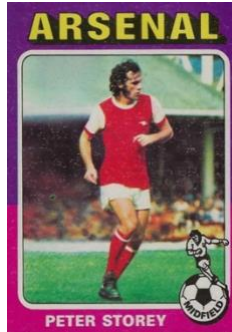
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LINKED TO THE LANE

I love looking at the old A&BC, Panini, Merlin, Topps, etc. football cards and stickers, and it struck me how many of the players pictured had links to Frickley Athletic. They might have played for or against us at some point, or are related to one of The Azzurri past or present. Or the connection might be even more tenuous! But you can be sure it was the highlight of their career ;)

In 1977/78, Jimmy McGill, who had made a career as a solid lower divisions footballer, ended his playing days with a few games at Westfield Lane. However, at the start of his professional football career he had been a promising young midfielder at Arsenal. He had the dubious honour of making one of his 10 first team appearances against Leeds United in 1966, which attracted the Gunners' lowest ever crowd at Highbury, but it was alongside fellow youngster Peter Storey. Storey went on to be an Arsenal legend and, to put it politely, became renowned as a hard man's hard man. Peter Storey was born in 1945 in Farnham, Surrey, and grew up near Aldershot. An England Schoolboy international, he joined Arsenal as an apprentice in 1962 and progressed through the club's youth system before making his first team debut in October 1965. Initially used as a fullback, Storey established himself as a tough, uncompromising defender who was particularly valued for his tackling and determination. As his career developed, he moved into midfield, where he became an important defensive presence. Storey spent the vast majority of his career with Arsenal, remaining at the club until 1977. He made 501 appearances in all competitions and scored 17 goals, mostly from the penalty spot.



His most successful period came under manager Bertie Mee. Storey was an important member of the Arsenal side that won the Inter Cities Fairs Cup in 1970, beating Anderlecht over two legs in the final. The following season brought the biggest achievement of his career. Arsenal won the First Division title and FA Cup in 1970/71, becoming the first English club to complete the League and FA Cup Double since Tottenham Hotspur in 1960/61, and only the fourth side to ever do so.

Storey's performances for Arsenal also brought international recognition. He made his England debut against Greece in April 1971 and won 19 caps by the time his international career came to an end in 1973, as Alf Ramsay's England failed to qualify for the 1974 World Cup after finishing behind Poland in their qualifying group. Bearing in mind that Storey is best remembered for the physical side of his game, he really could play

– 19 caps is proof of that in times when they were hard won, and no other member of Arsenal's great double winning side got anywhere near that for England. Peter Storey eventually left Arsenal in 1977 after 15 years with the club and joined Fulham, where he made 19 appearances before retiring from professional football in 1978.

His life after football was considerably more 'colourful'. Following his retirement, Storey became involved in various business ventures but also entered the criminal world. His activities included car theft, importing pornography and involvement in a counterfeit gold scheme. He was subsequently convicted and served periods in prison. The contrast between his successful football career and his later criminal activities became a major part of his story.

In 2011, Storey published his autobiography, *True Storey: My Life and Crimes as a Football Hatchet Man*, in which he described both his years at Arsenal and his experiences after leaving football. Jimmy McGill even gets a mention. Surprisingly, Frickley didn't. Criminal!

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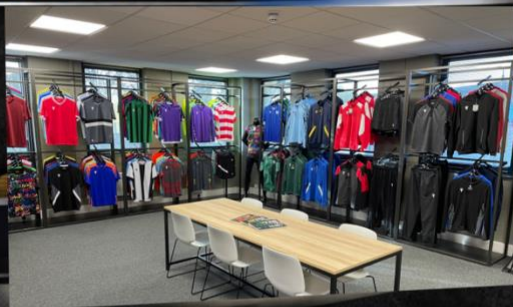
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
